Fees and Conditions of Licenses.

52. Radio-dealers' licenses shall be divided into four classes, as follows:

The company shall maintain and keep the above-mentioned wharf and all erections on or in connection with the said wharf in good order and repair; and shall at all times exhibit therefrom and maintain at the company's own cost suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels: Provided that no new light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved by the Minister.

7. Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said wharf and any buildings erected on the said wharf or in connection therewith and view the state of repair thereof; and upon the Minister leaving at or posting to the last known registered office of the company in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair is such wheat requiring the company within a reason. repair in such wharf, requiring the company within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to make good or repair the same, the company shall, with all convenient speed, cause such defect to be removed, or such repairs to be made.

8. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the company

to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1923, or its amendments, or any regulation thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

9. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharf shall be taken away by the company and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that

Minister, or by any person appointed by the minister for blav purpose.

10. The rights, powers, and privileges hereby conferred shall continue in force for fourteen years, computed from the 24th day of July, 1927, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the company shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Motor-omnibus (Supplementary) Regulations, 1927.

For the purpose of the Motor-omnibus Traffic Act, 1926, an Inspecting Engineer may, at his discretion, make a report that a motor-omnibus is in a fit condition to be licensed as a motor-omnibus, save that certain requirements of Part I of the Motor-omnibus (Constructional) Regulations, 1926, require to be fulfilled, and in such case shall, by his certificate, state

such requirements and fix a time limit or limits within which all or each of such requirements shall be complied with.

3. The licensing authority may thereupon, in pursuance of the said report, issue a license in respect of the motor-omnibus, subject to the condition that the said requirements be fulfilled within the said time limit or limits.

within the said time limit or limits.

4. The fact that in the opinion of the Inspecting Engineer the chassis of any motor-omnibus is carrying, or in service is likely to carry, a greater load than it was designed by the makers to carry, may be a ground for refusal by the Inspecting Engineer to make a report that the motor-omnibus may be licensed for the carrier of presences.

be licensed for the carriage of passengers.

5. A fresh report shall be obtained from the Inspecting Engineer in terms of section 6 (3) of the said Act before a license for another period is granted in respect of any motoromnibus that has previously been licensed, whether by the same or any other licensing authority.

6. Save with the written permission of the Minister of Public Works upon the recommendation of the licensing authority by which the omnibus is licensed, the maximum number of passengers permitted to be carried by any motor-omnibus, in terms of the condition in that behalf to be con-

omnibus, in terms of the condition in that behalf to be contained in any license issued in respect of such motor-omnibus, shall be not greater than four-thirds of the number of passengers for which seating-accommodation is provided.

7. It shall be a condition of every license issued in respect of a motor-omnibus (whether such condition be inserted in the license or not) that no standing passenger shall be allowed to travel on the driver's platform or forward of an imaginary line drawn at right angles to the length of the omnibus across the back of the driver's seat and for the full width of the vehicle. vehicle.

8. The Motor-omnibus (Constructional) Regulations, 1926,

are amended as follows:—

(a) Regulation 28 thereof is amended by adding after "needs" the following words: "provided that any omnibus may, at the discretion of the Inspecting Engineer, by writing under his hand, be exempted for the duration of the current license or such shorter period as may therein be stated, either (b) Clause (5) of Regulation 35 thereof is amended by substituting for the words "shall be greater than" the words "shall be not less than."

Importation of certain Publications prohibited.

Customs Department, Wellington, 25th May, 1927.

T is hereby notified for public information that the importation of the publications shown in the list hereunder is regarded as being prohibited under the provisions of the Order in Council made on 10th May, 1921, and gazetted on 19th May, 1921, which prohibits the importation into New Zealand of the following goods, that is to say: Any document which incites, encourages, advises, or advocates violence, lawlessness, or disorder, or expresses any seditious intention.

The list includes only those publications which have been submitted to the Customs Department and which, after consideration by it, are regarded as infringing the abovementioned Order in Council.

It should be understood that it does not follow that any document not mentioned in the list will be allowed to be imported. The onus rests on importers to avoid infringing the provisions of the Order in Council. If any person is in doubt as to whether any publication he desires to import is or is not regarded as prohibited from importation he should communicate with the Comptroller of Customs, Wellington.
