A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the land described in the Schedule hereto forms part of land taken for the purposes of the Kaipara-Waikato Railway, and it is considered desirable to allocate such land to the purposes of a road:

Now, therefore, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by section one hundred and ninety-seven of the Public Works Act, 1908, and of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto shall, upon the publication hereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*, become a road, and that the said road shall be under the control of the Manukau County Council, and shall be maintained by the said Council in like manner as other public highways are controlled and maintained by the said Council.

WHEREAS by section five of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1909, it is provided that in the case of any land taken, purchased, or acquired for a Government work, and not required for that purpose, the Governor may, on recommendation by the Minister, by Proclamation, declare such land to be Crown land subject to the Land Act, 1924, and thereupon the land may be administered and disposed of under that Act accordingly:

Now, therefore, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on me by section five of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1909, and of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare the land described in the Schedule hereto to be Crown land subject to the Land Act, 1924.

Apportioning the Cost of Maintenance, &c., of Portion of Hokio Stream in the County of Horowhenua.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS under the provisions of section sixty-five of the Land Drainage Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), a Commission was appointed and an inquiry was duly held with a view to determining what local authority could most conveniently and efficiently control the Hokio Stream, in the County of Horowhenua (hereinafter referred to as "the stream"), and what proportion of the cost of maintaining, repairing, improving, or reconstructing the stream should be paid by any, and, if so, which, local authority or local authorities:

And whereas such Commission did report to the Governor-General, after due inquiry, its opinion as to the matters respecting which it was appointed to report:

And whereas it is expedient to make provision under the said Act for the purposes and in the manner hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and direct as follows, that is to say:—

1. Subject to the provisions hereinafter mentioned and to section fifty-three of the Local Legislation Act, 1926, that portion of the stream described in the Schedule hereto (hereafter referred to as "the said area") shall be under the exclusive care, control, and management of the Hokio Drainage Board (hereinafter referred to as "the Drainage Board").

2. The cost of maintaining, repairing, improving, or reconstructing the said area shall be provided and paid by the Drainage Board.

3. The Horowhenua County Council (hereinafter referred to as "the County Council") shall pay annually to the Drainage Board the sum of ten pounds (£10) towards the cost of maintaining, repairing, improving, or reconstructing the said area: Provided that if in any year the County Council expends any sum for the improvement of any portion of the stream between the said area and the sea then the said payment of ten pounds (£10) shall be reduced in that year by the amount so expended.

4. I direct that any payment hereby required to be made as aforesaid by the County Council shall be paid from time to time, in the amounts hereinbefore fixed and determined, out of the funds under the control of the County Council, within a period of thirty days after demand in writing made by or on behalf of the Drainage Board; and all such payments shall be made from time to time to the Clerk of the Drainage Board, for and on account of such Drainage Board.

5. In the exercise of the powers conferred by this Proclamation the Drainage Board shall take all reasonable steps to safeguard and preserve any Native fishing rights conferred by the Horowhenua Block Act, 1896, and any rights of user of the Horowhenua Lake as a public recreation reserve under the Horowhenua Lake Act, 1906; and for that purpose—

(a.) It shall not be lawful for the Drainage Board to deepen or to do any acts likely to deepen the said area without the consent of a majority of the Native owners of adjoining property. In the event of such consent not being given, the Minister of Internal Affairs, on the request of the Drainage Board, if after due inquiry he is satisfied that the said area should be deepened, may authorize the Drainage Board to deepen the said area accordingly.

(b.) The Drainage Board shall repair or replace any eel-weirs that are damaged or removed by it in the execution of works in the said area or, in the alternative, it may pay to the Native owners of such eel-weirs reasonable compensation for such damage or removal.

Revoking the Reservation over Portion of a Scenic Reserve in the Auckland Land District.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by Order in Council dated the twenty-fourth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and ten, and gazetted on the thirty-first day of that month, and by Proclamation dated the twenty-ninth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and eleven, and gazetted on the seventh day of December, one thousand nine hundred and eleven, certain lands in the Auckland Land District were taken for scenery-preservation purposes under the provisions of the Public Works Act, 1908, the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908, and the Scenery Preservation Amendment Act, 1910:

And whereas the land described in the Schedule hereto (being part of the land so taken) is no longer suitable for scenic purposes owing to the absence of scenic bush thereon:

WHEREAS by the Native Land Act, 1909, and its amendments, it is enacted that the Governor-General may from time to time, by Order in Council, make regulations for the purposes specified in the said Act :

Now, therefore, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the said Act and its amendments, and all other powers him thereunto enabling, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following additional regulations relating to Maori Land Boards.

REGULATIONS.

FUNDS OF BOARDS.

1. WITH the direction in writing of the President, which may be revoked at any time, money in the account of a Maori Land Board referred to in section 35 of the Native Land Amendment Act, 1913, may be paid out of such account by cheque, signed by the Registrar and countersigned by the Accountant to the Board. The powers hereby conferred shall extend to the persons carrying on for the time being the duties of the Registrar and of the Accountant respectively.

2. (1.) A Maori Land Board may invest any money in its hands in the manner following, subject, however, to obtaining the consent or approval of the Native Minister in such cases as the statute requires it, namely :—

(a.) In stocks, funds, or other securities of the Government of the Dominion of New Zealand.

(b.) In bonds, debentures, or other securities of any local authority or statutory Board having authority to borrow money.

- (c.) In real securities in New Zealand.
 (d.) On the security of leasehold interest held by any person in any Native freehold land.
 (e.) On the security of any leasehold or other particular interest held by any Native in Crown land.
 (f.) By deposit in the Common Funds of the Public Trustee or the Native Trustee.
 (g.) By deposit with any other Maori Land Board.
 (h.) By deposit in any bank carrying on business in New Zealand under statutory authority, or in any Post Office Savings-bank or other savings-bank in New Zealand.
 (i.) In any securities in which trustees are from time to time specifically authorized by statute to invest their funds.
 (j.) In any other security that may from time to time be authorized by the Governor-General in Council.

(2.) Advances upon real or leasehold securities shall not exceed three-fifths of the estimated value thereof according to a valuation approved by the Board.

(3.) Any such investment may be varied from time to time.

(4.) The powers hereby given are in addition to those contained in section 8 of the Native Land Amendment and Native Land Claims Adjustment Act, 1926.

INTEREST PAYABLE TO NATIVE LAND SETTLEMENT ACCOUNT.

3. The rate of interest payable to the Native Land Settlement Account for money paid from that account into the account of a Maori Land Board under the provisions in that behalf contained in subsection (d) of section 417 of the Native Land Act, 1909, as amended by section 10 of the Native Land Amendment and Native Land Claims Adjustment Act, 1926, shall be calculated at five pounds per centum per annum until repayment.

PREPARATION OF SUBSTITUTED AND RENEWED LEASES AND VARIATION OF TERMS OF LEASES.

4. (1.) The cost of preparation of the undermentioned documents and of perusal of same on behalf of the Natives interested shall be borne by the lessee:—

- (a.) Substituted lease under section 17 of the Native Land Amendment and Native Land Claims Adjustment Act, 1922.
 (b.) Renewal of lease under section 6 of the Native Land Amendment and Native Land Claims Adjustment Act, 1926.
 (c.) Memorandum under subsection (4) of section 5 of the Native Land Amendment and Native Land Claims Adjustment Act, 1926.

(2.) The Board may at any stage of the proceedings require a deposit to be made with the Board of a sum equivalent to the estimated reasonable cost of the documents required, and may decline to take any further steps until such sum is either paid or secured.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him by the New Zealand University Amendment Act, 1926, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the regulations hereinafter set forth for the first election of members of the Council of the University of New Zealand by members of the General Court of Convocation.

REGULATIONS.

1. FOR the purpose of the first election of members of the Council of the University of New Zealand by members of the General Court of Convocation the Registrar of the University shall be the Returning Officer.

2. The election shall be held on the 21st day of January, 1927, and the poll shall close at 5 o'clock on the afternoon of that day, and all voting-papers shall be included and counted which, not being informal in accordance with the provisions of clause 8 hereof, are received by the Returning Officer in due course of post before 5 o'clock in the afternoon of the 26th day of January, 1927.

3. The Registrar of each constituent college shall, not later than the 4th day of January, 1927, prepare a register of the full names, academic status, and addresses of the members of the District Court of Convocation, shall arrange the names in alphabetical order of surnames, and shall forthwith send a copy of the register to the Returning Officer. These registers shall be the roll used for the election to be conducted under these regulations, but the Returning Officer shall add to the roll all names received by him from any Registrar before the nominations close.

4. The roll shall be closed at the time when nominations close, and shall remain closed till the election is completed.

5. (1.) The Returning Officer shall, by advertisement published in at least one newspaper circulating in each of the four University districts, notify—

(a.) The day and hour for the closing of nominations.

(b.) The number of candidates to be elected.

(c.) The day and hour for the closing of the poll.

(2.) The first such advertisement shall be published in each of the University districts aforesaid not later than the 20th day of December, 1926.

(3.) Every candidate shall be nominated in writing by one or more electors entitled to vote for his election. Each elector may nominate any number of candidates not exceeding five.

(4.) Every nomination-paper shall be in the form or to the effect of the following :—

I [*Name and address*], being a member of the General Court of Convocation of the University of New Zealand entitled to vote in the election, hereby nominate [*Name and address*] as a candidate for election to the Council of the said University at the election to be held on the 21st day of January, 1927.

Dated this day of , 192 .

[*Signature of Nominator.*]

I hereby consent to my nomination.

[*Signature of Candidate.*]

(5.) Nominations shall close at 5 o'clock on the afternoon of the 10th day of January, 1927.

(6.) A nomination paper shall be informal—

(a.) If it is not made and signed by a person entitled to vote in the election :

(b.) If it is received by the Returning Officer after the time at which nominations close :

(c.) If it does not bear the consent of the candidate in writing, unless such consent is received by the Returning Officer before the nominations are closed.

6. (1.) If the number of duly nominated candidates does not exceed five the Returning Officer shall forthwith declare the candidate or candidates so nominated to be duly elected.

(2.) If the number of duly nominated candidates is greater than five, the Returning Officer shall immediately after the closing of nominations prepare and post to each elector whose name is on the roll according to his address a printed voting-paper containing in alphabetical order of surnames a list of all the duly nominated candidates.

7. The voting-paper shall be in the form or to the effect of the following :—

The voting-paper must be enclosed in an envelope, bearing on the outside the word "Voting-paper" and addressed "The Returning Officer, University of New Zealand, Dominion Farmers Institute Buildings, Featherston Street, Wellington," and must be either delivered to the Returning Officer or posted to him. If delivered it must reach him before 5 o'clock on the afternoon of 21st January, 1927; if posted, it must be posted not later than that day and bear the postmark of that or an earlier day, and it must reach the Returning Officer not later than 5 o'clock on the afternoon of 26th January, 1927.

8. (1.) A voting-paper shall be informal in any of the following cases :—

- (a.) If the elector votes more than once.
- (b.) If in any way the paper fails to indicate clearly the order of preference of the candidates.
- (c.) If, being delivered, the voting-paper is not received by the Returning Officer before the close of the poll.
- (d.) If, being posted, it does not reach him by 5 o'clock p.m. on the 26th January, 1927, or if from the postmark on the envelope or otherwise the Returning Officer is satisfied that it was not posted until after the day of the election.

(2.) No ballot-paper shall be informal merely because the voter omits to mark more than one preference.

9. (1.) At 10 o'clock a.m. of the sixth day after the closing of the poll the voting-papers, having been put in a ballot-box and there thoroughly mixed, shall be drawn out in succession, and before inspection shall be stamped with consecutive numerals.

(2.) The voting-papers shall then be sorted into bundles according to the first preference of the voters, and the voting-papers in each bundle shall be counted.

(3.) Every candidate who has a number of first preference votes not less than the quota, as defined in clause ten hereof, shall be declared elected, and so many of the voting-papers containing these votes as shall be equal to the quota (being those stamped with the smallest numerals) shall be set aside, in respect of each elected candidate, as of no further use for the purposes of the ballot.

(4.) On all other voting-papers the name of the elected candidate, or of every elected candidate if more than one has been declared elected, shall be cancelled so as more clearly to indicate the voters' order of preference. These papers will then be severally transferred to the candidates having the next preference, and any candidate then having a number of votes at least equal to the quota shall be declared elected.

(5.) The process hereinbefore described of setting aside in respect of each elected candidate a number of voting-papers equal to the quota, of cancelling on the remaining papers the names of the elected candidates, and of transferring those voting-papers to the several remaining candidates in order of the voters' preferences shall be repeated as often as may be required: Provided that, for the purposes of the second or any later

transfer of any surplus voting-papers, those voting-papers that have already been once transferred shall be set aside as of no further use, before any voting-paper that has not been transferred is set aside.

(6.) If, after carrying out the aforesaid process as far as possible, the whole number of candidates required has not been elected, the candidate having the fewest votes shall be declared not elected, and his votes shall be distributed among the remaining candidates according to the voters' preferences.

(7.) If the whole number of candidates required to be elected has not then been elected, the process described in the foregoing provisions shall be repeated so far as may be necessary, until the election has been completed.

10. The quota necessary to elect a candidate shall be ascertained by dividing the total number of valid votes by a number larger by one than the number of members to be elected, and increasing the quotient by one and disregarding fractions.

11. Each candidate may, by writing under his hand, appoint one scrutineer, who may be present at the examination of the voting-papers and the counting of the votes by the Returning Officer.

12. The Returning Officer shall, immediately after counting the votes, seal up all voting-papers, and transmit the whole to the Clerk of the Magistrate's Court, at Wellington, who shall keep the same for six months thereafter, and shall not open or permit to be opened such packet, except on the order of some Court of competent jurisdiction, and shall at the end of six months effectually destroy the same.

13. Forthwith after the completion of the election the Returning Officer shall, by notice exhibited on the outside of the office of the University of New Zealand, notify the names of the persons elected and shall also, by writing signed by him, notify the result of the election to the Minister of Education.

14. The Returning Officer and every scrutineer shall be required faithfully and impartially to perform the duties of their offices, and shall not directly or indirectly make known the state of the poll or give or pretend to give any information by which the state of the poll may be known before the final declaration thereof by the Returning Officer, or make known for which candidate any voter has voted, or otherwise communicate to any person any information likely to defeat the secrecy of the ballot.

15. If any dispute or question arises touching the regularity of the election, such dispute or question shall be determined by a Stipendiary Magistrate in manner provided by sections 58 to 67 of the Local Elections and Polls Act, 1925, all the provisions of which shall, with the necessary modifications, apply.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the Education Act, 1914, and the amendments of that Act, and of all other powers enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth revoke the regulations at present in force relating to training colleges, and in lieu thereof doth make the regulations set forth in the Schedule hereto; and, with the like advice and consent, doth prescribe that this Order shall be deemed to have come into force on the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven.

SCHEDULE.

TRAINING COLLEGES.

CONTROL AND ORGANIZATION.

1. FOR the purpose of the following regulations the "University district" means the University district in which a training college is situated, and the "University college" means the University college in such University district.

2. The Board of any district in which any teachers' training college is situated (hereinafter referred to as the Board) shall have the entire control and management of such college, subject to the provisions hereinafter contained.

3. (1.) For every training college there shall be a Committee of Advice, consisting of the Chairman or other member of the Board, the Senior Inspector of the education district, a representative of the Professorial Board of the University college, and a representative of the Boards of such other education districts as are situate wholly in the University district, to be chosen, if there be more than one other such district, in such manner as the Minister of Education shall determine.

(2.) The Committee of Advice shall meet at least twice in each year. The first meeting shall be called by the Chairman of the Board, and shall be held not later than the month of March. Any subsequent regular meeting shall be at a time to be fixed by the Committee, but other meetings may at any time be called on the joint request of two members of the Committee, or on the initiative of the Chairman. The Principal of the training college shall be present at all meetings of the Committee of Advice, except when questions affecting his personal or professional status are under discussion.

4. (1.) With each training college shall be affiliated one normal school and one associated normal school, both of which shall be regarded as practising schools, and may be so designated. Every such practising school shall include—

(a.) A "main school," organized as a "mixed school," having children of all classes from Class P to Class S6; and

(b.) Such "model schools" as may be approved by the Minister, each model school being of one of the following types, namely,—

(i.) A rural public school of Grade II (hereinafter designated Model I) under one teacher, with not more than forty children on the roll.

(ii.) A junior school (hereinafter designated Model II) under one teacher, with not more than forty-five children of Classes P to S2 on the roll.

(iii.) A special class of children of school age, with not more than thirty children on the roll, such class being hereinafter designated Model III.

(iv.) A junior kindergarten class or classes (hereinafter designated Model IV), with not more than forty children between the ages of three and five on the roll; but children so enrolled shall not be reckoned in computing the average attendance of the practising school.

(v.) A class or classes organized as the secondary department of a district high school, with not more than fifty-five pupils on the roll.

(2.) For the purpose of giving students wider observation of and practice in teaching methods any teachers of public schools, and with the approval of the controlling authorities any teachers of secondary schools and technical high schools, may be selected by the Board to supervise and report on the work of such students as are sent to observe and practise teaching in the classes under the charge of the said teachers. The head teacher or Principal of any school to which students are sent shall be responsible for the efficient carrying-out of all arrangements pertaining to the training of the students in his school. The selection of teachers for this purpose shall be made on the recommendation of the Principal of the training college after consultation with an Inspector of Schools, and with the Principals or head teachers concerned.

5. (1.) The organization of the training college and of the practising schools shall be such as is approved by the Director of Education.

(2.) No uncertificated teacher shall be appointed to the staff of a practising school unless he possesses special qualifications approved by the Minister.

(3.) No probationer or probationary assistant shall be assigned to a practising school.

6. (1.) After consultation with the Committee of Advice the Board shall make recommendations to the Minister regarding appointments to the staff of the training college and of each practising school, and on receipt of the Minister's approval thereto the Board shall make appointments accordingly. Except in regard to the appointments of the Principal and Vice-Principal of the training college and the headmaster of each practising school, the Committee of Advice may delegate its function in this respect to the Senior Inspector of Schools.

(2.) In making appointments to the staff of each practising school the Board shall, in addition to considering applications received for any position, take into consideration the advisability of appointing by transfer any teacher in the district whose qualifications for the position are superior to those of any of the applicants.

7. (1.) The following shall be the staff of the training college:—

(a.) Principal: Salary £700 per annum, rising to £750 per annum by annual increments of £25.

(b.) Vice-Principal: Salary £575 per annum, rising to £650 by annual increments of £25.

(c.) One or more Lecturers as approved by the Minister. Salary, not exceeding in any case £430 per annum, rising to £475 per annum by annual increments of £15, together with a married allowance of £50.

(d.) Such Lecturers' assistants as may be approved by the Minister. Salary, £200 per annum.

(e.) Warden of Women Students, who shall, on the recommendation of the Principal, be selected from the staff either of the training college or of the normal school, and who shall receive an addition of £30 to the salary otherwise provided under these regulations.

(f.) The person holding the position of Tutor and Librarian when these regulations come into force shall remain on the staff of the training college until he is offered a transfer to another position in the Education service without loss of salary, and shall perform such duties as may be assigned to him by the Principal with the approval of the Director.

(2.) The following shall be the staff of the normal school:—

(i.) Head Teacher: Salary £600 per annum, rising to £650 per annum by annual increments of £25:

Provided that the salary and house allowance of any head teacher of a normal school appointed previous to the coming into operation of these regulations shall not be reduced so long as he remains in the same position.

(ii.) First Assistant Master, with a salary of Grade 4.

(iii.) Kindergarten Mistress, with a salary of £340-£385.

(iv.) One assistant, male or female, with a salary of Grade 3; two female assistants with salaries of Grade 2, with an additional £30 per annum; and two male assistants with salaries of Grade 2.

(v.) Such additional assistants at salaries of Grade 2 as are required to make up the total number of assistants to the number provided by the Regulations respecting Salaries of Teachers and Staffing of Public Schools, or to such greater number as the Minister may approve.

- (vi.) Assistant in charge of Model I, with salary of £325-£370.
- (vii.) Assistant Mistress in charge of Model II, with salary of Grade 2, with an additional £30.
- (viii.) Assistant Mistress in charge of Model III, with salary of Grade 2, with an additional £30.
- (ix.) Assistant Mistress in charge of Model IV, with salary of Grade 2.

(x.) In the secondary department, if the number of pupils in yearly average attendance is not more than thirty an assistant with a salary of Grade 3; and, if the number of pupils in yearly average attendance is more than thirty, a male assistant teacher with a salary of Grade 4 and a female assistant teacher with a salary of Grade 2, with an additional £30.

(3.) The associated normal school shall be staffed and the salaries paid in accordance with the regulations for public-school staffs and salaries, provided that an assistant teacher with a salary of Grade 2 shall be substituted for each probationary assistant, and provided further that the head teacher shall receive an addition to salary of £40 per annum, assistants of Grades 2 and 3 an addition of £30 per annum, and assistants of Grade 1 an addition of £20 per annum.

(4.) Where circumstances render it advisable the staffing and salaries for a training college and for a practising school as prescribed in this clause may, with the approval of the Minister, be modified in such manner as he shall determine.

(5.) A married assistant on the staff of a normal school shall be entitled to additional salary of £50 per annum under the same conditions as if he were an assistant in a public school other than a normal school.

(6.) (a.) Any teacher, other than the head teacher, on the staff of a normal school shall receive by way of addition to the salary hereinbefore provided such grading addition as he would have been entitled to receive under the regulations relating to salaries of public-school teachers if he were a teacher on the staff of a public school other than a normal school.

(b.) Any teacher, other than the head teacher, on the staff of a normal school not entitled to an addition to his salary as provided in paragraph (a) of this subclause shall receive by way of addition to the salary otherwise payable under these regulations such amount, not exceeding in any case £50 per annum, as may be approved by the Minister.

(7.) A teacher other than the head teacher on the staff of a normal school shall be entitled to the same annual increment as public-school teachers of the same grade. Those not receiving grade salaries will receive annual increments of £15.

(8.) The provisions of the regulations relating to public-school teachers respecting commencing salaries, salaries on transfer, leave of absence, and annual increments shall apply, *mutatis mutandis*, to staffs of training colleges and normal schools; and should any dispute or difficulty arise respecting the meaning or effect of these regulations the question shall be submitted to the Minister, whose decision thereon shall be final.

(9.) The grades of salaries referred to in this clause are the grades of salaries prescribed for assistant teachers of public schools.

(10.) (a.) No member of the staff of a training college shall be employed as assistant to the Professor of Education in a University college unless it is shown to the satisfaction of the Minister that the work for the latter college is done outside the ordinary training-college hours and that the duties in the training college are not interfered with; and unless the Minister approves of the conditions of employment in the University college and the remuneration therefor.

(b.) All the members of the staff of the normal school shall be deemed to be also members of the staff of the training college, and shall take such part in the tuition, training, and supervision of the students as the Principal may direct and the Director approve.

(c.) All the members of the staff of the associated normal school shall be required to assist in providing the students with such training and practice in the art of teaching as the Principal may direct.

8. (1.) The following grants shall be paid to the Board:—

- (a.) For the incidental expenses of the practising schools, the same grants as are prescribed under the Act for public schools with the same average attendance.
- (b.) For the incidental expenses of the training college, the upkeep of the college library, and the provision of clerical assistance, such grants or allowances as the Minister may approve.
- (c.) Where expert assistance, not provided by the regular staff of the training college, is found to be required for instruction of students in manual work, elocution, singing, and other special subjects, such additional grants, not exceeding £200 per annum, as the Minister may approve.

- (d.) For material approved by the Director as necessary for the instruction of the students in science and handwork, such annual grants as may be required.
- (e.) For fittings and permanent apparatus for use in the instruction of students in science and handwork, such grants as the Minister may from time to time determine: provided that the purchase of such fittings and apparatus is first approved by the Director.
9. Applications for admission as training-college students shall be sent in the first place to the Education Board of the district in which the applicants reside, and shall then be forwarded with such comments as the Senior Inspector desires to make to the Education Board controlling the training college. The applications shall then, as far as the numbers to be admitted under the various divisions from each education district are concerned, be dealt with as the Minister may direct, provided that no distinction shall be made between applicants residing within the education district in which such training college is situated and applicants residing outside that district.
- (10.) (a.) Students of Divisions A, B, and C shall in the first instance be admitted to a teachers' training college for a period of one year, but the Director may extend this period to two years or three years in the case of those students who are recommended therefor by the Principal.
- (b.) At the end of his training-college course of one, two, or three years, as the case may be, a student may be required to complete his training by serving for one year as a probationary assistant, and such period of training shall be counted as service for the purpose of subclause (1) of clause 16 hereof.
- (c.) The Principal of the training college shall, after consultation with the Director, recommend to each Education Board the probationary assistants who should be selected and attached to schools in accordance with Schedule 1 of clause 4 of the Regulations for the Staffing of Public Schools.

Studentships of Division A.

11. (1.) To be admitted in Division A an applicant must satisfy all the following conditions—namely, he must—
- (a.) Have within one year and six months immediately preceding—
- (i.) Completed his course as a probationer in some education district in accordance with regulations, and since his appointment as a probationer made progress in his studies to the satisfaction of the Senior Inspector of Schools for the district: or
- (ii.) Completed to the satisfaction of the Director a full-time two years' course as a student teacher in a technical school since his appointment as a student teacher, and made progress in his studies to the satisfaction of the Director: provided that in special cases, approved by the Director, such student teachers who have completed not less than one year of service may be admitted if otherwise eligible: or
- (iii.) Completed to the satisfaction of the Director a two years' course of training at a kindergarten school under the control of a kindergarten association maintaining free kindergarten schools recognized by the Education Department for purposes of subsidy, and obtained at least a partial pass in the Teacher's Class D Examination:
- (b.) Give satisfactory evidence of his suitability for the work of teaching (*e.g.*, by a certificate to that effect signed by the Senior Inspector of Schools):
- (c.) Give satisfactory evidence as to moral character and produce a satisfactory certificate of health from a School Medical Officer, or, where this is impracticable, from a duly qualified medical practitioner approved by the Director:
- (d.) Enter into a bond as prescribed in clause 16 hereof.
- (2.) The allowances payable to a student in Division A shall be at the rate of £85 a year for a male and £80 for a female student, together with the fees of the University College classes attended by the student, with the approval of the Director.
- (3.) In the case of a student who is obliged to live away from home or his usual place of residence in order to attend the training college there shall be paid to the Board controlling the college an allowance of £30 per annum, and the Board may, at its discretion, either—
- (a.) Provide board and residence in a hostel under its control at a charge to the student of not more than £25 per annum in addition to the £30 boarding-allowance; or
- (b.) Pay to the student the boarding-allowance of £30 per annum, provided that the place of board and residence is approved by the Board on the recommendation of the Principal.

(4.) In the case of a student who lives at home, but is obliged to travel more than four miles daily each way in order to attend the training college, there may be paid the actual cost of travelling (not exceeding £10 per annum).

Studentships of Division B.

12. (1.) To be admitted in Division B a student must satisfy all of the following conditions—namely, he must—

(a.) Be not less than seventeen years of age, and have obtained a higher leaving certificate, or a partial pass in accordance with regulations in the Class D Certificate Examination, or have obtained some other educational qualification that, in the opinion of the Director, is equivalent thereto :

(b.) Comply within six months of the date of admission with such conditions as to probation in teaching as the Principal of the training college, with the approval of the Committee of Advice, may require :

(c.) Satisfy conditions (c) and (d) as for students in Division A.

(2.) The allowances payable to a student in Division B shall be those set out in subclauses (2), (3), and (4) of clause 11 hereof for a student in Division A, except that the allowance provided in subclause (2) shall be £65 for a male and £60 for a female student.

Studentships of Division C.

13. (1.) To be admitted in Division C a student must satisfy all of the following conditions—namely, he must—

(a.) Be a graduate of a recognized University, or have, as a matriculated student, satisfactorily completed a two years' course at a recognized agricultural college or at a school of home science recognized by the University of New Zealand, or have obtained some other educational qualification that, in the opinion of the Director, is equivalent thereto :

(b.) Give such evidence of teaching ability or promise as the Principal, with the approval of the Committee of Advice, may require :

(c.) Undertake to devote his whole attention to subjects of professional study and practice under the direction of the Principal :

(d.) Satisfy conditions (c) and (d) as for a student of Division A.

(2.) The allowances payable to a student in Division C shall be at the same rate as that for a student in Division A.

Short-period Studentships, Division D.

14. (1.) To be admitted in Division D a student must satisfy all of the following conditions—namely, he must—

(a.) Have passed in Group I of the examinations for Class D, or have obtained some other educational qualification that, in the opinion of the Director, is equivalent thereto :

(b.) Have been, for such period as may be approved by the Director, regularly employed in teaching in a registered school or schools :

(c.) Be deemed, on the certificate of an Inspector of Schools, worthy of further training in professional work :

(d.) Satisfy condition (c) as for a student of Division A.

(2.) The course for a student of Division D shall be for such period, being not less than three months or more than one year, as the Principal, with the approval of the Committee of Advice, shall determine, and shall be wholly professional or partly academic and partly professional, at the discretion of the Principal.

(3.) The allowances payable to a student of Division D shall be at the annual rate of the allowances payable to a student of Division B.

15. Notwithstanding anything in the above provisions the Principal may, on the recommendation of an Inspector of Schools, admit to the training college, for such period as the Director may approve, any teacher of a registered school for the purposes of observation of the methods of teaching. No allowances shall be payable in such cases.

General.

16. (1.) Every student of Division A, B, or C shall enter, by his parent or guardian, or by some other person approved by the Board and the Minister, into a bond with the Minister to return the amount paid in allowances and fees in case he shall fail to complete his course of training whether as a student or as a probationary assistant, or be dismissed on the grounds named in subclause (2) of clause 29 hereof, or fail to complete within the time required such term of service as a teacher as is prescribed in a public school, in a secondary or technical school, or in a free kindergarten school

under a kindergarten association maintaining free kindergarten schools recognized by the Education Department for the purposes of subsidy, or in any school under the control of the Department, or in a University college in New Zealand. The bond shall be on the form supplied by the Department, and shall provide—

- (a.) In the case of a male student, for a teaching service of not less than five years, to be completed immediately after the close of the training-college course :
- (b.) In the case of a female student, for a teaching service of not less than three years, to be completed immediately after the close of the training-college course :

Provided that the Director may, in special circumstances, approve of an extension of time within which the prescribed service shall be completed.

(2.) No allowances shall be paid to or for any student of Division A, B, or C until the said bond has been executed.

17. (1.) A studentship shall not be tenable with a Junior Scholarship of the University, or a Senior National Scholarship, or any other scholarship, unless it is shown to the satisfaction of the Director that the holding of such scholarship would not interfere with the student's training as a teacher.

(2.) None of the allowances named in clauses 11 to 14 hereof shall be payable in the case of any student for a greater period than three years ; nor shall any allowances be payable to a student for any period during which he has been in receipt of salary or allowance as a teacher, pupil-teacher, or probationer.

18. University college fees shall not be paid in respect of any classes at which the students' attendances and progress have not been satisfactory, and if such fees have been paid, the amount shall be deducted from any allowances due to him, or be otherwise recoverable from him by the Board.

19. In no case shall the number of students admitted in any year under Divisions B, C, and D conjointly be so great as thereby to make the total number of all students in attendance at the training college more than 250, or such larger number as the Minister may decide.

20. (a.) All allowances to students shall, subject to the restrictions named in these regulations, be paid monthly, save that the first payment of a student's allowance may be a quarterly payment.

(b.) The provisions of the regulations relating to the granting of leave of absence to public-school teachers shall apply, *mutatis mutandis*, to students in attendance at training colleges.

CURRICULUM.

21. The curriculum of each training college shall provide for a three years' course of training, and shall be subject to the approval of the Director of Education.

22. (1.) Every training college shall make provision for the following :—

- (a.) Instruction in the principles and history of education (including elementary psychology), in school and personal hygiene (inclusive of ambulance work), and in methods of teaching :
- (b.) Courses in elementary practical science as suited to the requirements of public schools, namely—
 - (i.) An approved course of general experimental science.
 - (ii.) General agriculture on the lines of the prescriptions for the Teachers' Class D and Class C Examinations.
 - (iii.) General nature-study.

(It is to be understood that the main purpose of the courses named in paragraph (b), and to a material extent the purpose of the courses named in paragraphs (c) and (d), is to train the students in the methods of teaching the subjects named.)

(c) Courses in—

- (i.) Kindergarten work ;
- (ii.) Elementary handwork, in accordance with the requirements of the public schools :

(d.) Courses in—

- (i.) Physical instruction (including swimming), which may be arranged with the Director of Physical Instruction ;
- (ii.) Singing ;
- (iii.) Drawing ;
- (iv.) Needlework (for women) :

(e.) Opportunities for observation of the child and of the methods of teaching and school-management :

(f.) Sufficient, regular, and co-ordinated practice in teaching.

(2.) The opportunities for observation of the child and of the methods of teaching referred to in paragraph (e) shall be provided at the practising schools, or in any class or classes of a school or schools within convenient

distance of the training college, if the teacher or teachers of such class or classes are approved for this purpose in terms of clause 4 hereof.

23. In the arrangement of the curriculum special regard shall be paid to the opportunities of instruction presented by the lectures given at the University college, and, where possible, the general education of the student shall in the main be so continued; but no student shall be permitted to take University classes that are, in the judgment of the Principal, inconsistent with the requirements of his professional course, nor shall a student be permitted to take classes forming a recognized step towards a University degree unless his capacities and attainments are of a character to fit him therefor without detriment to the interests of his training as a teacher.

24. With the limitations and exceptions contained in clauses 23 and 25 hereof, no course of training for any student shall be deemed complete that does not include attendance at at least one course of lectures in a subject other than education at the University college, together with the following:—

- (a.) The subjects named in paragraph (a) of clause 22 hereof:
- (b.) A course of nature-study, and at least one other of the courses named in paragraph (b) of clause 22 hereof; such courses in elementary science occupying two hours a week, half of which must be devoted to individual practical work: Provided that any student who completes, to the satisfaction of the Principal, a course in science in a University college may be excused from all elementary science except nature-study:
- (c.) At least two of the courses named in paragraph (c) of clause 22, the total time devoted to elementary science and handwork together being not less than four hours a week:
- (d.) All the courses named in paragraph (d) of the clause, two hours a week being given to physical instruction:
- (e.) Observation of the child and of methods of teaching and practice in teaching as prescribed in paragraphs (e) and (f) of clause 22, the time devoted to observations and practice being, in general, not less than four hundred hours in the course. It is important that the observation should be such as to form a basis for the work in elementary psychology and the principles of education, and that the practice should be regular and co-ordinated.

25. (1.) Students who are University graduates, or who have satisfactorily completed an approved course of not less than two years at an agricultural college or at a school of home science recognized by the University, or who have already satisfied the requirements of the examination for Class C, may be excused from attendance at University lectures; such students, together with those who have already passed in the subject for Class D or for Class C, may also be excused from needlework. Exemption from attendance at science may also be granted in the case of graduates who have taken a science subject in their degree course, and of students who have completed an approved course of two years at an agricultural college.

(2.) A student who is taking a science course at the University college may be exempted from attendance at a science class at the training college during the year in which he is so attending.

(3.) Students who have, in the opinion of the Supervisor of School Music, no ear for music may be excused from attendance at singing if an equivalent therefor, approved by the Director, is taken as indicated in clause 26 of the Regulations for the Examination and Classification of Teachers.

26. The observation of methods of teaching for which provision is made shall include particularly observation of the methods of teaching English, arithmetic, drawing, singing, nature-knowledge, geography, civics, as prescribed for public schools. It shall also include either (a) methods of teaching as specially adapted to the requirements of infant classes; or (b) the methods of teaching the following subjects in secondary classes—English, elementary mathematics, and the elementary stages of a foreign language; or (c) the methods adopted in teaching two or more branches of elementary science and handwork as suited to the requirements of the higher primary classes. The practice in teaching shall correspond thereto.

CERTIFICATES.

27. At the close of their period of training, students duly admitted under these regulations as students of Division A, B, or C, who have satisfactorily completed the prescribed course of work during their attendance at the training college, and who are favourably reported upon in respect both of professional promise and of educational progress, may, on the recommenda-

tion of the Principal of the college and with the concurrence of the Director of Education, receive, without further examination, in such subjects as are approved for this purpose by the Director, and subject to compliance with the necessary conditions of service, age, and health, as prescribed by the regulations for the time being in force for the examination and classification of teachers, a trained teacher's certificate, which shall rank in respect of attainment with certificates of Class C or with certificates of Class D, as may in each case be determined. The recommendations should be based mainly on the results of a final examination covering the work during the year and of a standard at least equal to the attainment demanded by the Department in the Teacher's Certificate Examinations, although not necessarily covering the same syllabus.

GENERAL.

28. (1.) Subject to the general control and management of the Board, the Principal shall have full control of the staff of the practising schools and training college and of the students; he shall also have power to arrange for the several courses of instruction in accordance with the requirements named above, to allot to himself and the other members of the staff such subjects of instruction as he may find convenient and the Committee of Advice may approve, to choose text-books and to determine the course of study and training of each student.

(2.) A statement shall be furnished to the Professorial Board giving the names of all training-college students in attendance at the University college, and the classes approved by the Principal for each student, in order that the Professorial Board may be in a position to report to the Principal on the progress made by the students.

29. (1.) Every student shall, when required by the Director, submit to re-examination by a School Medical Officer or other approved medical practitioner.

(2.) The Board may at any time, on receipt of a report from the Principal, dismiss a student, or direct him to cease attendance at the training college, on the ground of neglect of duty or gross misbehaviour, and all allowances to such student shall thereupon cease.

(3.) A studentship may also be terminated at any time if it shall appear to the Board and the Minister that the holder does not possess sufficient aptitude for the teaching profession to warrant further expenditure in training, or is considered on the report of a School Medical Officer to be physically unfit to continue his course of training.

30. The Principal shall make an annual report to the Board on the work of the training college, and the Board shall forward that report, with such other report as it may desire to make, to the Minister of Education before the 31st January in each year.

31. Every training college shall be open at all times to the visits of the Director or Assistant Director, or of any Inspector, or of any member of the Committee of Advice, or of any other person appointed by the Minister to visit such training college.

said Dominion, do hereby order and declare that the reserve for recreation in the Southland Land District described in the Schedule hereto shall be and the same is hereby brought under the operation of and declared to be subject to the provisions of Part II of the said Act; and such reserve shall hereafter form part of the Croydon Bush Domain, and be managed, administered, and dealt with as a public domain by the Croydon Bush Domain Board.

Making Regulations for controlling the Traffic on Lake Taupo and the Management of Wharves erected therein, and prescribing Dues for the Use thereof.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this 13th day of December, 1926.

Present:

THE HONOURABLE W. DOWNIE STEWART PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is provided by the Harbours Act, 1923 (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), that in harbours where there is no Harbour Board the Governor-General in Council shall have all the powers, functions, duties, and authorities by the said Act conferred upon Harbour Boards, and may, in cases where such powers would be exercised under by-laws to be made by a Board, exercise the same under regulations to be made in the manner provided in section two hundred and thirty-four of the said Act: And whereas there is no Harbour Board having jurisdiction in Lake Taupo, which is a harbour within the meaning of that term as defined by the said Act:

And whereas by section fourteen of the Native Land Amendment and Native Land Claims Adjustment Act, 1926 (hereinafter termed "the special Act"), the power to make regulations thereby conferred is declared to include the power in so far as there may not be a provision for doing so under the Harbours Act, 1923, to license boats and vessels plying for hire over or upon the waters referred to in the said section, with the further powers therein set out:

And whereas by Order in Council made on the thirteenth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and sixteen, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* on the sixteenth day of the same month, at page 3568, regulations under the Harbours Act, 1908, now enuring under the said Act, were made for controlling the traffic on the said lake and for the management of the wharves erected therein, and to prescribe dues for the use thereof:

And whereas it is desirable to revoke the said regulations, and to make others in lieu thereof:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by section nine of the said Act and section fourteen of the special Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, doth hereby revoke the said regulations, and doth hereby make the regulations hereinafter contained, and doth order that the same shall, on and after the date of this Order in Council, apply to Lake Taupo and the wharves aforesaid.

REGULATIONS.

1. (a.) IN these regulations, where not inconsistent with the context,—

"Department" means the Minister having charge of the Department of Internal Affairs, and any person acting for, by, or under the direction of such Minister:

"Lake" includes Lake Taupo and all other waters referred to in section 14 of the special Act:

"Vessel" includes steamer, ship, launch, and boat:

"Master boatman" includes any officer, licensed or otherwise, in charge of any vessel:

"Licensed" includes any vessel or master boatman licensed under these regulations:

"Wharf" means any wharf as defined by the Harbours Act, 1923, and under the control or jurisdiction of the Department.

(b.) These regulations may be cited as the Taupo Harbour Regulations, 1926.

2. All vessels plying on the lake, and all master boatmen in charge of same, shall be under the direction of the Department, and subject to these regulations.

WHARVES, JETTIES, AND MOORINGS.

3. The Department shall have power to close any wharf or any portion thereof whenever in its opinion it is advisable to do so, and the wharf or portion thereof so closed shall not be used for traffic.

4. No person shall be allowed on any wharf or in the sheds or buildings used therewith unless he has, in the opinion of the Department, legitimate business thereon.

5. No person shall disobey the orders of the Department or its officers when acting in the due performance of their duty, nor in any way obstruct the traffic on any wharf, pier, jetty, or landing-place, nor make use of abusive or improper language thereon.

6. No person shall scribble upon, cut, scratch, or otherwise deface any part of any wharf, or any shed thereon or connected therewith.

7. Any person who accidentally or otherwise damages or destroys any of the Department's property shall be liable for the cost of repair or renewal thereof.

8. No pitch, tar, resin, or other combustible matter shall be lighted or heated on board of any vessel while lying alongside or near any other vessel or wharf.

9. Every master boatman shall on all occasions, when ordered by the Department, do whatever the Department may consider necessary or expedient with the view to the safety and interest of the whole shipping, and in consideration of the state of the weather or any other circumstance.

10. It shall be an offence under these regulations to anchor or moor a vessel or boat in such a manner as to obstruct the approach to any wharf, and any such vessel may be removed by the Department at the risk and expense of the owner.

11. The Department may order any vessel to be removed from any berth alongside any wharf, or from any anchorage, to any part of the lake, whenever in the opinion of the Department such removal is proper for the general accommodation of shipping, and it shall be the duty of the master boatman to obey such order.

12. Every vessel arriving at a wharf shall be moored where directed by the Department, and shall not remain moored at any wharf for a period exceeding one hour without the permission of the Department. If deemed necessary, the Department may order the removal from a wharf of any vessel as soon as its passengers (and cargo, if any) have been landed. In all cases licensed vessels shall have prior right to moor at any wharf, as against unlicensed vessels.

13. All goods shall be removed from the wharves within three hours of their being placed thereon. Any goods not so removed may be removed by the Department at the owner's risk and expense.

14. No person shall throw fish, cans, or other refuse, or empty tins into the lake within half a mile of the shore.

15. Every owner of a vessel shall have a permanent mooring placed in such position as may be approved by the Department and which shall leave room for the adjacent vessels at all times to swing clear. The position of such mooring shall be clear of the fairway and of all wharves (whether under the control or jurisdiction of the Department or not) and of all approaches thereto.

The moorings shall be of a substantial and permanent nature, and every part thereof, except a floating buoy and a rope or chain attaching such buoy to the rest of the mooring, shall be sunk entirely below the bed of the lake.

WHARFAGE DUES.

16. The following dues shall be payable to the Department for the use of the wharves on the said lake:—

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The above annual charge due shall be payable in advance on the 1st day of January in each year. Any vessel using the wharves only between the 1st day of July and 31st day of December of any year shall pay one-half of the amount of the above annual wharfage fees.

17. All vessels which do not pay wharfage dues for a period of one year in advance shall be deemed to be irregular trading-vessels, and wharfage dues shall be payable accordingly for each occasion they come alongside any wharf.

18. All wharfage dues payable by irregular trading-vessels shall be paid to the Department, or to some one appointed by it to receive them, the payments to be made by the master or owner of the vessel upon application.

VESSELS.

19. Vessels shall not ply for hire, nor carry passengers or cargo, nor be employed as ferry-boats or tug-boats, without being licensed by the Department for such purposes.

20. Applications for licenses must be made in writing, in Form No. 1 set out in the Schedule hereto, signed by the owners working the vessel, and addressed to the Department, and shall give full details of the dimensions and description of the vessel and engine, if any.

21. Before any license is issued, the vessel must, unless subject to survey under the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and its amendments, be inspected by the Department, which will determine whether the vessel is in a seaworthy condition and properly equipped for the safety and comfort of passengers, or for any other purpose for which the vessel is to be licensed, as the case may require. The license shall also specify the number of passengers and the quantity of cargo the vessel may carry, such number and quantity shall be as provided in the certificate of survey granted by the Marine Department.

22. The license shall be carried at all times on the boat, and shall be open for inspection by the Department, or by any passenger at any time on demand.

23. The license shall be in the Form No. 2 set out in the Schedule hereto.

24. A card shall be supplied with each license giving the name of the vessel, the main dimensions, and the number of passengers and quantity of cargo which it is licensed to carry. This card shall be exhibited at all times in a conspicuous position on the vessel.

25. Every vessel licensed to carry passengers or cargo shall have its name legibly painted in a conspicuous position on the hull.

26. No vessel shall carry more passengers, cargo, ballast, water, or otherwise than the number or quantity allowed in the license.

27. No license under these regulations shall be held to give any right to carry cargo in any vessel until the requirements of the Customs laws and regulations have been duly complied with.

28. A condition of every such license shall be that the applicant shall keep such vessel fully equipped with proper gear and in a seaworthy condition, and properly marked, as required by these regulations.

29. No vessel shall be fumigated or smoked for the extermination of vermin while lying alongside any wharf or other vessel.

30. Proper tarpaulins shall be used in discharging or taking in ballast, coals, rubbish, gravel, earth, or filth of any kind, so as to prevent any part thereof from falling into the lake.

31. Fees for licenses shall be paid to the Department according to the following scale per annum:—

For each vessel or boat plying for hire: 5s. per annum.

Every mechanically propelled boat shall be allowed one dinghy not exceeding 12 ft. in length, and the name of the licensed vessel shall be clearly painted on such dinghy. All other rowing-boats employed for hire, or as ferry-boats, or as watermen's boats shall be licensed as above.

32. All licenses shall be issued for such periods only as shall expire on the 31st December in any year, but these may be renewed year by year at the discretion of the Department.

33. Applications for renewals of licenses must be sent in writing to the Department at least seven days before the expiry of the existing license.

34. Steamships at all times when under way must have a responsible person in charge of the ship, and also a responsible person in charge of and attending to the engine. The utmost care must be taken by the person or persons in charge to prevent accidents to other vessels.

35. If the master of any vessel that is being navigated within the lake neglects to observe any of the "Regulations for preventing Collisions at Sea" which may from time to time be made by His Majesty's Order in Council (which regulations are by section 191 of the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, brought into force in the Dominion), he shall, in addition to any liabilities he may incur by so doing, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

36. Whenever the hatch of a vessel is open for the purpose of working cargo or otherwise, and there is not sufficient daylight for persons working at or near it or passing near it to see clearly that it is open, then the master of the ship shall place a light or lights at such hatch of sufficient brilliancy to enable persons to see that it is open, and shall maintain such light during the time the hatch is so open and insufficiently lighted.

37. After work has ceased for the day on board of any vessel all hatches shall be put on and properly secured to prevent accidents; and before closing the hatches an officer of the vessel shall go into the hold and into the between-decks and satisfy himself that there are no signs of fire.

38. The officer appointed by the Department may at any time inspect or measure any vessel plying on the lake, or test the accuracy of any measurement, and may appoint the

time, place, and manner when, where, and in which such measurement or inspection shall be made; and, if he finds that these regulations are not duly complied with, he may suspend or cancel the license for any such vessel.

39. The expense of measuring or re-measuring, and of marking, such vessels shall be borne and paid by the owner or owners of such vessels; and if any such expense has been incurred by the Department no license shall be issued until the owner has repaid the same to it.

MASTER BOATMEN AND WATERMEN.

40. No person shall act as master of a steamboat, ferry-boat, tug-boat, or launch unless he is the holder of a master boatman's license issued under these regulations, but this regulation shall not apply to a duly certificated master while acting as master of any vessel subject to survey under the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and its amendments.

41. No person shall drive or ply for hire within the lake, nor use any vessel for the conveyance of passengers, cargo, ballast, water, or otherwise, unless he is the holder of a master boatman's license or a waterman's license issued under these regulations.

42. Applications for a master boatman's license or a waterman's license must be made in writing, on Form No. 3 set out in the Schedule hereto, signed by the person seeking to be licensed, and addressed to the Department, and must be accompanied by a full statement of the qualifications and experience of the applicant.

43. The fee for each master boatman's license or waterman's license shall be 2s. 6d. per annum.

44. Before any license is issued to a master boatman or waterman, the applicant must prove to the satisfaction of the Department, or some person appointed for the purpose, that he possesses a competent knowledge of the management of his craft, also that he is a person of respectability and free from intemperate habits.

45. Every license for a master boatman or waterman shall be in the Form No. 4 set out in the Schedule hereto.

There shall be from time to time endorsed on every license by the officer appointed for the purpose the names of the vessels with which the licensee shall ply for hire.

46. Every license issued to any person under these regulations shall expire on the 31st day of December of the year in respect of which it is issued.

47. The fares to be charged by master boatmen or watermen shall not exceed those shown in the table of fares, which the Department is hereby authorized to make and to alter from time to time as it deems expedient.

48. Any licensed master boatman or waterman found guilty of dishonest or improper conduct, or of using abusive or insulting language, or of plying with a boat which the Department shall consider to be not fully equipped with proper gear and not in a seaworthy condition, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 and to have his license cancelled or suspended, at the discretion of the Department.

49. Any licensed master boatman or waterman who shall carry in any vessel more passengers or cargo than the vessel has been licensed to carry, and any licensed master boatman or waterman who shall demand more than the proper fare, or who shall without sufficient reason refuse or neglect to take a passenger in his boat when required, or who shall ply for hire with a vessel other than that named in his license or in any endorsement thereon, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

50. Any licensed master boatman or waterman lending his license to any other person shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

GENERAL.

51. Licenses shall be issued by the Department after they have been signed, numbered consecutively, and the particulars thereof entered in a book to be kept for that purpose.

52. The Department is hereby empowered to take such means and to give such orders and directions as it deems necessary for the purpose of preventing risk or accident, confusion, or overcrowding of boats alongside of vessels; and any person wilfully disobeying any orders so given shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

53. Any person obstructing or impeding the navigation of the lake, or obstructing any landing-place, by any vessel, cable, warp, or other article, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5; and in case such obstruction or impediment be not removed when ordered by the Department, it may cast off, cut, or remove any such obstruction or impediment at the risk and expense of the master or owner thereof.

54. If any person fails, refuses, or neglects to do anything required by these regulations, or in any manner obstructs, impedes, or interferes with the doing of anything enjoined or authorized to be done, or wilfully does anything prohibited by these regulations, or fails to comply with any condition

of a license issued under these regulations, every such person so offending shall, where no other penalty is imposed by these regulations, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on me by section twenty-five of the Naval Defence Act, 1913, and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in that behalf, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, do hereby amend and supplement the regulations referred to in the Schedule hereto as shown therein.

SCHEDULE.

REGULATIONS FOR THE GOVERNMENT AND PAYMENT OF THE NEW ZEALAND DIVISION OF THE ROYAL NAVY.

REGULATION No. 4, paragraph 3, between "Division" and "shall" in first line, insert "except those under training in the training establishment who shall be granted fourteen days' leave at Christmas, fourteen days at Easter, and fourteen days in August"; at the end of paragraph 3 insert "Permanent New Zealand Ratings proceeding to England for courses, &c., may, subject to the exigencies of the service, be granted ten days' leave before sailing; such leave to be in addition to the annual allowance. On returning to New Zealand, ratings are to be granted foreign service leave at the rate of seven days per six months and one day per complete month of absence from the Dominion."

Pensions in respect of Death or Disablement of Members of the New Zealand Naval Forces.

Commence by inserting:—

1. (i.) In the event of the death of any member of the New Zealand Naval Forces by misadventure, suffered in the performance of his duties, there may be paid out of the Consolidated Fund, to or on behalf of his dependants, an allowance by way of pension at rates not exceeding the rates that would be payable if he had been a member of the Forces within the meaning of the War Pensions Act, 1915, and if his death had been due to service with those Forces.

(ii.) In the event of the disablement of any member of the New Zealand Naval Forces by reason of misadventure suffered in the performance of his duties, there may be paid out of the Consolidated Fund to that member, and to or on behalf of his dependants, an allowance by way of pension at rates not exceeding the rates that would be payable if he had been a member of the Forces within the meaning of the War Pensions Act, 1915, and if his disablement had been due to service with those Forces.

(iii.) All applications for pensions under this section shall be referred to the War Pensions Board under the War Pensions Act, 1915, and the Board shall, with respect to the hearing of such applications, have the same powers as if the application were an application under that Act.

(iv.) In making any recommendation for the grant of a pension under this section the Board shall take into consideration any amount paid by way of pension, retiring-allowance, compensation, or compassionate allowance out of the Public Account, or out of any superannuation fund, in respect of the death or disablement of the person in respect of whose death or disablement the application is made.

(v.) For the purposes of this section the term "New Zealand Naval Forces" means the Naval Forces established under the Naval Defence Act, 1913; and the term "dependants," in relation to a member of the said Force, has the same meaning, with the necessary modifications, as in the War Pensions Act, 1915.

2. Nothing in the foregoing shall reduce the powers conferred upon the Naval Board by Regulation No. 37 of Order

in Council of the 20th June, 1921, making regulations under the provisions of the Naval Defence Act, 1913.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this 6th day of December, 1926.

THE HONOURABLE W. DOWNIE STEWART PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS, there being no Harbour Board empowered to grant the license hereinafter mentioned, Thomas Percival Lane, of Rawene (who with his executors, administrators, and assigns, is hereinafter referred to as "the licensee"), has applied to the Governor-General in Council for a license under the Harbours Act, 1923 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), to occupy a part of the foreshore below low-water mark at Rawene, in Hokianga Harbour, as a site for a store, and, in accordance with the one-hundred-and-seventy-first section of the said Act, has deposited a plan in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington (marked M.D. 6283), showing the place where it is intended to construct such store, the area of foreshore and land below low-water mark intended to be occupied for such purpose, and the manner in which it is proposed to erect the said store on the site marked as an extension to site number 8 on the said plan:

And whereas it has been made to appear to the Governor-General in Council that the proposed work will not be or tend to the injury of navigation, and the said plan has, prior to the making of this Order in Council, been approved by the Governor-General in Council:

And whereas it is expedient that a license under the said Act, for the purpose aforesaid, should be granted and issued to the licensee on the terms and conditions hereinafter expressed:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said license is required by the licensee as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the licensee to use and occupy that part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark which is particularly shown and delineated as an extension to site number 8 on the plan so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of maintaining thereon a store constructed in accordance with the said plan, such license to be held and enjoyed by the licensee upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto.

D

SCHEDULE.

1. In these conditions the term—

"Foreshore" means such parts of the bed, shore, or banks of a tidal water as are covered and uncovered by the flow and ebb of the tide at ordinary spring tides:

"Low-water mark" means the low-water mark at ordinary spring tides:

"Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to that part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark necessary for the construction of the store as shown on an extension to site No. 8 of the plan M.D. 6283.

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council the licensee shall pay to the Minister the sum of £2 10s., and thereafter an annual sum of £5 in advance, payable on the 1st day of April in each year, the proportionate part of such annual rental in respect of the period from the date hereof until the 31st day of March following to be paid on the licensee being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.

4. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, over, and out of the said store without payment.

5. The licensee shall maintain the above-mentioned store in good order and repair, and shall at all times exhibit therefrom, and maintain at the licensee's own cost, any lights that may be required by the Minister; provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

6. Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said store and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the licensee in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such store, requiring the licensee, within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, the licensee shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

7. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the licensee to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1923, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

8. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the licensee shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

9. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, and the licensee may be required to remove the store at the licensee's own cost, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensee three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the licensee in New Zealand:

10. The licensee shall be liable for any injury which may be sustained by any vessel or boat in passing the store, or by contact therewith, and which may be occasioned by any default or neglect on the licensee's part.

11. In case the licensee shall—

(1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;

(2.) Cease to use or occupy the said store for a period of thirty days;

(3.) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause 3 of these conditions; or

(4.) Become bankrupt or be brought under the operation of any law for the time being in force relating to bankruptcy,—

then and in any of the said cases this Order in Council and every right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any notice to the licensee or other proceedings whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensee and to all persons concerned or interested that this Order in Council, and the rights and privileges thereby conferred, have been revoked and determined.

12. In the event of this Order in Council being revoked for any reason whatsoever, or upon the expiry of the period for

which the license is granted, the licensee shall, if required by the Minister so to do, remove the said store entirely from the site and restore the site to its original condition within three months from the date of revocation or expiry, as the case may be; and, if the licensee fails so to do, the Minister may cause the said store to be removed and the site so restored, and may recover the costs incurred by the said removal and restoration from the licensee.

13. The construction of the store shall be deemed to be an acceptance by the licensee of the conditions of this Order in Council.

The total births registered for the urban areas amounted to 1,229 as against 1,086 in October—an increase of 143. The deaths in November were 473—a decrease of 32 as compared with the previous month. Of the total deaths males contributed 257, females 216. Fifty-two of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 10.99 per cent. of the whole number. Forty-five of these were under one year of age.

Declaring New Zealand to be a Reciprocating State within the Meaning of the Judgments (Reciprocity) Acts (Victoria).

NEW ZEALAND DECLARED A RECIPROCATING STATE WITHIN THE MEANING OF THE JUDGMENTS (RECIPROCITY) ACTS.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Lieutenant-Colonel the Right Honourable Arthur Herbert Tennyson, Baron Somers, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Companion of the Distinguished Service Order, Military Cross; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, being satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made by the Legislature of New Zealand (the same being a part of His Majesty's Dominions outside the United Kingdom and the Commonwealth of Australia) for the enforcement within such part of judgments as defined by section 2 of the Supreme Court Act, 1923, so far as the same relate to Victorian Judgments, Orders, and Awards, do now under the powers conferred by section 3 of the Judgments (Reciprocity) Act, 1925, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, declare New Zealand to be a reciprocating State for the purposes of the Judgments (Reciprocity) Acts, and that the said Acts shall extend and apply to all parts of New Zealand.

- (d.) Common prostitutes, and persons who habitually consort with thieves or persons who have no lawful visible means of support.
- (e.) Professional tipsters, persons convicted of house-breaking or pocket-picking, forgery, uttering or possessing counterfeit coin, theft, false pretences, receiving stolen goods, mischief, assault, or any offence or crime of any kind under the Crimes Act, 1908, and also idle and disorderly persons, rogues, and vagabonds, and incorrigible rogues convicted under the Police Offences Act, 1908, and persons convicted of an offence under the Gaming Act, 1908.
