IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him by the Apprentices Act, 1923, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby amend the regulations under the said Act dated the eighth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-four, in the manner set forth in the Schedule hereto.

(1.) Regulation 5 is hereby deleted, and the following regulation substituted therefor :—

“ 5. An appeal against the decision of an Apprenticeship Committee in any matter shall be in the form No. 3, and such appeal, together with five copies thereof, shall, within seven days of the notification of the decision of the Committee to the appellant, be forwarded to the District Registrar of Apprentices, who shall thereupon file such appeal, together with three copies thereof, with the Clerk of Awards for the district, and shall forward one copy thereof to the Secretary of the Apprenticeship Committee. (Section 6 (2)). ”

(2.) Regulation 6 is hereby deleted, and the following regulation substituted therefor :—

“ 6. (a.) If any or all of the parties to an appeal or affected by an appeal desire that the Court of Arbitration should hear evidence or argument on the subject, intimation in writing of such desire shall be given to the Clerk of Awards for the district, who shall set the matter down for hearing upon the list of business for the next sitting of the Court of Arbitration, and shall notify the parties concerned and the District Registrar of Apprentices of the fact and of the time and place of the hearing of the appeal. In any case where no such intimation is given, the Clerk of Awards shall forthwith forward the file relating to such appeal to the Court of Arbitration, which may make such order thereon as it shall think fit. The Clerk of Awards shall notify the parties concerned and the District Registrar of Apprentices of the decision of the Court of Arbitration in any appeal.

“ (b.) The Court of Arbitration may make such other rules as it may think fit respecting the procedure to be adopted with respect to any appeals, and may make such order pending the hearing of any appeal as it may think fit. (Sections 6 (2), 8 (5), 13 (3), and 15.) ”

(3.) Regulation 7 is hereby amended by deleting the word “ Court ” where it first appears, and substituting therefor the following words : “ Clerk of Awards for the district for the determination of the Court. The Secretary of the Committee or the Clerk of Awards, as the case may be, shall notify the parties concerned and the District Registrar of Apprentices of the time and place of the hearing of the application and of the determination of the Committee or the Court. ”

(4.) Regulation 12 is hereby deleted, and the following regulation substituted therefor :—

“ 12. An appeal against the refusal of the District Registrar of Apprentices to register a contract of apprenticeship or alteration thereof shall be in the form No. 5, and such appeal, together with four copies thereof, shall be forwarded to the District Registrar of Apprentices within seven days of the notification of the decision to the appellant, and the District Registrar of Apprentices shall forthwith file such appeal, together with three copies thereof and the proposed contract or alteration, with the Clerk of Awards for the district. (Section 8 (5).) ”

(5.) Regulation 16 is hereby deleted, and the following regulation substituted therefor:—

“ 16. An appeal against the decision of the District Registrar of Apprentices in any such matter shall be in the form No. 9, and such appeal, together with four copies thereof, shall be forwarded, within seven days of the notification to the appellant of such refusal, to the District Registrar of Apprentices, who shall thereupon file such appeal, together with three copies thereof, and the contract of apprenticeship with the Clerk of Awards for the district. (Section 13 (3).)”

(6.) Regulation 18 is hereby deleted, and the following regulation substituted therefor:—

“ 18. An appeal by an apprentice against his discharge shall be in the form No. 11, and such appeal, together with five copies thereof, shall be forwarded, within seven days of the receipt by him of the notification from the District Registrar of Apprentices of the endorsement of the filed copy of the contract of apprenticeship, to the District Registrar of Apprentices, who shall thereupon file such appeal, together with three copies thereof and the contract of apprenticeship, with the Clerk of Awards for the district, and shall forward one copy thereof to the employer. (Section 15.)”

(7.) The following new regulations 20, 21, and 22 are hereby inserted after regulation 19:—

“ 20. (a.) An application for an apprenticeship order for any industry and locality shall be in the form No. 13, and shall be forwarded to the District Registrar of Apprentices, together with four copies thereof, and four copies of the recommendation of the Apprenticeship Committee (if any) set up for the industry and locality concerned.

“ (b.) The District Registrar of Apprentices shall forthwith file the said application, together with three copies thereof and the recommendations of the Apprenticeship Committee, with the Clerk of Awards for the district.

“ (c.) If a hearing is desired the Clerk of Awards shall place the matter on the list of business for the next sitting of the Court of Arbitration in the district concerned, and shall give notice in writing of the date of the sitting of the Court of Arbitration to the Secretary of the Apprenticeship Committee (or, where there is no Apprenticeship Committee, to the Secretaries of the organizations (if any) of employers and workers concerned).

“ (d.) In any case where the recommendations of an Apprenticeship Committee are complete and a hearing is not desired by the parties, the Clerk of Awards shall forward the file relating to such application to the Court of Arbitration, with a request that an apprenticeship order be made without the formality of a hearing. (Section 5.)

“ 21. (a.) An application to amend an apprenticeship order shall be in the form No. 14, and shall be forwarded to the District Registrar of Apprentices, together with as many copies thereof and of the apprenticeship order as the District Registrar of Apprentices may require.

“ (b.) The District Registrar of Apprentices shall forthwith file the said application, together with the copies thereof and of the apprenticeship order, with the Clerk of Awards for the district.

“ (c.) Notice of such application shall be served by the Clerk of Awards on the Secretary of the Apprenticeship Committee (if any) set up for the industry and locality concerned.

“ (d.) If a hearing is desired the Clerk of Awards shall place the matter on the list of business for the next sitting of the Court of Arbitration in the district concerned, and shall give notice in writing of the date of the sitting of the Court of Arbitration to the Secretary of the Apprenticeship Committee, or, where there is no Apprenticeship Committee, to the secretaries of the organizations of employers and workers concerned.

“ (e.) In any case where the proposed amendment is agreed on by an Apprenticeship Committee and a hearing by the Court of Arbitration is not required, the Clerk of Awards shall forward the file relating to such application to the Court of Arbitration, with a request that an amendment be made without the formality of a hearing. (Section 5.)

“ 22. (1.) Every employer employing apprentices to whom the Act applies shall keep in a Wages and Time Book, in a form approved by

the District Registrar of Apprentices, a record in English showing in the case of each apprentice—

- “(a.) The name and age of the apprentice, and date of commencement of apprenticeship ;
- “(b.) The industry or branch thereof to which he is apprenticed ;
- “(c.) The hours of his employment on each day ;
- “(d.) The wages paid on each pay-day and the date thereof ;
- “(e.) Such other information as the District Registrar of Apprentices may require.

“(2.) The Wages and Time Book in use for the time being and any such book used since the date of the commencement of the apprenticeship of the apprentice shall at all times be open to the inspection of the District Registrar of Apprentices.

“(3.) The District Registrar of Apprentices may at any time require the employer to verify the entries in the Wages and Time Book in such manner as the District Registrar may think fit.”

WHEREAS it is enacted by section two hundred and twenty-six of the Harbours Act, 1923 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), that a Harbour Board may from time to time, by by-laws made under the said Act, provide, among other things, for the safe navigation of any navigable river within its jurisdiction, and regulate all matters relating to the protection of life and property in or on vessels using any such river :

And whereas it is enacted by section nine of the said Act that in harbours where there is no Harbour Board the Governor-General in Council shall have all the powers, functions, duties, and authorities by the said Act conferred upon Harbour Boards, and may exercise the same in accordance with the said Act, under regulations to be made by Order in Council gazetted :

And whereas it is desirable to make regulations providing for the safe navigation of vessels through the Northern Wairoa Bridge, on the Wairoa River, Kaipara Harbour :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. No vessel exceeding 250 ft. in length shall pass through the bridge.
2. No vessel exceeding 200 ft. in length shall pass through the bridge without the assistance of a towing-vessel.
3. No vessel exceeding 125 ft. in length shall pass through the bridge, except at high-water slack.
4. All vessels shall reduce speed when nearing the bridge and go slow when passing through.
5. All pontoons or barges carrying cargo which will not float shall be towed through the bridge singly.
6. No vessel shall tow more than two pontoons or barges at one time through the bridge.
7. All towing-vessels shall use a short tow-line when passing through the bridge in order to prevent the towed vessel from sheering.
8. All yards of vessels shall be braced up sharp, and all derricks, boats, and light-screens must be swung inboard, and any movable projection on a vessel's side shall be removed.
9. No vessel of any description, timber, raft of timber, or any article shall be tied up to the bridge structure or to the fender piles.
10. No vessel shall attempt to pass under or through any part of the bridge during a thick fog.
11. No raft of timber passing through the bridge shall exceed 120 ft. in length and 25 ft. in breadth.
12. Any persons in charge of any vessel, timber, or raft of timber, coming into contact with any part of the bridge or fender piles and losing any cargo or timber which will not float, shall immediately report such occurrence to the Harbour-master, and shall take adequate measures to search for and remove such material, and shall be liable for any consequent damage to the bridge or fender piles, and for the cost of searching for and removing such material.
13. The owner, master, or person in charge of any vessel damaging the bridge structure, including the fender piles, or causing the same to be damaged, shall be responsible for the damage done.
14. All vessels under 40 ft. in length which do not use a derrick and having a mast, the top of which is more than 12 ft. in height above the water-line at light-draft, shall have the mast lowered down when passing through the bridge.
15. The master of any vessel who requires the bridge-passage to be opened at a given time, to enable his vessel to pass through, shall, at least two hours prior to such time, give notice to that effect to the person in charge of the bridge.
16. Any person committing a breach of these regulations shall be liable to a fine of £20.

Vesting the Control of a Scenic Reserve in the Mount Balloon Hut Scenic Board.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by section thirteen of the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand doth hereby vest the control of the reserve described in the Schedule hereto (being land reserved under the said Act), for the period of five years from the date hereof (unless previously altered or revoked under the said Act) in the undermentioned persons, namely:—

2. The members of the Board shall at their first meeting, and thereafter at the annual meeting hereinafter mentioned, elect one of themselves to be Chairman, who may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote. The Chairman shall hold office until the election of his successor.

3. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman, provided that two days' notice of such meeting is given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting; and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.

4. Any four members of the Board shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.

5. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at the meeting.

6. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose one of their number to be Chairman for such meeting.

7. If, by resignation, death, incapacity, or otherwise, the seat of any member shall be or become vacant, or if any member absents himself, without reasonable cause, from three consecutive meetings of the Board, the Governor-General shall have power to appoint any other person to be a member of the Board in his stead.

8. The Board shall prepare and submit at an annual meeting to be held in the month of April in each year a report of the proceedings of the Board for the previous year ending on the thirty-first day of March, together with a statement of the receipts and expenditure of the Board for such year. A copy of every such report and statement, certified by the Chairman to be correct, shall be sent to the Minister in Charge of Scenery Preservation as soon as possible after each annual meeting.

9. The Board shall control the said reserve in accordance with the provisions of the said Act and of the regulations made thereunder.

The total births registered for the urban areas amounted to 1,086, as against 1,030 in June—an increase of 56. The deaths in July were 806—an increase of 278 as compared with the previous month.
