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Altering Boundaries of Dannevirke and Woodville Counties, and including Area in Dannevirke Riding, Dannevirke County.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS it is provided by subsection two of section fourteen of the Counties Act, 1920, that the boundaries of any one or more counties may be altered in accordance with a resolution proposing the alteration passed by the Council of each of such counties in which the Counties Act is in force :

And whereas a resolution was passed by the Dannevirke County Council on the fifteenth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-five :

And whereas a similar resolution was passed by the Woodville County Council on the twentieth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-five, praying for the alteration of the boundaries of the Dannevirke and Woodville Counties in the manner described in the said resolutions and in the first Schedule hereto :

And whereas it is expedient to make such alteration in accordance with the said resolutions, and that the area to be added to the Dannevirke County should be included in the Dannevirke Riding of that county :

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred on me by the said Act, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that the area described in the First Schedule hereto, being now part of the Woodville County, shall be added to and form part of the Dannevirke County ; that the boundaries of the Woodville and Dannevirke Counties as so altered shall be those set forth under the respective headings in the Second Schedule hereto ; that the area added as aforesaid to the Dannevirke County shall be included in the Dannevirke Riding of the said county ; and that the boundaries of that riding shall be those set forth in the Third Schedule hereto :

And I do also proclaim and declare that this Proclamation shall take effect on the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-six.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

AREA EXCLUDED FROM WOODVILLE COUNTY AND INCLUDED IN DANNEVIRKE COUNTY.

ALL that area in the Hawke's Bay Land District bounded on the west by the Manawatu River, on the north and east by the Otopo Stream, and on the south by Lot 1 on plan 3777, deposited in the office of the District Land Registrar at Napier, and being Lot 2 on plan 3777, deposited as aforesaid.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

WOODVILLE COUNTY.

ALL that area in the Hawke's Bay and Wellington Land Districts bounded by a line commencing at Trig. Station 85 in the Ruahine Range, and proceeding thence in an easterly direction along the northern boundary of the forest reserves to the Oruakeretaki Stream, along the aforesaid stream to its intersection with the northern boundary of Section 50, Block I, Woodville Survey District ; thence easterly along the northern boundaries of Sections 50, 51, and 54, Block I aforesaid, to a public road, across that road, and along the northern boundary of Section 13 to its intersection with the Oruakeretaki Stream ; thence along that stream to its confluence with the Manawatu River ; thence southerly along the right bank of that river to point in line with the southern boundary of Lot 2 on plan 3777, deposited in the office of the District Land Registrar at Napier ; thence easterly along that boundary to its intersection with a public road forming the south-eastern boundary of the Otawhao Block ; along the western side of that road to and along the south-eastern boundary of the aforesaid block to the most northerly corner of Section 38, Block XIV, Tahoraite Survey District ; thence easterly along the northern boundaries of Sections 38, 39, and 40, Block XIV, Tahoraite Survey District, Section 1, Block XV, Tahoraite Survey District, to a public road forming the eastern boundary of the said Section 1 ; thence southerly along the western side of that road to a point in line with the northern boundary of Section 9, Block XV, Tahoraite Survey District, across the road, and easterly along that boundary to the north-eastern corner of the aforesaid Section 9 ; thence southerly along the eastern boundary of

Sections 9 and 8 and along the eastern side of the rabbit-fence reserve to the Wellington Land District, and westerly along the northern boundary of that district to a point in the middle of the Manawatu River; thence westerly along the middle of that river to a point opposite the south-eastern corner of Section 2, Subdivision X, of the Manchester Block; thence northerly along the eastern boundary of that subdivision to the north-western corner of Section 3, Block II, Gorge Survey District; thence to and along the middle of the road forming the north-eastern boundary of the said Section 3, to a point in line with the western boundary of Section 2, Block II aforesaid; thence to and along the western, northern, and eastern boundaries of that section to its intersection with the western boundary of Section 6, Block II aforesaid; thence north-easterly along the western boundaries of Section 6, Block II aforesaid, Sections 4, 3, 1, and 6, Block VII, Gorge Survey District, to the north-western corner of the last-mentioned section; thence south-easterly along the northern boundary of that section to Whariti Trig. Station; and thence northerly along the summit of the Ruahine Range to Trig. Station 85, the point of commencement: and excluding therefrom the Borough of Woodville:

DANNEVIRKE COUNTY.

All that area in the Hawke's Bay Land District bounded by a line commencing at a point on the summit of the Ruahine Range due west of the source of the Makaretu River; thence by a right line to the source of the Marekutu River; thence by a line down the middle of the Makaretu River to a point due north of the junction of the main Norsewood-Takapau Road with the old Norsewood-Takapau Road; thence by a line running due south to that junction; thence by the main Norsewood-Takapau Road to the Manawatu River, and by a line down the middle of the said Manawatu River to its confluence with the Waikopiro Stream; thence by a line up the middle of the Waikopiro and Mangapurakau Streams to the southern boundary of Block 83, and by that boundary to the Whatatuna Stream; thence down the middle of the said Whatatuna Stream and up the middle of the stream forming the south-eastern boundary of Sections 17 and 13, Block XV, Takapau Survey District, to the south-eastern corner of the last-mentioned section; thence along the eastern boundary of Section 14, Block XV aforesaid, to Whangai Stream; and down the middle of that stream to its junction with the Mangapuaka Stream; thence up the middle of the said Mangapuaka Stream to its intersection by a right line running through Trig. Station 27 to Trig. Station 12 at the south-eastern corner of Mangangara No. 3; thence to and along that line to the said Trig. Station 12; thence south-easterly and south-westerly along the north-eastern and south-eastern boundaries of Section 3, Block VIII, Mangatoro Survey District, to the Te Uri Road; thence across the Te Uri Road and along the eastern boundary of S.G.R. 74, Block XII, Mangatoro Survey District, to its south-eastern corner; thence westerly along the southern boundaries S.G.R.s 74 and 73, Block XII aforesaid, to the western boundary of the last-mentioned run; thence southerly along the eastern boundaries of Section 1, Block XI, Mangatoro Survey District, and Sections 2 and 1, Block XV, Mangatoro Survey District; thence generally westerly along the southern boundaries of Sections 1 and 3, Block XV aforesaid, Sections 4 and 2, Block XIV, Mangatoro Survey District, and Sections 4, 3, and 2, Mangatoro Settlement; thence along the eastern boundaries of Puketoi 6B and 6A Blocks to Wahataura Trig. Station; thence westerly along the southern boundaries of Puketoi 6A Block and Section 9, Block XVI, Tahoraite Survey District, and Section 10, Block XV, Tahoraite Survey District, to the south-western corner of the last-mentioned section; thence northerly along the western boundary of Section 10 aforesaid, across the rabbit-fence reserve, and along the eastern boundary of Section 8 and the eastern and northern boundaries of Section 9, Block XV aforesaid, to Otope Road at the north-western corner of the said Section 9; thence across Otope Road and northerly along its western side to the southern boundary of Section 4, Block XI, Tahoraite Survey District; thence along the southern boundary of Section 4 and the southern and north-western boundaries of Section 5, Block XI aforesaid, to the Otope Stream; thence westerly along the southern boundary of Lot 2 on plan 3777 deposited in the office of the District Land Registrar at Napier, to the Manawatu River, across that river, and along its right bank to the Oruakeretaki Stream; thence up that stream and the Mangapukakakahu Stream to the northernmost corner of Section 13, Block I, Woodville Survey District; thence across Grainger Road, and along the northern boundaries of Sections 54, 51, and 50, Block I aforesaid, to the Oruakeretaki Stream; thence up the Oruakeretaki Stream and along the northern boundary of a forest reserve to its north-western corner at Trig. Station 85 in the Ruahine Range; thence

northerly along the summit of the Ruahine Range to the point of commencement: and excluding therefrom the Borough of Dannevirke.

THIRD SCHEDULE.

WHEREAS by section five of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1908, it is enacted that the Governor-General may from time to time, by Order in Council, grant to any person or body corporate a license to use water from any fall, river, stream, or other source for the purpose of generating electricity for electric light, mechanical power, or other uses, and to exercise in respect of that license any of the powers and authorities specified in that behalf in the said section : And whereas it is further provided by the said section that any such license may confer upon the licensee a right at any time or times during the continuance of the license (but subject to such conditions and restrictions as are expressed in the license) to enter upon any road, railway, or other land, whether vested in or occupied by the Crown or any other person or body corporate, and there to construct, erect, lay down, maintain, renew, or repair all such cables, wires, and other things as are required for the transmission of electricity between the fall, river, stream, or other source aforesaid and any place to which the licensee is authorized to transmit electricity in pursuance of the license :

And whereas Gerald Fitzgerald, of Wellington, Company Director ; Charles Edward Daniell, of Masterton, Merchant ; Arthur Leigh Hunt, of Wellington, Company Director ; William Duffus Hunt, of Wellington, Company Director ; Phineas Levi, of Wellington, Solicitor ; John Gerrie Neil, of Dunedin, manufacturing Chemist ; Joseph Orchiston, of Wellington, Retired Telegraph Engineer ; Lemuel Thomas Watkins, of Wellington, Master Printer ; Sir James Glenny Wilson, of Bull's, Farmer ; and Harben Robert Young of Westport, Civil Engineer (hereinafter, with their respective executors, administrators, and assigns, referred to as "the licensees"), have applied for a license under the said section to take and use certain waters from sources in the Land District of Southland for the purpose of generating electricity as aforesaid, and it is expedient to issue such license accordingly :

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon him as aforesaid, and of the powers conferred by section two of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1911, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby grant to the licensees (with the rights and powers and upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto)—Firstly, a license for the period mentioned in the said Schedule to take and use water from the falls, rivers, or streams called the Helena Falls, Lyvia River, Stella Burn, and Huntleigh Falls, all discharging into Deep Cove at the head of Smith Sound on the West Coast of the South Island of New Zealand, and situate in the Land District of Southland, the situation of which falls, rivers, or streams being approximately shown on the plan marked P.W.D. 65121, deposited in the office of the Minister at Wellington aforesaid, and also from any other water-source emptying into the said Deep Cove or into Hall's Arm or Crooked Arm or other parts of the said Smith Sound : Secondly, a license for the period mentioned in the said Schedule to take and use water from the waters of Lake Manapouri situate in the said land district by conducting the same by tunnel or otherwise to or towards the said Deep Cove or the said Smith Sound and also in connection with the construction of the said tunnel to take and use water from any fall, river, stream, or lake emptying into the said Lake Manapouri within the area of supply for the purposes in the case of each of the said licenses of generating electricity for electric light, mechanical power, electro-chemical, electro-metallurgical and/or other uses. The waters to be so taken to be sufficient in respect of the first license above-mentioned (hereinafter referred to as the first license) for developing continuously electrical energy not exceeding fifty thousand horse-power and in respect of the second license above mentioned (hereinafter referred to as the second license) not exceeding two hundred and fifty thousand horse-power ; and also to erect and maintain electric lines and other works and plant for power, lighting, heating, electro-chemical, electro-metallurgical, or other uses within the area of supply hereinafter described ; and subject also to the regulations dated the ninth day of

October, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-two, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the twelfth day of the same month, or any regulations made in amendment thereof or in substitution thereof (hereinafter collectively referred to as "the regulations"), and which regulations shall, so far as they are applicable, be deemed to be incorporated herein, but nothing herein shall be held to guarantee that the above-mentioned sources of supply or any of them contain sufficient water to enable the hereinbefore-mentioned amounts of electrical energy respectively to be developed.

SCHEDULE.

1. PLANS.

THE licensees shall, before any works hereby authorized are commenced, forward for the approval of the Minister of Public Works (hereinafter referred to as "the Minister")—

- (a.) Full detailed drawings and specifications of such works :
- (b.) Such other plans as the Minister may require.

2. UTILIZATION OF THE WATER.

The said waters respectively shall, except with the consent of the Minister, be used solely for the purpose of generating electricity, and shall be returned to the respective sources of supply or to the waters of the said Deep Cove, Hall's Arm, Crooked Arm, Smith Sound, or Lake Manapouri at or near the powerhouse where the same is used respectively.

3. LOCATION OF HEADWORKS.

The said waters respectively shall be taken from the respective sources of supply at the headworks situated in each case at a place to be fixed in accordance with the provisions of this license.

4. GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF WORKS.

Subject to the approval of such plans as the Minister may consider necessary, the licensees are hereby authorized to construct, maintain, and use the following works for the purposes of the first license and the second license respectively, the position of the said works in each case to be indicated on such plans :—

- (a.) Headworks consisting of a dam and necessary intake.
- (b.) Tunnel, pipe-line, or other conduits leading from such dam to the powerhouse hereinafter referred to.
- (c.) A power-house with all necessary equipment, including water-turbines, generators, transformers, lightning-arresters, switchboards, switches, exciters, and other appliances for generating electricity.
- (d.) Buildings, plant, and equipment for and in connection with the employment of electricity which may be generated for the purposes of electric lighting, mechanical power, and/or any electro-chemical or electro-metallurgical process, and/or for the purposes of the manufacture, storage, or carriage of any materials used in connection with or the products of any such process.
- (e.) Such transmission and other lines within the area of supply as may from time to time be required within such area of supply, and after compliance with the provisions of clause 13 of the regulations.

5. INSPECTION OF WORKS.

The Inspecting Engineer, both during and after the construction of the works, shall have free access to and liberty at any time to inspect the same so as to ensure that the provisions of this license are given due effect to.

6. MAINTENANCE OF WORKS.

After the said works have been completed, the licensees shall maintain the same in proper working-order during the continuance of this license.

7. RIGHT TO ENTER LANDS, ETC.

The licensees shall have the right at any time or times during the continuance of this license, with the consent of the Minister, to enter upon any road or other land, whether vested in or occupied by the Crown or any other person or body corporate, and there to construct, erect, lay down, maintain, renew, or repair all such transmission-lines, poles, or other things as are required for the transmission of electricity between the generating-stations and any of the substations to which this license applies.

8. POWER TO TAKE LAND.

The licensees are hereby empowered to take, under the Public Works Act, 1908, as for a public work such land as may, in the opinion of the Governor-General, be necessary or advisable to enable the licensees to construct and maintain the various works authorized by this license, and for the purposes of any business or undertaking established or proposed to be

established by the licensees in connection with the license, whether within or beyond the area of supply, including in particular the purposes of quarrying or mining marble, limestone, and other minerals and the taking of supplies of timber for the purpose of any such business or undertaking and the establishment of hostels and accommodation-houses for the use of employees in such business or undertaking and visitors thereto.

9. DURATION OF LICENSE.

The first license and the second license respectively shall, unless sooner determined in accordance with the provisions hereinafter expressed, continue in force for a period of sixty years from the date hereof. Upon the expiry of the said term, or upon the sooner determination of this license by revocation or otherwise, but subject to clause 16 hereof, all rights hereby granted to the licensees shall thereupon cease and determine; but such expiration or determination shall not relieve the licensees of any liability theretofore incurred under this license.

10. RENTAL.

The licensees shall, as from and after the lapse of five years from the day on which electrical power other than power required by the licensees for constructional purposes is first supplied in pursuance of this license, pay to the Public Works Engineer for the district, or otherwise as the Minister may from time to time require, a rental at the rate of 1s. per annum per kilowatt of maximum output, as recorded by the wattmeters to be installed by the licensees at each of the powerhouses mentioned in clause 4 (c) hereof; payment to be made yearly for the period ending on the 31st day of March in each year, commencing from five years after the day electrical power is first supplied as above mentioned. "Maximum output" means twice the number of units generated in the half-hour during which the number of units generated is a maximum for the year. For this purpose the units generated shall be recorded at the end of each half-hour commencing from noon of each day.

11. CHARGES FOR ELECTRICAL ENERGY.

The charge for electrical energy supplied at the licensees' power-house shall not exceed 1d. per unit.

12. AREA OF SUPPLY.

The area of supply comprises that portion of the Lake County indicated by a distinctive border coloured red on the plan marked P.W.D. 65121, deposited in the office of the Minister at Wellington, in the Land District of Wellington.

13. SYSTEM OF SUPPLY.

The system of supply shall be as approved by the Minister. The generating voltage shall be as approved by the Minister.

14. DATUM TEMPERATURE.

For the purposes of calculating stresses as provided in clause 32 of the regulations, the datum temperature shall be taken as 12 degrees Fahrenheit.

15. EXPIRY OF LICENSE.—CROWN MAY TAKE OVER WORKS OR ALLOW LICENSEES TO REMOVE BUILDINGS, ETC.

Upon the expiration of the term of the license hereby granted, the following provisions shall apply:—

(a.) His Majesty the King may take over and use the whole of the works hereby authorized, including all structures, buildings, equipment, machinery, plant, and land, hereinafter in this clause called "the works," on payment by him to the licensees of the then value of the works. The price to be paid under this clause shall be fixed by mutual agreement or, failing that, by arbitration under the Arbitration Act, 1908; or

(b.) The Governor-General may, at his option, by Order in Council, grant to the licensees a new license for a further period of forty-two years, subject to such terms, conditions, and payment of rental as may then be imposed by him; or

(c.) If His Majesty the King does not elect to take over the works under subclause (a), or the Governor-General declines to issue a further Order in Council under subclause (b) hereof, the licensees may, within such time and subject to such conditions as the Minister may then impose, remove all structures, buildings, equipment, machinery, and plant erected or installed by the licensees under the powers conferred by this license. If the licensees fail or neglect to effect such removal within the time or subject to the conditions imposed by the Minister, such structures, buildings, equipment, machinery, and plant shall, without payment of any compensation, vest in and become the property of His Majesty the King.

16. CROWN'S RIGHT TO PURCHASE WORKS.

Notwithstanding anything herein contained, the right is hereby reserved to His Majesty the King, at his option, at any time after the expiration of thirty years from the commencement of the period of this license, upon at least twelve calendar months previous notice in writing of such intention having been given to the licensees by any Government officer, to purchase at such price, and upon such terms and conditions as may be mutually agreed upon (or failing such mutual agreement, then as may be determined by arbitration in the manner prescribed by the Arbitration Act, 1908), this license, together with the whole of the business and undertaking of the licensees so far as the same relates to or is connected with the exercise of this license, and any manufacture carried on in connection therewith, and together with all real and personal property of the licensees then used in connection with the same, and all rights acquired by the licensees under this license and used or enjoyed in connection therewith. The said price, if determined by arbitration, shall be based upon the actual value of the assets at the time of the exercise of the option, but shall not include any sum in respect of the value of the goodwill of the licensees' business or undertaking or in respect of the value of the license in respect of the unexpired period thereof, or in respect of the value of any Crown land held or occupied by the licensees in connection with the undertaking. On the completion of this purchase His Majesty the King shall be deemed to be the assignee of this license, and all the rights vested in the licensees by the license shall thereupon vest in His Majesty the King.

17. COMPENSATION PAYABLE FOR LAND INJURIOUSLY AFFECTED, ETC.

In respect of all land injuriously affected, and in respect of all damages done by the exercise of any of the powers conferred upon the licensees by this license, the licensees shall from time to time, as and when any such injury or damage accrues or happens, pay compensation in accordance with the provisions of the Public Works Act, 1908, in the same manner (subject to all necessary modifications) as if such licensees were a local authority and the claim was one for injury or damage arising out of the construction of a public work.

18. CROWN NOT LIABLE TO PAY COMPENSATION.

Nothing in this license shall be held to cast upon or imply any liability upon His Majesty the King or upon the Government of New Zealand to pay compensation to any person, corporate body, or local authority by reason of the exercise by the licensees of the authority hereby granted; but the licensees shall be liable for any loss or damage which any person, corporate body, or local authority may sustain as the result of the exercise by the licensees of any of the powers granted by this license.

19. CONSUMERS ENTITLED TO SUPPLY.

The licensees shall supply and sell to any person, company, or corporate body within the area of supply requiring the same, for any purpose within that area, electricity to the extent to which it may be available and not required in connection with any business or undertaking carried on by the licensees; provided that such person, company, or corporate body pays the cost of connecting his or its premises with the power-house erected by the licensees in pursuance of this license.

20. INTERCHANGE OF SUPPLY OF ELECTRICAL ENERGY.

(a.) In the event of the Minister establishing a hydro-electric power scheme outside the area of supply of a frequency of 50 cycles per second on the three-phase alternating-current system, he may require the licensees to connect that system with the licensees' electrical system in such a manner that an interchange of electrical energy between the two systems may be made from time to time and when required by either the licensees or the Minister, up to at least one-half of the total capacity of the plant installed at the licensees' power-house.

(b.) The licensees shall erect and maintain in good order, at the expense of the licensees, the necessary transmission-lines between the licensees' power-house and a point on the boundary of the area of supply to be determined by the Minister, such point being not more than half a mile from some transmission-line of the licensees.

(c.) The Minister shall erect and maintain in good order, at the expense of the Minister, the necessary transmission-lines outside the area of supply for the purpose of connecting the two systems at the point last mentioned in subclause (b) hereof.

(d.) The licensees and the Minister respectively shall, on demand, and from time to time as and when required, supply to each other so much of the surplus electrical energy as is then required and is available, but not in excess of one-half of the capacity of the plant installed in the licensees' power-house.

(e.) The price to be paid by the licensees or the Minister shall not exceed $\frac{1}{4}$ d. per unit; to be measured in each case at the point last mentioned in subclause (b) hereof.

(f.) For the purpose of this clause either the licensees or the Minister may have the unit measured in kilovolt-ampere hours instead of kilowatt hours.

21. DEPOSIT.

The deposit of £500 which the licensees have lodged with the Public Trustee as a guarantee of good faith shall be retained as security for the due fulfilment by the licensees of the terms and conditions contained in this license to be performed by them: Provided, however, that when and so soon as the licensees shall have submitted the drawings and specifications required by clause 1 hereof, and those drawings and specifications have been duly approved, and the licensees shall have constructed permanent works in connection with headworks, dam, pipe-lines, and generating-station mentioned in the said clause to the satisfaction of the Minister, to the value of £1,000 at the least, then the Minister shall require the Public Trustee to return the said deposit to the licensees; but if this license is determined, cancelled, or revoked under the powers herein contained before such works to such value have been constructed, then and in any such case the said sum of £500 shall be forfeited to the Crown as ascertained and liquidated damages.

22. BED OF RIVER NOT LEASED.

Nothing herein shall be held to constitute a lease from the Crown of the bed of any fall, river, stream, or lake, nor shall the provisions of Part IX of the Property Law Act, 1908, apply to this license.

23. CONTRACT BETWEEN LICENSEES AND CROWN.

This license shall be deemed to constitute a contract as between the licensees and His Majesty the King, and may be enforced as a contract by and against His said Majesty or the licensees accordingly.

24. TIME FOR SUBSTANTIAL COMPLETION OF WORKS.

The licensees shall proceed energetically with the survey and investigation of the works hereby authorized in respect of the first license, and shall within two years from the date hereof submit to the Minister of Public Works a progress report showing the stage which the work of investigation has reached and the amount expended thereon, and shall within four years from the date hereof submit complete details and full plans and surveys of the work proposed in respect of the first license. If such details be not submitted within such period of four years, or such extended time as is granted by the Governor-General by Order in Council, not exceeding six years from the date hereof, this license shall cease and determine. This license shall also cease and determine unless a company approved by the Minister is formed within such period of six years, with a subscribed capital of not less than the estimated cost as approved by the Minister at the first complete installation of the proposed works.

If the licensees shall not within seven years from the date hereof either develop electrical energy to the extent of 25,000 kilowatts in respect of the first license or expend on works authorized in respect thereof a sum of at least £100,000, this license shall cease and determine. If the licensees shall not submit complete details and full plans and surveys of the works proposed in respect of the second license within the period of nine years from the date hereof, or such extended time as is granted by the Governor-General by Order in Council not exceeding eleven years from the date hereof, such second license shall cease and determine without prejudice to the first license if the same is still in existence. The second license shall also cease and determine unless an installation in respect of such license to develop electrical energy to the extent of at least 50,000 horse-power is completed within fifteen years from the date hereof.

25. GRANTING OF OTHER WATER-RIGHTS.

Nothing herein shall prevent the Governor-General in Council from granting to any person or body corporate other than the licensees a license to take water from any portion of the said sources of supply, except at the place where the licensees are by this license empowered to take it; provided that no such license shall so operate as to reduce the natural fall between the headworks and tail-water, or the volume of

the water which the licensees are by this license authorized to take from the said sources of supply.

26. DEFAULT.

If the licensees fail or neglect to observe any of the conditions or obligations imposed by this license, then and in any such case the provisions of clauses 15 and 16 of the regulations shall apply to the breach of any such condition or obligation.

27. VARIATION IN CONDITIONS OF LICENSE.

The terms and conditions of this license may at any time or from time to time, if found necessary and if duly agreed upon between the licensees and the Governor-General in Council be altered by the Governor-General by Order in Council, whereupon all the terms and conditions in this license contained (save and except as they may have been so altered or modified by such alterations) shall, *mutatis mutandis*, apply to such alterations as if the latter had formed part of this license as originally issued.

28. SURRENDER OF LICENSE.

The licensees may at any time, with the consent of the Minister, surrender this license, and shall thereupon, if so required by the Minister, remove from the ground all removable equipment, machinery, buildings, poles, transmission-lines, and other plant herein authorized to be installed or provided. If the licensees fail or neglect so to remove the said plant within twelve months after being required so to do, such equipment, machinery, buildings, poles, lines, and other plant shall, without payment of any compensation, vest in and become the property of the Crown.

29. DISFIGUREMENT OF NATURAL FEATURES.

The licensees shall not unnecessarily cause serious disfigurement from a scenic point of view, and shall use all precautions to preserve the scenic attractions of the neighbourhood.

30. USER.

(1.) If the licensees do not in respect of the first license develop electrical energy to the extent of 50,000 horse-power within ten years from the date of this license, nothing in such license shall give the licensees the right to use more water from the sources of supply specified in the first license than the amount then required for the development of electrical energy to the full capacity of the then installed plant. But before any license is issued to any other person or body corporate in respect of such additional water a license to use the same shall be offered to the licensees.

(2.) If the licensees do not in respect of the second license develop electrical energy to the extent of 250,000 horse-power within twenty years from the date of this license, nothing in such license shall give the licensees the right to use more water from the source of supply specified in the second license than the amount then required for the development of electrical energy to the full capacity of the then installed plant. But before any license is issued to any other person or body corporate in respect of such additional water a license to use the same shall be offered to the licensees.

31. PROTECTION OF BIRDS AND WILD ANIMAL LIFE.

The licensees or their assigns shall not do or permit any of their agents, servants, officers, or workmen to do anything in pursuance of this license which may cause the destruction of birds or any forms of wild animal life.

32. REVOCATION.

If during the continuance of either of the said licenses and after works are constructed in respect of either of the said licenses the licensees shall fail for a continuous period of at least two years to carry on operations in connection with such works with reasonable continuity and to a capacity in respect of each license at least equal to 50 per centum of the total plant capacity, either license in respect of which such failure shall exist may be revoked in accordance with the provisions of the regulations.

In the event of any question as to whether the licensees have failed to carry on operations in connection with the works erected in pursuance of either license with reasonable continuity, such question shall be decided in accordance with the provisions of the Declaratory Judgments Act, 1908.

33. ASSIGNMENT.

The above licenses respectively shall be assignable from time to time on the terms and conditions set forth in the regulations.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section sixteen of the Deteriorated Lands Act, 1925 (hereinafter referred to as the said Act), it is enacted that the Governor-General may from time to time make all such regulations as may be required for the purpose of giving effect to the provisions of the said Act :

And whereas by section two hundred and nineteen of the Land Transfer Act, 1915, it is enacted that the Governor-General may from time to time make regulations for regulating the practice and conduct of business under that Act :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by the hereinbefore mentioned enactments, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations, and declare that the regulations hereby made shall come into force on the day of publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

REGULATIONS.

INTERPRETATION.

1. IN these regulations—

“Commissioner” means the Commissioner of Crown Lands for the Land District in which is situated the land affected by the subject-matter and includes his deputy.

“Minister” means the Minister of Lands.

APPLICATIONS.

2. Every application for relief under the said Act shall be made in the Form No. 1 in the First Schedule hereto, or to the like effect.

REPORTS, VALUATIONS, AND RECOMMENDATIONS MADE BY SPECIAL REVALUATION COMMITTEE.

3. Every report and valuation, with recommendations, under the said Act made by a special revaluation committee shall be in the form No. 2 in the First Schedule hereto or to the like effect.

ADVANCES.

4. With respect to advances made under section eleven of the said Act, the following provisions shall apply:—

(a.) The amount of advance that may be so made to any one person, including all other advances made to the same person under these regulations and still remaining unpaid, shall not exceed £750 :

Provided that where two or more persons hold or propose to acquire any land (whether freehold or leasehold) as joint tenants or tenants in common in equal shares advances may be made to them only to the aggregate amount that one of them would have been entitled to obtain individually.

(b.) The amount of any advances made for the purchase of fencing-materials, lime, or manure, or to assist occupiers to defray any capital expenditure, may, in the discretion of the Minister, be advanced by progress payments corresponding to 75 per centum of the amount so expended from time to time by the mortgagor. In such case the value of the improvements effected out of moneys so expended shall from time to time be ascertained and certified to by some person authorized by the Minister in that behalf, and any certificate given by such person shall be final. The balance of the amount agreed to be advanced may be paid on receipt of a final certificate that the improvements in respect of which the advance is made have been satisfactorily completed.

(c.) Advances may be made hereunder as follows:—

(i.) On flat mortgage for any period not exceeding ten years bearing interest at the rate of 5½ per centum per annum secured by mortgage on the Form No. 3 in the First Schedule hereto, with such modifications as may be necessary.

(ii.) On instalment mortgage in the Form No. 4 in the First Schedule hereto, providing that all moneys advanced, together with interest thereon at the rate of 5½ per centum per annum, shall be repayable by half-yearly instalments over a period

either of twenty years or twenty-four and one-half years. Every half-yearly instalment shall consist partly of interest and partly of principal, and shall be calculated and apportioned according to the appropriate table in the Second Schedule or the Third Schedule hereto.

(iii.) Where advances secured by a flat mortgage given hereunder have been made to the full amount authorized, by these regulations, or where advances to a lesser amount so secured are sufficient for the requirements of the mortgagor, such flat mortgage may be converted to an instalment mortgage in the manner prescribed by the preceding subparagraph, and effect may be given to such an arrangement by a memorandum of adjustment duly executed and registered.

(d.) For the purpose of the administration of these regulations the Minister may authorize the Commissioner, or any other officer of the Department of Lands and Survey, to make advances, and any such authority to make an advance issued by the Minister shall be deemed to be an authority to advance in one or more sums of money so that the total indebtedness, exclusive of interest of the person to whom such advance is made, shall not at any time exceed the amount so authorized.

(e.) For the purposes of section 82 of the Land Act, 1924, any moneys owing by a lessee on account of an advance made pursuant to these regulations, together with interest due thereon (if any), shall be deemed to be moneys due in respect of the land, and such moneys shall constitute a first charge on moneys received by the Receiver of Land Revenue pursuant to that section.

(f.) All the powers conferred upon His Majesty the King as mortgagee by any mortgage to secure repayments of moneys advanced under these regulations or pursuant to any law as such mortgagee may be exercised in his own name by the Commissioner, and all actions and proceedings for the recovery of moneys advanced or interest thereon may be taken by the said Commissioner in his own name.

(g.) Where pursuant to subsection (5) of section 11 of the said Act any mortgage makes provision for the postponement for any period of the payment of interest, or of any instalment of principal and interest due thereunder until the due date of any later payment, all subsequent payments due shall, unless the Minister otherwise specifically determines, be deemed to be postponed for a like period, and the term of the mortgage shall be deemed to be extended by that period.

ENDORSEMENT ON TITLES, ETC., OF ALTERATIONS AFFECTED.

5. The District Land Registrar, on receipt of a certificate signed by a Commissioner of Crown Lands in the Form No. 5 in the First Schedule hereto, or to the like effect, setting forth particulars as to any reduction made pursuant to the said Act in the capital value of any land, or in the rental payable under any lease or license, or in the amount of any mortgage, or as to any other matter arising out of the said Act shall endorse a memorial of such certificate on the registered copy of the lease or license, or certificate of title or mortgage, or other document as the case may require.

WHEREAS, there being no Harbour Board empowered to grant the license hereinafter mentioned, Samuel Walter Moutt (who with his executors, administrators, and assigns is hereinafter referred to as "the licensee"), has applied to the Governor-General in Council for a license under the Harbours Act, 1923 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), to occupy a part of the foreshore in Porirua Harbour, as a site for a jetty and slipway, to be built in the position and in accordance with plan marked M.D. 6024, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington:

And whereas it has been made to appear to the Governor-General in Council that the work will not be or tend to the

injury to navigation, and the said plan has, prior to the making of this Order in Council, been approved by the Governor-General in Council:

And whereas it is desirable that a license should be granted and issued to the licensee under the said Act for the purpose aforesaid, on the terms and conditions hereinafter expressed:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said license is required by the licensee as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the licensee to use and occupy that part of the foreshore on which the said jetty and slipway are to be erected, as shown on plan marked M.D. 6024 deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of maintaining the said structure thereon, such license to be held and enjoyed by the licensee upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

1. In these conditions the term—

“Foreshore” means such parts of the bed, shore, or banks of a tidal water as are covered and uncovered by the flow and ebb of the tide at ordinary spring tides:

“Low-water mark” means low-water mark at ordinary spring tides:

“Minister” means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to that part of the foreshore occupied by the said jetty and slipway as shown on the plan marked M.D. 6024.

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council the licensee shall pay to the Minister the sum of £2 10s., and thereafter an annual sum of £5, in advance, payable on the 1st day of April each year, the proportionate part of such rental in respect of the period from the date hereof until the 31st of March following to be paid on the licensee being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.

4. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the said jetty and slipway without payment.

5. All persons shall, at all reasonable times, and upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the said jetty and slipway, and all rights of ingress and egress thereon and therefrom.

6. The licensee shall maintain the above-mentioned jetty and slipway in good order and repair, and shall at all times exhibit therefrom, and maintain at the licensee's own cost, suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels; provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved by the Minister.

7. Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said jetty and slipway, and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the licensee in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such jetty and slipway, requiring the licensee, within a reasonable time to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, the licensee shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

8. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the licensee to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1923, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

9. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said jetty and slipway shall be taken away by the licensee and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

10. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue to be in force for fourteen years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the licensee shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the written consent of the Minister first obtained.

11. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, and the licensee may be required to remove the jetty and slipway, at the licensee's cost, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensee three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the licensee in New Zealand.

12. The licensee shall be liable for any injury which the said jetty and slipway may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on the licensee's part.

13. In case the licensee shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;
- (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said jetty and slipway for a period of thirty-days;
- (3.) Become bankrupt, or be in any manner brought under the operation of any law in force for the time being relating to bankruptcy; or
- (4.) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause 3 of these conditions,—

then and in any of the said cases this Order in Council, and every license, right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any notice to the licensee or other proceeding whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensee, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

14. In the event of this Order in Council being revoked for any reason whatsoever, or upon the expiry of the period for which the license is granted, the licensee shall, if required by the Minister so to do, remove the said jetty and slipway entirely from the site, and restore the site to its original condition within three months from the date of revocation or expiry, as the case may be; and, if the licensee fails so to do, the Minister may cause the said jetty and slipway to be removed and the site so restored, and may recover the costs incurred by the said removal and restoration from the licensee.
