SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF NOVEMBER, 1926.

On account of numerous intense westerly disturbances November proved a wet, windy, and cold month—rainfall being in excess of the average in all parts of the country except at a few places in Hawke's Bay and Otago. The outstanding feature of the month was the severe floods in Westland in the beginning of the month. Through the exceptional rise in the Buller River, Westport experienced one of the worst floods in the history of that town. The heavy rains at the end of the previous month had soaked the land and swollen the streams, while much snow had also fallen in the mountains. On the 3rd November an extensive westerly disturbance brought further heavy rain, and this combined with the melting of the snow accounted for record floods. About the same time the Waimakirir River, in Canterbury, rose to an abnormal height, and inundated much of the surrounding country.

During the month thunderstorms were rather frequent, and one in Hawke's Bay on the 12th did considerable damage to orchards.

Several light frosts occurred, particularly in the South Island, and the cold southerly which brought snow to the uplands on the 27th and 28th caused loss in newly-shorn sheep. Shearing and haymaking were greatly retarded, and growth in Anticyclonic conditions ruled between the 20th and 24th, and this was the longest period of generally fair weather

experienced during the month.
