The total births registered for the urban areas amounted to 1,175, as against 991 in February—an increase of 184. The deaths in March were 493, an increase of 63, as compared with the previous month. Of the total deaths males contributed 247, females 246. Forty-nine of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 9.94 per cent. of the whole number.
