In pursuance of all powers and authorities enabling me under the Government Railways Act, 1908, and its amendments, and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, I, Joseph Gordon Coates, Minister of Railways, do hereby make the following alterations in the scale of charges in force on the New Zealand Government Railways open for traffic made on the 10th day of August, 1925, and published in the Gazette of 11th August, 1925:—

Where a motor-vehicle is too long to permit of it being loaded in a four-wheeled wagon, thus necessitating the use of a bogie wagon for its conveyance and another motor-vehicle from the same forwarding station to the same destination station is available and can be loaded in the same bogie wagon the railage charges on each motor-vehicle may be computed (irrespective of whether such vehicle is from the same consignor to the same consignee) as would be the case if each vehicle was loaded in a four-wheeled wagon.
