Amending and Varying the Description of the Rotoiti Scenic Reserve

# CHARLES FERGUSSON, Governor-General. A PROCLAMATION.

W HEREAS by section twenty of the Native Land Amendment and Native Land Claims Adjustment Act, 1926, the Governor-General is authorized and empowered to amend and vary in such manner as he thinks fit the description in the Schedule to a Proclamation issued on the fourth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-three, setting apart portion of the Rotoiti Native Township as a scenic reserve in terms of section thirty-one of the Native Land Claims Adjustment Act, 1922:

And whereas it is desired to exclude from the land set apart

And whereas it is desired to exclude from the land set apart for scenic purposes by the Proclamation hereinbefore referred to the area described in Part I of the Schedule hereto, and to include within the boundaries of the scenic reserve the area described in Part II of the said Schedule:

Now, therefore, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by section twenty of the Native Land Amendment and Native Land Claims Adjustment Act. 1926, do hereby amend Native Land Claims Adjustment Act, 1926, do hereby amend and vary the description in the Schedule to the Proclamation issued on the fourth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-three, hereinbefore referred to, by excluding from the land referred to in the said description the areas described in Part I of the said Schedule hereto and by including therein the area described in Part II of the said Schedule, and I do further declare that the boundaries of the scenic reserve as amended by this Proclamation shall be as set forth in Part III of the said Schedule.

(c) The sinking fund of one per centum per annum is not the only source from which the said loan may be record.

#### REGULATIONS.

1. For the purpose of the first election of members of the Academic Board of the University of New Zealand by Professors of the University, the Registrar of the University shall be the Returning Officer.

- 2. The election shall be held on the 10th day of May, 1927, and the poll shall close at 5 o'clock on the afternoon of that day, and all votingpapers shall be included and counted which, not being informal in accordance with the provisions of clause 9 hereof, are received by the Returning Officer in due course of post before 5 o'clock in the afternoon of the 16th day of May, 1927, or are delivered to him before 5 o'clock on the afternoon of the 10th day of May, 1927.
- 3. The Registrar shall, not later than the 29th day of April, 1927, prepare a roll of the full names and addresses of the Professors of the University, and shall arrange the names in alphabetical order of surnames. Such roll shall be the roll used for the election to be conducted under these regula-
- 4. The roll shall be closed at the time when nominations close, and shall remain closed till the election is completed.
- 5. (1) The Returning Officer shall, not later than the 16th day of April, 1927, post a written notice to each elector informing him-
  - (a) The day and hour for the closing of nominations.

(b) The number of candidates to be elected.(c) The day and hour for the closing of the poll.

- (2) Every candidate shall be nominated in writing by one or more electors entitled to vote for his election. Each elector may nominate any number of candidates not exceeding eight.

  - (c) If it does not bear the consent of the candidate in writing, unless such consent is received by the Returning Officer before the nominations are closed.
- 6. (1) If the number of duly nominated candidates does not exceed eight the Returning Officer shall forthwith declare the candidate or candidates so nominated to be duly elected.
- (2) If the number of duly nominated candidates is greater than eight the Returning Officer shall, immediately after the closing of nominations, prepare and post to each elector whose name is on the roll, to his address,

a printed voting-paper containing in alphabetical order of surnames a list of all the duly nominated candidates.

If delivered, it must reach him before 5 o'clock on the afternoon of 10th May, 1927; if posted, it must be posted not later than that day and bear the postmark of that or an earlier day, and it must reach the Returning Officer not later than 5 o'clock on the afternoon of 16th May, 1927.

- 11. Each candidate may, by writing under his hand, appoint one scrutineer, who may be present at the examination of the voting-papers and the counting of the votes by the Returning Officer.
- 12. The Returning Officer shall, immediately after counting the votes, seal up all voting-papers, and transmit the whole to the Clerk of the Magistrate's Court, at Wellington, who shall keep the same for six months thereafter, and shall not open or permit to be opened such packet, except on the order of some Court of competent jurisdiction, and shall at the end of six months effectually destroy the same.
- 13. Forthwith after the completion of the election the Returning Officer shall, by notice exhibited on the outside of the office of the University of New Zealand, notify the names of the persons elected and shall also, by writing signed by him, notify the result of the election to the Minister of Education.
- 14. The Returning Officer and every scrutineer shall be required faithfully and impartially to perform the duties of their offices, and shall not directly or indirectly make known the state of the poll or give or pretend to give any information by which the state of the poll may be known before the final declaration thereof by the Returning Officer, or make known for which candidate any voter has voted, or otherwise communicate to any person any information likely to defeat the secrecy of the ballot.
- 15. If any dispute or question arises touching the regularity of the election, such dispute or question shall be determined by a Stipendiary Magistrate in manner provided by sections 58 to 67 of the Local Elections and Polls Act, 1925, all the provisions of which shall, with the necessary modifications, apply.

# PART I. AMENDING REGULATIONS AS TO ATTENDANCE REGISTERS; RETURNS; AVERAGE ATTENDANCE.

- 1. In this Part of these regulations, the expression "the said regulations" means the regulations relating to attendance registers, returns, and average attendance (as appearing in an Order in Council dated the 21st day of December, 1914, and published in the *Gazette* of the 7th day of January, 1915).
- 2. (1) Clause 9 of the said regulations is hereby amended by omitting from the first proviso thereto the words "shall be deemed," and substituting "may, at the discretion of the Board, be deemed."

  (2) The amendment to clause 2 of the said regulations appearing in
- (2) The amendment to clause 2 of the said regulations appearing in an Order in Council dated the 22nd day of March, 1926, and published in the *Gazette* of the 25th day of March, 1926, is hereby revoked as from the date thereof.

# PART II. AMENDING REGULATIONS AS TO TEACHERS' SALARIES, ETC.

- 3. In this Part of these regulations, the expression "the said regulations" means the regulations relating to teachers' salaries, grading, staffing, and other matters (as appearing in an Order in Council dated the 12th day of January, 1925, and published in the *Gazette* of the 15th day of January, 1925).
- 4. Clause 6 of the said regulations is hereby revoked, and the following substituted therefor:—
- "6. Married Allowance.—An assistant holding a permanent appointment, who is married or is a widower or widow, shall receive an addition of £50 per annum to the salary otherwise provided for in these regulations: Provided that no payment under this clause shall be made (a) to a married assistant whose husband or wife is employed in the Education Service or Government Service, or is otherwise employed to such an extent as to satisfy the Minister that an allowance under this clause should not be paid; or (b) to a widower or woman assistant unless the Minister approves such payment on account of the fact that he or she has a child under sixteen dependent upon and supported by him or her, or on account of other special circumstances; or (c) to an assistant who is provided with a free residence; or (d) in any special case if the Minister, taking into consideration the special circumstances, is of opinion that an allowance under this clause should not be paid."
  - 5. Clause 14 of the said regulations is hereby amended:—

(a) By adding to subclause (1) the following proviso:—
"Provided that the commencing salary payable in accordance with clause 4 of these regulations to an assistant of Grade I shall not be greater than £175 per annum in the case of a man nor £160 per annum in the case of a woman, unless the conditions required by the second proviso to clause 15 hereof for payment of an increment are complied with."

(b) By deleting from subclause (3), as made by Order in Council dated the 28th day of October, 1925, the words "nor than the salary

received by the teacher in any former position."

6. Clause 18 of the said regulations is hereby revoked, and the following substituted therefor:—

"18. If at any time between the annual grading of public schools on the 1st February in any year and the 1st February immediately following the quarterly average attendance of a school rises above the maximum or falls below the minimum average attendance of the grade or subgrade in which the school is placed to such an extent as to satisfy the Board or the Minister that the grade or subgrade of the school will be raised or reduced, and a position on the staff of such school thereafter becomes vacant, the grade of salary for such position shall, as from the date of such vacancy, be the grade of salary that would be attached to the position if the school were graded on the increased or reduced average attendance."

7. Teachers' Salaries.—Clause 19 of the said regulations is hereby revoked, and the following substituted therefor:—

"19. (1) Subject to the provisions of the next succeeding subclause, every teacher shall be entitled to be paid only in respect of the following periods:—

"(a) The period commencing on the school day on which he enters upon his duties and ending on the school day on which his duties cease, including any holidays that may intervene between those dates:

"(b) Any period of school holidays that may immediately succeed the day on which his duties cease as aforesaid; in the case of the mid-summer holidays such period shall be deemed to end not later than the 31st day of January in any year:

"(a) The period necessarily occupied in transferring from one position to another.

"(2) The last preceding subclause shall be read subject to the following special provisions, namely:—

"(a) A teacher who enters upon his duties during the first week in February in any year may be paid from the 1st day of February, inclusive, in that year.

"(b) A teacher who, during any year ending on the 31st day of January, has been on leave without pay for a period or periods exceeding in the aggregate five school days, shall be entitled to be paid only for such part of the school holidays during that year as is equal to one-fourth of his period of service as hereinafter defined.

"(3) Notwithstanding anything in paragraph (b) of the last preceding subclause, the Minister may in any case authorize the payment of salary in respect of the whole period of holidays or in respect of a greater portion of those holidays than is therein provided for.

"(4) For the purposes of paragraph (b) of subclause (2) hereof, a teacher's period of service shall comprise the actual period spent in teaching, together with any period during which the teacher has been on leave with full pay or half pay, but does not include any period of school holidays or any other period."

8. Clause 20 of the said regulations is hereby amended by adding the following subclause:—-

"(4) When a teacher holding a temporary position is permanently appointed to the same position he shall receive, from the date of such permanent appointment, a salary computed in accordance with clause 4 hereof (but not less in any case than his salary as a temporary teacher), together with the addition to his salary provided for by clause 5 hereof."

9. Clause 36 of the said regulations is hereby amended by inserting after the word "authorize" the words "or direct."

# PART III. AMENDING REGULATIONS AS TO LEAVE OF ABSENCE OF TEACHERS.

- 10. In this Part of these regulations, the expression "the said regulations" means the regulations relating to leave of absence of teachers (as appearing in an Order in Council dated the 12th day of December, 1924, and published in the *Gazette* of the 18th day of December, 1924).
  - 11. Clause 4 of the said regulations is hereby amended—
  - (a) By omitting from subclause (1) thereof the first three lines of the table of leave of absence set out therein and substituting the following:—

Under 3 months .. .. 5 school days.

Over 3 months and under 6 months . . 10 ,,

Over 6 months and under 9 months ... 20

(b) By revoking the proviso to subclause (4) thereof.

(c) By adding the following subclause:—

"(8) The period during which any teacher is on leave of absence and any adjustment of salary consequent thereon shall be computed in such manner as the Minister shall determine."

12. Clause 6 of the said regulations is hereby amended by omitting the proviso thereto, and substituting the following:

"Provided that salary at full or half rate may, under special circumstances from time to time defined by the Minister, be granted by the Board for a period not exceeding five school days. In each such case the circumstances shall be forthwith reported by the Board to the Department."

#### PART IV. AMENDING REGULATIONS AS TO JUNIOR HIGH SCHOOLS.

13. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in clause 9 of the regulations relating to junior high schools (as appearing in an Order in Council dated the 4th day of September, 1922, and published in the Gazette of the 7th day of September, 1922), the rates of salaries as prescribed by that clause may, in the case of any junior high school, be modified by the Minister in such manner as, having regard to any special circumstances, he considers desirable, but so that the total amount of salaries payable in respect of that school shall not exceed the amount that would be payable pursuant to the said clause.

## PART V.—AMENDING REGULATIONS AS TO TRAINING COLLEGES.

- 14. (1) Clause 7 of the regulations relating to training colleges (as appearing in an Order in Council dated the 13th day of December, 1926, and published in the Gazette of the 16th day of December, 1926), is hereby amended as from the 1st day of January, 1927,—
  - (a) By revoking paragraph (i) of subclause (2) thereof and substituting-"(i) Head teacher: Salary £540 per annum, rising to £590 per annum by annual increments of £25, together with a free residence or a house allowance of £60 per annum":

(b) By revoking paragraph (a) of subclause (10) thereof, and sub-

stituting-

- "(a) The Principal and Vice-Principal of a training college shall, if required so to do by the Minister at the request of the Council of a University College, act without special remuneration as lecturer in assistance of the Professor of Education in the University College, and in any such case the Principal or Vice-Principal shall be entitled to claim a reasonable reduction of the time during which he is required to be in attendance at the training college. Except as herein provided, the Principal or Vice-Principal shall not be employed on the staff of any University College.
- (2) Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this clause, any person holding office on the 1st day of January, 1927, as the Principal or Vice-Principal of a training college, or as the Head Teacher of a Normal School may, with the approval of the Minister, continue to hold any other position, and to receive the salary and allowances to which he would have been entitled if the amendments effected by this clause had not been made.

#### PUKEKOHE FIRE BOARD BY-LAWS,

By virtue of the power and authorities vested in it in that behalf by section 43 of the Fire Brigades Act, 1908, the Puke-kohe Fire Board hereby makes the following by-laws:—

# INTERPRETATION.

In these by-laws, except where inconsistent with the context,

or when otherwise expressly provided,—
"Board" means the Pukehoke Fire Board elected and

"Brigade" means the Pukekohe Fire Brigade established

"Secretary", means the Secretary appointed by the Pukekohe Fire Board:

"Superintendent" and "Deputy Superintendent" means respectively the Superintendent and Deputy Superintendent of the Pukekohe Fire Brigade:

intendent of the Pukekohe Fire Brigade:

"Street" means any public or private street, and includes public places:

"The Act" means the Fire Brigades Act, 1908, and amendments thereof:

"Petroleum" means petroleum as defined by the Explosives and Dangerous Goods Act, 1920.

"Inspector" means the Inspector as appointed by the local authority.

local authority:

"Inflammable material" as described in the Explosives and Dangerous Goods Act, 1920, and any subsequent amendments thereto.

# ESTABLISHMENT.

1. The brigade shall consist of a Superintendent and Deputy Superintendent with such officers and firemen as the Board may from time to time determine, with such number of auxiliaries as the Board may from time to time determine.

#### ENROLMENT.

2. Candidates for enrolment as members of the brigade must be physically strong men, free from any defect in limb, hearing,

out and printed by the Board, and applicants shall only be enrolled as members of the Brigade on their application being approved by the Board.

#### PROBATION.

4. Candidates, when approved, will be accepted as members of the brigade on probation only, the term of which shall be three months. If at the end of that term the probationer shall have given satisfaction to the Superintendent, the Board may confirm his enrolment as a member of the brigade: Provided always that unless the Board shall think it expedient so to do the Board shall not confirm such enrolment until the to use board shall not confirm such enrolment until the probationer has received the affirmative vote of not less than three-fifths of the members present at a meeting of the brigade, called by the Superintendent for that purpose.

5. Members of the Brigade are, subject to the provisions of clause 4 hereof, enrolled for service subject to one month's notice on either side, except as hereinafter provided.

#### APPOINTMENT AND PROMOTION OF OFFICERS.

6. The appointment of Superintendent and Deputy Supero. The appointment of Superintendent and Deputy Superintendent shall be made by the Board as provided by section 30 of the Fire Brigades Act, 1908, due consideration being given in each case to the claims of men already in the service of the Board. Such appointments may be terminated by one month's notice on either side.

7. The age at which members of the brigade must retire from the brigade shall be as follows:

Superintendent and Deputy Superintendent, sixty-five years; firemen, fifty-five years; but the Board may, if it thinks fit in any special case, extend these limits.

# CARE OF UNIFORM AND EQUIPMENT.

8. Uniform and equipment of a pattern and design approved by the Board shall be issued to members of the brigade on enrolment, but shall remain the property of the Board.

9. On discharge from the Board's service either by resignation or dismissal, each member must return to the Secretary in good order and condition (fair wear and tear excepted) and thing or equipment the present of the property m good order and condition (fair wear and tear excepted) every article of clothing or equipment the property of the Board which may be on issue to him. In the event of his failing to return any article of clothing or equipment or returning same in a damaged condition, the cost of such article, or the cost of repairing the damage, shall be charged to such member and deducted from any pay or money that shall be due to such member, or recovered by process of law.

#### FIRE HOSE.

10. That it be the duty of the Superintendent to keep a record of the various makes of hose and the service rendered thereby, also the hose to be stamped with distinctive maker's mark and year brought into service.

# PLANT NOT TO BE REMOVED WITHOUT PERMISSION.

11. Except for the purpose of answering alarm of fire or false alarm, or for bona fide brigade practices ordered by the Superintendent, no plant or appliance of any kind shall be removed from the brigade premises, unless such person removing same shall have first received permission of the Superintendent to do so. Any person removing any plant or appliance without such permission as aforesaid shall be guilty of an offence.

# THE SUPERINTENDENT.

- 12. The duties and powers of the Superintendent, in addition to those conferred upon him by the Act, shall be as follows:

  (I) He shall be responsible to the Board for the efficiency
  - of the members of the brigade and all gear used in its
  - (2) He shall have power to suspend any member for breach of discipline or misconduct of any description at any time, but must immediately report such suspension to the Board. The member so suspended may appeal to the Board, which may hold an inquiry into the alleged breach of discipline or misconduct. At such inquiry the suspended member may be present and have the right to speak in his defence and, if he so desires, to bring witnesses in support of such defence.

(3) He shall keep an order-book in which from time to time all orders affecting the working of the brigade shall be entered. Such order book, or a copy of the orders therein, shall be available for inspection by members of the brigade at all times

(4) He shall allot such duties to the members of the brigade as he may deem necessary for ensuring the efficiency thereof, and may draw any member from any special duty and allot him fresh duties at his (the Superin-

tendent's) discretion.

(5) He shall keep a service record-book containing the names, occupations, places of birth, dates of birth, dates of joining and discharge from the brigade, with awards and punishments by the Board, in a proper manner.

(6) He shall perform any other duty in connection with his position which the Board may from time to time assign to him.

#### FIREMAN TO TAKE CHARGE IN OFFICERS' ABSENCE.

13. In the event of the absence of all the Board's officers at any fire or false alarm of fire, the senior fireman there present shall take charge of the brigade.

14. A member of the brigade guilty of any of the following offences whilst on duty in the Board's service shall be liable to suspension from duty by the Superintendent:—

(a) Being in an intoxicated condition:

15. A member of the brigade committing either of the following offences shall be suspended and immediately reported

(b) Absenting himself without sufficient excuse from any drill or practice ordered by the Superintendent, or from any false or real alarm of fire:
(c) A fine of 5s. is inflicted for absence from fires, and a fine of 2s. fed for absence are inspection parados

fine of 2s. 6d. for absence at inspection parades unless the member is ill, incapacitated, out of town,

or can satisfy the Superintendent of the cause of his absence: (d) A fine of 2s. 6d. is inflicted on any member who fails to

return to the Fire Station after working at a fire or fires, to clean up the gear and wash the hose and attend to his duties, unless leave is granted by and attend to his duties, unless leave is granted by the officer present:

(e) A fine of 2s. 6d. is inflicted on any member who neglects orderly duties. These duties are: Keeping the plant, gear, &c., clean and in order; putting away hose left out to dry; and performing any services the Superintendent may require. Substitutes may be made, but the member first appointed will be held responsible for the work. The men in charge of outstations are exempt from the above, but are responsible for the care of the gear in their charge.

The Board shall have power to waive any fines so incurred if recommended by the Superintendent:

(h) No member of the brigade shall enter, or in any way use the board-room except on business:

(j) No noisy recreation shall be indulged in on brigade premises on Sundays.

16. #### LEAVE OF ABSENCE.

17. Leave of absence for any period not exceeding fourteen days may, on the application of a member of the brigade, be granted by the Superintendent, who shall record the same in his occurrence-book.

Any member of the brigade desiring leave of absence for a longer period than fourteen days shall apply in writing addressed to the Superintendent, who shall forward each

application to the Secretary of the Board, with such recommendation as he may think fair, and leave of absence for such longer period shall be granted by the Board.

#### BRIGADE MAY MAKE RULES.

18. Subject to the approval of the Board, and provided they in no way conflict with these by laws, the brigade may make rules and regulations for its own government.

#### GRATUITIES FOR VOLUNTEER AND OTHER SERVICES.

19. For the performance of any volunteer or special services rendered by any person, whether a member of the brigade or not, in respect of any fire, there may be paid out of the funds of the Board such sum as the Board may direct.

#### ELECTRIC FIRE-ALARM CIRCUITS.

20. The Board may establish or contract with any person or corporation for the establishment of an electric fire-alarm corporation for the establishment of an electric fire-alarm circuit, and may from time to time extend such circuit and provide for the connection therewith of street alarms and public and private buildings or premises. All connections of alarms installed in public or private buildings or premises or any alterations to same shall be carried out to the approval of the Reard at the cost of the awar of the property to be of the Board at the cost of the owner of the property to be connected, and the cost of maintenance and of the periodical examination and testing of such connection shall be borne by the owners of the property connected, and all connections shall be efficiently maintained to the satisfaction of the Board or the officer appointed by the Board for that purpose. With the consent of the owner such cost may be commuted to the payment of such annual sum as may be agreed on between the Board and such owner.

#### Donations in Recognition of Brigade's Services.

21. Donations by the public in recognition of the brigade's services shall be the property of the brigade, and shall be used in providing for the comfort and recreation of the members thereof, or otherwise for the benefit of the members of the

MAINTENANCE OF DISCIPLINE AND GOOD CONDUCT ON THE PART OF THE OFFICERS AND MEN OF THE BRIGADE.

22. No person shall supply any intoxicating liquor to any officer or member of the brigade while such member or officer shall be on duty, unless he shall first have received permission from the officer in charge of the brigade at the time so to do.

23. No person other than a member of the brigade, its

Secretary, or members of the brigade, shall enter the fire-station controlled by the Board, unless such person shall first have received permission to do so from the officer in charge of the station or a member of the brigade, and no person shall, after having been requested by the officer in charge of the station to leave any such station, remain in any such station or on or

about the station premises.

24. No person other than an officer of the brigade or a member thereof, or the wife or child of such officer or member, shall sleep in or on any station or in any of the Board's premises without having first received written permission of the Super-

intendent to do so.

IN RESPECT OF FIRES OUTSIDE THE PUKEKOHE FIRE DISTRICT.

25. If any brigade or portion of a brigade established and maintained by the Board within the Pukekohe Fire District attends or performs service at a fire on any premises outside the Fire District of Pukekohe at the request of the owner or occupier of such premises, then such owner or occupier shall pay to the Board for such attendance and service at the undermentioned rates :-

#### PENALTY CLAUSE.

26. Every person guilty of an offence against, or committing any breach of, or failing to perform any duty imposed upon any such person by any of the provisions of these by-laws shall be liable for such offence, breach, or failure, to such fine not exceeding £20, as the Court inflicting the same shall in its discretion think fit.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 13th day of April, 1927.

#### Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

N pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by sections nine and two hundred and twenty-six of the Harbours Act, 1923, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following by-laws in respect of the Harbour of Westport; and doth hereby order that such by-laws shall come into force on the first day of May, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven, and that they shall then supersede all by-laws theretofore existing in respect of the said harbour.

#### BY-LAWS.

#### INTERPRETATION.

1. The following terms used in these by-laws shall (except where inconsistent with the context) have the meanings here-

where inconsistent with the context) have the meanings hereby given to them, viz.:—

"The Department" shall mean the Marine Department.

"Cargo," "goods," shall mean and include all wares, merchandise, and commodities of every description, and
all chattels, live-stock, and other articles.

"Cattle" shall include oxen, horses, sheep, swine, and

goats.
"Harbour," "Port," shall mean the Port of Westport as

"Harbour," "Port," shall mean the Port of Westport as defined by Order in Council issued on the 8th day of February, 1901.
"Harbourmaster" shall mean the person appointed to that office by the Marine Department, and shall include his deputy and any person acting under the authority or instructions of the Harbourmaster.
"Licensed" shall mean licensed by the Department, or by any person authorized by the Department to issue any licenses.

license. extends to and includes the person, not being a pilot, having the command or charge of a vessel either

permanently or for the time being.
"Owner," when used in relation to a vessel, shall include "Owner," when used in relation to a vessel, shall include any person who is the owner of the vessel jointly with any other person or persons; and "persons," for the purpose of the foregoing definition of "owner," shall include a corporation body and joint-stock company. 'Owner," when used in relation to goods, includes any consignor, consignee, shipper, or agent for sale or custody of such goods, as well as the owner thereof. "Pilot" shall mean any person duly licensed and appointed by the Department to act as a pilot for the Port of Westport.
"Secretary-Manager" shall mean the Secretary Manager "shall mean the Secretary Manager"

"Secretary-Manager" shall mean the Secretary-Manager for the time being to the Westport Harbour, or any person acting for him under the authority of the Department.

"Ship" or "vessel" includes every description of vessel, whether read in period to a manager hart.

"Ship" or "vessel" includes every description of vessel, whether used in navigation or in any way kept or used as a hulk or storeship, or for any other purpose, and not propelled exclusively by oars.

"Steamer," "steamship," shall include sailing-vessels using auxiliary power for the purpose of propulsion.

"Tidal land" shall mean such parts of the bed, shore, or banks of a tidal water as are covered and uncovered by the flow and ebb of the tide at ordinary spring

by the flow and ebb of the tide at ordinary spring tides.

"Tidal water" means any part of the sea or of a river within the ebb and flow of the tide at ordinary spring

tides.
"Tons," "tonnage," and words of like import having reference to a vessel's tonnage, shall mean or refer to the net register number of tons or tonnage. "Wharf" shall mean and include all wharves, quays, piers,

jetties, and premises in or on which passengers or goods may be taken on board of or landed from ships or

may be taken on board of of matter reversels.

eek," "day," "hour," shall be taken to mean and include a portion of a week, day, or hour when a whole week, day, or hour has not been required or " Week, used.

#### SHIPS.

2. Steamships about to pass any dredging machine. whether at work or merely moored in the harbour, or any public

work in progress, or any vessel being towed, must slow their engines at such a distance before approaching such dredge, work, or vessel as to obviate damage to such dredge, work, or vessel.

3. Vessels occupying berths for the purpose of loading or after being loaded shall, when required by the Harbour-master so to do, vacate their berths for vessels wishing to discharge

4. The Harbourmaster shall have absolute discretion in the allotment of berths to vessels coming to the port: Provided, however, that the right of vessels to berths for unloading and loading shall, as between vessels entering on the same tide, and, other things being equal, be determined according to

the following rules:

(a.) Passenger vessels shall take precedence over cargo vessels.

(b.) Steamships shall take precedence over sailing-vessels.
(c.) As between vessels of the same class priority of arrival in the roadstead, and not priority of arrival at the wharf, shall give precedence over other vessels of that class.

5. No master or other person having command or charge of any vessel shall allow any steam-whistle, siren, or fog-horn on board the vessel to be sounded in the harbour except for navigation purposes, and except also that on days other than Sundays vessels employed in carrying passengers may sound their steam-whistles, sirens, or fog-horns in the usual way to

indicate their impending departure.

6. In the event of a fire happening on any vessel or on any wharf, or in any store, shed, or building adjacent to any vessel, the Department may, by any of its officers, take such steps as may be deemed advisable to extinguish or reduce such fire, and the Department shall not be responsible for any damage done to such vessel, its cargo, or otherwise in consequence of any action so taken.

7. No master shall permit any shoot to remain on his vessel in such a position or condition that it could be possibly used for the discharge of ashes, galley, or other refuse into

the harbour or on to the wharf.

8. If any cargo or other material is, by accident or otherwise, dropped or let fall overboard, the person or persons present at the time shall forthwith report the same to the Harbourmaster, and the Harbourmaster shall be at liberty to take such steps as may seem to him advisable to recover and land such cargo or other material; and all expenses of such recovery and landing shall be a debt due to the Department from the owner, agent, and master of the vessel out of which such goods were being landed, or into which they were being shipped or from any person responsible for letting

of which such goods were being landed, or into which they were being shipped, or from any person responsible for letting such goods drop or fall overboard.

9. No ballast, rubbish, gravel, earth, stones, cinders, cases, oil-tins, or any other substance or thing shall be thrown or permitted to be thrown overboard from any vessel or boat within the limits of the harbour, and no ballast, rubbish, gravel, earth, stones, cinders, cases, oil-tins, or other substance or anything whatsoever, whether soluble or insoluble, is to be placed by any means at any place below the highis to be placed by any means at any place below the high-water mark within the harbour or on any lands in which the Department has any estate or interest, without the written permission of the Department. Any person who commits a breach of this by-law shall, in addition to incurring a penalty, be liable to pay the expenses of the removal of such substance or thing to whatever place the Harbourmaster or Secretary shall deem fit.

10. The Department takes no charge of or responsibility over vessels or boats lying within the harbour. Their security and safety, whether at anchor or moored alongside of any wharf, pier, or jetty, or at any mooring buoy or dolphin, are at the risk of the owners, and the Department will in no case be answerable for any damage to vessels from any cause whatever.

11. No instruction or direction given by the Harbourmaster to the master of any vessel, and no act performed by the Harbourmaster in respect to any vessel, shall place any responsibility for the security or safety of any such vessel upon the Department.

12. All masters and owners of vessels shall, when so required, attend at the harbour office and shall answer such questions with respect to any casualty or accident to any person, ship, vessel, or boat, and produce such books, papers, or documents as may be considered necessary.

#### WHARVES AND GOODS.

13. No person shall hold any auction sale, sell, or expose for sale any goods on any land or wharf under the control of the Department without the consent of the Harbourmaster, and no sorting, bulking, or packing of timber or other goods, or screening of coal, will be permitted on any land or wharf under the control of the Department without the like consent.

14. No goods or other articles shall be put in or on any wharf under the control of the Department so as to be an impediment to the approaches or an obstacle to the removal of other goods from such wharf.

15. All goods and cattle placed on any wharf under the control of the Department or in any yard under such control shall be at the owner's risk.

shall be at the owner's risk.

16. The Harbourmaster, when he shall deem it necessary for the convenience of the loading and unloading of vessels, or for the better regulating of the traffic, or for any other purpose authorized by the Department, may block off, fence, or otherwise stop from being used as a thoroughfare any portion or portions of the wharves under the control of the Department.

17. Masters of vessels lying alongside any wharf under the control of the Department shall be responsible for all damage caused to all goods lying on such wharf by water used for washing-down decks or for any other purpose upon such vessels.

18. The master of every vessel lying alongside any wharf under the control of the Department shall have closed for use, or shall have properly screened and protected in a manner to be approved by the Harbourmaster, all openings out of which water, steam, or other fluid is liable to be discharged. so as to ensure that such water, steam, or other fluid shall not fall on or wet the deck of such wharf.

19. Proper and sufficient save-alls or nets, in good order, shall at all times be provided and securely fastened by vessels between such vessels and wharves to the satisfaction of the Harbourmaster when passengers or cargo are being landed or

shipped.

All the foregoing charges for towage and services of the tug (including minimum and maximum charges) to be subject to .25 per cent. increase for services on Sundays and public holidays.

holidays.

21. When the steam-tug belonging to the Department is required to perform any work not specified in the foregoing scale the Harbourmaster or, in his absence, the master of the tug shall have power to make a special agreement for the same, and also to make any agreement as to the remuneration for attending on vessels in distress or cast or run ashore.

22. Applications for outward towage shall be made in writing on the prescribed form to the Harbourmaster, or to the master of the tug before the services of the tug shall be required, and no deduction shall be made from the charge if the tug shall be prevented from towing the vessel through the action of the person in charge of the vessel to be towed, or for any other reason for which the tug is not responsible.

23. The outward-towage work shall be taken in the order of the application and the inward-towage work shall be undertaken according to the priority of arrival in the roadstead,

of the application and the inward-towage work shall be under-taken according to the priority of arrival in the roadstead, subject in both cases, however, to the state of the tide and weather; and the order may also be varied in the absolute discretion of the Harbourmaster if from any reason he deems it necessary to do so, and the Department shall not be liable for any loss arising from any such variation of the order of towage, or delay in performing towage or inability to provide towage power.

24. On the hiring of the Department steam-tug for towage services the master or other person in charge and the crew thereof become the servants of and identified with the ship which is being towed, and this whether or not the master of the tug acts as pilot in charge of the ship which is being towed; the Department undertaking only to provide the motive power; and the Department will not be responsible for any damage or loss that may arise to ship or cargo, nor for any damage caused by the defect in or accident happen-ing to the machinery of the steam-tug, or to the towing-gear,

or by any peril of the seas, river, or navigation, or otherwise.

25. The foregoing scale of towage rates shall not prejudice any claim the Department may have to salvage remuneraany chain the Department may have to savage remineration for any extraordinary services that may be rendered to ship or cargo, or arising out of any circumstances not existing or contemplated at the time of making the ordinary application for the use of the tug.

26. The ordinary towage scale is not to apply to salvage crvices, or to claims for or in the nature of salvage.
27. All towage charges shall be due and payable when the

application for the services of the tug is made, and are paid to the Secretary-Manager, and failing payment having been made the Harbourmaster or master of the steam-tug may made the Harbourmaster or master of the steam-tug may require payment before the performance of the services is required. Should the services of the tug not be required after any application for the service shall have been made the person or persons so applying shall not be entitled to any rebate on or refund of any such charges on account thereof, but shall be liable for the same as if the service required had been duly rendered.

28. On a vessel being signalled the tug will, at the discretion of the Harbourmaster, immediately proceed out to her; the master of the tug is authorized to make a fair additional

the master of the tug is authorized to make a fair additional charge for towing vessels from or to any point beyond three miles from the signal-station.

29. If at any time the Department decides to use its steam

dredge for towage all the foregoing provisions relating to the Department's steam-tug shall relate, mutatis mutandis, to the Department's steam-dredge.

30. The Department may make arrangements for any 30. The Department may make arrangements for any steamer or steamers to perform towage services, and all the foregoing provisions relating to the Department's steam-tug shall relate, mutatis mutandis, to any such steamer or steamers, it being distinctly understood that the Department shall not incur any liability whatsoever for any wrongful act, neglect, or default of the master or crew of such steam-dredge or steamer performing towage services or of the Harbourmaster or other servant of the Department, nor for any damage caused by defact in or accident to the machinery of such steam. by defect in, or accident to, the machinery of such steam-dredge, steamer, or steamers, or to the towing-gear, or by any peril of the seas, river, or navigation, or otherwise.

## WARPS.

31. Vessels at the wharves will be charged £2 per warp per trip for the use of the warps. Vessels not at the wharves, supplied with warps or other appliances, will be charged for the same not exceeding £2 for each rope supplied, at the discretion of the Harbourmaster. Nothing herein contained shall be deemed to lay upon the Department any obligation to keep on hand procure or supply warps. to keep on hand, procure, or supply warps.

# SWINGING WIRES.

32. Vessels requiring the use of a swinging wire will be charged £2 per wire per trip. Nothing herein contained shall be deemed to lay upon the Department any obligation to keep on hand, procure, or supply swinging wires.

# PILOTS AND PILOTAGE.

33. The Department hereby declares that the display of harbour beacons and of the other shore signals (including signals of every description from the signal-station at West port) for the time being used for the purpose of aiding and directing vessels entering or going out of the port shall be deemed to be pilot service, and the following shall be the rates paid to the Department for such pilot service (herein-after called "ordinary pilotage"):—

For every vessel inwards the sum of 1d. per ton net register, and for every vessel outwards the same charge. If in any case the Harbourmaster considers a vessel cannot safely enter or leave the port without a pilot, or that for other reasons a pilot should board her, or if the owner, master, or agent of any vessel apply to the Harbourmaster for a pilot (in any of which cases the service to be rendered is hereinafter called "special pilotage") the charge shall be as follows :-

For every sailing-vessel the sum of 6d. per ton inward, and the same sum outward.

For every steam-vessel the sum of 4d. per ton inward, and the same sum outward.

The master, agent, and owner of any vessel shall be jointly and severally liable for all the aforesaid charges, which shall be paid to the Department. The charges for special pilotage be paid to the Department. The charges for special pilotage shall be paid whether special pilotage services have been actually rendered or not in all cases where the master, agent, or owner of a vessel has applied for a pilot. All outward-pilotage rates shall be paid either before or at the time of making the application, if the application for a pilot shall be made by the owner, master, or agent of the vessel. The charges for ordinary pilotage and special pilotage shall not both be made in respect of the same entry or the same departure of a vessel to or from the port. Any vessel arriving for bunker coal only—i.e., coal to be used in the ship on her voyage and for no other purpose—will, on a declaration to this effect being given to the Harbourmaster by the master of the vessel, be charged half pilotage rates.

34. Pilotage is compulsory.

35. Every pilot shall duly train in the duties of a pilot any apprentice who may from time to time be appointed to

36. Each pilot shall be stationed at such place within the limits of his license as the Department may from time to time direct, and shall obey the orders of the Harbourmaster at all times, and no pilot shall absent himself from his station, unless on duty, without permission from the Harbourmaster.

unless on duty, without permission from the Harbourmaster.

37. Every pilot engaged on special pilotage service shall offer his services to the inward-bound ship nearest to him having a pilot signal flying, unless another ship shall be observed running into danger, in which case every exertion shall be made to board and assist the latter ship. Except in cases of emergency as aforesaid, preference shall be given to His Majesty's ships and mail-packets regularly employed in the postal service.

38. Every pilot shall carry his license with him, and shall produce it to the master of any ship boarded by him on its being demanded.

being demanded.

39. No master of any ship shall employ any other than a duly appointed pilot unless he has first exhibited the signal for a pilot, and a duly appointed pilot has not offered his services within a reasonable time.

- 40. When vessels are not in the charge of pilots performing special pilotage services, such vessels will, if the Harbour-master considers it necessary, be piloted through the navi-gable channel by means of the semaphore attached to the signal flagstaff. The vessel is to be steered in the direction towards which the semaphore-arm is pointed. When the semaphore-arm is dropped the vessel is to be kept steady as she goes. No charge other than the ordinary pilotage above. she goes. No charge other than the ordinary pilotage charges will be made for the pilotage services mentioned in this by-law.
- 41. Pilots shall by every means in their power aid and

assist ships in distress.

- 42. The master, agent, or owner of any ship requiring a pilot to conduct her to sea must make application in writing at least twenty-four hours previously at the Harbourmaster's office
- 43. Pilots shall take vessels in or out on Sundays if required. 43. Phots shall take vessels in or out on Sundays if required.

  44. No pilot shall in any case conduct a vessel to sea until she has been regularly cleared at the Custom House and Harbour Office; and in proof of this the master shall be bound to show his clearance to the pilot if asked, and no pilot shall be bound to take a vessel to sea without seeing such clearance.
- 45. When a pilot is detained on board a ship longer than 45. When a pilot is detained on board a ship longer than forty-eight hours, whether by stress of weather, quarantine, or otherwise, £1 per day shall be paid, in addition to the regular pilotage, for the first three days of such detention, commencing from the expiration of the aforesaid period of forty-eight hours, and 15s. per day as aforesaid for the remainder of such detention so long as the pilot is absent from his station; and if the said pilot has been carried to a distance, the master, owner, or agent of the ship shall further pay for his travelling-expenses in returning to his station.

  46. The master of any vessel having any complaint against
- 46. The master of any vessel having any complaint against any pilot must report the same in writing to the Department, otherwise such complaint will not be recognized; and all complaints by any pilot or other persons connected with the harbour service shall be made in writing to the Harbour-master, who shall forthwith forward the same to the Same master, who shall forthwith forward the same to the Secretary-Manager.
- 47. Should any casualty occur to a vessel whilst in charge of a pilot, such pilot shall immediately report the same in writing to the Harbourmaster, stating the nature and the cause of the accident and the amount of damage (if any) cause of the accident and the amount of damage (if any) apparently sustained by the vessel, and all other matters relating to the pilotage and casualty. If such casualty shall happen to any outward vessel, the pilot shall, before leaving such vessel, demand from its master a written statement concerning the casualty and the conduct and proceedings of the pilot, and such statement shall be given to the Harbourmaster. If such casualty shall happen to an

inward-bound vessel, its master shall, as soon as he conveniently can, report the same in writing, with full particulars, to the Harbourmaster.

48. The Harbourmaster shall, on receiving reports from pilots, make inquiries of the masters or officers in charge of pilots, make inquiries of the masters or officers in charge of vessels as to the correctness of the information conveyed in the pilot's report, and attach thereto any remarks he may deem applicable to each case.

49. All pilots shall answer in writing (if required) all questions put to them by the Harbourmaster, and afford every information in their power respecting the grounding, collision, or injury to the vessels.

50. The pilot, master, or other person in charge of any vessel entering, departing from, or moving within the port shall, by every means in his power, consistent with the safety of such vessel, assist every duly authorized public officer in

of such vessel, assist every duly authorized public officer in boarding or leaving such vessel, and no person on board such vessel shall interfere with or obstruct any Government officer

vessel shall interfere with or obstruct any Government officer or pilot whilst carrying out his duties.

51. If any pilot shall be guilty of any of the offences mentioned in sections 222 and 223 of the Harbours Act, 1923, or shall fail, refuse, or neglect to do anything required by these by-laws, he shall, in addition to all the penalties and liabilities prescribed by the Harbours Act, 1923, and by these by-laws, be liable, in the discretion of the Department, to dismissal or suspension from his appointment and to have dismissal or suspension from his appointment and to have his license as a pilot withdrawn or suspended, as the Depart-ment may direct. When the Harbourmaster or his deputy ment may direct. When the Harbourmaster or his deputy acts as pilot in bringing in vessels and taking them out to sea he shall exercise every care and precaution, but the Department shall not be responsible for casualties that may occur to the vessel while under the charge of the pilot in such case.

52. For each time a vessel is berthed alongside a wharf, or alongside another vessel which is itself berthed alongside a wharf, the following berthage charges shall be paid by the master, agent, or owner of such vessel on demand to the

Department's collector of dues :-

(a.) For the first fifty-one hours, per ton net register, 3d.
(b.) For each additional twenty-five hours after the first

fifty-one hours, per ton net register, 1d.
(c.) For each twenty-five hours after the first 101 hours on (c.) For each twenty-five hours after the first 101 hours on which (weather permitting) cargo or ballast is not loaded or unloaded continuously during the usual working hours prevailing on the Westport Wharf, but not including the twenty-five hours' period on which discharging or loading is completed, per ton net register, in addition to the charge under paragraph (b) of this by-law, 1d.
(d.) Any vessel arriving within the port for the purpose of taking on board bunker coal for consumption on board such vessel, and for no other purpose, shall, on a declaration to this effect being made by the master of the vessel, be charged half berthage rates.
(e.) Minimum berthage charge, 10s.
53. The Harbourmaster shall be the sole judge as to whether

53. The Harbourmaster shall be the sole judge as to whether the weather permits of the loading or unloading of cargo or ballast under the last preceding by-law, and no exemption from payment shall be claimed on the grounds that no cargo or ballast is available, that insufficient labourers or trucks are or ballast is available, that insufficient abouters or trucks are available, or on any other grounds whatever, save only that the weather does not permit of loading or unloading. Sundays or statutory holidays shall be absolutely excluded in computing the period for which, and the rate at which berthage charges are payable, if no cargo or ballast is loaded or unloaded on any such days,
54. Vessels bar bound or required to remain in port through

54. Vesseis bar bound of required to remain in port through stress of weather shall, if no cargo or ballast is loaded or unloaded, be free from the charges under paragraphs (b) and (c) of By-law No. 52, during the period of detention.

55. If a ship is ready to sail, and by order of the Harbour-

master is prevented from leaving within the periods as shown in By-law No. 52, the charges under paragraphs (b) or (c) of that by-law shall not be made for the period so detained.

#### CRANAGE.

56. The charges for the use of any steam-crane belonging to the Department shall be as follows:

Without crane-driver, 5s. per hour or part of an hour during which the crane is actually used, with a minimum

charge of 10s.

With crane-driver, 7s. 6d. per hour or part of an hour during which the crane is actually used, with a minimum charge of 15s.

Without limiting the meaning of the words "actually used," the crane shall be deemed to be actually used—(a) From the time the work starts for the purpose of getting up steam, and (b), during the time such crane is being moved towards the place it is required by the hirer, and from such place to the place where the Department requires it to be redelivered by the hirer. If the Department supplies a crane-driver the Department shall not incur any liability whatsoever for any damage caused by any patent or latent defect in such crane.

#### GENERAL.

57. A copy of these by-laws shall be delivered by the boarding pilot or Harbourmaster to the master of any vessel entering the harbour, and such master shall give a receipt for the same if called upon to do so: Provided, however, that it shall not be necessary in any case to issue a second copy of the by-laws to the master of the same vessel, except on the demand of such master, and in such case only on the payment of a fee of one shilling, to be accounted for by the Harbourmaster or boarding officer.

58. Every complaint made by any person not in the service of the Department against any officer or servant of the Department shall be made in writing and addressed to the Secretary-Manager, who shall forthwith forward a copy of the complaint to the officer or servant complained of. In the case of every such complaint the Secretary-Manager will make a preliminary inquiry into the circumstances and report to the Minister for Marine.

59. In case of accident of whatever kind the Harbourmaster or other officer of the Department present or available may order such steps to be taken as he may deem necessary and

order such steps to be taken as he may deem necessary and charge the cost of the same to the party or parties interested.

60. No person shall disobey the orders of the Harbour-master when acting in the performance of his duty.

61. No ballast, rock, stone, slate, shingle, gravel, sand, earth, cinders, rubbish, driftwood, or other substance or thing shall be taken away from any tidal land or tidal water or from the seashore below high-water mark in any part of the harbour without the written permission of the Harbourmaster or from any other land vested in the Department for any estate whatsoever or under the Department's control, without the permission of the Secretary-Manager.

62. No person shall remove or displace the rocks, stones, or material of any breakwater, training-wall, or structure within

material of any breakwater, training-wall, or structure within

the harbour.

63. No person shall put down or injure any board put up for the purpose of publishing any by-laws, regulations, notice, or penalty, or obliterate any of the letters, marks, or figures

thereon.

64. No person shall interfere with any life-saving gear, boat-hook, drag, grapnel, life-buoys, or other apparatus placed within the port and intended to be used for the purpose of saving life from drowning unless such interference is for the purpose of saving life, or by the police in dragging for drowned persons. No person shall trespass on or be on or in any dredge or tug-boat belonging to the Department without the authority from the Department. Should any servant of the Department divulge to any person not in the service of the Department, any information of a confidential nature, he shall be dismissed from the service of the Department. the service of the Department.

the service of the Department.
65. Nothing contained in these by-laws shall be deemed to apply to any ship, vessel, or other property of His Majesty or to any ship of war belonging to any foreign nation.
66. All by-laws and regulations heretofore enforced for and within the limits of the Harbour of Westport are hereby repealed, provided always that the General Harbour Regulations Schedule "A" shall apply and be enforced.

#### PENALTIES.

67. If any person fails or refuses or neglects to do anything required by the foregoing by-laws to be done, observed, or performed, or in any matter obstructs, impedes, or interferes with the doing of anything enjoined, required, or authorized to be done, or wilfully does anything prohibited by the foregoing by-laws, every such person in each and every case so offending shall be liable to a penalty of twenty pounds (£20).

The total births registered for the urban areas amounted to 1,205 as against 1,020 in February—an increase of 185. The deaths in March were 472—an increase of 63 as compared with the previous month. Of the total deaths males contributed 266, females 206. Fifty-two of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 11.02 per cent. of the whole number. Forty-three of these were under one year of age.

The equivalent annual rates per 1,000 of mean population for March, and three months ended March, 1927, were as follows. The infantile mortality rate per 100 births for the same period is also given.

### · Register of Engineers.

Office of the Minister of Public Works, Wellington, 31st March, 1927. IN pursuance of section 13 of the Engineers Registration Act, 1924, a certified copy of the names, qualifications, and addresses entered in the Register of Engineers is published for general information.

Under the heading of qualification is shown the particular clause of section 6 of the Act under which the applicant has

been registered.

Section 6 of the Act is as follows:—

"6. (1.) Every person shall, on payment of the prescribed fee, be entitled to be registered under this Act as an engineer who—

"(a.) Holds some recognized certificate as hereinafter defined, and who satisfies the Board that he has had not less

than three years' practical experience in engineering; or

"(b.) Has attained the age of twenty-five years, and has been engaged during a period of not less than six years before the commencement of this Act in the acquisition of professional knowledge or in the practice of engineering in a manner satisfactory to the Board, and who makes application for registration within twelve months after the commencement of this Act; or

the commencement of this Act; or

"(c.) Passes or has passed an examination or examinations approved by the Board, and who satisfies the Board that he has had not less than three years' practical experience in engineering.

"(2.) For the purposes of this section the term 'recognized certificate' means a certificate, diploma, degree, or license granted by some university, college, or other public institution (whether in New Zealand or elsewhere), and which is recognized by the Board as furnishing sufficient evidence of the possession of the requisite knowledge and skill for the efficient practice of the profession of engineering."

(d) Common prostitutes, and persons who habitually consort with thieves or persons who have no lawful visible means of support.
