W HEREAS by section five of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1909, it is provided that in the case of any and taken, purchased, or acquired for a Government work, and not required for that purpose, the Governor may, on recommendation by the Minister, by Proclamation, declare such land to be Crown land subject to the Land Act, 1924, and thereupon the land may be administered and disposed

of under that Act accordingly:

pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him by the Kauri-gum Control Act, 1925 (hereinafter referred to as the said Act), and in pursuance and exercise of every other power enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the regulations hereinafter set forth, and declare that the said regulations shall take effect on the day of the publication thereof in the Gazette.

REGULATIONS.

1. (1.) THESE regulations may be cited as "The Kauri-gum

Control Regulations, 1926."

(2.) In these regulations, where not inconsistent with the

"The Board" means the Kauri-gum Control Board:
"The Minister" means the Minister of Lands:
"Producers" means the holders of ordinary licenses or

special licenses for the time being in force under the Kauri-gum Industry Act, 1908: "Producers' representatives" mean

roducers' representatives" means the persons appointed as members of the Board by the Governor-General as representatives of producers on election in manner as hereinafter provided.

2. For the purposes of the election of producers' representa-tives as members of the Board there shall be appointed from time to time one or more Returning Officers, who shall make

all arrangements necessary in connection therewith.

3. (1.) For the purpose of such election the Minister shall direct the preparation of separate rolls of such producers in each of the two subdivisions of kauri-gum districts described in the First Schedule hereto (hereinafter referred to as "electoral districts") as have been operating under renewed ordinary or renewed special licenses or under ordinary or special licenses that have been in force within each electoral district for a period of not less than three months pairs to the data for a period of not less than three months prior to the date fixed for the election.

(2.) Such rolls shall be compiled from the registers of such licenses kept by Commissioners of Crown Lands pursuant to section 13 of the Kauri-gum Industry Act, 1908, and shall be closed at 4 o'clock on the fourteenth day next before the day on which any election is to be held, and shall continue to be

closed until the election is completed.

4. (1.) Elections of producers' representatives as members of the Board shall close at four o'clock in the afternoon on such day as may be fixed in that behalf from time to time by the Minister.

(2.) Not earlier than four months nor later than three months before the date fixed for an election or the date of a vacancy by effluxion of time in the office of a producers' representative as a member of the Board the Returning Officer shall, by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating

shall, by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in the electoral district, publicly notify—

(a.) The day and hour for the closing of nominations:
(b.) The number of candidates to be elected:
(c.) The day and hour for the closing of the election.

5. No person shall be eligible as a candidate for election as a producers' representative unless he is nominated in writing by at least two producers entitled to vote in terms of these regulations, and unless the nomination-paper, bearing the candidate's consent, is received by the Returning Officer the candidate's consent, is received by the Returning Officer before the nominations are closed.

6. (1.) A producer shall not be entitled to nominate candidates in an electoral district in which he is not entitled to

(2.) No person may accept nomination as a candidate for lore than one electoral district.

7. If the nomination-paper does not bear the written consent of the candidate nominated such consent may be given by him to the Returning Officer before the nominations are closed, and every nomination-paper shall be void in so far as concerns any candidate whose written consent is not duly given as aforesaid.

8. The form of nomination may be in the Form No. 1 in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the effect thereof.

9. Every nomination-paper shall be accompanied by a deposit of £5, which shall be retained by the Returning Officer until after the official declaration of the poll. If the total number of votes received by any unsuccessful candidate is

less than one-fourth of the total number of votes received by the successful candidate, the deposit shall be forfeited and paid into the Board's account established under section 21 the Kauri-gum Control Act, 1925, but otherwise it shall be returned to the person who paid it.

10. Nominations shall close at 4 o'clock on the fortieth day

before the day fixed for the election.

11. If only one nomination is received in respect of an electoral district, the Returning Officer shall forthwith declare electoral district, the Returning Officer shall forthwith declare the candidate so nominated to be duly elected, and shall by advertisement in the Gazette notify the name of the person elected, and shall notify to the Minister the name of the person elected. In all other cases he shall as soon as the nominations are closed prepare and post to each elector at his address as appearing on the roll a printed voting-paper containing in alphabetical order of surnames a list of all the duly nominated candidates for whom such elector is entitled to vote, and such voting-paper shall bear the number of the voter on the roll and be in the Form No. 2 in the Second Schedule hereto

Schedule hereto.

12. Each voter shall indicate his vote by drawing a line through the names of all the candidates for whom he does not through the names of all the candidates for whom he does not desire to vote, and shall then sign the voting-paper on the back thereof and post or deliver the same to the Returning Officer in a closed and stamped envelope bearing on the outside the word "Voting-paper." Where a voter is unable to read or write he may sign the voting-paper by affixing his mark in the presence of a Justice of the Peace or of a Postmaster, and a voting-paper with such signature witnessed accordingly shall be deemed to be valid.

13. The voting-paper (whether delivered or posted to the Returning Officer) must be received by him not later than 4 o'clock in the afternoon of the day fixed for the closing of the election at such address as may be fixed and notified by

14. A voting-paper shall be informal in any of the following

(a.) If it is not duly signed by the voter:
(b.) If more than one candidate's name is left uncancelled: (c.) If the voter votes more than once at the same election:

(d.) If it does not reach the Returning Officer before the

time fixed for closing of the poll.

15. Each candidate may by writing under his hand appoint one scrutineer who may be present at the examination of voting-papers, and the counting of the votes by the Returning

16. Each Returning Officer, his assistants and scrutineers, shall, before entering upon their duties as such, make and sign the declaration set forth in the Form No. 3 of the Second Schedule hereto.

17. On the day after the day of the poll the Returning Officer shall cause to be opened and examined all voting-papers duly delivered to him or received by him through the papers duly delivered to him or received by him through the post as aforesaid, and, after rejecting all informal voting-papers, shall ascertain and announce the candidate for the electoral district who has received the greatest number of votes, and shall by advertisement in the Gazette notify the names of the persons elected, the number of valid votes rejected for each candidate, the total number of votes rejected as informal, and shall notify to the Minister the names of the persons elected.

18. If by reason of an equality of votes given for two or more candidates the election is not complete, the Returning Officer shall complete the election by lot in such manner as

19. The Returning Officer shall, immediately after counting the votes, seal up all voting-papers and transmit the same to the Clerk of the nearest Magistrate's Court, who shall keep the the clerk of the hearest Magnetrate's Court, who shall keep the same for six months thereafter, and shall not open such packet or permit the same to be opened except on the order of some Court of competent jurisdiction, and shall at the end of six months effectually destroy the same.

20. If any dispute or question arises touching the regularity or validity of any election held hereunder, such dispute or question may be determined by a Stipendiary Magistrate in the manner provided by sections 58 to 67 of the Local Elections and Polls Act, 1925, all the provisions of which shall, with the necessary modifications, apply.

21. No producers' representative on the Board shall, during his term of office, enter into business as a buyer or exporter of kauri-gum or acquire any interest in such business. A breach of this rule by such a representative shall be deemed to be a ground for his removal from office under the power given by subsection (5) of section 3 of the said Act.

22. (1.) There shall be paid by way of levy on all kauri-gum exported from New Zealand on and after such date as may hereafter be fixed by Order in Council (whether such kauri-gum is subject to the control of the Board or not) such charges as may be fixed by the Board not exceeding 1½ per centum of the value of the gum so exported.

(2.) For the purposes of this regulation, the value of any kauri-gum exported shall be taken to be the value at which gum of like description and quality is sold for export free on board in the ordinary course of business at the time the said gum is placed on board the exporting vessel. Such value is hereinafter in these regulations referred to as "the current f.o.b. export value."

(3.) The exporter shall on the entry required under section 69 of the Customs Act, 1913, for any kauri-gum exported and in addition to any other particulars therein required, and in addition to any other particulars therein required, state (a) the current f.o.b. export value of such gum, and (b) the amount of levy payable under these regulations, and shall verify the particulars hereby prescribed by declaration in like manner as the other particulars on the said entry; and shall at the time of delivering such entry to the Collector

and shall at the time of delivering such entry to the Collector of Customs pay to the Collector the amount of such levy.

(4.) If the Collector of Customs has reason to believe or suspect that the value of any kauri-gum exported stated on the entry as aforesaid is less than the current f.o.b. export value thereof, he may value the gum at such higher sum as he thinks proper and his decision shall be final, and the leave shall be payable accordingly except as beginning the same as the control of th shall be payable accordingly, except as hereinafter

(5.) (a) From any valuation made by the Collector of Customs under this regulation, the exporter may, if he thinks

fit, appeal to the Board.

(b.) Such right of appeal shall be exercised by the exporter by giving to the Collector within fourteen days after the assessment or within such further time as the Collector may allow notice in writing that he appeals to the Board, and by depositing with the Collector the sum of £5 to be dealt

with as hereinafter provided.

(c.) On any such appeal the Board shall, after giving a reasonable opportunity to the appellant to be heard, determine the current f.o.b. export value of the gum for the purposes of the levy, and the Board's decision shall be final.

(d.) On any such appeal the burden of proving the current f.o.b. export value of the sum shall be upon the appellant.

(e.) If any such appeal is unsuccessful the said sum of £5 deposited as aforesaid, or any part thereof, may, in the discretion of the Board, be ordered to be retained by the Collector, on account of the expenses incurred by the Collector in the appeal, and any part of the said sum not ordered to be so retained shall be repaid to the appellant.

(6.) If any person makes any false statement on any entry with respect to the value or quality of any kauri-gum exported or proposed to be exported, or if by any act or omission he evades, or attempts to evade, or assists any person to evade payment of the full amount of the levy payable on any kauri-gum exported, he shall be deemed to payable on any kauri-gum exported, he shall be deemed to have committed a breach of these regulations, and shall be liable to a fine not exceeding £5.

23. On moneys received in respect of levy collected hereunder the proportion deductible in respect of the services of the Collectors and other officers of the Department of Customs

shall be 1 per centum

24. The travelling-allowances, fees, or other remuneration that may be paid to members of the Board shall be such as are from time to time determined by resolution of the Board, but shall not exceed the following rates:—

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Public Works Amendment Act, 1908, the Public Works Amendment Act, 1911, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the Orders in Council dated the twenty-ninth day of April, one thousand nine hundred

and thirteen, and the ninth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and twenty, authorizing the Mangaweka Town Board to use water from the Mangawharariki Stream for the purpose of generating electricity and to erect electric lines in the Town District of Mangaweka, and doth—subject to the conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto, and to the regulations made under section two of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1911, and dated the ninth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-two, published in the New Zealand Gazette of the twelfth day of the same month, or any regulations hereafter made in amendment thereof or in substitution therefor (and hereinafter collectively referred to as "the regulations") and which regulations shall be deemed to be incorporated herein—hereby grant to the Mangaweka Town Board (hereinafter with its successors and assigns referred to as "the licensee") a license to take and use from the Mangawharariki Stream (hereinafter referred to as "the said stream") in the Wellington Land Dustrict, for the purposes hereinafter set forth, a stream of water (hereinafter set of the call was a "the said stream") not according twenty to as "the said stream") in the Wellington Land Dustrict, for the purposes hereinafter set forth, a stream of water (hereinafter referred to as "the said water") not exceeding twenty-seven cubic feet per second at any one time; and also to erect and maintain electric lines for power, lighting, heating, or other uses within the area of supply hereinafter described, together with electric lines from the power-house to the area of supply along the route shown on the plan marked P.W.D. 30900 hereinafter referred to; and the works and lines already erected in the said area of supply (being indicated on the plans marked P.W.D. 30900 and P.W.D. 65149, and deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works, in the Wellington Land District) shall be deemed to be erected under this license, and the provisions hereof shall apply as fully and effectively as if this were the license originally issued; but nothing herein shall be held to guarantee that the said stream contains sufficient water to supply twenty-seven cubic feet per second hereinbefore mentioned. twenty-seven cubic feet per second hereinbefore mentioned.

SCHEDULE.

CONDITIONS.

1. Plans.

The licensee shall, before the works hereby authorized are commenced, forward for the approval of the Minister of Public Works (hereinafter referred to as "the Minister")—

(a.) Full detailed dayings and specifications of the divert-

ing weir and dam.

(b.) Drawings showing how and in what manner the water diverted is to be returned to the said stream.

(c.) Contour-plan showing difference in level of water due to the construction of the headworks.

2. Utilization of Water.

The said water shall be used solely for the purpose of generating electricity, for water-supply works, for the supply of electric light and power, and for the purposes of a sewage system within the Town District of Mangaweka.

3. Location of Headworks, &c.

The said water shall be taken from the said stream at the headworks, situated about 15 chains up the said stream from its junction with the Rangitikei River, at a point indicated on the plan marked P.W.D. 30900, deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works at Wellington.

office of the Minister of Public Works at Wellington. From the said headworks the water shall be conducted by a fluming along the left bank of the said stream to the power-house, situated at a point about 1 chain distant from the junction of that stream and the Rangitikei River, the positions of the said fluming and power-house being more particularly delineated on the plan referred to in the last preceding clause hereof. All water taken from the said stream by the licensee in pursuance of this license shall be returned thereto at the power-house.

4. General Description of Works.

The licensee is hereby authorized to construct, maintain, and use the following works for the purposes of this license, the position of the said works being indicated on the plans marked P.W.D. 30900 and P.W.D. 65149 hereinbefore referred to:

(a.) Headworks consisting of a main dam, together with a subsidiary dam to act as a water-cushion and

necessary intake.

(b.) Fluming leading from such main dam to the power-house hereinafter referred to. (c.) A power-house with all necessary equipment, includpower-nouse with an necessary equalment, induc-ing water-turbines, generators, transformers, light-ning-arresters, switchboards, switches, exciters, and other appliances for generating electricity. Such equipment shall be suitable for and capable of generating electrical energy equal to 80-horse power.

- (d.) Transmission and other lines over the routes dotted green on the said plan P.W.D. 30900, or shown by green and black lines on the said plan P.W.D. 65149.
- (e.) Such further transmission and other lines within the area of supply as may from time to time be required within such area of supply, and after compliance with the provisions of clause 13 of the regulations.

5. Right to enter Lands, &c.

The licensee shall have the right at any time or times during the continuance of this license, with the consent of the Minister, to enter upon any road or other land, whether vested in or occupied by the Crown or any other person or body corporate, and there to construct, erect, lay down, maintain, renew, or repair all such transmission-lines, poles, or other things as are required for the transmission of electricity between the generating-stations and any of the substations to which this license

6. Power to take Land.

The licensee is hereby empowered to take, under the Public Works Act, 1908, as for a public work, such land as may, in the opinion of the Governor-General, be necessary to enable the licensee to construct and maintain the various works authorized by this license.

7. Duration of License.

This license shall, unless sooner determined in accordance with the provisions hereinafter expressed, continue in force for a period of twenty-nine years commencing on the 1st January, 1926. Upon the expiry of the said term, or upon the sooner determination of this license by revocation or otherwise, all rights hereby granted to the licensee shall thereupon cease and determine, but such expiration or de-termination shall not relieve the licensee of any liability theretofore incurred under this license.

8. Granting of other Water-rights.

Nothing herein shall prevent the Governor-General in Council from granting to any person or body corporate other than the licensee a license to take water from any portion of the said stream, except at the place where the licensee is by this license empowered to take it: Provided that no such license shall so operate as to reduce the natural fall between the headworks and tail-water, or the volume of the water which the licensee is by this license authorized to take from the said stream.

9. Surrender of License.

The licensee may at any time, with the consent of the Minister, surrender this license, and shall thereupon, if so required by the Minister, remove from the ground all removable equipment, machinery, buildings, poles, transmission-lines, and other plant herein authorized to be installed or provided. If the licensee fails or neglects so to remove the said plant within twelve months after being required so to do, such equipment, machinery, buildings, poles, lines, and other plant shall, without payment or compensation, yest in other plant shall, without payment or compensation, vest in and become the property of the Crown.

10. Charges for Electrical Energy.

The charges for electrical energy for lighting purposes, which shall include the operation of motor-generators for lighting purposes, shall not exceed 1s. 4d. per unit. The charge for electrical energy for motor-power, heating, or cooking purposes shall not exceed 8d. per unit. In both the above cases the charges shall be subject to a discount of 25 per cent. if accounts are paid by consumers within fourteen days from the date of the licensee's rendering such accounts.

A minimum charge of 4s. per month including meter rent (if any) may be collected if required by the licensee, and shall be printed on the licensee's conditions of supply.

11. Area of Supply.

The area of supply comprises the Town District of Mangaweka as at present constituted.

12. System of Supply.

The system of supply shall be as described in paragraphs (e) and (c) of clause 2 of the regulations.

The generating voltage shall be approximately 2,400 volts

between phases.

The transmission and primary distribution voltage shall be approximately 2,300 volts between phases. The secondary distribution voltage shall be approximately 400 volts between phases and 230 volts between any phase and neutral.

13. Bed of Stream not leased.

Nothing herein shall be held to constitute a lease from the Crown of the bed of the said stream, nor shall the provisions of Part IX of the Property Law Act, 1908, apply to this

14. Alteration of License.

The terms and conditions of this license may at any time or from time to time, at the request or with the consent in writing of the licensee, be altered by the Governor-General by Order in Council.

15. Purchase of Electrical Energy.

Notwithstanding anything contained in this license or in the licenses hereby revoked, the licensee is hereby authorized to use electrical energy purchased from the Wanganui-Rangitikei Electric-power Board in lieu of or in addition to the electrical energy generated by the licensee's hydro-electric

16. Alterations to Works.

In the event of the licensee at any time desiring to make alterations to the work involving a departure from the type of construction shown on the approved plans it shall submit for the Minister's approval plans showing such type of construction as it is proposed to adopt, and with such approval the alterations may be carried out.

17. Inspection of Works.

The Inspecting Engineer, both during and after the construction of the works, shall have free access to and liberty at any time to inspect the same so as to ensure that the provisions of this license are given due effect to.

18. Rental.

The licensee shall, in respect of its license, pay to the Receiver of Land Revenue at Wellington, or otherwise as the Minister may from time to time require, a fee of one peppercorn per annum if demanded.

19. Contract between Licensee and Crown,

This license shall be deemed to constitute a contract as between the licensee and His Majesty the King, and may be enforced as a contract by and against His said Majesty or the licensee accordingly.

20. Requirements of the Rangitikei County Council.

Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, the licensee shall not be entitled to erect, maintain, or use any electric lines within the Rangitikei County, except subject to electric lines within the Kangitikei County, except subject to such conditions (not inconsistent with the provisions of this license and the regulations relating thereto or any variation of this license or the regulations, or new regulations which may take the place of these regulations) as may from time to time be agreed upon between the licensee and the Rangitikei County Council County Council.

21. Location of Overhead Lines.

Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, one side of every road or street shall be left free by the licensee for telegraph-lines. Lines shall not be erected on both sides of a road or street unless the permission of the Minister of Telegraphs or the Post and Telegraph Department is first obtained in accordance with clause 5 of the regulations. Except at crossing-places, the minimum separation between a telephone-line and poles carrying high or extra-high tension circuits shall be equal to the height of the taller pole.

22. Conversion of Lines from Earth-working to Metallic.

Notwithstanding anything herein contained, the licensee shall bear the cost of converting the Railway or Post and Telegraph Department's lines which are now erected from earth-working to metallic if such conversion is required by the Minister of Railways or the Minister of Telegraphs owing to electrical interference arising from the licensee's lines.

23. Telegraph-lines.

The licensee shall rectify to the satisfaction of the Minister of Railways or the Minister of Telegraphs any interference or disturbance caused by the erection or operation of the licensee's system that affects the satisfactory working of the telegraph-lines which are the property of the Railway Department or the Telegraph Department, and which were erected prior to the licensee's lines.

24. Existing Water-rights.

Nothwithstanding anything in this license, all the rights acquired by the licensee in respect to the use of water for the purpose of generating electrical energy under the Order in Council dated the 29th day of April, 1913, shall continue in force as if such Order in Council had not been revoked.

REGULATIONS.

1. No person shall use a Danish-seine net or a purse-seine net of any description whatever for taking fish within any of the areas more particularly described in the First Schedule hereto.

2. During the period from midnight of the fifteenth day of November in any year until midnight of the thirty-first day of January following no person shall use a trawl net, Danish-seine net, purseline net, seine net, purse-seine net, or any other net of whatsoever description for taking fish within the area more particularly described in the Second Schedule hereto:

Provided that this regulation shall not apply to set nets, used in taking flounders or soles only within the said area.

3. It shall be unlawful to use or convey a Danish-seine net or a purse-seine net of any description whatever on any vessel while such vessel is engaged in trawling.

4. The mesh in the last six yards of the cod-end of every Danish-seine net shall measure, when prepared for use, not less than four and a half inches.

5. Any person committing a breach of any of the above

5. Any person committing a breach of any of the above regulations is liable to a fine of fifty pounds.

3. All His Majesty's subjects shall at all reasonable times and upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the above-mentioned wharf, and rights of ingress and egress thereto and therefrom.

4. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all officers on the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have ingress, passage, and egress into, over, and out of the said wharf without payment.

5. The Council shall maintain and keep the above-mentioned wharf and all erections on or in connection with the wharf in good order and repair; and shall at all times exhibit therefrom, and maintain at the Council's own cost, suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels; provided that no new light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved by the Minister. approved by the Minister.

6. All dues and rates received on account of the said wharf by the Council shall be applied to keeping the said wharf and all erections on or in connection with such wharf in good

order and repair.

7. Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reason-7. Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said wharf and any buildings erected on the wharf or in connection therewith, and view the state of repair thereof; and upon his leaving at or posting to the last known address of the Council a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf or buildings, requiring the Council, within a reasonable time, to be therein preserribed to make good or repair the same the Council. prescribed, to make good or repair the same, the Council shall, with all convenient speed, cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

8. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharf shall be taken away by the Council and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Ministr for that purpose.

9. The Council shall not erect, or suffer to be erected, on the said wharf any building or structure whatever, except with the consent of the Minister.

10. The Council shall keep a separate account of the receipts and expenditure on account of such wharf and premises, and shall cause such account to be balanced to the thirty-first day of March in every year, and shall send a copy of such account when balanced to the Minister, and shall supply any particulars in reference thereto as may be required by the

Minister.

11. The Council shall appoint all officers necessary for the working and management of the wharf.

12. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the Council to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1923, or its amendments, or any regulation thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

13. The rights, powers, and privileges hereby conferred shall continue in force for fourteen years, computed from the 15th day of March, 1919, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the Council shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege withcharge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

14. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred under or by virtue of this Order in Council may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the Council three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last

16. In case the Council shall—

thirty consecutive days,—
then, and in either of the said cases this Order in Council, and every license, right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any notice to the Council or other proceeding whatsoever; and the publication in the New Zealand Gazette of an Order in Council contribution and containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the Council, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby

Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

17. In the event of this Order in Council being revoked for any reason whatsoever, or upon the expiry of the period for which the license is granted, the Council shall, if required by the Minister so to do, remove the said wharf entirely from the site, and restore the site to its original condition within three months from the date of revocation or expiry, as the case may be; and, if the Council fails so to do, the Minister may cause the said wharf to be removed and the site so restored, and may recover the costs incurred by the said removal and restoration from the Council.

For the purposes of this section the term 'recognized certificate' means a certificate, diploma, degree, or license granted by some university, college, or other public institution (whether in New Zealand or elsewhere), and which is recognized by the Board as furnishing sufficient evidence of the possession of the requisite knowledge and skill for the efficient practice of the profession of engineering."
