SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF DECEMBER, 1926.

Precipitation during December was above normal over most of the Dominion, the only parts recording a deficiency being the central portion of the North Island and the West Coast districts of the South Island. Southerly winds and cold, changeable conditions prevailed during the first week of the month, owing to the presence of an intense storm eastward of the Dominion. A barometric pressure of 28.97 inches was reported from the Chatham Islands on the morning of the 3rd, while in New Zealand it averaged 0.75 inches higher. Westerly depressions passing in the South on the 11th and 20th respectively accounted for strong north-west winds generally and heavy rain in the western districts. districts.

Two disturbances were in evidence about Christmastide, one in the North bringing very heavy rain, but they neutralized each other so far as wind was concerned, though together accounting for mild, dull, and wet weather generally. The weather, on the whole, was very changeable for a summer month, and detrimentally affected haymaking and shearing operations.
