4. The head or antiers of any stag, or the venison or skins of any deer, taken or killed pursuant to this Warrant may be disposed of subject to the regulations made under the said Act by Order in Council dated the 1st day of February, 1924, and gazetted on the 7th day of the same month.

5. Any person who commits a breach of any of the provisions of these regulations is liable to a penalty not exceeding

SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF MARCH, 1926.

Anticyclonic pressure predominated during March, which proved a dry month over most of the Dominion. An excess of the average rainfall was only recorded in parts of the Wellington District and about Kawhia in the North Island, in the Nelson and Marlborough Districts and also at a few places in Westland in the South Island.

Some heavy and beneficial rains occurred about the 23rd, 27th, and 31st. On the 23rd the centre of a small but rather intense cyclone passed through Cook Strait, and this was followed by another on the 26th.

Westerly gales were experienced about Cook and Foveaux Straits on the 7th, 8th, and 9th, but generally there was little wind during the month

On the whole, conditions were mostly cool and fair. The rainfall during the latter part of the month relieved the situation for farmers in many parts of the country.

The total births registered for the urban areas amounted to 1,033, as against 1,099 in April—a decrease of 66. The deaths in May were 483—an increase of 26, as compared with the previous month. Of the total deaths males contributed 248, females 235. Sixty-five of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 13.46 per cent. of the whole number. Forty-six of these were under one year of age.

The equivalent annual rates per 1,000 of mean population for May, 1926, and five months ended May, 1926, were as follows. The infantile-mortality rate per 100 births for the same period is also given.
