I, THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, being satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made by the Legislature of New Zealand (the same being a part of His Majesty's Dominions outside the United Kingdom to which the Imperial Maintenance Orders (Facilities for Enforcement) Act, 1920, extends) for the enforcement within such part of maintenance orders made by Courts within Victoria, do now, under the powers conferred by section 12 of an Act of the Victorian Parliament intitled the Maintenance Orders (Facilities for Enforcement) Act, 1925, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby declare New Zealand to be a reciprocating State within the meaning and for the purposes of the Act last referred to.

The second list (II) gives the names of those who have passed in two or more subjects of Parts II and III of Class C, but have yet to complete the examination.

The third list (III) contains the names of those who have obtained "partial passes" in the Class D Examination, and the fourth list (IV) those who have gained passes or partial passes in one or more "groups" of Class D. Those in List IV who obtained a pass in Group I are indicated by an asterisk.

In the fifth list (V) are given the names of the candidates whose work has been deemed worthy of "special mention."

The next examination will take place in August, 1927. Notice must be sent to the Director of Education so as to reach him not later than the 31st May, 1927. Candidates who have yet to complete the examination must observe this rule equally with other candidates, and must not expect to receive any further information of the date at which the notices become due.

Certificated teachers who have gained promotion at this examination may send their certificates to the Department for endorsement.

Uncertificated teachers who have now obtained full passes and who have completed two years' teaching service, as required by the Regulations, will be considered shortly for the issue of certificates. Those who have not completed two years' teaching service should apply for the issue of certificates when this requirement is fulfilled.

Alterations to Scale of Charges in Force upon the New Zealand Government Railways.

IN pursuance of all powers and authorities enabling me under the Government Railways Act, 1926, and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, I, Francis Joseph Rolleston, Acting Minister of Railways, do hereby make the following alterations in the scale of charges in force on the New Zealand Government Railways open for traffic made on the 10th day of August, 1925, and published in the *Gazette* of the 11th August, 1925, and I do hereby declare that such alterations shall come into force on the 25th day of October, 1926.

PART I.—PASSENGERS.

3. Reserved Seats.

By omitting the following:—

2. Passengers travelling first or second class by mail or express trains running between Wellington (Thorndon) and Auckland, Auckland and Whangarei (or Opuā), Auckland and Rotorua, Wellington (Thorndon) and New Plymouth, Wellington (Thorndon) and Napier, Christchurch and Greymouth, Christchurch and Dunedin and Invercargill, and holding tickets for a journey of not less than 100 miles to be made by such trains, may, if they so desire, reserve seats for the journey on production of their tickets and payment of a charge of 9d. for each seat so reserved.

4. Any passenger intending to join a train for a journey in respect of which seats may be reserved at a station other than Wellington (Thorndon), Auckland, Whangarei (or Opuā), Rotorua, New Plymouth, Napier, Greymouth, Christchurch, Culverden (or Waiau), Dunedin, Cromwell, or Invercargill, and who desires to reserve a seat, must apply for such reservation to a Stationmaster, and on presentation of his ticket for the journey and payment of a fee of 9d. for such reservation together with a telegraphing fee of 9d., application will be made for the reservation, but no guarantee will be given that a seat will then be available for reservation.

And substituting the following:—

3. Reserved Seats.

2. Passengers travelling first or second class by mail or express trains running between Wellington (Thorndon) and Auckland, Auckland and Whangarei (or Opuā), Auckland and Rotorua, Wellington (Thorndon) and New Plymouth, Wellington (Thorndon) and Napier, Christchurch and Greymouth, Christchurch and Dunedin and Invercargill, and holding tickets for a journey of not less than 100 miles to be made by such trains, may, if they so desire, reserve seats for the journey on production of their tickets and payment of a charge of 1s. for each seat so reserved.

4. In the case of an application for a reserved seat made by telegram no guarantee will be given that a seat will be available for reservation.

PART III.—GOODS.

By omitting from Regulation 6 the following:—

5. For each loading or unloading performed by the Department 4d. per bale for undumped and 8d. per bale for double-dumped will be charged; when the goods are tallied but not handled by the Department 4d. per bale (dumped or undumped) will be charged.

And substituting the following:—

5. For each loading or unloading performed by the Department 4d. per bale for undumped and 8d. per bale for double-dumped will be charged, and these charges shall include the service of tallying when such is performed in connection with either the loading or unloading. When it is desired by either consignors or consignees that the Department should tally but not handle the goods 1½d. per bale (dumped or undumped) will be charged for each such service performed by the Department.

By adding to paragraph 6 of Regulation 8 the following:—

The Department may decline to extend the benefit of this reduced rate to consignments of pigs consigned to any person or firm utilizing other means of transport than the railway for the carriage of bacon, hams, and other products manufactured from such pigs when the railway is available for the transport of these goods.

The total births registered for the urban areas amounted to 1,128, as against 1,149 in August—a decrease of 21. The deaths in September were 609—a decrease of 63 as compared with the previous month. Of the total deaths males contributed 349, females 260. Seventy-five of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 12.32 per cent. of the whole number. Fifty-six of these were under one year of age.

1. *Paratutai Light (Unwatched)*.—A flashing light, having red, white, and green sectors, 12 seconds, flash 4 seconds, 25 ft., visible 8 miles, will be exhibited from the extreme southern end of Paratutai. The light shows red from 237° to 253°, white thence to 261°, green thence to 050°, white thence to 057°, red thence to 077°, obscured elsewhere.

Position : From Paratutai light, South Head Signal-station flagstaff bears 095½°, and South Head Lighthouse 116°.

2. *Windy Point Unlighted Beacons*.—Two white beacons, at Pigeonhole, northward of the entrance, have been realigned for use as day marks only, and will be in transit 032½°.

3. *Main Lighted Leading Beacons*.—Amending Wellington Notice to Mariners No. 36 of 1926, the alignment of these beacons at South Head in transit is 069½°.

4. *Destruction Gully Light*.—This light, at the northern side within the entrance, will be discontinued.

5. *Destruction Gully White Patch*.—This white patch, at the northern side within the entrance, is to be obliterated.

MASTERTON RACING CLUB.

REGULATIONS.

(Under the Gaming Act, 1908.)

In pursuance and exercise of the powers in that behalf contained in section 33 of the Gaming Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities it enabling in that behalf, the Masterton Racing Club, a racing club within the meaning of

the said Act (hereinafter referred to as "the said club"), doth hereby make the following regulations controlling the admission of persons to that part of the racecourse situated in the district of Trentham, and known as the Trentham Racecourse, while the said racecourse is used or occupied by the said club for race meetings:—

1. These regulations shall come into force on the date of the same being published in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

2. In these regulations the words "bookmaker," "racing club," and "race meeting" shall have the meanings ascribed to those terms respectively by section 2 of the Gaming Act, 1908.

3. The following persons shall be and are hereby excluded from the racecourse above described while the same is used or occupied by the said club for a race meeting, namely:—

- (a.) Bookmakers.
- (b.) Bookmakers' clerks, bookmakers' assistants, and bookmakers' agents.
- (c.) All persons under disqualification inflicted by any racing or trotting club in the Dominion of New Zealand, the Commonwealth of Australia, or elsewhere if affiliated to the New Zealand Racing Conference, or the New Zealand Trotting Conference, or the New Zealand Trotting Association.
- (d.) Common prostitutes and persons who habitually consort with thieves or persons who have no lawful visible means of support.
- (e.) Professional tipsters, persons convicted of house-breaking or pocket-picking, forgery, uttering or possessing counterfeit coin, theft, false pretences, receiving stolen goods, mischief, assault, or any offence or crime of any kind under the Crimes Act, 1908, and also idle and disorderly persons, rogues, and vagabonds, and incorrigible rogues convicted under the Police Offences Act, 1908, and persons convicted of an offence under the Gaming Act, 1908.

Provided always that the Stipendiary Stewards' Committee appointed by the New Zealand Racing Conference, upon being satisfied by evidence as to character and otherwise that any person who, by reason of any conviction, comes within the scope of this regulation should have relief from the effect thereof, may grant exemption to any such person, and may at any time revoke any such exemption without notice to such person, and without assigning any reason for such revocation.

The foregoing regulations of the Masterton Racing Club were made and passed by such club on the 29th day of September, 1926, and signed by the Chairman and Secretary.
