Crown Land set apart as a Permanent State Forest.

A PROCLAMATION.

BY virtue and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by section eighteen of the Forests Act, 1921-22, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby set apart the Crown land described in the Schedule hereto as a permanent State forest.

SCHEDULE.

AUCKLAND LAND DISTRICT.—ROTORUA FOREST-CONSERVATION REGION.

State Forest No. 77.—Extension of Kaingaroa Plantation.

ALL that area of land in the Auckland Land District, being part of Run No. 57, situated in Blocks XI, XII, XV, and XVI, Kaingaroa Survey District, Blocks IX and XIII, Galatea Survey District, III and IV, Weao Survey District, and I, Ahikereru Survey District, and containing by admeasurement 13,500 acres, more or less. Bounded towards the north generally by the Galatea Road; towards the east generally and north by subdivisions of the Karatia Block, 301-8, 2199-5, 1463-2, 314-7, 676-1, 772-0, 681-4, 1706-4, 1459-6, 440-7, 525-2, 1701-5, 2905-7, 2566-4, 1895-8, 2738-7, 1566-4, 2150-4, and 1706-5 links; towards the south-east by a public road, 235-1 and 179-2 links; towards the south-west and south-east by a post-office site, 200 and 495-1 links; towards the south-west by the Te Whaiti Road, 253 and 399-5 links; across that road; towards the south-east, north-east, and north-west by Section 2 of Block XVI, Kaingaroa Survey District, 1580, 3731-5, and 2101 links; across a road to the Rangitaiki River; towards the east generally by that river; towards the south-west by Run No. 58 (permanent State Forest, *Gazette* 1926, page 2153), 25611-5 and 8576-4 links; towards the north-west by the Kaingaroa State Forest (*Gazette*, 1911, page 3567), 17888-9 links; across the aforesaid Te Whaiti Road, and again towards the north-west and south-west by the aforesaid Kaingaroa State Forest (*Gazette*, 1911, page 3567), 14514-9, 13689-9, and 957-1 links, to the Galatea Road at the place of commencement: save and excepting two roads within the above-described boundaries: be all the aforesaid linkages more or less. As the same is more particularly delineated on the plan No. 47/9, deposited

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in the Head Office of the State Forest Service in Wellington, and thereon bordered red. (Auckland Survey Office plan, 24162.)

WHEREAS by section fourteen of the Native Land Amendment Act, 1914, it is provided, *inter alia*, that on being satisfied that the purchase of any Native land has been duly completed by or on behalf of the Crown under the authority of the Native Land Act, 1909, the Governor-General may issue a Proclamation that such land has become Crown land:

And whereas the purchase of the Native Land set out in the Schedule hereto has been duly completed by or on behalf of the Crown under the authority of the Native Land Act, 1909, and its amendments:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority so conferred upon me by section fourteen of the Native Land Amendment Act, 1914, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim that the Native land set out in the Schedule hereto has become Crown land.

Imposing Conditions and Restrictions on the Taking of Quinnat Salmon (Onchorynchus tshawytscha) for Purposes of Sale.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 4th day of October, 1926.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Order in Council dated the twenty-sixth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the fourth day of the following month, regulations were made imposing conditions and restrictions upon the taking of quinnat salmon (*Onchorynchus tshawytscha*) for purposes of sale :

And whereas it is desirable to revoke the said regulations and to make other regulations in lieu thereof :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by sections eighty-three and ninety-four of the Fisheries Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the said regulations of the twenty-sixth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, and doth hereby make the following regulations in lieu thereof; and doth hereby order and declare that these regulations shall have force and effect throughout New Zealand.

REGULATIONS.

1. In these regulations the term "Minister" means the Minister of Marine, and includes any person acting by or under the authority or direction of such Minister.
2. It shall be unlawful for any person to take salmon for sale, unless such person is the holder of a license issued in pursuance of these regulations.
3. Subject to these regulations, it shall be lawful for any person duly licensed in that behalf to take salmon for purposes of sale from the 1st day of January to the 15th day of May in each year.
4. Licenses shall be issued in the discretion of the Minister and under the hand of the Secretary of Marine in the form prescribed in the First Schedule hereto, and the fees payable in respect of such licenses shall be those respectively prescribed in the Second Schedule hereto :
Provided that in the consideration of applications for licenses to net salmon precedence shall be given to *bona fide* whole-time professional fishermen.
5. No applications for netting licenses will be received after 15th November in any year.
6. The areas of waters within which salmon may be taken by means of nets or traps pursuant to these regulations shall be those more specifically defined in the Third Schedule hereto : Provided that the issue of licenses to take salmon in that part of the Waimakariri River defined in the said Third Schedule shall be subject to the following restrictions :—
(a.) The taking of salmon by the process known as "drag-netting" shall be prohibited during the period from midnight of Friday in any one week until midnight of the Sunday following, except within that area below a straight line drawn from a sign-post (marked "Salmon-netting limits"), on the left bank of the river, to a similar sign-post on the opposite bank.
(b.) No set-net shall be placed in the waters of the river above a straight line drawn between the sign-posts hereinbefore mentioned.
7. Any person using a net for taking indigenous fish and taking salmon therein shall immediately return the same to the waters whence they were taken.
8. Any person duly licensed in that behalf may take salmon by means of a set-net, seine-net, hauling-net, pound-net, or trap constructed of wire-netting or twine or by rod and line.
9. The Minister may, in his discretion, limit the number of nets or traps which may be used in any of the said areas of waters, and may at any time order the holder of a license to remove any net or trap if in the opinion of the Minister it is necessary or advisable to do so; and upon any such order being given the said holder shall forthwith comply with the same.
10. No net or trap shall be placed or used in any of the said areas of waters within a distance of 20 chains from any established net or trap belonging to a holder of a license under these regulations.

11. The size of mesh of any net used for taking salmon shall be not less than 4 in., except in the case of set-nets, which shall be not less than 6 in., in each case between knot and knot of opposite corners

12. The length of any net used in taking salmon pursuant to these regulations shall not exceed in length one hundred feet.

13. Sea fishermen duly licensed under the provisions of Part I of the said Act may, upon payment of a license fee of £1, receive a license to take salmon for sale from the sea outside a radius of five hundred yards from the mouth or entrance of any river.

14. The holder of a license to take salmon for sale shall, on the expiry of such license, or of his ceasing to fish, whichever first happens, forthwith remove any net, trap, or stakes used by him for taking salmon.

15. Any trout accidentally taken by the holder of a license under these regulations shall be forthwith put back into the waters whence it came.

16. The licensee shall forward to the Minister, in such form and at such times as may be prescribed, returns of all salmon taken by him pursuant to these regulations.

17. Any person committing a breach of these regulations shall be liable to a fine of £20 and to the immediate cancellation of his license.

THIRD SCHEDULE.

AREAS OF WATERS WITHIN WHICH QUINNAT SALMON MAY BE TAKEN BY MEANS OF NETS OR TRAPS FOR PURPOSES OF SALE.

The Clutha River.—On the Koau Branch from the mouth to a straight line drawn from the river end of the boundary-line between Sections 6 and 7, Block II, Inch-Clutha, to the opposite bank.

On the Matau Branch from its junction with the Koau Branch to a straight line from the river end of the boundary-line between Sections 4 and 5, Block III, Inch-Clutha, to the opposite bank.

The Waitaki River.—Between a straight line drawn from the south bank of the river at Uxbridge Railway-station to the Redcliffs on the north bank, and the Kurow-Hakataramea Bridge :

Provided that after the 30th day of April in any year it shall be unlawful to take salmon by any means whatsoever in that portion of the said river above a straight line drawn from Strachan Railway-station to the post marked "Salmon-fishing limit" placed on the opposite side of the river. Any person who while fishing for trout after the date aforesaid takes a salmon from this last-mentioned portion of the river shall immediately return the same to the waters whence it was taken.

The Rangitata River.—From the railway-bridge to the traffic-bridge.

The Rakaia River.—From a right line drawn across the head of Great Island at Trig. Station Y to the Gorge Bridge.

The Waimakariri River.—The mouth or entrance east of a straight line drawn at right angles to the course of the said river and across the said river from the eastern corner of Rural Section 1393, in the Mandeville Survey District, the said corner of Rural Section 1393 being two miles or thereabouts in an easterly direction from the main bridge over the Waimakariri River to the Town of Kaiapoi.

Altering Boundaries of Sluggish River and Oroua Drainage Districts, County of Manawatu.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 4th day of October, 1926.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of section three of the Land Drainage Act, 1908, a majority of the ratepayers in the area described in the First Schedule hereto, situated in the County of Manawatu, and forming part of the Oroua Drainage District, have presented a petition to His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, praying that the land comprised in the said area be excluded from the said Oroua Drainage District and included in the Sluggish River Drainage District as constituted under the provisions of the said Act:

And whereas it is expedient to alter the boundaries of such drainage districts in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority contained in section three of the Land Drainage Act, 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby declare that the boundaries of the said Oroua and Sluggish River Drainage Districts shall be altered by excluding from the said Oroua Drainage District, and including in the said Sluggish River Drainage District, the area of land described in the said petition and in the First Schedule hereto; and doth hereby declare that the boundaries of the said Sluggish River Drainage District, with such addition as herein provided for, shall be those described in the Second Schedule hereto; and doth hereby further declare that the boundaries of the said Oroua Drainage District, with such exclusion as herein provided for, shall be those described in the Third Schedule hereto.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

AREA EXCLUDED FROM OROUA DRAINAGE DISTRICT AND INCLUDED IN SLUGGISH RIVER DRAINAGE DISTRICT.

ALL that area in the Wellington Land District bounded by a line commencing at the north-eastern corner of Section 142, Township of Carnarvon Registration District, Block XI, Te Kauwau Survey District, thence southerly along the eastern boundaries of Sections 142, 147, 366, and 148, Township of Carnarvon, to the south-eastern corner of the last-mentioned section; thence north-westerly along Taikorua Road, being the south-western boundaries of Sections 148, 149, 150, and 157, Township of Carnarvon, to the south-western corner of the last-mentioned section; thence north-easterly along the Carnarvon-Sandon Tramway, forming the north-western boundaries of Sections 157, 155, 154, 151, 146, 143, and 139, Township of Carnarvon, to the north-western corner of the last-mentioned section; thence south-easterly along the road forming the north-eastern boundaries of Sections 139, 140, 141, and 142, Township of Carnarvon aforesaid, to the north-eastern corner of the last-mentioned section, the point of commencement.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

SLUGGISH RIVER DRAINAGE DISTRICT.

ALL that area in the Wellington Land District bounded by a line commencing at a point in the middle of the Oroua River in line with the north-eastern boundary of Section 14, Block VIII, Te Kauwau Survey District; thence by a line down the middle of that river to a point in line with the northern side of the Foxton-Palmerston North Railway Reserve; thence to and along that boundary to the south-western boundary of Section 319, Block XV, Te Kauwau Survey District; thence along the western boundary of the said Section 319 to its north-western corner; thence easterly along the northern boundary of Section 319 aforesaid to the eastern boundary of Lot 1 on plan 3706 deposited in the office of the District Land Registrar at Wellington; thence northerly along the eastern boundary of Lots 1 and 2 on plan 3706 aforesaid to the north-eastern corner of the last-mentioned lot; thence westerly along the northern boundary of Lot 2 aforesaid to the road forming the western boundary of Lot 123 on plan 519 deposited as aforesaid; thence northerly along that road to the Taikorua Road; thence north-westerly along Taikorua Road, being the south-western boundaries of Sections 148, 149, 150, and 157, Township of Carnarvon, to the south-western corner of the last-mentioned section;

thence north-easterly along the Carnarvon-Sandon Tramway forming the north-western boundaries of Sections 157, 155, 154, 151, 146, 143, and 139, Township of Carnarvon, to the north-western corner of the last-mentioned section; thence easterly along the road forming the north-eastern boundary of Section 139 aforesaid, to its intersection with the road forming the south-western boundary of Section 56, Block XI aforesaid; thence south-easterly along that road to the stream forming the south-eastern boundary of the said Section 56; thence north-easterly generally along that stream to the north-eastern corner of Section 38, Block VIII, Te Kauwau Survey District; thence by a right line across a public road to the south-western corner of Section 25, Block VIII aforesaid; thence northerly along the road forming the western boundary of Section 25 aforesaid, to its intersection with the road forming the northern boundary of Section 20, Block VIII aforesaid; thence easterly along that road to the Oroua River at the easternmost corner of Section 14, Block VIII aforesaid; thence by a right line to the middle of that river, the point of commencement.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said license is required by the company as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the company to use and occupy that part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark on which the said wharf and slip are erected, as shown on plans marked M.D. 1926, 1927, and 1934A, deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of maintaining the said structures thereon, such license to be held and enjoyed by the company upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto.

In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council the company shall pay to the Minister the sum of £2 10s., and thereafter an annual sum of £5 in advance, payable on the 1st day of April each year, the proportionate part of such rental in respect of the period from the date hereof until the 31st March following to be paid on the company being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.

4. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the said wharf and slip without payment.

5. All persons shall, at all reasonable times, and upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the said wharf and slip and all rights of ingress and egress thereon and therefrom.

6. The company shall maintain the above-mentioned wharf and slip in good order and repair, and shall at all times exhibit therefrom, and maintain at the company's own cost, suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels; provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved by the Minister.

7. Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said wharf and slip and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known registered office of the company in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf and slip, requiring the company, within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, the company shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

8. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the company to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1923, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

9. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharf shall be taken away by the company and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

10. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue to be in force for fourteen years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the company shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the written consent of the Minister first obtained.

11. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, and the company may be required to remove the wharf and slip at the company's cost, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the company three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known registered office of the company in New Zealand.

12. The company shall be liable for any injury which the said wharf or slip may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on the company's part.

13. In case the company's shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;
- (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said wharf and slip for a period of thirty days;
- (3.) Be in any manner wound up or dissolved; or
- (4.) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause 3 of these conditions,—

then and in any of the said cases this Order in Council, and every license, right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any notice to the company or other proceeding whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the company, and to all persons concerned or interested,

that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

14. In the event of this Order in Council being revoked for any reason whatsoever, or upon the expiry of the period for which the license is granted, the company shall, if required by the Minister so to do, remove the said wharf and slip entirely from the site, and restore the site to its original condition within three months from the date of revocation or expiry, as the case may be; and if the company fails so to do, the Minister may cause the said wharf and slip to be removed and the site so restored, and may recover the costs incurred by the said removal and restoration from the company.

And whereas by Order in Council made on the twenty-second day of September, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-four, and published in the *Gazette* on the twenty-fifth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-four, at page 2218, regulations were made prohibiting the importation of certain goods from the United States of America and from certain other places :

And whereas it is now deemed expedient to amend the said Order in Council to enable certain goods to be imported under the conditions set out below :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the said powers conferred upon him and of every other power and authority enabling him in this behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. CLAUSE 1 of the said regulations is hereby revoked.
2. The importation into the Cook Islands either directly or indirectly from the United States of America of the following seeds—namely, flower, vegetable, grass, clover, and tree seeds (but not including oats, barley, maize, wheat, or other grain) is prohibited unless the following conditions are complied with :—
 - (a.) That, if the said seeds were grown in States other than the States of California and Texas, a certificate signed by the consignor showing the State in which the said seeds were grown is produced to the Resident Commissioner.
 - (b.) That, if the said seeds were grown in the State of California or in the State of Texas, a certificate signed by the consignor to the effect that the said seeds were grown in California or in Texas, as the case may be, but that they were not harvested prior to the 1st day of April, 1926, is produced to the Resident Commissioner.
3. Every person who commits a breach of the last preceding regulation is liable to a fine not exceeding £50.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by section two of the Public Reserves and Domains Amendment Act, 1914, doth hereby vest the control of the reserve described in the Schedule hereto for the period of five years from the date hereof (unless previously amended or revoked under the said Act) in the undermentioned persons, namely:—

Murdoch McKenzie,

who are hereby constituted for that purpose a special Board by the name of the Taurikura Public Hall Board (hereinafter referred to as "the Board"), with the powers and subject to the conditions hereinafter contained, that is to say:—

1. The Board shall meet for the transaction of business on the second Saturday in each month at ten o'clock a.m. at the office of Messrs. Bannister and Lamb, Solicitors, Whangarei, or at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board. The first meeting shall be held on Saturday, the ninth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-six.

2. The members of the Board shall at their first meeting, and thereafter at the annual meeting hereinafter mentioned, elect one of themselves to be Chairman, who may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote. The Chairman shall hold office until the election of his successor.

3. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman, provided that two days' notice of any such meeting is given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting; and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.

4. Any three members of the Board shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.

5. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose one of their number to be chairman of such meeting.

6. If by resignation, death, incapacity, or otherwise the seat of any member shall be or become vacant, or if any member absents himself without reasonable cause from three consecutive meetings of the Board, the Governor-General shall have power to appoint any other person to be a member of the Board in his stead.

7. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at meeting.

8. The Board shall have prepared and submitted at an annual meeting to be held in the month of April in each year a report of the proceedings of the Board for the previous year ending on the thirty-first day of March, together with a statement of the receipts and expenditure of the Board for such year. A copy of every such report and statement, certified by the Chairman to be correct, shall be sent to the Minister of Lands as soon as possible after each annual meeting.

9. The Board shall control the said reserve and the building erected thereon for the purposes of a public hall, and shall also afford settlers and residents of Taurikura and the surrounding district such facilities for meeting within the said hall as may from time to time be determined by the Board provided that the Board shall have power to fix reasonable charges for the use of the said hall.

The sections now offered comprise part of the Hutt Valley Settlement acquired by the Crown from Mrs. Riddiford. The rate of brokerage on New Zealand Government Debentures and Stock, whatever the amount, shall be ½ per cent.

Rule 26b amended to read:—

All dealings in Australian and New Zealand shares shall be "ex div." on the day the dividend is payable at the Company's Head Office.

In all dealings in debentures, subject to Debenture Tax, no adjustments shall be made in respect of such tax.

Rule 40: Add to the Rule as follows:—

Any Listed Company which interferes with the Preference Shareholders, such as writing down of Capital, may be removed from the Official List.

That the following scale be adopted as the fee to be charged for valuations of shares in deceased or other estates:—

One guinea per £1,000 or part thereof in value up to £5,000.
