Districts constituted under the Marriage Act, 1908.

A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in the Governor-General by the Marriage Act, 1908, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby abolish the existing marriage districts known as the Wakatipu, Otago, and Orepuki Districts, and do proclaim and declare that the territory heretofore comprised within the said districts is hereby divided anew into four marriage districts, the names and boundaries whereof shall be as follows:—

TUATAPERE DISTRICT.

ALL that area in the Southland Land District bounded by a line commencing at the confluence of Redcliff Creek and the Waiau River; thence up Redcliff Creek to its source; thence along a right line to Corner Peaks; thence to Mount Nichols; thence southerly along the watershed to the Wairaki River; thence down the Wairaki River to its intersection with the northern boundary of Section 65, Block II, Waiau Survey District; thence along a right line to Sharpridge; thence south-easterly along Sharpridge and that line produced to a public road; thence southerly along the road forming the eastern boundary of Sections 69 and 68, Block VI, Waiau Survey District, to its intersection with the Clifden-Otago Road; thence south-easterly along the Clifden-Otago Road to a point in line with the eastern boundary of Lot 28 on plan 1285 deposited in the office of the District Land Registrar at Invercargill; thence to and along the eastern boundaries of Lots 28, 27, and 26, plan 1285 aforesaid, and the eastern boundary of Section 12, Maori Hill Settlement, to the south-eastern corner of the last-mentioned settlement; thence south-easterly along the northern boundary of Block XV, Waiau Survey District, to the eastern boundary of the said Waiau Survey District; thence southerly along the eastern boundaries of Waiau and Longwood Survey Districts to a point in line with the southern boundary of Block XXII, Longwood Survey District; thence to and along that boundary, and the southern boundary of Blocks XVI and XV of the said Longwood Survey District, to the sea-coast; thence northerly, westerly, and southerly generally along the coast to Sandhill Point; thence along the summit of the watershed from Sandhill Point to the Hump; thence by lines from peak to peak to the Billow Mountains; thence by the summits of the Billow Mountains and Hunter's Mountains to Cone Peak; thence by a right line to the shore of Lake Manapouri; thence

south-easterly generally along the shore of Lake Manapouri to the easternmost point of Hope Arm; thence by a right line to the confluence of the Waiau River and Redcliff Creek, the place of commencement.

WAKATIPU DISTRICT.

All that area in the Southland Land District bounded by a line commencing at a point due north of Cosmos Peak upon a line drawn from the mouth of the Awarua River to Mount Aspiring; thence bounded on the north by the said line to the summit of the Forbes Ranges; thence towards the east by right lines from peak to peak along the summit of the range to Mount Edward; and thence by right lines from peak to peak to Mount Tyndall; thence towards the north by the summit of the range to Fox Peak; thence towards the east by the summit of the watershed to Black Peak, Treble Cone, and Mount Motatapu; thence by right lines from peak to peak following the watershed of the Shotover and Arrow Rivers to the Kawarau River at its junction with the Shotover; thence by the Kawarau River to a point due north of Ben Nevis; and thence by the range to Lorn Peak; thence by a right line to the junction of the Allan Burn with the River Mataura; thence towards the south-west by the River Mataura to Eyre Peak; thence towards the south-east by a right line drawn to a point on the River Oreti due east of Surprise Cove on Lake Manapouri; thence towards the south by another right line to Surprise Cove; thence along the shore of Surprise Cove to the outlet of the Waiau River; thence down the Waiau River to the confluence of the Waiau River and Redcliff Creek; thence north-westerly and southerly along the north-eastern and western boundaries of Tuatapere District (hereinbefore described) to Sandhill Point; thence towards the south and west by the sea to Cloudy Pass in Bligh Sound; thence towards the north by a right line through Cloudy Pass and over the Castle to the summit of the Earl Mountains; thence along the summit to Mount Anau; and thence along the summit of the ranges to the eastern summit of the watershed of the Hollyford River; again towards the west by the summit of the said watershed to Cosmos Peak; and thence by a line due north to the point of commencement.

OTAUTAU DISTRICT.

All that area in the Southland Land District bounded by a line commencing at the source of Redcliff Creek; thence along a right line to Spence Peak; thence along a right line to the source of Etal Stream, and along that stream to the Aparima River; thence by the right bank of that river to a point due west of the north-western corner of Section 162A

Taringatura Survey District; thence along a right line to the north-western corner of that section; thence southerly along the western boundaries of Sections 162A, 154A, 162C, and 188 to the south-western corner of the last-mentioned section; thence due west to a point in line with the eastern boundary of Section 119, Taringatura Survey District; thence to and along that boundary and the eastern boundary of Sections 245, 244, 243, 242, 241, 240, 239, and 238 to the south-eastern corner of the last-mentioned section; thence along the southern boundary of Sections 238 and 237, Taringatura Survey District, to the road forming the north-eastern boundary of Section 53, Taringatura Survey District; thence to and along that road to the south-eastern corner of Part Section 62, Oreti Hundred; thence south-westerly and westerly along the road forming the south-eastern and southern boundaries of part Section 62, Oreti Hundred, to the road forming the western boundary of part Section 62, Oreti Hundred; thence south-easterly and south-westerly along that road to the south-eastern corner of Section 51, Oreti Hundred; thence westerly along the southern boundaries of Sections 51 and 61, Oreti Hundred, to the north-western corner of Section 44; thence southerly along the road forming the western boundary of the said Section 44, Oreti Hundred, and its production to the north-eastern corner of Section 183, Oreti Hundred; thence westerly and southerly along the road forming the northern and western boundaries of the said Section 183 to the road forming the southern boundary of the said section; thence westerly along that road to its intersection with the Waimatuku Stream; thence north-westerly, south-easterly, and westerly along the north-eastern, south-western, and northern boundaries of Jacobs River Hundred to the eastern boundary of the Tuatapere District (hereinbefore described); and thence northerly along that boundary to the source of Redeliff Creek, the place of commencement.

OREPUKI DISTRICT.

All that area in the Southland Land District bounded on the north by the Tuatapere District (hereinbefore described) from the sea to the eastern boundary of the Longwood Survey District; thence along a right line from the south-eastern corner of the said Tuatapere District to the source of the Ourawera Stream; thence down the middle of that stream to the sea; thence north-westerly generally by the sea to the northern boundary of the Tuatapere District (hereinbefore described), the place of commencement.

And I hereby declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation on the first day of December, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and twenty-six.

Districts constituted under the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1924.

A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in the Governor-General by the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1924, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby abolish the existing registration districts known as the Wakatipu, Otautau, and Orepuki Districts; and do proclaim and declare that the territory heretofore comprised within the said districts is hereby divided anew into four registration districts, the names whereof shall be the Tuatapere, Wakatipu, Otautau, and Orepuki Districts, and the boundaries whereof shall be coextensive with the boundaries of the marriage districts bearing the same names as are set forth in a Proclamation of even date herewith made under the provisions of the Marriage Act, 1908.

And I hereby declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation on the first day of December, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and twenty-six.

Revocation of the Reservations of Permanent State Forests.

A PROCLAMATION.

BY virtue and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by the Forests Act, 1921-22, and pursuant to a resolution in that behalf passed by both Houses of Parliament, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby revoke the reservation as a permanent State forest of the Crown lands described in the Schedule hereto (which reservation was effected as regards part of the said lands by section one hundred and six of the Reserves and other Lands Disposal and Public Bodies Empowering Act, 1921-22, and as regards other part thereof by Proclamation of the twenty-fourth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-four, published in the *New Zealand Gazette* on the third day of April, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-four, at page 802), and do hereby revoke the said Proclamation (so far only as it relates to any part of the Crown lands described in the Schedule hereto) accordingly, and do hereby declare that the reservations thereby respectively effected are (so far only as aforesaid) revoked accordingly.

Proposed Revision of Customs Tariff.

Customs Department,
Wellington, 11th November, 1926.

IT is hereby notified for public information that it is proposed to revise the Customs Tariff during the session of Parliament to be held in 1927.

The attention of all those interested is drawn to the provisions of section 130 of the Customs Act, 1913, as amended by the Customs Amendment Act, 1921, which are as follows:—

“130. (1.) If, after any agreement is made (whether in New Zealand or elsewhere) for the sale of goods, any alteration takes place in the law relating to the liability of such goods to duty or in the rate or amount of such duty, then, in the absence of express written provision to the contrary, the agreement shall be deemed to be modified as follows:—

“(a.) In the event of the alteration being a new or increased duty, the seller, after payment thereof, may add to the agreed price the difference caused by the alteration:

“(b.) In the event of the alteration being the reduction of duty, the purchaser may deduct from the agreed price the difference between the amount of duty which the seller would have paid had the alteration not been made and the amount of duty actually paid by him:

“(c.) In the event of the alteration being the abolition of duty, the purchaser may deduct from the agreed price the duty which the seller would have paid had the alteration not been made.

“(2.) When any such alteration of duties takes place so as to operate retrospectively from any date this section shall also apply retrospectively in like manner as from the same date.

“(3.) Any money paid by a buyer to a seller in excess of the amount payable under this section may be recovered from the seller as money paid by mistake whether the error was one of fact or law.

“(4.) All the provisions of this section with respect to an alteration of the law shall extend and apply to any alteration of the Tariff by authority of the Governor in Council or by any other lawful authority.”

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been in the possession of any company for a period of six years or upwards after the time when the same became payable, and in respect whereof no claim has been made by the owner against the company.

THE Nautical Almanac and Tide Tables for the year 1927 will be published on 1st December, 1926, immediately after which the book will be available by purchase from Government Shipping Offices and from the Marine Department at Wellington.

The contents of this publication embrace the necessary astronomical ephemeris used in navigation and nautical astronomy, comprising—Right ascension of the mean sun; sun's declination and equation of time for every two hours of Greenwich mean time; sun's semi-diameter at Greenwich mean noon; moon's age and upper meridian passage in New Zealand mean time for every day throughout the year, and the moon's phases in New Zealand civil mean time. Positions of the principal stars used in navigation for the 1st of January, also the times of their meridian passages for the middle of each month, the more important astronomical phenomena, &c., for 1926, and some useful nautical tables, and a lengthy explanation of the various elements are provided. The times of rising, setting, and meridian passage of planets and bright stars seen at Wellington at each mid-monthly period, in New Zealand civil mean time, are included. The principal ports of the Dominion are described from latest information, which has been revised by the several harbour authorities; and some plans of harbours and berthage accommodation are given.

Several important changes which have taken place since publication of Supplement No. 6 of the "New Zealand Pilot," ninth edition, 1919, are included for the use of mariners.

The characteristics of the fog-beacon will then be automatically transmitted for a period of thirty minutes from commencement. A charge of 2s. against such vessel will be made by the Post and Telegraph Department for this service.

The radio-beacon does not exchange wireless signals with ships.
