2. The maximum rate of travelling-allowance payable to members of the said Board while travelling in the Dominion shall be £1 per diem, plus actual locomotion expenses.

3. The charge payable by way of levy on all fruit produced in a district in which Part I of the said Act is for the time being in operation and intended for export, shall be 1d. per case.

4. Any moneys payable under clause 3 hereof shall be paid to the Board immediately upon the shipment of the fruit from the Dominion.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him by the Education Act, 1914, and the amendments of that Act, and of all other powers enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the regulations at present in force relating to the Intermediate Examination, and in lieu thereof doth make the regulations set forth in the Schedule hereto; and, with the like advice and consent, doth prescribe that this Order shall have effect on and from the first day of October, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven.

SCHEDULE.

THE INTERMEDIATE EXAMINATION.

SPECIAL EXAMINATION FOR SENIOR FREE PLACES.

1. AN examination to be termed the Intermediate Examination shall be held annually in the month of November or December at such convenient centres as the Director of Education shall appoint, and shall be open to candidates of either sex who desire to obtain a qualification by examination for a Senior Free Place in a secondary school, district high school, or technical school.

2. The examination shall in general be held at the same time and places as the Public Service Entrance Examination.

CANDIDATES' NOTICES.

3. Every candidate for the Intermediate Examination must give notice to sit for such examination. Such notice must be on the form provided, and must be addressed to the Director of Education, and sent so as to be delivered at the office of the Education Department, Wellington, not later than the 8th day of September preceding the examination. All such notices shall include the names of the optional subjects selected by the candidate.

These provisions notwithstanding, late applications received after the 8th day of September and on or before the 22nd day of September may be accepted by the Education Department, provided that the application is in each case accompanied by a receipt for a late fee of 10s. paid to the Public Account at some branch of the Bank of New Zealand.

4. A candidate at the Intermediate Examination may not at the same time be a candidate for a Senior National Scholarship or for the Public Service Entrance Examination.

A candidate who qualifies in the Senior National Scholarship Examination, or who passes the Public Service Entrance Examination, shall be deemed to have passed the Intermediate Examination.

SELECTION OF SUBJECTS.

5. Subject to any limitation hereinafter made, every candidate in the Intermediate Examination shall be examined (a) in the four subjects named below as constituting Group I of the examination schedule, (b) in one subject to be chosen by the candidate from Groups II or III, and (c) in any other subject or subjects to be chosen from Groups II, III, or IV, in accordance with such schedule, but so that the total possible maximum of marks assignable in all the subjects in which he is to be examined shall not exceed 2,000: Provided that any selection from Group II must include general experimental science, together with at least one, but not more than two, of the remaining subjects of the same group.

#### PASS CONDITIONS.

7. In order to pass the examination a candidate must gain not less than 33 per cent. in each of the subjects English and Arithmetic, and not less than 40 per cent. of the total possible maximum of marks assignable under these regulations.

8. In any case, if the marks assigned to a candidate's work in the subject of handwriting are less than 33 per cent., and in any other subject are less than 25 per cent. of the maximum assignable in that subject, such marks shall not be included in reckoning the candidate's aggregate of marks.

9. The legibility of handwriting and the setting-out of matter will in all cases be taken into account when assigning marks to papers in the various subjects.

#### STANDARD OF EXAMINATION.

10. The standard of the Intermediate Examination shall be approximately that of the Public Service Entrance Examination, and the same papers may be set for both examinations.

#### SCOPE OF EXAMINATION.

11. The scope and other limiting conditions of the examination in the several subjects shall be in all respects the same as those prescribed in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the 28th October, 1926, for corresponding subjects of the Public Service Entrance Examination.

#### PUBLICATION OF RESULTS.

12. As soon as may be after the examination, the names of candidates who pass the Intermediate Examination shall be published in the *New Zealand Gazette*. Candidates shall be notified of the result of the examination, and shall be entitled to receive a statement of the marks obtained in the several subjects.

For any other statement of marks obtained or certificate of results furnished to the candidate, a fee of 2s. 6d. shall be payable to the Public Account in the manner specified in clause 3 hereof for the payment of late fees.

(including tractors driven by gas, oil, or electricity, suited for use in warehouses, or upon wharves and pavements) 10 per cent. ad val.; and, in cases where such motor-vehicles are imported having bodies suited or designed for carrying passengers, an additional duty (herein referred to as "body duty") of 10 per cent. ad val. on any such vehicle (inclusive of the body): Provided that where the value for duty of any vehicle (inclusive of the body) exceeds £200 the body duty shall be: On £200 of such value, 10 per cent. ad val.; on the remainder of such value, 5 per cent. ad val.

(1.) When any body of a motor-vehicle suited or designed for carrying passengers is imported by itself or otherwise than as set out above, body duty shall be payable, and the Minister shall determine the amount of such body duty. The body duty so payable shall, as nearly as may be, be equal to the amount of body duty that would have been payable if such body had been imported as part of and attached to a motor-vehicle manufactured in the same country as the body.

(2.) Where the Minister is of opinion that any body duty is being or is likely to be evaded or avoided by the importation of any motor-vehicles without engines, tires, or other component parts which, in the ordinary course of business, are usually imported therewith, the Minister may, at his discretion, require that body duty shall be paid as if such engines, tires, or other component parts had been imported with such vehicles.

And in addition thereto, for every night's necessary absence from such place of abode	0	4	0

(b.) Provided that persons in receipt of salary or wages from the General Government will only be entitled to such allowances if necessarily absent at night from their usual place of abode. If not so absent such persons will be allowed their actual personal expenses only.

(c.) Witnesses residing beyond three miles from the town or city in which the Court is held will also be allowed their coach, railway, or steamboat fares. Second-class fares will be allowed to mechanics, labourers, and persons of similar rank, and first-class fares to others. Receipts must be furnished for coach and steamer fares over 5s.

When there is no public conveyance witnesses will be allowed a mileage rate of 9d. per mile one way.

(d.) Medical practitioners using their own motor-cars, or motor-cars hired for their personal use, whether public conveyances are available or not, will be allowed mileage at the rate of one shilling per mile one way for every mile between their place of residence and the place at which evidence is required to be given; provided, however, that in no case will mileage be paid for a greater distance than fifty miles.

#### OHAI RAILWAY BOARD.—BY-LAW No. 2.

Public Works Department,  
 Wellington, 21st January, 1927.

IN pursuance of the powers, provisions, and authorities contained in the Local Railways Act, 1914, and all amendments thereof, and of all other enabling powers, provisions, and authorities contained in any other Acts or otherwise vested in it, the Ohai Railway Board doth hereby, by this special order make and ordain the following by-law.

#### BY-LAW.

1. THIS by-law may be cited or referred to as the Ohai Railway Board By-law No. 2, and shall be read together with the by-laws passed by the Board on the 11th day of July, 1924.

2. "Booking station" means a station on the Board's line where there is a booking-office in charge of an officer of the Board.

3. Passengers may obtain tickets at any booking-station and passengers boarding a train at any station other than a booking-station may obtain tickets from the guard of the train.

4. Milk, cream, and milk or cream cans will be carried at the owner's risk in all respects, and the owner of any milk or cream or of any milk or cream cans being carried on the Board's railway shall be responsible for all the loading and unloading of the same.

5. The Board hereby fixes the fares and rates of freight set out in the following Schedule :—

Single tickets for local journeys at ordinary fares will be available for day of issue only.

Return tickets for local journeys at ordinary fares will be available for two days.

Ordinary tickets for local journeys will not be available for break of journey.

Through tickets which entitle the holders to travel over specified portions of the New Zealand Government lines in addition to the Board's line will, on the Board's line, be subject to the Department's regulations applicable to break of journey and period of availability.

2. Workers' Twelve-trip Tickets.

Twelve-trip tickets, for use on trains timed to run between 6 a.m. and 8 a.m. and between 3 p.m. and 5 p.m. on stated days will be charged as follows :—

Workers' twelve-trip tickets are available for a fortnight, including day of issue, and are not transferable or available for break of journey.

3. School Season Tickets.

Season tickets available for fourteen weeks will be issued to scholars and students holding school season tickets issued by the New Zealand Government Railways entitling the holders to travel from Wairio to stations on the Department's lines.

They will be available for travel from the date and on the day corresponding with the season ticket issued to the holder by the Railway Department, and will be charged as follows :—

4. School Boarders' Fourteen-trip Tickets.

Fourteen-trip tickets will be issued to school boarders holding school season tickets issued by the New Zealand Government Railways, entitling the holders to travel from Wairio to stations on the Department's lines.

They will be charged for at the following rates :—

School boarders' fourteen-trip tickets are available for seven weeks including day of issue, and are not transferable or available for break of journey.

5. Passengers' Luggage.

Passengers are allowed to take with them free of charge 112 lb. weight each (children travelling on half-tickets, 56 lb.) of personal luggage or goods for their own domestic use.

Workpeople travelling to or from work will be allowed to take free of charge (in addition to 112 lb. of bona fide personal luggage) up to 112 lb. weight of work-tools or work which they do at their homes.

For every 112 lb. or fraction of 112 lb. above the weight allowed the charge will be 1s.

6. Parcels.

Parcels will be charged for at the rate of 6d. for each 56 lb. or fraction of 56 lb. up to 224 lb.

7. Newspapers.

Single newspapers will be charged 1d. each.  
Packages of newspapers will be charged 3d. each.

8. Bicycles.

Bicycles (pedal), whether booked or accompanying passengers will be charged 9d. each.

Bicycles (motor), whether booked or accompanying passengers will be charged 3s. each.

Bicycles (motor) with side-car attached will be treated as motor-cars.

9. Dogs.

Dogs, whether booked or accompanying passengers, will be charged 9d. each.

Puppies or slut and puppies properly secured in hampers, crates, or boxes, so as to prevent injury to other goods will be charged at parcel rates.

10. Milk or Cream.

Milk or cream will be charged 6d. per can.

Empty milk or cream cans being returned will be carried free.

11. Corpses.

The charge for the conveyance of corpses will be 15s. each.

12. Goods.

Goods will be classified according to the classification set out from time to time in Part V of the Scale of Charges upon the New Zealand Government Railways :—

(1.) Goods of classes A, B, C, and D (consigned to stations except Nightcaps) will be charged at the rate of 5s. per ton. Minimum charge, 1s. 6d.

(2.) Goods of classes E, N, and P (consigned to stations except Nightcaps) will be charged at the rate of 3s. 4d. per ton. Minimum charge 1s. 6d.

(3.) Goods of classes A, B, C, D, E, N, and P, consigned to Nightcaps, will be charged at the rate of 1s. 8d. per ton. Dangerous goods will be charged at the rate of 3s. 4d. per ton. Minimum charge, 1s. 6d.

(4.) Goods of Classes F and Q will be charged at the rate of 1s. 8d. per ton. Minimum charge, 1s. 6d.

(5.) Lime for Manuring Farm Lands.—Lime booked through to stations on the Board's line and conveyed free of charge for any distance on the Government line will be charged free on the Board's line.

6. Goods of Class R will be charged for at rates as arranged from time to time.

(7.) Goods of Class H will be charged 6d. per bale.

(8.) Goods of Class K will be charged 8d. per 100 super feet. Minimum charge, 1s. 6d. In computing the charges for timber 50 ft. or under will be foregone; over 50 ft. will be charged as the next 100 ft.

(9.) Live-stock.—Goods of Class M (by arrangement) will be charged 10s. per four-wheeled wagon. Bogie trucks will be charged double rates.

13. Road Vehicles.

Carriages, motor-vehicles, carts, drays, express wagons, and wagons will be charged 7s. per four-wheeled wagon. Bogie trucks will be charged double rates.

14. Returned Empties.

Returned empties will be charged 6d. per cwt.

15. Weighing.

When weights are supplied to any persons requiring them the charge will be 3d. per ton. Minimum charge, 6d.

16. General.

Fractions of less than 1 cwt. in the tonnage will be taken as follows :—

- Under ¼ cwt. as ¼ cwt.
- Over ¼ cwt. but not over ½ cwt. as ½ cwt.
- Over ½ cwt. but not over ¾ cwt. as ¾ cwt.
- Over ¾ cwt. but not over 1 cwt. as 1 cwt.

Except where otherwise specified, in computing rates and charges, any fraction less than ¼ d. in the result will be omitted; ¼ d. or more will be taken as 1d.

In computing rates and charges odd fractions of a mile amounting to 5 chains and over will be taken as an additional mile; less than 5 chains will be omitted.

The foregoing by-law was duly made by special order passed at a meeting of the Ohai Railway Board held on the 12th day of November, 1926, and confirmed at a meeting of the said Board held this day at which last-mentioned meeting, the 20th day of December, 1926, was fixed as the day on which the said by-law should come into force.
