Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by section five of the Fisheries Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulation, additional to the hereinbefore recited regulations.

REGULATION.

2A. DURING the period from midnight of the 15th day of November in any year until midnight of the 31st day of January following no person shall use a Danish seine-net or a purse-seine net for taking fish within the area more particularly described in the Third Schedule hereto.

AGRICULTURAL SEEDS ACT, 1921.

[Published in Government Gazette No. 132 of 8th October, 1926.] Department of Agriculture, Sydney, 8th October, 1926.

His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to repeal all regulations previously made under the provisions of the Agricultural Seeds Act, 1921, and to make the following regulations in lieu thereof.

REGULATIONS.

1. The seeds of the plants mentioned in Schedule A shall

1. The seeds of the plants mentioned in Schedule A shall be deemed to be noxious weed seeds.

2. The name of an agricultural seed, as indicated by the statement or label which, in pursuance of section four of the Agricultural Seeds Act, 1921, is written on or attached to the parcel containing such seed, shall be the common name of such seed: Provided that the names of seeds of the plants whose botanical name is shown in Schedule B shall be indicated by the corresponding common names as set out in such Schedule Schedule.

Schedule.

3. Agricultural seeds may have mixed with them not more than a total number of seventy-five seeds of the various classes mentioned in Schedule C to every ounce of agricultural seed, but the total number of weed seeds present shall not exceed 2 per cent. by count: Provided that any agricultural seed mentioned in Schedule D may, in addition to the above, have mixed with it weed seeds of the variety or varieties set out opposite such agricultural seed in such Schedule, and in a percentage not greater than that specified therein.

4. The proportion of impurities permitted with agricultural seeds, and the minimum percentage of germination, shall be as indicated in Schedule E.

5. Lucerne seed other than that grown in Australia shall,

5. Lucerne seed other than that grown in Australia shall, before being sold, be treated in the manner following: Not less than 5 per cent. of such seed shall be stained by immersion in an aqueous solution of safranin made by the addition of not less than I ounce of safranin to 7 gallons of water, and such stained seed shall thereafter be thoroughly mixed with the unstained portion of the seed: Provided that such treatment shall not be necessary if such seed has been treated in accordance with any Proclamation in force for the time

being under the Customs Act, 1901-23.

SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF OCTOBER, 1926.

The weather of October was, for the most part, remarkably wet and, except in the Poverty and Hawke's Bay districts, and in Westland southward of Westport, both the total rainfall and number of wet days were everywhere above the average. Between the 10th and 12th an ex-tropical disturbance passed over the North Island, and stormy conditions were experienced. Very heavy rain fell at this time in the basin of the Waikato River, and caused the highest flood recorded for many years. Snow and hail also fell on the higher levels.

A westerly depression between the 14th and 19th brought further unsettled weather, particularly to districts with a westerly aspect. From the 20th to the 24th anticyclonic pressure dominated, and this was the only period during the month when fair weather prevailed generally.

An extensive westerly disturbance during the last week was complicated by a well-defined cyclonic system which invaded the larger area of low pressure. The centre of the latter storm passed through Cook Strait during the night of the 28th.

The centre of the latter storm passed through Cook Strait during the night of the 28th. There were some heavy rainfalls accompanying thunderstorms in the South at the close of the month.

Frosts were not frequent, but a severe one on the morning of the 13th did considerable damage to tender spring growth at places in both Islands.

THE following lists of assistant teachers employed in technical schools, recognized technical classes, or recognized manual-training classes, are issued under the authority of the Minister of Education, in accordance with the regulations relating to technical schools, recognized technical classes, and recognized manual-training classes, made by Order in Council dated the 20th November, 1925.

Under the heading "Division" is shown the division and class in which the teacher is classified

class in which the teacher is classified.

The class of salary corresponding with the class and division in which the teacher is placed is given in the Schedule to the

aforementioned regulations.

Attention is drawn to the regulations relating to appeals of teachers against their classification and grading, under which any teacher who considers he has good grounds for objection to his classification may lodge an appeal to reach the Director of Education not later than forty clear days after the publication of this list in the New Zealand Gazette i.e., such appeals must reach the Director not later than the 18th January, 1927, and must contain an explicit statement of the grounds on which the appeal is based.

Note.—In the last column of the classification list T.S. stands for "Technical School," E.B. for "Education Board," S. of A. for "School of Art," and J.H.S. for "Junior High School."
