Zealand, and includes also mutual associations as well as proprietary; but does not include any institution subject to the provisions of the Friendly Societies Act, 1909, and its amendments.

2. The general manager for New Zealand of every accident-insurance company shall upon request, and within such times as are hereinafter set out, furnish to the Statistician particulars in the form of the return set out in the Schedule hereto in accordance with any instructions that may accompany such

in the form of the return set out in the Schedule hereto in accordance with any instructions that may accompany such form or may from time to time be issued by the Statistician.

3. The general manager for New Zealand shall certify the particulars contained in such form of return as correct to the best of his knowledge and belief, and shall transmit such form of return by post or otherwise so as to reach the Statistician not later than the 30th day of June in each year.
