CHARLES FERGUSSON, Governor-General. A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS in accordance with subsection three of section six of the Counties Amendment Act, 1925 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act)," and on petition signed by not less than two-thirds of the ratepayers in the area described in the First Schedule hereto, the Waimea County Council has passed a resolution recommending that the said area be excluded from the Waimea County (a county in which area be excluded from the Waimea County (a county in which the Counties Act, 1920, is in force) and included in the Sounds County (a county in which the Counties Act, 1920, is not in

And whereas it is expedient to make such alterations of boundaries of the said counties in accordance with the said resolution:

I N pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by the Public Works Amendment Act, 1924, and the Motor-vehicles Act, 1924, and of every other power and authority in anywise enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations by way of amendment to the Motor-lorry Regulations, 1925.

REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations may be cited as "the Motor-lorry Regulations Amendment, No. 2."
2. In these regulations "the said regulations" means the Motor-lorry Regulations, 1925.

"Six-wheeled motor-lorry" means a motor-lorry as defined by the Motor-lorry Regulations Amendment No. 1 which is specially designed so that the weight of the load is distributed between the middle and rear pair of wheels, or a four-wheeled motor-lorry as defined by the said Amendment No. 1 adapted to secure the better distribution of the load by means of a combination body and trailer with two wheels added.

5. Clause (1) of Regulation 1 of the said regulations is hereby further amended by revoking the definition of "width" therein contained, and substituting the following definitions:—

"Width" of a tire in any case in which such tire is pneumatic or is otherwise made wholly or principally of a soft or elastic material such as rubber and is held in a metal rim (whether the rim be detachable or part

in a metal rim (whether the rim be detachable or part of the wheel) means the distance measured across the tire, parallel to the axis of the wheel at the place nearest the top of the metal rim where the tire makes contact with the rim:

Width" of a tire in any case in which such tire is made

idth" of a tire in any case in which such tire is made wholly or principally of a soft or elastic material such as rubber and is immovably affixed to a metallic base as rubber and is immovably affixed to a metallic base means the greatest distance that can be measured across the tire parallel to the axis of the wheel, exclusive of the distance (if any) along that line where the soft or elastic material, when measured vertically towards the metallic base, is less than one-quarter of an inch in thickness:

"Width" in relation to a metal tire means the distance measured in the shortest straight line across the running-surface of the tire that actually makes contact with the roadway.

"(6.) The tire of each wheel of a motor-lorry, if such tire is not of a soft or elastic material, shall be smooth, and shall, where the tire touches the surface of the road or other base whereon the motor-lorry moves or rests, be flat:

"Provided that the edges of the tire may be bevelled or rounded to the extent in the case of each edge of not more than half an inch, measured as the shortest straight line across the width of the surface of the bevelled or rounded

'Provided also that if the tire is constructed of separate plates the plates may be separated by parallel spaces shall be disposed throughout the outer surface of the of the tire so that nowhere shall the aggregate extent of the space or spaces in the course of a straight line drawn horizontally across the circumference of the wheel exceed one-eighth part of the width of the tire.

"(7.) No person shall operate any motor-lorry having any tires which, if not of a soft or elastic material, are not smooth and flat (to the extent aforesaid and subject to the foregoing

proviso), or which, if constructed of separate plates, have spaces greater than the spaces hereinbefore prescribed."

12. Clause 2 of Regulation 5 of the said regulations is hereby amended by revoking the words "and Class P," and substituting in lieu thereof the words "Class P and Class Q."

13. Regulation 9 of the said regulations is amended by adding thereto the following additional clauses:—
"(8.) Notice of any prohibition under clause (4) of this regulation shall be given by the controlling authority at least seven days before the commencement of the specified period, or the first of the specified periods, by means of a statement conveying the general effect of the prohibition published in some newspaper circulating in the district to which the matter of the notice relates, and if there is no such newspaper then by a printed or written placard posted in some conspicuous place on the road or street affected by such notice."

In pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred on him by section twenty-six of the War Pensions Act, 1915, and sections ten, fourteen, and eighteen of the War Pensions Amendment Act, 1923, and of every other power and authority enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations, and doth order that the same shall come into force on the date of publication hereof in the Gazette.

REGULATIONS.

1. (a.) CLAUSE 12 of the regulations under the War Pensions Act, 1915, dated the 23rd day of August, 1915, and published in the Gazette of the 26th day of the same month, as heretofore amended, is hereby revoked.

(b.) Clause 10 of the regulations under the War Pensions Act, 1915, and the War Pensions Amendment Act, 1917, dated the 8th day of April, 1918, and published in the *Gazette* of the 9th day of May, 1918, is hereby revoked.

(c.) Clause 17 of the regulations under the War Pensions Amendment Act, 1923, dated the 16th day of June, 1924, and published in the Gazette of the 26th day of the same month, is hereby revoked.

(d.) In lieu of the regulations revoked by this clause the following regulation is substituted:—

" PAYMENT OF PENSIONS.

"12. Every pension granted shall be payable by equal monthly instalments, of which the first shall be payable on the first day of the month next after the commencement of the pension-year:

"Provided that any instalment falling due while the pensioner is in New Zealand may be paid not earlier than the 23rd day of the month preseding the due date of payment; provided further that any instalment falling due during the absence of the pensioner from New Zealand may be paid on any other date authorized by the War Pensions Board; provided further that in any case in which the War Pensions Board or the War Pensions Appeal Board awards a temporary pension of a certain sum per week as final, it may, if it thinks fit, direct that a lump sum be paid to the claimant in full satisfaction of all payments to accrue in respect of such final pension. The lump

sum is to be equivalent to the total amount and no more of the weekly sums awarded for the period for which the Board considers that such final pension should be granted. The receipt to be given by the claimant for the lump sum shall express that the sum is accepted in full satisfaction of all payments accrued or to accrue in respect of the final pension granted to him."

2. Clause 20 of the said regulations, dated the 16th day of June, 1924, is hereby revoked, and the following regulation substituted:—

" MEDICAL TREATMENT.

"20. (1.) Accommodation supplied to service patients suffering from pulmonary tuberculosis shall take the form of either a specially constructed tent or of alterations or additions to the patient's residence. In the case of structural alterations to any residence the cost shall not exceed the sum of £20 (twenty pounds).

"(2.) The Department will not be responsible for the maintenance

"(2.) The Department will not be responsible for the maintenance in the case of structural alterations or additions, but repairs to or replacement of tents may be considered, having regard to the circumstances of each case, and provided that the necessity for repairs or

replacement is due to fair wear-and-tear.

"(3.) To provide items of furniture for accommodation, a cash grant not exceeding £5 (five pounds) may be made to the service patient by the Department, but this must be deemed to be a final grant. The Department will not be responsible for the maintenance or replacement of articles of furniture."

REGULATIONS.

COAL-MINERS' RELIEF FUND.

1. The commission payable to the Public Trustee for managing and administering the Coal-miners' Relief Fund shall be at the rate of 1 per cent. of the total contributions to the fund in each year.

Coal-miners Relief Fund Local Committees.

2. Each Coal-miners' Relief Fund Local Committee (hereinafter referred to as the Local Committee) shall consist of not less than three members elected from workmen employed in or about a coal-mine or coal-mines. For the purpose of electing members, votes shall be taken by a show of hands at a meeting of the workmen entitled to vote, of which not less than three days' notice shall be given by a notice posted at the pit-head of each mine concerned, specifying the time and place of meeting. A certificate stating the result of the voting and signed by the person presiding at such meeting shall be forthwith forwarded through the Inspector of Mines to the Public Trustee. In the event of a member of the Local Committee resigning or becoming unable or unfit to hold office from any cause whatever, the remaining members, if less than three in number, shall, within seven days, call a special meeting for the election of a new member. Any changes in the personnel of a Local Committee shall be immediately communicated through the Inspector of Mines to the Public Trustee. 2. Each Coal-miners' Relief Fund Local Committee (here

immediately communicated through the Inspector of Milles to the Public Trustee.

3. Each Local Committee shall nominate two persons, who shall be approved of by the Minister, to act as trustees for the purpose of opening and operating upon a branch account of the Coal-miners' Relief Fund kept at the nearest post-office money-order and savings-bank. The trustees shall notify the Minister in writing of their acceptance of the office

4. In the event of any trustee resigning or becoming unable or unfit to hold office from any cause whatever, the Local Committee shall forthwith notify the Postmaster, and apply to the Minister for authority to appoint another person to act in the place of the trustee vacating office.

5. Coal-miners' Relief Fund moneys only shall be kept in the branch account at the post-office money-order and

in the branch account at the post-office money-order and savings-bank.

6. No sum exceeding £20 in amount shall be withdrawn from the said account without the prior written authority of the Public Trustee, to whom application shall be made by the Local Committee. The application shall be supported by a medical certificate and forwarded through the Inspector of Mines, who will certify whether or not the claim is in order.

7. All moneys withdrawn from the said account shall be paid and applied as follows: When any workman has been off work through an injury whilst employed in or about a mine, he shall receive payment at the rate of 2s. ld. for every day except Sundays from the date of the accident, such payment to be made on the certificate of a medical officer, and to continue so long as such medical officer and the trustees certify that the workman is unable to work by reason of the said injury; but in no case for a longer period than two years. than two years.

8. In addition to the foregoing benefit, a workman who is

s. In addition to the foregoing benefit, a workman who is permanently totally disabled as the result of an injury whilst employed in or about a mine shall be granted a sum of £50, and a workman who is permanently partially disabled may be granted a proportionate part of £50, based on the degree of disability prescribed by the Second Schedule to the Workers' Compensation Act, 1922.

9. Any workman who meets with an injury in or about a mine which disables him from work shall send, or cause to be sent, within seven days of such injury occurring, a notice in writing, together with a copy of the medical officer's certificate, to the Inspector of Mines; and all applications for relief must be made within fourteen days of the accident, or the claim cannot be entertained, unless specially authorized

or the claim cannot be entertained, unless specially authorized by the Public Trustee.

10. Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, the trustees may, on the recommendation of the Inspector, pay to any coal-miner who, through any injury sustained in the course of his employment as a coal-miner, is permanently totally incapacitated from work of any kind, such weekly allowance as may from time to time, subject to such conditions as he may impose, be authorized by the Minister.

11. No workman shall be entitled to relief from the Coalminers' Relief Fund for any accident caused by drinking intoxicating liquors, fighting, or any kind of athletic sports or game of amusement, or for any accident caused by the misconduct of such workman.

12. For each quarterly period ending 31st March, 30th June, 30th September, and 31st December in each year returns shall be forwarded by the trustees to the Inspector of Mines for the information of the Public Trustee, showing the several amounts paid into the said account and the particulars of all withdrawals and disbursements therefrom during such quarter.

13. Every such return shall be so forwarded within ten days after the expiration of the quarterly period to which it relates, and shall be certified as correct by the Chairman or other chief officer or officers of the local committee. The quarterly return shall be supported by receipted vouchers for all amounts in excess of 5s. paid by way of relief and adminis-

tration expenses.

14. The trustees shall keep proper books of accounts, showing the various items of receipt and expenditure in relation to the said account; and such books shall at all reasonable times be open to the inspection of any Inspector of Mines, or any officer duly authorized by the Public Trustee in that behalf, who may take such extracts therefrom as he

in that behalf, who may take such extracts therefrom as he may require.

15. Receipts shall be obtained by the trustees for all relief payments and for all other disbursements in excess of 5s. The Local Committee may claim an allowance not exceeding 5 per cent. of all disbursements as a contribution towards the expense of management of the fund.

16. If in any case the trustees or any of them wilfully commit a breach of any of these regulations, or misspend or missappropriate any of the moneys standing to the credit of, or withdrawn from, the said account, then the Minister of Mines, on proof of the fact, by notice to the Chief Postmaster of the district, may prohibit any further dealing with such account by the said trustees or any of them, and may remove the offending trustee or trustees from office; and any moneys so missappropriated may be recovered in the name of the Minister of Mines as a debt due to His Majesty the King.

17. In case of removal of the trustees or any of them from office as last aforesaid the Minister shall, by writing, forthwith request the Local Committee to appoint with his approval some other person or persons to fill the vacancy, and if such

Local Committee neglects so to do for the space of fourteen days after service of such written request, then the Minister may appoint a trustee or trustees to fill such vacancy; and such trustee or trustees, when so appointed, shall have and may exercise all the powers of the original trustee or trustees with respect to the said account.

Coal-miners' Relief Fund where there is no Local Committee.

18. In any district where there is no Local Committee the Public Trustee shall, on receipt of a certificate from a duly qualified medical officer, and also on a certificate from an Inspector of Mines, apply the moneys deposited to the credit of the Coal-miners' Relief Fund as follows: When any workman has been off work through an accident he shall receive payment at the rate of 2s. Id. for every day except Sundays from the date of the accident, which payment shall continue so long as such medical officer and Inspector of Mines certify that the workman is unable to work, but in no case for a longer period than two years; but when an accident occurs in any mine situate in a locality remote from settlement, where the services of a medical officer are not procurable, payment at the prescribed rate may be made for any period not exceeding thirty days from the date of accident on the certificate of the Inspector of Mines alone.

19. In addition to the foregoing benefit, a workman who is permanently totally disabled as the result of an injury whilst employed in or about a mine shall be granted a sum of £50, and a workman who is permanently partially disabled may be granted a proportionate part of £50, based on the degree of disability prescribed by the Second Schedule to the Workers' Compensation Act, 1922.

20. Any workman who meets with an injury in or about a mine which disables him from work shall send. or cause 18. In any district where there is no Local Committee the

of disability prescribed by the Second Schedule to the Workers' Compensation Act, 1922.

20. Any workman who meets with an injury in or about a mine which disables him from work shall send, or cause to be sent, within seven days of such injury occurring, a notice in writing, and, except in the case mentioned in the preceding clause, a copy of the medical officer's certificate to the Inspector of Mines; and all applications for relief must be made within fourteen days from the date of the accident, or the claim cannot be entertained. The Public Trustee is, however, authorized to pay any claims notwith-standing the failure to give such notice, provided he is satisfied that the failure was through no fault of the injured person.

21. Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, the Public Trustee may, on the recommendation of the Inspector, pay to any coal-miner who, through any injury sustained in the course of his employment as a coal-miner, is permanently totally incapacitated from work of any kind such weekly allowance as may from time to time, subject to such conditions as he may impose, be authorized by the Minister.

22. No workman shall be entitled to relief from the Coalminers' Relief Fund for any accident caused by drinking intoxicating liquors, fighting, or any kind of athletic sports or game of amusement, or for any accident caused by the misconduct of such workman.
