Now, therefore, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on me by section five of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1909, and of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare the land described in the Schedule hereto to be Crown land subject to the Land Act, 1924.

Altering Boundaries of Otorohanga and Waitomo Counties, and including Area in Waipa Riding, Otorohanga County.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS it is provided by subsection two of section fourteen of the Counties Act, 1920, that the boundaries of any one or more counties may be altered in accordance with a resolution proposing the alteration passed by the Council of each of such counties in which the Counties Act is in force:

And whereas a resolution was passed by the Otorohanga County Council on the twenty-seventh day of January, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, praying for the alteration of the boundaries of the Otorohanga and Waitomo Counties in the manner described in the said resolution and in the First Schedule hereto:

And whereas a similar resolution was passed by the Waitomo County Council on the twelfth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-six:

And whereas it is expedient to make such alterations in accordance with the said resolutions, and that the area to be added to the Otorohanga County should be included in the Waipa Riding of that county:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred on me by the said Act, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that the area described in the First Schedule hereto, being

now part of the Waitomo County, shall be added to and form part of the Otorohanga County; that the boundaries of the Otorohanga and Waitomo Counties as so altered shall be those set forth under the respective headings in the Second Schedule hereto; that the area added as aforesaid to the Otorohanga County shall be included in the Waipa Riding of the said county; and that the boundaries of that riding shall be those set forth in the Third Schedule hereto.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

AREA EXCLUDED FROM WAITOMO COUNTY AND INCLUDED IN OTOROHANGA COUNTY.

ALL that area in the Auckland Land District bounded by a line commencing at a point in the middle of the Owawenga Stream in line with the northern boundary of Rangitoto-Tuhua A No. 48B No. 2c in Block III, Pakaumanu Survey District; thence up the middle of the said Owawenga Stream to its intersection with the eastern boundary of Rangitoto-Tuhua A 50B No. 2 Block; thence along the eastern boundary of that block, the northern and eastern boundaries of Section 1, Block VII, Pakaumanu Survey District, and the northern boundary of Rangitoto-Tuhua A No. 60 Block to its north-eastern corner; thence along the eastern, southern, and part of the western boundaries of the last-named block, to its intersection with the southern boundary of Rangitoto-Tuhua A 67B 1A Block; thence westerly along that boundary to the middle of the Waipa River; thence down that river to its intersection with the southern boundary of Rangitoto-Tuhua A No. 41; thence along the southern, eastern, and northern boundaries of the aforesaid Rangitoto-Tuhua A No. 41 to the middle of the Waipa River; thence down the middle of that river to its intersection with the northern boundary of Rangitoto-Tuhua A No. 48B 2c; thence north-easterly along that boundary to the middle of the Owawenga Stream, the point of commencement.

ALL that area in the Auckland Land District bounded by a line commencing at the confluence of the Mangauika Stream with the Waipa River; thence running up the middle of the Waipa River to a point in line with the north-eastern boundary of the Ouruwhero 3E 1 Block; thence to and along that boundary, across the Ouruwhero Road, along the northern boundaries of Ouruwhero Nos. 3E 2, 3E 5, 303, 302c, and 301 Blocks to Section 1, Block X, Puniu Survey District; thence along the western, southern, and eastern boundaries generally of the said Section 1 to and along the southern boundary of Ouruwhero No. 3U Block, along the north-eastern boundary of Ouruwhero No. 3X Block, along the north-western boundary of Tokanui C No. 11 Block; thence by a right line to the north-western corner of Lot 2 of Tokanui C No. 4 Block, Block X, Puniu Survey District; thence along the northern boundary of the said Lot 2, across a road, along the eastern side of that road to and along the southern boundary of Lot 1 of Tokanui A Block, Block XI, Puniu Survey District; thence north-easterly along a right line to the junction of the Moerika Stream with the Puniu River; thence up the middle of the Puniu River to its intersection with the north-eastern boundary of Section 1, Block I, Wharepapa Survey District; thence south-easterly along the eastern boundaries of Section 1 aforesaid and Sections 1, 6, and 2, Block II, Wharepapa Survey District; thence north-easterly along the south-eastern boundaries of Section 3 and 5, Block II, Sections 1, 2, and 3, Block III, Wharepapa Survey District, and the continuation of the latter boundary to the centre of the Waikato River; thence along the middle of the Waikato River to its confluence with the Waipapa Stream; thence up the middle of the said stream to its junction with the Waiteti Stream and up the middle of the said Waiteti Stream to its approximate source at peg CXXX on Survey Office plan 20946 (2) blue; thence south-westerly along a right line, bearing 209° 13' distance 7767 links; thence south-easterly along right lines bearing 169° 44' distance 10266 links, bearing 169° 5' distance 3508 links, as shown on the aforesaid plan; thence along the eastern and southern boundaries of Maraeroa A No. 3B Block to the south-western boundary of the Rangitoto B Block; thence by the north-eastern boundary of Waitomo County (hereinafter described) to the south-western corner of Section 5, Block I, Orahiri Survey District; thence generally north-easterly along the western boundary of the said Section 5 and a production thereof to the centre of the Awaroa Road; thence by a line along the middle of the said road to the Hauturu Road; and thence along the middle of the Hauturu Road to and along the middle of the Kawhia-Pirongia Road, to a point in line with the north-western boundary of Section 1, Block IX, Pirongia Survey District; thence to and along the said north-western boundary of Section 1 and along the

south-eastern boundary of Section 1, Block VI, Pirongia Survey District, and a continuation of the said boundary across a road to trig. station on Te Ake-o-Hikopiro; thence along the north-western boundary of the Mangauika Block 1B 2 Section 2 to the northernmost corner of the said block; thence along the north-eastern boundary of the said 1B 2 Section 2 to Native reserve; thence along the western boundary of said Native reserve and Section 4, Block VII, Pirongia Survey District, to the south-western corner of that section; thence along the southern boundaries of Sections 4 and 5, Block VII aforesaid, to the south-eastern corner of the last-mentioned section; thence along the western boundaries of Kaipha Blocks Nos. 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5 to the north-western corner of the said Block 5; thence along the northern boundary of the said Kaipha Block No. 5 to Pukehoua Trig. Station; thence along the western boundary of Section 8, Block IV, Pirongia Survey District, to the north-western corner of the said Section 8; thence along the northern boundary of the said Section 8 and Section 2, Block IV aforesaid, to the Mangauika Stream; thence down the middle of that stream to its confluence with Waipa River, the place of commencement: excluding therefrom the Town District of Otorohanga.

WAITOMO COUNTY.

All that area in the Auckland Land District bounded towards the north generally by a line commencing at a point where the northern boundary of Section 1, Block VI, Marakopa Survey District, intersects the coast-line; thence south-easterly by the said northern boundary of Section 1 to the Kiritehere Road; thence across the said road and southwards by the eastern boundary of Section 2B (scenic reserve) to the point where the said boundary intersects the northern boundary of Section 2; thence following the northern and eastern boundaries of the said Section 2 to the junction with the Ngawaitangirua Road; thence across the said road and along the north-east boundary of Section 3, Block II, Whareorino Survey District; thence by the northern and north-western boundaries of Sections 4 and 3, Block I, Maungamangero Survey District, to the intersection of the Mangakokopu Road, across the said road, and thence easterly by the northern boundary of Sections 7 and 2 of Block I, Maungamangero Survey District, and Sections 5, 2, and 1, of Block II, Maungamangero Survey District, to the intersection of the Mahoenui-Kawhia Road; thence across the said road to the middle of the Mangahae River; thence down the middle of that river and up the middle of the Mangarere Stream to the western boundary of Section 3, Block IV, Maungamangero Survey District; thence by the western boundaries of Section 3, Block IV aforesaid, and Kinohaku East No. 2 No. 6B 2, to the southern boundary of S.G.R. 26, Block XVI, Orahiri Survey District; thence by the southern and western boundaries of S.G.R. 26 to the Mangatuhaua Stream; thence by that stream to the eastern boundary of Lot 2 of Section 2, Block XI, Kawhia South Survey District; thence by that boundary to the middle of the Mangapohue Road, and by the middle of that road to the western boundary of Section 7, Block IX, Orahiri Survey District; thence by the western boundaries of Sections 7 and 3, Block IX aforesaid, to Hauturu Road; thence by Hauturu Road to the road forming the southern boundary of Section 1, Block VIII, Kawhia South Survey District; thence by that road to the western boundary of the said Section 1; thence by the western boundary of the said Section 1, Block VIII aforesaid, and Sections 8 and 7, Block I, Orahiri Survey District, to the north-western corner of the last-mentioned section, and by the northern boundary of that section to the Hauturu Road; thence southwards along the middle of the said road to a point opposite the northern boundary of Section 3, Block I, Orahiri Survey District; thence across that road, and along the said boundary of Section 3 to the intersection with the Orongo Road; thence across the said road, and along the southern side of the road to its intersection with the eastern boundary of Section 4, Block I, Orahiri Survey District; thence due south along the said eastern boundary of Section 4; thence south-easterly by the north-eastern boundary of Section 1, Block V, Orahiri Survey District; and thence eastwards generally by the north-east and eastern boundaries of the Hauturu East B No. 2 Block to where the northern boundary of Section 19, Block VII, Orahiri Survey District, intersects; thence eastward along the northern boundary of the said Section 19 and Section 18; thence north and eastward again by the western and northern boundaries of the Hauturu East C No. 2B Block to the intersection of the Haurua Road, across the said road, and easterly and southwards along the northern and eastern boundaries of Section 7A and the eastern boundary of Section 8A, Block VIII, Orahiri Survey District, Hauturu East No. 2A 3, to the intersection of the Te Kuiti-Otorohanga Road, across the said road, and along the eastern and southern boundaries of Hauturu East 2 No. 2 Block to the intersection of the Te Kuiti-Otorohanga Road;

thence south-easterly along the eastern boundary of Pukeroa-Hangatiki No. 1A Block to the Main Trunk Railway Reserve; thence along the western boundary of the railway reserve to the Waitomo Road, across the said road, across the Main Trunk Railway Reserve to the middle of the Whangamata Road, and northerly along the middle of the road to a point opposite to where the south-western boundary of the Pukeroa-Hangatiki 4D 2D No. 5A Block intersects the road; thence across the road and south-easterly along the south-western boundary of the said Pukeroa-Hangatiki 4D 2D No. 5A Block to the intersection of the Mangarapa Stream; thence southwards along the Mangarapa Stream to its intersection with the northern boundary of Section 1, Block XII, Orahiri Survey District; thence eastwards and southwards by the northern and eastern boundaries of the said Section 1 and the eastern boundary of Section 2, Block XII, Orahiri Survey District; thence southwards by the eastern boundary of Section 1, Block XVI, Orahiri Survey District, and Mangarapa No. 1B Block to a point where the eastern boundary of the Mangarapa No. 1B Block intersects the northern boundary of the said Section 1; thence eastwards by the northern boundaries of the said Section 1 and of the Te Kuiti No. 2B 14B Block; thence southwards along the eastern boundaries of the Te Kuiti No. 2B 14B, No. 2B 9B, and No. 2B 22 Blocks to a point where the northern boundary of the Rangitoto-Tuhua No. 71B Block intersects the eastern boundary of the said Te Kuiti No. 2B 22 Block; thence eastwards along the said northern boundary of the Rangitoto-Tuhua No. 71B Block and along the northern boundary of the Rangitoto-Tuhua 69B Block to its intersection with the Otewa Road; thence across the said road and along the northern boundary of the Rangitoto-Tuhua No. 69B Block again; thence south-westerly by a right line to the south-western corner of Rangitoto-Tuhua No. 26B Block; thence easterly and northerly by the southern and eastern boundaries of the Rangitoto-Tuhua No. 26B Block to a point where the northern boundary of the Rangitoto-Tuhua No. 35E Block intersects the said eastern boundary of the Rangitoto-Tuhua No. 26B Block; thence generally easterly by the northern boundaries of the Rangitoto-Tuhua No. 35E Block to its intersection with Section 3, Block XIV, Mangaorongo Survey District; thence easterly generally by the northern boundary of the said Section 3, across a road, and again by the northern boundary of the said Section 3, across a road, and easterly by the northern boundary of Section 4, Block XIV, Mangaorongo Survey District; thence southerly along the eastern boundaries of the said Section 4 to the northern boundary of Rangitoto-Tuhua No. 35E Block; thence south-easterly along the said boundary to the eastern boundary; thence southerly along the said boundary to its intersection with the Waipa River; thence along the middle of the Waipa River to the northern boundary of Rangitoto-Tuhua A No. 41; thence easterly, southerly, and westerly along the northern, eastern, and southern boundaries to the middle of the Waipa River again; thence along the middle of the said Waipa River to the southern boundary of Rangitoto 67B 1A Block; thence along the southern boundary of Rangitoto A 67B 1A and the western, southern, and eastern boundaries of Rangitoto A No. 60 Block to the north-eastern corner of the last-mentioned block; ON the recommendation of the Native Land Purchase Board, referred to in section three hundred and sixty-three of the Native Land Act, 1909, and in exercise of the power in this behalf conferred upon him by that section, and by section one hundred and eleven of the Native Land Amendment Act, 1913 (as amended by section eight of the Native Land Amendment and Native Land Claims Adjustment Act, 1916), His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby extend for a further period of eighteen months the Order in Council dated the seventeenth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-four, and gazetted the twentieth day of Novem-

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Public Works Amendment Act, 1911, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth—subject to the conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto, and to the regulations made under section two of the aforesaid Act, and dated the ninth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-two, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the twelfth day of the same month, or any regulations hereafter made in amendment thereof or in substitution thereof (and hereinafter collectively referred to as "the regulations"), and which regulations shall be deemed to be incorporated herein—hereby authorize Paul Spender, of Rawene, Garage-proprietor, (hereinafter referred to as "the licensee"), to erect and maintain electric lines for lighting, power, and heating purposes within the area of supply hereinafter described, such electric lines at present proposed to be erected being indicated by means of green lines shown on the plan marked P.W.D. 64653 and deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works at Wellington, in the Wellington Land District.

SCHEDULE.

1. AREA OF SUPPLY.

THE area of supply comprises portion of the Rawene Town District. As the same is more particularly delineated on the plan marked P.W.D. 64653 deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works at Wellington, in the Wellington Land District, and thereon bordered green.

2. SYSTEM OF SUPPLY.

The system of supply shall be as described in paragraph (a) of clause 2 of the regulations. The generating voltage shall be approximately 230 volts between the terminals.

3. CHARGES FOR ELECTRICAL ENERGY.

The charges for electrical energy shall not exceed 1s. 3d. per unit for lighting and 9d. per unit for motor-power, heating, or cooking purposes; provided that "lighting purposes" shall include the operation of motor generators for lighting purposes; and provided further that if accounts are paid within fourteen days after due date the charges shall not exceed 1s. per unit for lighting purposes and 6d. per unit for motor-power, heating, or cooking purposes.

4. DURATION OF LICENSE.

This license shall, unless sooner determined in accordance with the provisions hereinafter expressed, continue in force for a period of forty-two years from the date hereof; pro-

vided that should an electric-power district be constituted under the Electric-power Boards Act, 1918, including the Rawene Town District, or should the Rawene Town Board commence to supply electrical energy in the said town district, the licensee shall within three months after the receipt of a notice in writing from either the Electric-power Board or the Town Board requesting the licensee so to do, discontinue the supply of electrical energy and remove the plant used by the licensee under this license, and at the expiration of the said three months this license shall, *ipso facto*, cease and determine. Upon the expiry of the said term, or upon the sooner determination of this license by revocation or otherwise, all rights hereby granted to the licensee shall thereupon cease and determine; but such expiration or determination shall not relieve the licensee of any liability theretofore incurred under this license.

5. REQUIREMENTS OF RAWENE TOWN BOARD.

Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, the licensee shall not be entitled to erect, maintain, or use any electric lines within the Town District of Rawene except subject to such conditions, not inconsistent with the provisions of this license and the regulations relating thereto, or any variation of this license or the regulations, or new regulations which may take the place of these regulations, as may from time to time be agreed upon between the licensee and the Rawene Town Board.

6. TELEGRAPH DEPARTMENT'S LINES.

The licensee shall rectify to the satisfaction of the Minister of Telegraphs any interference or disturbance caused by the erection or operation of the licensee's system that affects the satisfactory working of the telegraph-lines which are the property of the Telegraph Department, and which were erected prior to the licensee's lines.

WHEREAS, there being no Harbour Board empowered to grant the license hereinafter mentioned, Ethel Broughton Hazelwood, of Anakiwa (who with her executors, administrators, and assigns is hereinafter referred to as "the licensee"), has applied to the Governor-General in Council for a license under the Harbours Act, 1923 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), to occupy a part of the foreshore at Anakiwa, Grove, Queen Charlotte Sound, as a site for a jetty, to be built in the position and in accordance with plan marked M.D. 6144, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington:

And whereas it has been made to appear to the Governor-General in Council that the work will not be or tend to the injury of navigation, and the said plan has, prior to the making of this Order in Council, been approved by the Governor-General in Council:

And whereas it is desirable that a license should be granted and issued to the licensee under the said Act for the purpose aforesaid, on the terms and conditions hereinafter expressed:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said license is required by the licensee as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the licensee to use and occupy that part of the foreshore on which the said jetty is to be erected, as shown in plan marked M.D. 6144 deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of maintaining the said structure thereon, such license to be held and enjoyed by the licensee upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

1. IN these conditions and terms—

"Foreshore" means such part of the bed, shore, or banks of a tidal water as are covered and uncovered by the flow and ebb of the tide at ordinary spring tides:

"Low-water mark" means low-water mark at ordinary spring tides:

"Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to that part of the foreshore occupied by the said jetty as shown on the plan marked M.D. 6144.

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council the licensee shall pay to the Minister the sum of £1, and thereafter an annual sum of £1 in advance, payable on the 1st day of April each year, the proportionate part of such rental in respect of the period from the date hereof until the 31st March following to be paid on the licensee being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.

4. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the said jetty without payment.

5. All persons shall, at all reasonable times, and upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the said jetty, and all rights of ingress and egress thereon and therefrom.

6. The licensee shall maintain the above-mentioned jetty in good order and repair, and shall at all times exhibit therefrom, and maintain at the licensee's own cost, suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels; provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved by the Minister.

7. Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said jetty and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the licensee in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such jetty, requiring the licensee, within a reasonable time to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, the licensee shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

8. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the licensee to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1923, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may thereafter be in force.

9. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said jetty shall be taken away by the licensee and deposited above high-water-mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

10. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue to be in force for fourteen years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the licensee shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the written consent of the Minister first obtained.

11. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, and the licensee may be required to move the jetty at the licensee's cost, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensee three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the licensee in New Zealand.

12. The licensee shall be liable for any injury which the said jetty may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on the licensee's part.

13. In case the licensee shall—

(1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;

(2.) Cease to use or occupy the said jetty for a period of thirty days;

(3.) Become bankrupt, or be in any manner brought under the operation of any law in force for the time being relating to bankruptcy; or

(4.) Fail to pay the sum specified in clause 3 of these conditions,—

then and in any of the said cases this Order in Council, and every license, right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any notice to the licensee or other proceeding whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council

containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensee and to all persons concerned or interested that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

14. In the event of this Order in Council being revoked for any reason whatsoever, or upon the expiry of the period for which the license is granted, the licensee shall, if required by the Minister so to do, remove the said jetty entirely from the site, and restore the site to its original condition within three months from the date of revocation or expiry, as the case may be; and if the licensee fails so to do, the Minister may cause the said jetty to be removed and the site so restored, and may recover the costs incurred by the said removal and restoration from the licensee.

who are hereby constituted for that purpose a special Board by the name of the Tikokino War Memorial Public Library Board (hereinafter referred to as "the Board"), with the powers and subject to the conditions hereinafter contained, that is to say:—

1. The Board shall meet for the transaction of business at the Tikokino War Memorial Public Library, or at such other place and at such time as may be from time to time fixed by the Board. The first meeting shall be held on the 3rd day of May, 1926.

2. The members of the Board shall at their first meeting, and thereafter at the annual meeting hereinafter mentioned, elect one of themselves to be Chairman, who may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote. The Chairman shall hold office until the election of his successor.

3. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman, provided that two days' notice of such meeting be given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting; and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.

4. Any five members of the Board shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.

5. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose one of their number to be Chairman of such meeting.

6. If by resignation, death, incapacity, or otherwise the seat of any member shall be or become vacant, or if any member absents himself, without reasonable cause, from three consecutive meetings of the Board, the Governor-General shall have power to appoint any other person to be a member of the Board in his (or her) stead.

7. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at a meeting.

8. The Board shall have prepared and submitted at an annual meeting held in the month of April in each year a report of the proceedings of the Board for the previous year ending on the thirty-first day of March, together with a statement of the receipts and expenditure of the Board for such year. A copy of every such report and statement, certified by the Chairman to be correct, shall be sent to the Minister of Lands as soon as possible after each annual meeting.

9. The Board shall control the said reserve and the building erected thereon for the purposes of a war memorial public library, and may afford settlers and residents of Tikokino and the surrounding district such facilities for meeting within the said building as may from time to time be determined by the Board; provided that the Board shall have power to fix reasonable charges for the use of the said building.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section thirty-seven of the Reserves and other Lands Disposal and Public Bodies Empowering Act, 1924, it is provided that the Governor-General may, by Order in Council, vest the land described in the said section thirty-seven (being the land described in the Schedule hereto) in the Corporation of the Borough of Whangarei for tree-planting purposes, subject to such terms and conditions as may be prescribed or embodied in such Order, and subject also to the payment by the Whangarei Borough Council of such price (if any) as the Governor-General may determine:

And whereas the Governor-General has determined that no price should be paid in respect of the said vesting:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the said section thirty-seven, doth hereby declare that from and after the day of the date hereof the land described in the Schedule hereto shall become vested in the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Corporation of the Borough of Whangarei for tree-planting purposes, subject to the conditions hereinafter contained, that is to say:—

1. The Whangarei Borough Council shall, within six months of the date hereof, or within such extended period as the Commissioner of State Forests may decide, prepare a general forest working-plan of future operations to cover a period of not less than five years; such working-plan shall fully specify the silvicultural operations proposed to be carried on during the currency of the plan and such other matters as the Director of Forestry thinks fit.

2. It shall not be lawful for the said Council to carry on such silvicultural operations unless and until such plan has been approved by the Commissioner of State Forests, and all such operations shall be carried on according to such plan as approved by the said Commissioner and under the supervision of the Director of Forestry.

3. Any officer of the State Forest Service shall have free access to the said land at all times for the purpose of inspecting planting or other forestal operations, or for the purpose of reporting on proposed forest activities.

4. The said Council shall, as soon as practicable after the date hereof, appoint some fit person to supervise and manage all tree-planting operations which may be undertaken by the said Council, and generally to advise the said Council on all matters pertaining to its forestry operations.

5. The said Council may dispose of, by private sale, tender, or auction, any timber, trees, tree-seeds, firewood, or other forest produce on or from the said land.

6. The payment of expenses of administration, management, and development of the said land for forestry and other purposes incidental thereto (including any expenses of supervision incurred to the State Forest Service) shall be a first charge on all moneys received therefrom, whether by way of rent, fees, proceeds of sales of forest produce, or from any other source whatsoever.

7. In April of each year the said Council shall furnish to the Commissioner of State Forests a report for the year ending on the preceding thirty-first day of March, presenting in complete detail full particulars of the technical operations, and of the administration of the land hereby vested in the said Corporation and of the financial operations relating thereto, and shall at the same time submit a plan of operations and management for the ensuing year, which shall be effective on approval by the Commissioner of State Forests.

Prescribing Forms and Procedure under the Child Welfare Act, 1925.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this 20th day of April, 1926.

THE RIGHT HONOURABLE J. G. COATES, P.C., PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by section forty-five of the Child Welfare Act, 1925 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), to make regulations prescribing forms of complaints, orders, agreements, and other instruments required for the purposes of the said Act, and providing for the registration of certain agreements, and for their enforcement under the Destitute Persons Act, 1910, and generally for giving effect to the provisions of the said Act, and pursuant to the provisions of section twelve of the Acts Interpretation Act, 1924, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the regulations hereinafter set out, and doth hereby declare that this Order in Council shall come into operation at the same time as the said Act comes into operation.

REGULATIONS.

1. PRELIMINARY.

(1.) THESE regulations may be cited as the Child Welfare (Forms and Procedure) Regulations, 1926.

(2.) It shall be lawful for any person taking any proceedings, discharging any duty, or entering into any contract under the said Act to modify or depart from any of the forms hereby prescribed if he shall, in his discretion, deem it necessary or advisable so to do, and the validity of any document shall not be affected by reason only of the fact that it is not in the terms of a form hereby prescribed.

2. FORMS OF AGREEMENT.

(1.) An agreement made by the Superintendent with any person pursuant to section 12 of the said Act may be in the form marked C.W. 1 in the Schedule hereto.

(2.) An agreement made by the Superintendent with any person pursuant to section 20 of the said Act may, subject to the approval of the Minister, be in either of the forms marked C.W. 2 and C.W. 3 in the Schedule hereto that may be applicable.

3. GENERAL FORMS.

(1.) The complaint of any constable or Child Welfare Officer made under subsection (1) of section 13 of the said Act may be in the form marked C.W. 4 in the Schedule hereto.

(2.) A summons under subsection (1) of section 13 of the said Act addressed to any person having the custody of a child may be in the form marked C.W. 5 in the Schedule hereto.

(3.) A warrant for the apprehension of any person who has been summoned to appear and has failed to obey such summons may be in the form marked C.W. 6 in the Schedule hereto.

(4.) A warrant under subsection (2) of section 13 of the said Act authorizing any person named therein to receive and hold a child may be in the form marked C.W. 7 in the Schedule hereto.

(5.) An order for the committal of a child under subsection (4) of section 13 of the said Act may be in the form marked C.W. 8 in the Schedule hereto.

(6.) An order placing a child under the supervision of a Child Welfare Officer under subsection (4) of section 13 of the said Act may be in the form marked C.W. 9 in the Schedule hereto.

(7.) A constable making a complaint or application under section 13 of the said Act may advise a Child Welfare Officer of the subject-matter of the complaint or application in the form marked C.W. 10 in the Schedule hereto.

(8.) The authority of the Superintendent given to an Officer of the Child Welfare Branch to cancel any arrangement or agreement and to take possession of a child pursuant to subsection (2) of section 20 of the said Act may be in the form marked C.W. 11 in the Schedule hereto.

(9.) The discharge of an inmate by the Superintendent under the powers conferred by section 23 of the said Act may be effected by an instrument in the form marked C.W. 12 in the Schedule hereto.

4. EXTENSION OF PERIOD OF CONTROL.

(1.) An application by the Superintendent to a Magistrate under section 22 of the said Act may be made in the form marked C.W. 13 in the Schedule hereto.

(2.) An appointment by a Magistrate of the time and place for hearing such application may be in the form marked C.W. 14 in the Schedule hereto, which form shall be appended to the said form marked C.W. 13.

(3.) An assignment by a Magistrate of counsel to an inmate under section 22 of the said Act may be made in the form marked C.W. 15 in the said Schedule, and such assignment shall be signed by counsel so assigned, and it shall be the duty of the Superintendent or some person acting on his behalf to obtain such signature and to afford such counsel all reasonable means of ascertaining the full facts of the case.

(4.) Counsel so assigned shall be a barrister or solicitor of the Supreme Court, and in discharging his duties shall not only appear as advocate, but shall also carry out the usual work of a solicitor in making inquiries, interviewing witnesses, and taking all steps necessary or proper for the preparation of the case.

(5.) An order made by a Magistrate under subsection (3) of section 22 of the said Act may be in the form marked C.W. 16 in the said Schedule.

(6.) An order made by a Magistrate under subsection (4) of section 22 of the said Act may be in the form marked C.W. 17 in the said Schedule.

5. REGISTRATION OF AGREEMENTS.

(1.) A copy of an agreement to be registered in the office of a Magistrate's Court pursuant to section 44 of the said Act may be certified for that purpose by the endorsement thereon of a certificate signed by any two persons purporting to be officers of the Child Welfare Branch of the Department of Education and to the effect of the form marked C.W. 18 in the Schedule hereto.

(2.) Such certified copy may be delivered personally to the Clerk of any Magistrate's Court or forwarded to such Clerk by registered-post letter by the Superintendent of the Child Welfare Branch of the Department of Education or any person on his behalf.

(3.) Registration of such certified copy shall be effected by the entry of particulars thereof in the Criminal Record Book of the Court as of the day on which the same was received by the Clerk.

(4.) The following shall be the particulars to be so entered:—

(a.) As the entry of the prosecutor, shall be entered "A.B. as Foster-parent," "Minister of Education," or "Superintendent of the Child Welfare Branch of the Department of Education," according as the agreement is made pursuant to section 46 of the Infants Act, 1908, section 127 of the Education Act, 1914, or section 12 of the Child Welfare Act, 1925.

(b.) As the entry of the person charged, shall be entered the name or names of the person or persons liable for payment of moneys under the agreement.

(c.) As the entry relating to the offence or matter of complaint, shall be entered a description of the agreement, including its date, parties, name of child affected, and the Act and section of the Act pursuant to which the agreement is made.

(d.) As the entry relating to the decision in the matter, shall be entered the payments to be made under the agreement, including amounts, dates and place (if specified) of payment.

(5.) There shall be written under the entry a memorandum in the words "entered in pursuance of section 44 of the Child Welfare Act, 1925," and such memorandum shall be signed by a Magistrate.

9. A certificate in writing signed by the Superintendent setting forth that any amount stated therein is due and owing to the Superintendent by the parent hereunder shall be *prima facie* evidence that the said amount is so owing at the date of the said certificate.

10. This agreement shall enure so as to bind the executors and administrators of the parent, and the term "parent" wherever used herein shall include the executors and administrators of the parent where the context so requires or admits.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

HIS Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of that Dominion, and in pursuance of the authority to make regulations for the peace, order, and good government of Samoa conferred upon him by the Samoa Act, 1921, and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Treaties of Peace Act, 1919, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, doth hereby order as follows.

REGULATIONS.

1. THESE regulations may be cited as the New Zealand Reparation Estates Service Order, 1926, and shall come into force on the 1st day of May, 1926.

2. In these regulations "New Zealand Reparation Estates Service" means the service of His Majesty in respect of the New Zealand Reparation Estates, other than honorary service and service in New Zealand or elsewhere outside the Territory of Western Samoa.

3. The Minister of External Affairs may appoint to the New Zealand Reparation Estates Service such officers, clerks, and servants as he thinks necessary for the execution of the New Zealand Reparation Estates Order, 1920, and the administration of the New Zealand Reparation Estates, and may, in so far as he thinks fit, delegate to the Administrator of Western Samoa the power of making such appointments, and may at any time revoke such delegation. All persons so appointed shall hold office at the pleasure of the person who for the time being has the power of making such appointment.

4. (1.) The pay, allowances, control, discipline, and management of the New Zealand Reparation Estates Service shall be in accordance with such regulations as may from time to time be made by the Governor-General in Council in that behalf, and pending the making of any such regulations shall be in accordance with the Samoan Public Service Regulations as far as the same are applicable.

(2.) Subject to any such regulations, officers of the New Zealand Reparation Estates Service shall receive such pay and allowances as the Minister of External Affairs thinks fit, or, in the case of officers appointed by the Administrator, such pay and allowances as the Administrator thinks fit.

5. When an officer of the New Zealand Reparation Estates Service is absent from Western Samoa, or is suspended from his office, or is in the opinion of the Administrator incapable by reason of sickness or otherwise of performing the duties of his office, or when his office is vacant, the Administrator may appoint any other fit person to execute that office temporarily during such absence, suspension, incapacity, or vacancy.

6. (1.) The Administrator may, for misconduct or any other sufficient cause, suspend from the execution of his office any officer of the New Zealand Reparation Estates Service.

(2.) The Administrator shall forthwith report such suspension, together with the reason therefor, to the Minister, who may either continue or terminate such suspension.

(3.) If an officer while remaining so suspended is dismissed from or resigns his office, he shall not, unless the Minister otherwise directs, be entitled to receive any salary in respect of the period of his suspension.

7. An appointment to an office in the New Zealand Reparation Estates Service may be made to take effect at a future date, not being later than one month after the date of appointment, notwithstanding the fact that the office is not yet vacant at the date of the appointment.

8. Except as provided in any regulations which may from time to time govern the pay, allowances, control, discipline, and management of the New Zealand Reparation Estates Service, no officer of that service shall be entitled to any compensation by reason of any reduction of his salary or in consequence of his services being dispensed with.

9. Clause 8 of the New Zealand Reparation Estates Order, 1920, as amended by Order in Council of 4th day of October, 1921, is hereby revoked.

And whereas it has been mutually agreed between the Waimarino County Council and the Wanganui County Council that the amount of forty-seven pounds five shillings and threepence be paid annually by the Wanganui County Council to the Waimarino County Council as its duly proportionate part of the interest and other charges in respect of the loan:

And whereas written application has been made by the Waimarino County Council to direct accordingly:

Now, therefore, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred on me by section seventy-three of the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1913, do hereby direct that the Wanganui County Council shall in respect of the above-mentioned loan pay annually to the Waimarino County Council on the second day of February in each and every year during the currency of the said loan, the above-mentioned amount of forty-seven pounds five shillings and threepence as its duly proportionate part of the interest and other charges payable in respect of the said loan.

Open Season for Imported Game and Native Game, License Fees, &c., Opotiki Acclimatization District.

IN exercise of the powers vested in me by the Animals Protection and Game Act, 1921-22, I, Richard Francis Bollard, Minister of Internal Affairs of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby declare the period from the 1st day of June to the 31st day of July, 1926 (both days inclusive), to be an open season in the Opotiki Acclimatization District, as described in the Schedule hereto, except in the areas referred to in condition No. 3, for the taking or killing of the following imported game and native game—viz., cock pheasants, Californian quail, Australian quail, grey duck, black teal, and black swan; and the period from the 1st day of February to the 31st day of March, 1927 (both days inclusive), to be an open season in the said district for the taking or killing of the following native game—viz., godwits—subject to the following conditions.

CONDITIONS.

1. LICENSES to take or kill such imported game and native game, including godwits, within the said district will be issued to any person on payment of the sum of twenty shillings (20s.) each, and licenses to take or kill the following native game only—viz., godwits—will be issued to any person on payment of the sum of ten shillings (10s.) each, and the Secretary of the Opotiki Acclimatization Society, or any person authorized by such Secretary in that behalf, is hereby authorized to sign and issue the said licenses.

2. The number of such imported game and native game that may be taken or killed by any one person in any one day shall not exceed twelve cock pheasants and twenty-five head in all of grey duck, black teal, and black swan.

3. Nothing in any license to take or kill imported game and native game, including godwits, or the following native game only—viz., godwits—shall authorize the holder thereof to take or kill imported game and native game, including godwits, or godwits only, on lands actually and exclusively used by any registered acclimatization society for acclimatization purposes, or on any sanctuary or public domain.

4. No person shall kill or destroy any such imported game or native game, or shoot at or attempt to shoot at any such imported game or native game, with any automatic or auto-loading gun, unless it is converted into a gun capable of carrying two cartridges only, or with any rifle or pea-rifle, swivel-gun, punt-gun, or pump-gun, or shall use any gun other than a shoulder-gun; and no gun shall be used for the purpose aforesaid the bore of which is larger than the size known as No. 12 at the muzzle, nor shall any gun be used which exceeds 10 lb. in weight.

5. Shooting may begin not earlier than half an hour before sunrise and must cease not later than half an hour after sunset.

6. Any person committing a breach of any of these conditions is liable, on conviction, to a fine of £20.

Alterations to Scale of Charges in force upon the New Zealand Government Railways.

IN pursuance of all powers and authorities enabling me under the Government Railways Act, 1908, and its amendments, and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, I, Joseph Gordon Coates, Minister of Railways, do hereby make the following alterations in the scale of charges in force on the New Zealand Government Railways open for traffic made on the 10th day of August, 1925, and published in the *Gazette* of 11th August, 1925:—

PART II.—LUGGAGE, PARCELS, HORSES, ETC.

By adding to Regulation 13 the following:—

1A. The provisions of paragraph 1 of this regulation will also be applicable to such other cases as may be authorized by the Board of Management, New Zealand Government Railways, Wellington. In such cases where the literature is not for exchange the provisions of subparagraph (c) of paragraph 1 of this regulation will not be effective, but in every case the consignor should endorse on the consignment note that the parcel contains books, magazines, or papers only.

Additional Rules and Regulations under the Law Practitioners Act, 1908.

BY virtue of the powers vested in us by law, we, the undersigned Judges of the Supreme Court of New Zealand, do hereby make the following rules and regulations to come into force as from the making hereof, that is to say:—

I. Clause IV (1) as set out in Rule I of the regulations made on the 21st day of October, 1925, is hereby revoked.

11. Clause IV (1) of the rules and regulations made on the 24th day of April, 1907, is hereby re-enacted and shall be deemed to have continued in existence as if it had never been revoked.

III. Rule II, made on the 21st day of October, 1925, is hereby amended by adding thereto the following words:—

“A candidate who shall have forwarded to the Registrar of the University of New Zealand a certificate from a teacher in an affiliated institution of the said University that he has done work to the satisfaction of the teacher in the preparation of the instruments hereinbefore enumerated shall be credited with a pass in Conveyancing without further examination.”

Professional Examinations in Law.

BY virtue of the powers vested in us by law, we, the undersigned Judges of the Supreme Court of New Zealand, do make the following rules and regulations under the Law Practitioners Act, 1908, and its amendments, to come into force as hereinafter provided—that is to say:—

I. Candidates for the legal profession may be examined by the University.

II. (1.) No fees shall be required for such examination other than those prescribed by the Law Practitioners Act, 1908.

(2.) No fee paid for any examination, or section thereof, which the candidate may fail to pass, shall be available for any subsequent examination or section thereof, excepting as provided under clause II of the statute “University Fees.”

III. Certificates shall be issued to candidates specifying the examination in which they have passed.

IV. A candidate for admission as barrister who shall have passed the examinations prescribed in Regulations V, VII, and IX of these regulations shall be deemed to have passed the examinations in General Knowledge and in Law required to be passed by candidates for admission as barristers.

A candidate for admission as solicitor who shall have passed the examinations prescribed in Regulations V, VIII, and IX of these regulations shall be deemed to have passed the examinations in General Knowledge and in Law required to be passed by candidates for admission as solicitors.

V. (1.) Every candidate for admission as barrister or solicitor shall pass the Matriculation Examination in the University of New Zealand, passing in Latin as a subject. Any candidate for admission as barrister or solicitor who shall have passed the said Matriculation Examination without passing in Latin may be credited with a pass in Latin on passing in Latin at a subsequent Matriculation or other University Examination or on keeping terms in Latin at a University College.

(2.) A candidate for admission as barrister or solicitor who is or has been an Entrance Scholar or an unsuccessful candidate for an Entrance Scholarship in the University of New Zealand and who has been held by the University of New Zealand to have passed the Matriculation Examination of the said University shall be deemed to have fulfilled the requirements of clause (1) of this regulation, provided that he has passed in Latin or passes in Latin in accordance with the requirements of the said clause (1).

(3.) A candidate for admission as barrister or solicitor shall be deemed to have fulfilled the requirements of clause (1) of this regulation if he shall have passed the Matriculation or other Examination of any University or College the standard of which examination is, in the opinion of the Chancellor of the New Zealand University, as high as the standard required for Matriculation in the University of New Zealand, and if such candidate shall have passed in Latin as one of the subjects of such examination.

(4.) A candidate for admission as barrister or solicitor who has obtained provisional matriculation under the regulations of the University of New Zealand and has had his matriculation confirmed by the said University as from a date prior to the 1st day of January, 1926, shall be deemed to have passed the Matriculation Examination.

(5.) Except as provided in the preceding clauses of this regulation, all candidates for admission as barristers or solicitors shall obtain matriculation only by passing the Matriculation Examination of the University of New Zealand and the regulations of the said University relating to provisional matriculation shall not apply to such candidates.

VI. No candidate shall be permitted to present himself for examination in the subjects of Regulations VII, VIII, or IX of these regulations unless and until he has fulfilled the requirements of Regulation V.

VII. Every candidate for admission as barrister who has fulfilled the requirements of Regulation V of these regulations shall pass in the following subjects, defined as prescribed for the time being for the degree of Bachelor of Laws in the University of New Zealand, namely:—

DIVISION I.

1. Latin.
2. English or Philosophy.
3. Jurisprudence.
4. Constitutional History and Law.

DIVISION II.

1. Roman Law.
2. The Law of Property.
3. The Law of Contract.

DIVISION III.

1. The Law of Torts.
2. Criminal Law.
3. Company Law and the Law of Bankruptcy.
4. The Law of Trusts, Wills, Intestate Succession, and the Administration of the Estates of Deceased Persons.

DIVISION IV.

1. The Law of Evidence.
2. Practice and Procedure.
3. International Law.
4. Conflict of Laws.

VIII. Every candidate for admission as solicitor who has fulfilled the requirements of Regulation V of these regulations shall pass in the following subjects, defined as prescribed for the time being for the degree of Bachelor of Laws in the University of New Zealand, namely:—

DIVISION I.

1. One of the following (i) Latin, (ii) English, or (iii) Philosophy.
2. Jurisprudence.
3. Constitutional History and Law.

DIVISION II.

1. The Law of Property.
2. The Law of Contract.

DIVISION III.

1. The Law of Torts.
2. Criminal Law.
3. Company Law and the Law of Bankruptcy.
4. The Law of Trusts, Wills, Intestate Succession, and the Administration of the Estates of Deceased Persons.

DIVISION IV.

1. The Law of Evidence.
2. Practice and Procedure.
3. Conflict of Laws.

IX. Every candidate for admission as barrister or solicitor shall also pass in the following subjects:—

1. Conveyancing (as provided in Regulation XII of these regulations).
2. Book-keeping (elementary questions on Trust Accounts and Book-keeping).

X. (1.) A candidate for admission as barrister or solicitor who has already been credited by the University of New Zealand with a pass in one or more of the subjects in Regulations VII or VIII of these regulations in a degree course in the said University shall be exempt from examination in such subject or subjects, provided that, in the year in which he passed, the definition of such subject or subjects was substantially identical with the definition of such subject or subjects as prescribed in Regulations VII and VIII of these regulations.

(2.) A candidate for admission as barrister or solicitor who may have taken the degree of Bachelor of Laws in the University of New Zealand since the 1st June, 1890, shall not be required to pass any further examination.

XI. (1.) A candidate shall, subject as hereinafter provided, pass in all subjects of any division before presenting himself for examination in the subjects of any later division.

(2.) No candidate shall present himself for examination in more than four subjects at one time; provided that, in the case of a candidate who requires a pass in five subjects to complete his examinations, he shall be allowed to present himself for examination in such five subjects.

(3.) Except as hereinafter provided, no candidate shall be credited with having passed in fewer than two subjects at a time.

(4.) A candidate who requires to pass in a single subject to complete a division may present himself for examination either in that subject alone or in that subject together with

subjects from the next succeeding division (provided that he presents himself in not more than four subjects in all), and if he passes in such subject he shall be credited with a pass in that subject.

(5.) A candidate who requires to pass in more subjects than one to complete a division may take the subjects of such division in which he may not have passed together with one or more subjects of the next succeeding division (provided that he presents himself in not more than four subjects in all), but such subjects must include all the subjects of the previous division in which he has not already been credited with a pass.

(6.) A candidate who presents himself in all the subjects of a division containing fewer than four subjects shall not be allowed to present himself in any subject of a later division to make up four subjects.

(7.) For the purpose only of computing the number of subjects "Conveyancing" and "Book-keeping" shall not count as subjects. A candidate may present himself for examination in Conveyancing and Book-keeping notwithstanding that he is taking four other subjects at the same time, and may be credited with a pass in them or either of them, notwithstanding that he has not passed in any other subjects at the same examination.

XII. (1.) A candidate shall be credited with a pass in Conveyancing either—(a) if the Registrar of the University of New Zealand shall have received a certificate from a teacher in an affiliated institution of the said University that he has undergone a course of study in practical conveyancing, consisting of not less than twenty-five lectures, and that he has done work in the preparation of the prescribed class of instruments to the satisfaction of the teacher, and, further, that, in the opinion of the teacher, he is reasonably qualified to prepare such prescribed class of instruments; or (b) if the candidate shall have passed an examination in Conveyancing intended to test the candidate's knowledge of the theory and practice of those branches of conveyancing involved in and illustrated by the prescribed class of instruments.

The prescribed class of instruments shall be Agreements for Sale; Conditions of Sale; Conveyances and Transfers of Land and Interests therein; Assignments of Personality; Hire-purchase Agreements; Mortgages and Sub-mortgages; Leases; Agreements for Lease; Under-leases; Surrenders of Lease; Powers of Attorney; Bonds; Partnership Deeds; Wills and Settlements; Appointments of New Trustees. (Forms to be of a simple and usual character only.)

(2.) No candidate shall be allowed to present himself for the examination in Conveyancing until he has been credited with a pass in all the subjects of Division II of Regulations VII or VIII.

XIII. A candidate may present himself for examination in book-keeping at any examination before admission.

XIV. The schedule of New Zealand statutes drawn up for the time being for the guidance of candidates for the degree of Bachelor of Laws in the University of New Zealand shall be deemed to apply for the examinations for admission as barrister or solicitor.

XV. Every candidate for admission as a barrister or solicitor of the Supreme Court not previously admitted elsewhere shall give notice to the Registrar of the University of New Zealand, at the dates specified each year in the University Calendar, of his desire to be examined, and shall state the nature of the examination that he proposes to submit to, and shall at the same time pay to the Registrar of the University the proper fee in respect of such examination.

XVI. The examinations will be conducted by the University of New Zealand. The examinations shall be held annually, at the times fixed by the Chancellor of the University, at any centre at which there may be ten or more candidates for the examination then proceeding, or where, if not so many, the total payment in fees may be made up to twenty guineas. All candidates for legal examinations must conform to the rules and regulations of the University for the conduct of University examinations, as stated in the University Calendar, so far as they are consistent with these regulations.

XVII. (1.) A candidate for admission as barrister or solicitor who shall have taken a degree in Arts or Science in any University or College in any part of His Majesty's dominions which has or hereafter may have power by law to grant such a degree shall be exempted from examination in any subjects of examination for admission as barrister or solicitor in which he shall have passed for such degree. Those who shall have taken a degree in Law in such University or College shall be examined only in the Law of New Zealand so far as it differs from the Law of England.

(2.) Every candidate for admission as barrister or solicitor who claims to be entitled, as a graduate of any such University or College, to be exempted from examination in any

subject or subjects of examination prescribed for the admission of barristers or solicitors shall produce his diploma or some duly authenticated certificate or other documentary evidence of having taken a degree and of the subjects passed therein, with an affidavit verifying the same and proving his identity with the person mentioned in such document.

XVIII. (1.) The age of all candidates applying for admission must appear on affidavit supported by a certificate of birth or, if such certificate should not be available, by some supporting evidence to the satisfaction of the Judge.

(2.) Every candidate before being admitted shall produce evidence of his good character to the satisfaction of the Judge to whom he applies for admission.

(3.) Every candidate who is required to be examined in New Zealand before being admitted as barrister or solicitor must produce a certificate signed by the Registrar of the University of New Zealand, showing that he has passed all examinations prescribed for the degree of Bachelor of Laws, for admission as barrister, or for admission as solicitor, as the case may be. The fee payable to the University for such certificate, other than diploma, shall be one guinea.

(4.) Every candidate for admission as barrister or solicitor, who shall not have been previously admitted as a barrister or solicitor elsewhere, shall, not less than two months before the date on which he intends to apply for admission, give to the Registrar of the Supreme Court at the place where he intends to apply notice of such application.

Every such notice shall be in duplicate, and shall state the qualifications in respect of which the application is intended to be made.

Upon receipt of every such notice the Registrar to whom the same shall be given shall forthwith send one copy thereof to the Secretary of the District Law Society for the district within which such Registrar shall reside.

XIX. Solicitors on the roll who shall have passed the examinations prescribed in Regulations V, VIII, and IX of these regulations, and who shall apply to be admitted as barristers, shall pass the examinations in Latin, Roman Law, and International Law as prescribed for the degree of Bachelor of Laws; provided that a candidate who has already passed in Latin as aforesaid shall pass in either English or Philosophy as prescribed for the degree of Bachelor of Laws.

These subjects may be taken at one examination, or in sections of two subjects in the first and one subject in the second section.

XX. (1.) Every candidate for admission as a barrister or as a solicitor of the Supreme Court of New Zealand, who has been previously admitted as a barrister or solicitor of any Superior Court or Supreme Court in any part of His Majesty's dominions, and who shall not be entitled to admission without further examination, shall be examined only as to his knowledge of the Law of New Zealand so far as it differs from the Law of England, and such examination will be confined to the following statutes (with amendments):—

The Magistrates' Courts Act, 1908; the Justices of the Peace Act, 1908; the Judicature Act, 1908; procedure only under the Bankruptcy Act, 1908; the Mining Act, 1908, Part IX; the Evidence Act, 1908; the Land Transfer Act, 1915; the Property Law Act, 1908; the Administration Act, 1908; the Family Protection Act, 1908; the Deeds Registration Act, 1908; the Wages' Protection and Contractors' Liens Act, 1908; the Divorce and Matrimonial Causes Act, 1908; the Destitute Persons Act, 1910; the Mercantile Law Act, 1908, sections 1-20; the Partnership Act, 1908; the Chattels Transfer Act, 1924; the Crown Suits Act, 1908.

(2.) Every candidate desiring to be examined under this regulation shall give to the Registrar of the University of New Zealand two months' notice in writing of his desire to be so examined, and shall with such notice forward or pay to such Registrar a fee of £2 2s.

(3.) The examination of such candidate shall be conducted by examiners appointed for that purpose by the Senate of the University of New Zealand, and shall be held at such times and places as may be fixed by the Chancellor of the University with the approval of the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court.

(4.) No candidate who, having presented himself for such examination, shall have failed to pass, shall present himself again within six months from the date of the examination at which he has failed to pass, without the special permission of the Chancellor of the University.

(5.) Every such candidate shall, not less than two months before the date at which he intends to apply for admission as a barrister or as a solicitor of the Supreme Court of New Zealand, give to the Registrar of the Supreme Court, at the place where he intends to apply for such admission, a written notice in triplicate stating the qualifications in respect of which such application is intended to be made.

(6.) Upon receipt of every such notice the Registrar to whom the same shall be given shall forthwith send one copy

thereof to the Secretary of the District Law Society for the district within which such Registrar shall reside, and one copy to the Secretary of the New Zealand Law Society, Wellington.

(7.) Every such candidate for admission as barrister or solicitor who claims admission on the ground of some previous admission elsewhere must produce some certificate or other documentary evidence of such admission, purporting to emanate from proper authority, and must make an affidavit verifying the same and proving his identity with the person named in such certificate or document.

(8.) He must also produce a certificate from the Incorporated Law Society, or other Law Society or Inn of Court under whose jurisdiction he was before coming to New Zealand, to the effect that he has been duly admitted as a barrister or solicitor, as the case may be, that his name still appears as such on the roll, and that the books of such Society or Inn of Court do not contain anything to his discredit, and, further, stating the period (if any) during which he practised as a barrister or solicitor. He shall also produce evidence of his good character to the satisfaction of the Judge to whom he applies for admission.

XXI. The following rules shall apply to the applications for admission by barristers and solicitors who are entitled to be admitted without further examination under subsection (a) of section 4 and subsection (b) of section 15 of the Law Practitioners Act, 1908:—

(1.) Every such person shall, not less than two months before the date on which he intends to apply for admission, give to the Registrar of the Supreme Court at the place at which he intends to apply for admission a written notice in triplicate stating the qualifications in respect of which such application is intended to be made, and the city or town in the United Kingdom where he was last in practice.

(2.) Upon receipt of such notice the Registrar to whom the same shall have been given shall forthwith send one copy thereof to the Secretary of the District Law Society for the District within which such Registrar shall reside, and one copy to the Secretary of the New Zealand Law Society, Wellington.

(3.) Every such person must produce to the Judge to whom he shall make his application for admission, in addition to all documents hereinbefore required, some certificate or other document, duly authenticated, which will sufficiently prove that he has been in practice in some part of the United Kingdom for not less than three years as a barrister or solicitor, as the case may be.

(4.) He shall also make and file an affidavit that he is the person named in the said certificate or other document, and that he has been in practice as aforesaid, and shall in such affidavit state the city or town in which he was last in practice. If his qualification is that of a solicitor, he shall also state in such affidavit that he is still upon the rolls as such solicitor, and, if his qualification is that of a barrister, that he is still entitled to practise in the United Kingdom as a barrister. He shall also produce evidence of his good character to the satisfaction of the Judge to whom he applies for admission.

(5.) The fees to be paid by such person upon his admission as a barrister or as a solicitor, as the case may be, shall be the same fees as are payable upon the admission of barristers or solicitors previously admitted elsewhere who are not entitled to be admitted without further examination.

XXII. (1.) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of December, 1926, and, except as provided in clause (2) of this regulation, shall apply to all candidates for admission as barristers or solicitors.

(2.) With the exception of Regulation XII, which shall apply to all candidates for admission as barristers or solicitors, these regulations shall not apply to any candidate for admission—

- (a.) Who shall have matriculated in the University of New Zealand not later than the 1st day of July, 1926; or
- (b.) Who shall have passed the Matriculation Examination of the said University at any examination held prior to the 1st day of July, 1926; or
- (c.) Who prior to the 1st day of March, 1926, shall have been credited with a pass in not less than two subjects of the examination in law; or
- (d.) Who has obtained provisional matriculation under the Regulations of the University of New Zealand and has had his matriculation confirmed by the said University as from a date prior to the 1st day of January, 1926:

Provided that any such candidate as in (a), (b), (c), or (d) shall not later than the 31st day of December, 1930, complete all examinations necessary for admission as barrister or solicitor, as the case may be, under the regulations in existence prior to the coming into force of these regulations;

and provided further that every candidate who is required to pass in the Law of Property (Part I) shall pass in the Law of Property as in Division II of Regulations VII and VIII, and every candidate who is required to pass in the Law of Property (Part II) shall pass in subjects Nos. 3 and 4 of Division III of Regulations VII and VIII.

(3.) After the coming into force of these regulations candidates who are allowed under the preceding clause to complete their course under the regulations in existence prior to the coming into force of these regulations may at any time elect to become subject to these regulations, and, on so doing, shall be credited with the subjects with which they have been credited under the old regulations.

(4.) Any candidate who in accordance with the foregoing provisions is allowed to continue his course under the regulations in force prior to the coming into force of these regulations, and who fails to complete his course before the 1st day of January, 1931, shall complete his course under these regulations, but shall be credited with a pass in all the subjects in which he has been credited with a pass before the said 1st day of January, 1931.

XXIII. On the coming into force of these regulations all other regulations made prior to the 1st day of December, 1926, under the Law Practitioners Acts of 1882 and 1908 and any amendments thereof, with the exception of the regulations of the 22nd May, 1914, 31st August, 1914, 30th July, 1918, and 22nd December, 1923 (dealing with the audit of solicitors' trust accounts) shall be revoked, except so far as is necessary for the purposes of Regulation XXII of these regulations.
