And whereas the said Court is of the opinion that it is in the public interest that the said road-lines should be proclaimed as public roads and a notification to that effect has been forwarded to the Minister of Lands, in terms of section fifty-one of the Native Land Amendment Act, 1913:

And whereas one month's notice in writing of the intention to proclaim the said road-lines as public roads has been given by the Surveyor-General to the local authority of the district concerned, in terms of section fifteen of the Native Land Amendment Act, 1914:

And whereas it is now expedient that the said road-lines should be proclaimed as public roads:

Now, therefore, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by section forty-nine of the Native Land Amendment Act, 1913, do hereby proclaim as public roads the road-lines described in the Schedule hereto.

Altering the Boundaries of the Hawke's Bay and Central Hawke's Bay Electric-power Districts.

A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Electric-power Boards Act, 1925, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby alter the boundaries of the Hawke's Bay and Central Hawke's Bay Electric-power Districts by excluding the area described in the First Schedule hereto from the Hawke's Bay Electric-power District, and including such area in the Central Hawke's Bay Electric-power District, and do hereby declare that the altered boundaries of the Hawke's Bay and Central Hawke's Bay Electric-power Districts shall be those described in the Second and Third Schedules hereto respectively.

Licensing the Pleasant Point Boat and Yacht Club to use and occupy a Part of the Foreshore and Land below Low-water Mark at Rat Island, in the Avon Estuary, Lyttelton Harbour, as a Site for a Boatshed and Slip.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 4th day of April, 1927.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS, there being no Harbour Board empowered to grant the license hereinafter mentioned under the Harbours Act, 1923 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), the Pleasant Point Boat and Yacht Club, of South New Brighton (who, with their executors, administrators, and assigns, are hereinafter called "the licensees"), have applied to the Governor-General in Council for a license under the said Act to use and occupy a part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark at Rat Island, in the Avon Estuary, Lyttelton Harbour, in order to erect and maintain a boatshed and slip thereon; and, in accordance with the one-hundred-and-seventy-first section of the said Act, has deposited plans in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington (marked M.D. 6319), showing the area of foreshore and land below low-water mark intended to be occupied, and the manner in which it is proposed to erect the said boatshed and slip :

And whereas it has been made to appear to the Governor-General in Council that the proposed work will not be or tend to the injury of navigation, and the said plans have, prior to the making of this Order in Council, been approved by the Governor-General in Council :

And whereas it is expedient that a license should be granted and issued to the licensees under the said Act for the purposes aforesaid, on the terms and conditions hereinafter expressed :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said license is required by the licensees as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the licensees to use and occupy that part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark on which the said boatshed and slip are to be erected, as shown on the plan M.D. 6319 so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of erecting and maintaining the said boatshed and slip, such license to be held and enjoyed by the licensees upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

1. In these conditions the term—
"Foreshore" means such parts of the bed, shore, or banks of a tidal water as are covered and uncovered by the flow and ebb of the tide at ordinary spring tides :
"Low-water mark" means low-water mark at ordinary spring tides :
"Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.
2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to that part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark necessary for the erection of the said boatshed and slip as shown on the plans marked M.D. 6319, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department as aforesaid.
3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council the licensees shall pay to the Minister the sum of £2 10s., and thereafter an annual sum of £1 in advance, payable on the 1st day of April each year, the proportionate part of such rental in respect of the period from the date hereof until the 31st March following to be paid on the licensees being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.
4. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all persons in the Government service acting in the execution of their duties, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, over, and out of the said boatshed and slip without payment.
5. The licensees shall maintain the above-mentioned boatshed and slip in good order and repair, and shall at all times exhibit therefrom, and maintain at the licensees' own cost, suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels ;

provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved by the Minister.

6. Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said boatshed and slip and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the licensees in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such boatshed and slip, requiring the licensees, within a reasonable time to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, the licensees shall with all reasonable speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

7. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the licensees to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1923, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

8. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the licensees shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege, without the written consent of the Minister first obtained.

9. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, and the licensees may be required to remove the boatshed and slip at the licensees' own cost, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensees three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the licensees in New Zealand.

10. The licensees shall be liable for any injury which the said boatshed and slip may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on the licensees' part.

11. In case the licensees shall—

- (1) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;
- (2) Cease to use or occupy the said boatshed and slip for a period of thirty days;
- (3) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause 3 of these conditions;
- (4) Become bankrupt, or be brought under the operation of the law for the time being in force relating to bankruptcy,—

then and in any of the said cases this Order in Council, and every license, right, power, or privilege thereby conferred, may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any notice to the licensees or other proceedings whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensees, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

12. In the event of this Order in Council being revoked for any reason whatsoever, or upon the expiry of the period for which the license is granted, the licensees shall, if required by the Minister so to do, remove the said boatshed and slip entirely from the site, and restore the site to its original condition within three months from the date of revocation or expiry, as the case may be; and, if the licensees fail so to do, the Minister may cause the said boatshed and slip to be removed and the site so restored, and may recover the costs incurred by the said removal and restoration from the licensees.

13. The erection of the said boatshed and slip shall be sufficient evidence of the acceptance by the licensees of the terms and conditions of this Order in Council.

1. THESE regulations may be cited as the Taupo Harbour Regulations Amendment No. 1.

2. The Taupo Harbour Regulations, 1926 (hereinafter referred to as "the said regulations"), are hereby amended by deleting the dates "thirty-first day of December," "first day of January," and "first day of July," wherever they occur in the said regulations (including the Schedule thereto), and substituting in lieu thereof the dates "thirty-first day of March," "first day of April," and "first day of October," respectively.

3. Every license issued and annual wharfage due received under the said regulations between the first day of January and the thirty-first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven, shall, subject to the provisions of the said regulations as to cancellation of licenses and of these regulations as to the payment of fees, continue in force and have effect until the thirty-first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight.

4. (1) In respect of every such license and annual wharfage due there shall be payable on or before the thirty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven, an additional fee equal to one-fourth of the amount of the fee payable in respect of a license issued or wharfage due received (as the case may be) for the whole year.

(2) The Department shall forthwith cause a receipt to be given to the licensee or payee for the payment of the additional fee and the production of such receipt shall be sufficient evidence, unless the contrary is proved, that the conditions prescribed by these regulations as to the continuance of the license or availability of the wharfage due until the thirty-first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight, have been complied with.

(3) If the holder of a license to which this clause relates fails to pay the fee herein required on or before the said thirty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven, his license shall expire on that date. Payment of the said fee after the thirty-first day of December aforesaid will not operate to revive a license that has expired as herein provided.

SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF JANUARY, 1927.

Notable features of the weather of January were the warmth, dryness, and absence of strong winds; more particularly during the latter half of the month.

The general precipitation was, in consequence, considerably below the average over most of the Dominion, excesses occurring at a few scattered places, chiefly in the far North and in the West Coast and southernmost portions of the South Island.

With the exception of a widespread westerly depression, which ruled between the 10th and 16th, and mostly affected the West Coast districts, only minor disturbances were experienced. In the first week conditions were rather unsettled owing to a shallow cyclone passing in the North. During this period some beneficial rains occurred in the northern and east coast districts of the North Island, accompanying thunderstorms in parts on the 2nd and 6th.

The early part of the month was favourable to crops and growth of grass, but the warm and dry weather of the latter half detrimentally affected the pasturage, particularly on light lands.
