REGULATIONS.

INTERPRETATION.

1. IN these regulations—

“ Minister ” means the Minister of Lands :

“ Land Board ” and “ Commissioner of Crown Lands ” mean the Land Board and Commissioner of Crown Lands respectively for the land district in which the land affected is situated.

APPLICATIONS.

2. Every application for a license to occupy land under these regulations shall be made on the special form provided, and shall be accompanied by a license fee of £1 ls. and such declaration as may be required. Such form and declaration shall be prescribed by the Minister.

3. If two or more applications are received in respect of one allotment of land, the Land Board may determine which of the applicants, in its opinion, is most suitable to occupy the land. If the Board is unable to determine between the claims of any two or more applicants, it shall cause a ballot to be taken, in accordance with the regulations for the time being in force relating to ballots under the said Act.

4. The decision of the Land Board, either in regard to the suitability or otherwise of any applicant, the sufficiency of capital possessed by him, or any other matter connected with the allotment of any section, shall be final and conclusive.

5. Except on the recommendation of the Land Board, and with the approval of the Minister, a single woman shall not be eligible to apply for land under these regulations.

IMPROVEMENTS.

6. Within two years after the date of selection the licensee shall clear and bring under cultivation not less than one-tenth of the total area of his selection, and in addition thereto shall place upon the land substantial improvements of a permanent character to a value equal to not less than ten shillings per acre.

7. Within four years after the date of selection the licensee shall clear and bring under cultivation an additional area of not less than one-third of the total area of his selection, and in addition thereto shall place upon the land substantial improvements of a permanent character to an additional value of not less than ten shillings per acre.

8. Within six years after the date of selection the licensee shall have laid down in permanent cultivated grasses and clovers not less than one-half of the total area of the section, and have placed upon the land substantial improvements of a permanent character to a total value of not less than thirty shillings per acre.

9. Before any improvements are effected upon any of the lands disposed of under these regulations, a proposal setting out the improvements in detail shall be submitted for the approval of the Land Board.

10. All areas brought into cultivation, and all improvements placed upon the land, shall be maintained in good order and condition during the currency of the license. All areas brought under pasture shall be so maintained by the necessary application of manures.

FORFEITURES AND SURRENDERS.

11. If any licensee under these regulations shall fail from time to time to effect such improvements as may be prescribed by these regulations, or in any other manner shall commit any breach of any conditions to which his license is subject, whether express or implied, his interest therein shall be liable to be absolutely forfeited, and the land shall revert to His Majesty the King.

12. Any licensee under these regulations may, with the consent of the Minister, on the recommendation of the Land Board, surrender his interest in his license.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said license is required by the Council as aforesaid : and in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the Council to use and occupy those parts of the foreshore and land below low-water mark which are more particularly shown on the said plans, for the purpose of maintaining the said wharves thereon ; such license to be held and enjoyed by the Council upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the First Schedule hereto ; and doth further prescribe that on and after the date of this Order in Council the dues and rates set forth in the Second Schedule hereto shall be charged and taken by the Council for the use of the said wharves :

FIRST SCHEDULE.

CONDITIONS OF MANAGEMENT.

1. In these conditions the term—
 - “Foreshore” means such parts of the bed, shore, or banks of a tidal water as are covered and uncovered by the flow and ebb of the tide at ordinary spring tides;
 - “Low-water mark” means low-water mark at ordinary spring tides;
 - “Minister” means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.
2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the parts of the foreshore, and land below low-water mark adjacent thereto, necessary for the maintenance of the said wharves, at the sites shown on the plans hereinbefore specified.
3. All His Majesty’s subjects shall at all reasonable times, and upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the above mentioned wharves, and rights of ingress and egress thereto and therefrom.
4. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, over, and out of the said wharves without payment.
5. The Council shall maintain and keep the above-mentioned wharves and all erections on or in connection with the wharves in good order and repair; and shall at all times exhibit therefrom, and maintain at the Council’s own cost, suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels: provided that no new light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved by the Minister.
6. All dues and rates received on account of the said wharves by the Council shall be applied to keeping the said wharves and all erections on or in connection therewith in good order and repair.
7. Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said wharves and any buildings erected thereon or in connection therewith, and view the state of repair thereof; and upon the Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the Council in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharves or buildings, requiring the Council, within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to make good or repair the same, the Council shall, with all convenient speed, cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.
8. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharves shall be taken away by the Council and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.
9. The Council shall not erect, or suffer to be erected, on the said wharves any building or structure whatever, except with the consent of the Minister.
10. The Council shall keep a separate account of the receipts and expenditure on account of such wharves and premises, and shall cause such account to be balanced to the 31st day of March in every year, and shall send a copy of such account when balanced to the Minister, and shall supply any particulars in reference thereto as may be required by the Minister.
11. The Council shall appoint all officers necessary for the working and management of the wharves.
12. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the Council to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1923, or its amendments, or any regulation thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.
13. The rights, powers, and privileges hereby conferred shall continue in force for fourteen years, computed from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the Council shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.
14. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred under or by virtue of this Order in Council may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the Council three calendar months’ previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the Council in New Zealand.
15. The Council shall be liable for any injury which may be caused at the said wharves to any vessel or boat through any default or neglect on the part of the Council.
16. In case the Council shall—
 - (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them; or
 - (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said wharves for a period of thirty consecutive days;
 then and in either of the said cases this Order in Council and

every license, right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any notice to the Council or other proceeding whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the Council, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the licenses, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

17. In the event of this Order in Council being revoked for any reason whatsoever, or upon the expiry of the period for which the license is granted, the Council shall, if required by the Minister so to do, remove the said wharves entirely from the sites, and restore the sites to their original condition within three months from the date of revocation or expiry, as the case may be; and, if the Council fails so to do, the Minister may cause the said wharves to be removed and the sites so restored, and may recover the costs incurred by the said removal and restoration from the Council.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

PASSENGER WHARFAGE.

1. For every passenger landed on any wharf from any vessel by means of a boat or other tender from any vessel lying away from such wharf the sum of 2d. shall be paid, and the owner of the vessel from which the passenger is landed shall pay such charge to the Council immediately on the landing of such passenger:
2. The master of any such vessel landing passengers as aforesaid shall furnish to the Council a certified statement of the number of passengers so landed.

SHIPPING WHARFAGE.

For every vessel, the sum of 1d. per ton on the gross tonnage of such vessel per day or part of a day the vessel shall occupy a berth alongside any wharf or alongside of any other vessel using any wharf, or shall lie off any wharf with a line attached thereto, shall be paid: Provided that in respect of any vessel trading regularly throughout the year to any of the said wharves, the Council may, in its discretion, in lieu of the foregoing rate, charge and take in advance the amount hereinafter set forth for the use by such vessel of the said wharf:

Deer to cease to be Imported Game in Nelson Acclimatization District.

WHEREAS by a Warrant dated the eighth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-three, and published in *New Zealand Gazette* No. 80, of the fifteenth day of the same month (hereinafter referred to as the said Warrant), made under the Animals Protection and Game Act, 1921-22 (hereinafter referred to as the said Act), deer were declared to cease to be included in the Second Schedule of the said Act with respect to portions of certain acclimatization districts:

WHEREAS by the Extradition Acts, 1870 (a) to 1906 (b), it was amongst other things enacted that, where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, His Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and that His Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of His Majesty's Dominions specified in the Order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions, and qualifications as may be deemed expedient;

And whereas a Treaty was concluded on the eleventh day of November, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-four, between His Majesty and the President of the Czechoslovak Republic for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals, which Treaty is in the terms following:—

His Majesty the King of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India, and the President of the Czechoslovak Republic, having determined, by common consent, to conclude a treaty for the extradition of criminals, have accordingly named as their plenipotentiaries:

His Majesty the King of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India:—

Sir William George Tyrrell, K.C.M.G., K.C.V.O., C.B.,
Assistant Under-Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs;
And the President of the Czechoslovak Republic:

Dr. Emil Spira, Head of Department in the Ministry of Justice;

who having exhibited to each other their respective full powers, and found them in good and due form, have agreed upon the following articles:—

ARTICLE 1.

The High Contracting Parties engage to deliver up to each other, under certain circumstances and conditions stated in the present treaty, those persons who, being charged with or convicted of any of the crimes or offences enumerated in Article 2, committed within the jurisdiction of the one Party, shall be found within the territory of the other Party.

ARTICLE 2.

Extradition shall be reciprocally granted for the following crimes or offences, provided that such crimes or offences be indictable and be punishable in accordance with the laws of that part of the territories of the High Contracting Parties in which the person claimed is found:—

1. Murder (including assassination, parricide, infanticide, poisoning), and attempt to murder.
2. Manslaughter.
3. Administering drugs or using instruments with intent to procure the miscarriage of women.
4. Rape.

5. Carnal knowledge, or any attempt to have carnal knowledge, of a girl under fourteen years of age.

6. False imprisonment.

7. Child-stealing, including abandoning, exposing, or unlawfully detaining.

8. Abduction of a female with intent to have carnal knowledge.

9. Procuration.

10. Bigamy.

11. Maliciously wounding or inflicting grievous bodily harm.

12. Threats, by letter or otherwise, with intent to extort money or other things of value.

13. Perjury, or subornation of perjury.

14. Arson.

15. Burglary or housebreaking, robbery with violence, and larceny.

16. Fraud by a bailee, banker, agent, factor, trustee, director, member or officer of any company, embezzlement, and fraudulent conversion.

17. Obtaining money, valuable security or goods by false pretences; receiving any money, valuable security or other property, knowing the same to have been stolen or unlawfully obtained.

18. (a.) Counterfeiting or altering money and bringing into circulation counterfeited or altered money.

(b.) Knowingly making without lawful authority any instrument or engine adapted and intended for the counterfeiting of the coin of either State.

19. Forgery, or uttering what is forged.

20. Crimes or offences against bankruptcy law.

21. Any act done with intent to endanger the safety of any persons travelling or being upon a railway.

22. Malicious injury to property.

23. Dealing in slaves.

Extradition shall also be reciprocally granted for piracy and other crimes or offences committed anywhere at sea which, according to the laws of the High Contracting Parties, are extradition crimes or offences.

Extradition is also to be granted for participation in any of the aforesaid crimes or offences, provided that such participation be punishable by the laws of both Contracting Parties.

Extradition may also be granted at the discretion of the State applied to in respect of any other crime or offence for which, according to the law of both the Contracting Parties, the grant can be made.

ARTICLE 3.

Each Party reserves the right to refuse or grant the surrender of its own subjects to the other Party.

ARTICLE 4.

The extradition shall not take place if the person claimed has already been tried and discharged or convicted, or is still awaiting trial in the State applied to, for the crime or offence for which his extradition is demanded.

If the person claimed should be under examination or under punishment in the State applied to for any other crime or offence, his extradition shall be deferred until the conclusion of the trial or, in case of his conviction, until the full execution of any punishment imposed on him.

ARTICLE 5.

The extradition shall not take place if, subsequently to the commission of the crime or offence or the institution of the prosecution or the conviction thereon, exemption from prosecution or punishment has been acquired by lapse of time, according to the laws of either State.

ARTICLE 6.

A fugitive criminal shall not be surrendered if the crime or offence in respect of which his surrender is demanded is one of a political character, or if he proves that the requisition for his surrender has been made with a view to try or to punish him for a crime or offence of a political character.

The State applied to or the Courts of that State shall decide whether the crime or offence is of a political character or not.

ARTICLE 7.

A person surrendered can in no case be kept in custody or be brought to trial in the State to which the surrender has been made for any other crime or offence, or on account of any other matters, than those for which the extradition shall have taken place, until he has been set at liberty and has had an opportunity of returning to the State by which he has been surrendered.

This stipulation does not apply to crimes or offences committed after the extradition.

ARTICLE 8.

The requisition for extradition shall be made through the diplomatic agents of the High Contracting Parties.

The requisition for the extradition of a person charged must be accompanied by a warrant of arrest or other judicial document of like nature issued by the competent authority of the State demanding the extradition, and by such evidence as, according to the laws of the place where the person charged is found, would justify his arrest if the crime or offence had been committed there.

If the claim for extradition relates to a person already convicted, it must be accompanied by the sentence of condemnation passed on him by the competent Court of the State that makes the claim.

A person sentenced *in contumaciam* shall not be dealt with as a convicted person, but as a person charged.

The documents forwarded in support of the requisition shall be drawn up in the State (official) language of the State making it.

ARTICLE 9.

If the requisition for extradition be in accordance with the foregoing stipulations, the competent authorities of the State applied to shall proceed to the arrest of the fugitive.

ARTICLE 10.

A criminal fugitive may also be arrested before the requisition for his surrender is made, under a warrant or other judicial document of like nature issued by a competent judicial authority in either State, on such information or complaint and such evidence, or after such proceedings, as would justify the issue of a warrant or other judicial document of like nature if the crime or offence had been committed or the person convicted in that part of the territory of the two Contracting Parties in which the competent judicial authority exercises jurisdiction.

Notice of the date of his arrest shall be given forthwith to the diplomatic agent of the party claiming extradition.

The person arrested shall be discharged, in so far as the laws of the State where he has been arrested do not oppose, if within the term of forty days from his arrest a requisition for extradition shall not have been made, in accordance with the stipulations of this treaty, by the diplomatic agent of the State claiming his extradition.

The same rule shall apply to persons charged with or convicted of any of the crimes or offences specified in this treaty, and committed on the high seas on board any vessel of either State which may come into a port of the other.

ARTICLE 11.

The extradition shall take place only if the evidence be found sufficient, according to the laws of the State applied to, either to justify the committal of the prisoner for trial, in case the crime or offence had been committed in the territory of the same State, or to prove that the prisoner is the identical person convicted by the Courts of the State which makes the requisition, and that the crime or offence of which he has been convicted is one for which extradition may be granted under this treaty.

ARTICLE 12.

Warrants, depositions, and all other documents and copies thereof shall be accepted as evidence in support of a claim for extradition if they are signed or certified by a competent authority and are authenticated in the United Kingdom by the seal of a Secretary of State, and in the Czechoslovak Republic by the seal of the Minister of Justice.

ARTICLE 13.

If the individual claimed by one of the High Contracting Parties in pursuance of the present treaty should be also claimed by one or several other Powers on account of other crimes or offences committed within their respective jurisdictions, his extradition shall be granted to the State whose claim is earliest in date, unless such claim is waived.

This article shall not affect such treaties as have already previously been concluded by one of the Contracting Parties with other States.

ARTICLE 14.

If sufficient evidence for the extradition be not produced within two months from the date of the arrest of the fugitive, or within such further time as the State applied to, or its competent tribunal, shall direct, the fugitive shall be set at liberty in so far as the laws of the State where the person claimed has been arrested do not oppose.

ARTICLE 15.

All articles seized which were in the possession of the person to be surrendered at the time of his arrest, and any articles

that may serve as a proof of the crime or offence, shall be given up, if possible when the extradition takes place.

The State to whom extradition is granted shall nevertheless return any article so given up for a temporary purpose if the State granting extradition shall so require.

The above stipulations are subject to the rights of third persons, and are applicable only so far as the law of the State concerned permits.

ARTICLE 16.

Each of the High Contracting Parties shall defray the expenses occasioned by the arrest within its territories, the detention, and the conveyance to its frontier, of the persons whom it may have consented to surrender in pursuance of the present treaty.

The cost of supplying translations of the documents forwarded in support of the requisition under Articles 8 and 12 shall be defrayed by the party claiming extradition.

ARTICLE 17.

The stipulations of the present treaty shall be applicable, so far as the laws permit, to all His Britannic Majesty's Dominions, except to the self-governing Dominions hereinafter named—that is to say, the Dominion of Canada, the Commonwealth of Australia (including for this purpose Papua and Norfolk Island), the Dominion of New Zealand, the Union of South Africa, the Irish Free State, and Newfoundland—and India, provided always that the said stipulations shall be applicable to any of the above-named Dominions or India in respect of which notice to that effect shall have been given on behalf of the Government of such Dominion or India by His Britannic Majesty's Representative in the Czechoslovak Republic, and provided also that it shall be competent for either of the Contracting Parties to terminate separately the application of this treaty to any of the above-named Dominions or India by a notice to that effect not exceeding one year and not less than six months.

ARTICLE 18.

The requisition for the surrender of a fugitive criminal, who has taken refuge in any of His Britannic Majesty's self-governing Dominions, Colonies, or Possessions to which this treaty applies shall be made to the Governor-General, Governor, or chief authority, of such self-governing Dominion, Colony, or Possession by the chief consular officer of the Czechoslovak Republic in such self-governing Dominion, Colony, or Possession.

Such requisition may be disposed of, subject always, as nearly as may be, and so far as the law of such self-governing Dominion, Colony, or Possession will allow, to the provisions of this treaty, by the said Governor-General, Governor, or chief authority, who, however, shall be at liberty either to grant the surrender or to refer the matter to His Britannic Majesty's Government.

Requisitions for the surrender of a fugitive criminal emanating from any self-governing Dominion, Colony, or Possession of His Britannic Majesty shall be governed, as far as possible, by the rules laid down in the preceding articles of the present treaty.

ARTICLE 19.

It is understood that the stipulations of the two preceding articles apply in the same manner as if they were possessions of His Britannic Majesty, to the following British Protectorates, that is to say, the Bechuanaland Protectorate, Gambia Protectorate, Kenya Protectorate, Nigeria Protectorate, Northern Rhodesia, Northern Territories of the Gold Coast, Nyasaland, Sierra Leone Protectorate, Solomon Islands Protectorate, Somaliland Protectorate, Swaziland, Uganda Protectorate, and Zanzibar.

It is also understood that if, after the signature of the present treaty, it is considered advisable to extend its provisions to any British protectorates other than those mentioned above, or to any British-protected State, or to any territory in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations has been accepted by His Britannic Majesty, the stipulations of the two preceding articles shall be deemed to apply to such protectorates or States or mandated territories from the date prescribed in the notes to be exchanged for the purpose of effecting such extension.

It is further understood that the provisions of the present treaty which apply to British subjects shall be deemed also to apply to Natives of any British protectorate or protected State or mandated territory to which the stipulations of the two preceding articles apply or shall hereafter apply.

ARTICLE 20.

The present treaty, of which the English and Czechoslovak texts are equally authentic, shall come into force forty days after the date on which ratifications are exchanged. It may

be terminated by either of the High Contracting Parties by a notice not exceeding one year and not less than six months.

It shall be ratified, and the ratifications shall be exchanged at London as soon as possible.

In witness whereof the respective plenipotentiaries have signed the treaty and have affixed thereto their respective seals.

And whereas a Protocol was signed on the 4th day of June, 1926, in the terms following:—

PROTOCOL.

It being considered necessary to amend Article 12 of the Extradition Treaty between His Majesty the King of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India, and the President of the Czechoslovak Republic, which was signed at London on 11th November, 1924, the undersigned Plenipotentiaries have agreed that that Article shall be amended to read as follows:—

“Warrants, depositions, and all other documents and copies thereof shall be accepted as evidence in support of a claim for extradition if they are signed or certified by a competent authority, and are authenticated in the United Kingdom by the seal of a Secretary of State, and in the Czechoslovak Republic by the seal of the Minister of Justice or other Minister of State.”

The present Protocol shall have the same force and duration as the Extradition Treaty of 11th November, 1924, to which it relates. It shall be ratified at the same time as that Treaty, of which it shall be regarded as an integral part.

In witness whereof the respective Plenipotentiaries have signed the present Protocol and have affixed thereto their seals.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and in virtue of the authority committed to him by the said recited Acts, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the 15th day of December, 1926, the said Acts shall apply in the case of the Czechoslovak Republic, under and in accordance with the said Treaty of the 11th November, 1924, as amended by the said Protocol of the 4th June, 1926:

Provided always that the operation of the said Acts shall be and remain suspended within the Dominion of Canada so long as an Act of the Parliament of Canada, being Part I of chapter 155, of the Revised Statutes of Canada, 1906, and entitled “An Act respecting the Extradition of Fugitive Criminals,” shall continue in force there, and no longer:

Provided further, that the operation of the said Acts shall be and remain suspended within the self-governing Dominions hereinafter named, that is to say, the Commonwealth of Australia (including for this purpose Papua and Norfolk Island), the Dominion of New Zealand, the Union of South Africa, the Irish Free State and Newfoundland, and India, until notification shall have been made in the *London Gazette* that the Treaty, as amended by the said Protocol of the 4th June, 1926, has been made applicable thereto, and that on such notification being made in respect of any such Dominion or India the said Acts shall apply in such Dominion or India in the case of the Czechoslovak Republic under and in accordance with the said Treaty, as amended by the said Protocol of the 4th June, 1926, as from the date of the said notification.

This Order may be cited as the “Czechoslovakia (Extradition) Order in Council, 1926.”

Notice under the Shops and Offices Act, 1921-22, prohibiting the Sale within the Borough of Lyttelton of certain Goods comprised in the Trade of a Tobacconist.

WHEREAS a petition in writing signed by a majority of the occupiers of all the tobacconists' shops within the Borough of Lyttelton has been forwarded to me, desiring that the sale of certain goods comprised in the trade of a tobacconist—namely, tobacco, cigarettes, cigars, and toilet requisites—be prohibited during such time as the shops are required to be closed in pursuance of the Shops and Offices Act, 1921-22:

And whereas I, George James Anderson, Minister of Labour am satisfied that the sale of the said goods is comprised in the said trade within the said borough, and that the signatures to such petition represent a majority of the occupiers of all the said shops within the said borough:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of section 33 of the said Act, I do hereby direct that on and after the 21st day of February, 1927, the sale of the said goods within the said borough shall be and is hereby prohibited as follows: On Mondays, Tuesdays, and Wednesdays, after the hour of 7 p.m., and on Thursdays, Fridays, and Saturdays after the hour of 9 p.m., with the exception that on the working-day that first precedes Christmas Day and on the working-day that first precedes New Year's Day the sale of the said goods is not prohibited.

The notice dated the 15th November, 1922, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the 16th November, 1922, prohibiting the sale in the Borough of Lyttelton of certain goods comprised in the trade of a tobacconist is hereby cancelled as from the date of the coming into operation of this notice.

SIX scholarships are offered annually for competition by students attending schools of mines within the Dominion—three for the South Island, and three for the North Island.

2. The scholarships will be granted to those candidates who comply with the conditions and obtain the highest percentage of marks, which must not be less than specified in Regulation 9.

3. Holders of scholarships are required to attend during the University session at the University of Otago (no class fees will be charged on subjects contained in the curriculum of the Otago School of Mines), and during the long recess are also required to engage in approved practical work at one of the mines or batteries in the Dominion, or in the field with the New Zealand Geological Survey Department.

4. The scholarships will be of the annual value of £65 each to successful candidates who, while attending classes at the University of Otago, have to reside away from their homes, and of £45 to successful candidates who are able to reside at their homes while attending the University classes.

5. The scholarships will be tenable for three years, or for such other period more than three years as may at the discretion of the Minister appear to be necessary.

6. The scholarships will be open to all students as aforesaid who are not less than sixteen years of age on the day appointed for receiving applications, and who shall have attended regularly at any school of mines within the Dominion for not less than two years at least 80 per cent. of the lectures in each subject of the examination course: Provided that the Minister may grant such exemption from the provisions of this regulation as he thinks reasonable in any case where it was not practicable for a student to attend 80 per cent. of the lectures in a subject in which he wishes to be examined, or where no lectures were held in that subject at the school of mines at which he was a student.

7. The examinations will be held in or about the month of December in each year, on days which will be duly announced.

8. The examination will embrace six of the following subjects,—

- (1.) Mathematics.
- (2.) Elementary Mechanics.
- (3.) Theoretical Chemistry.
- (4.) Practical Chemistry and Quantitative Analysis.
- (5.) Electricity.
- (6.) Mechanical Drawing.
- (7.) General and Mining Geology.
- (8.) Metallurgy of Gold and Silver.
- (9.) (a.) Coal-mining; or (b.) Metal-mining.
- (10.) Winding, Haulage, and Pumping.
- (11.) Ventilation.
- (12.) Land and Mine Surveying.

Subjects 1, 2, or 3, and 5 are compulsory for all candidates, and each candidate must state in his application the branch of mining he intends to take up.

9. No scholarship shall be awarded to any candidate who does not obtain 60 per cent. of the marks in each of the six subjects.

10. The examination may be passed as a whole or in sections. In the latter case the first section must consist of not less than two subjects, and the whole examination must be concluded within three years from the date of the first application.

11. No payment on account of the scholarship will be made until the whole examination is passed.

12. Applications from candidates, accompanied by a fee of £1, and by a certificate from the Director of the school of mines stating the number of lectures which the student has attended in each subject, must reach the Mines Department, in Wellington, not later than the 1st November in each year.

13. Candidates must present themselves for examination on the day fixed, as provided in Regulation No. 7.

14. The Minister of Mines retains to himself the right of cancelling any scholarships should the holder attend irregularly or be reported for idleness or bad conduct.

15. Holders of scholarships having to pay more than £5 for their return railway or steamer fare to Dunedin will be paid by the Mines Department any excess over the sum of £5, but such payment will only be made once in each year.

16. These regulations supersede the further amended regulations published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the 13th March, 1924.
