WHEREAS the Taumarunui County Council, in pursuance of subsection three of section fourteen of the Counties Act, 1920 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), presented a petition in accordance with the said subsection three praying that the boundaries of the Taumarunui and Kaitieke Counties be altered by including in the said Taumarunui County the area of the Kaitieke County the said Taumarunui County the area of the Kaitieke County

And whereas a Commission was appointed to inquire and report thereon in accordance with subsection four of section fourteen of the said Act, and has duly reported that the boundaries of the said counties should be altered in the manner prayed for in the said petition:

And whereas it is expedient that the boundaries of the said counties should be altered in such a manner as is deemed to be in accordance with the said report, that the area to be added to the Taumarunui County should form a new riding to be known as the Kirikau Riding of that county, and that the number of Councillors for the said Kirikau Riding should be fixed:

the said county: and that the boundaries of that riding shall be those set forth in the Third Schedule hereto; and that one Councillor shall be elected for the said Kirikau Riding. And I do also proclaim and declare that this Proclamation shall take effect on the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight.

N pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him In pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him by section ninety-four of the Pensions Act, 1926 (hereinafter referred to as the said Act), His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the several regulations specified in the Second Schedule hereto, and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the regulations hereinafter set forth; and doth hereby declare that this Order in Council shall come into force on the data of the publication thereof in the Gazette. date of the publication thereof in the Gazette.

#### REGULATIONS.

#### OLD-AGE AND WIDOWS' PENSION-CLAIMS

1. The claim for an old-age pension or for a widow's pension shall be in the form numbered 1 or the form numbered 2 in the First Schedule hereto, as the case may be; and when completed and signed by the applicant in the presence of any person authorized by section eighty-six of the said Act to take declarations shall be lodged with the Registrar for the district in which the applicant permanently resides

- district in which the applicant permanently resides.

  2. In every case where the applicant, or the wife or husband of an applicant, is a member of the Native race, there shall be annexed to the pension-claim a statement in the form numbered 3 in the First Schedule hereto setting forth particulars of any customary rights or interests now or previously held or enjoyed in Native land, and there shall be endorsed thereon a certificate by a Government officer that the contents thereof were fully explained to, and appeared to be fully understood by, the applicant before he signed it. It shall be the duty of every Government officer having the requisite knowledge of the Maori language to assist Maoris in preparing their pension-claims, and to give the aforesaid certificate without for without fee.
- 3. The Registrar shall keep an alphabetical index, in card form, of all claims made by applicants in his district. Any claim received by a Registrar from an applicant who resides in another district shall be forwarded by him to the Registrar
- in another district shall be forwarded by him to the Registrar of the district in which the applicant permanently resides.

  4. The Registrar, after preparing the index-card and noting thereon its registered claim-number, shall forthwith proceed to verify the statements of the applicant by means of the forms provided for the purpose. Having completed his inquiries, the Registrar shall submit the claim, together with all replies to inquiries, to the Magistrate presiding at the Courthouse nearest to the place of residence of the applicant.

  5. The Registrar shall notify the applicant in writing of the place and date fixed for the hearing of the claim by the Magistrate; but if by reason of physical disability or other sufficient cause the applicant is unable to attend the investi-
- sufficient cause the applicant is unable to attend the investigation, and the Magistrate is satisfied that the documentary evidence in support of the claim is sufficient to establish or reject it, he shall not require the personal attendance of the applicant.

6. On return of the pension-claim with the Magistrate's decision attached thereto it shall be filed by the Registrar, who shall note the index-card and notify the applicant of the

who shall note the index-cara and decision.

7. (1) If the Magistrate's decision is that the claim is rejected, he shall notify the Registrar in the form numbered 4 in the First Schedule hereto, which shall be forwarded to the Commissioner, who shall record and file the same.

(2) Where a fresh claim is lodged at any time subsequent to the rejection of a former claim, such new claim shall be recorded under a new number. For the purpose of this subclause, the adjournment of a claim sine die shall be deemed to be equivalent to the rejection of such claim.

8. If the Magistrate's decision is that the claim is established 8. If the Magistrate's decision is that the claim is established he shall fix the rate of the first year's pension and forward to the Registrar a certificate of establishment in the form numbered 5 or the form numbered 6 in the First Schedule hereto, as the case may require. Upon receipt of the Magistrate's certificate of establishment the Registrar shall record the contents thereof on a pension-card, and, after issuing a pension-certificate in the form numbered 7 in the First Schedule hereto, shall forward the said Magistrate's certificate to the Commissioner, who shall record and file the same. 9. The Commissioner shall in respect of each decision recorded by him prepare an index-card, and shall register the said decision in a Claim Register kept for the purpose. He shall also, in respect of each decision granting a pension, prepare a pension-card, to be known as the district card, whereon shall be entered all particulars affecting the payment of any each pression. of any such pension.

#### MILITARY, MINERS', AND BLIND PENSION-CLAIMS.

- 10. The claim for a military pension, a miner's pension, or a pension in respect of blindness shall be in the form numbered 8, or in the form numbered 9, or in the form numbered 10 in the First Schedule hereto, as the case may require, and shall, when completed by the applicant, be lodged with the Commissioner. Every application for a miner's pension or a pension in respect of blindness shall be accompanied by a medical certificate setting out the nature of the disability suffered by the applicant.
- 11. The Commissioner shall keep a separate Claim Register in respect of each class of pension under this head, in which all claims shall be recorded and numbered consecutively in the order in which they are received. He shall also prepare an index-card for each claim recorded by him.
- 12. The Commissioner, after recording a claim and noting thereon its registered claim-number, shall forthwith proceed to verify the statements of the applicant by the forms provided for the purpose, and, having completed his inquiries, shall record his decision in regard thereto, and the Claim Register and index-card shall be noted accordingly.
- 13. If the decision is that the claim is rejected the Commissioner shall notify the applicant of the reason for the rejection. If the decision is that the claim is established the Commissioner shall fix the amount of the first year's pension, and, after entering particulars thereof on a district card, shall issue a pension-certificate to the pensioner in the form numbered 7 in the First Schedule hereto.

#### INVESTIGATION OF PENSION-CLAIMS.

- 14. In connection with the investigation of pension-claims the following provisions shall apply:
- (a) If in the course of investigation evidence is required on any specific matter, the Commissioner, or the Regismay inquire into the same, and for the purpose of such inquiry free access shall be given to—

  (1) The registers and records of all Departments

of State:

(2) All property of the applicant, and all books, vouchers, and documents relating thereto and to any mortgage thereon, or to the income of the applicant.

(b) The powers of inquiry and search hereby given shall

be limited to specified pensioners or applicants for pension, and shall not be construed as authorizing any general search or inquiry.

(c) The Magistrate or the Commissioner may, in his discretion, accept as testimony for or against the

- (1) A statutory declaration made by any reputable person, who therein declares to what he knows of his own knowledge to be true:
- (2) Any other documentary evidence, whether strictly legal evidence or not:
- (3) The sworn spoken evidence of any reputable person who deposes to what he knows to be true:
- (4) The knowledge or observation of the Magistrate or Commissioner himself.
- 15. The valuations for the time being appearing in any district valuation roll under the Valuation of Land Act, 1925, shall, so far as the same are applicable, be used for the purpose of assessing the capital value of the accumulated property of applicants for pension.
- 16. Where the beneficial interest of the applicant in any 16. Where the beneficial interest of the applicant in any property consists of a life interest in such property, the present value of the said life interest shall, except as provided by section 10 of the said Act, be deemed to be accumulated property. To arrive at the value of the life interest, the net annual value of the property shall be multiplied by the value of £1 per annum at the required age as shown in the Carlisle Table of Mortality. For the purpose of any computation under this regulation the net annual value of a property shall be deemed to be the net annual income derivable therefrom, or, in the absence of any such income, an amount not exceeding or, in the absence of any such income, an amount not exceeding 5 per cent. of the capital value of the property after the deduction of all charges or encumbrances lawfully existing thereon.

#### PENSION-CERTIFICATES.

17. The pension-certificate shall set out on the face thereof the office of payment, and also the date on which the first

instalment is payable.

18. If a pension-certificate is lost, destroyed, or mutilated, the pensioner, or his duly authorized agent appointed under the pensioner, or his duly authorized agent appointed under these regulations, may make application for a duplicate certificate to the Registrar direct, or to him through a Postmaster or Clerk of Court. After satisfying himself that the original certificate has been lost, destroyed, or mutilated, as the case may be, the Registrar shall, in the case of a pension payable under Part I or Part II of the said Act, issue a duplicate certificate, which shall bear across its face the word "Duplicate," and shall forthwith forward the application to the Commissioner, who shall instruct the paying office to pay the Commissioner, who shall instruct the paying office to pay on the duplicate certificate only. Any application in respect of a pension payable under any other Part of the said Act shall be dealt with by the Commissioner.

19. Application for transfer from one district to another

of a pension payable under Part I or Part II of the said Act shall be made in writing to the Registrar direct, or to him through a Postmaster or Clerk of Court, and with respect

thereto the following provisions shall apply:—

(a) It shall not be granted unless the Registrar to whom
the application is made is satisfied that the penthe application is made is satisfied that the pensioner is about to change or has permanently changed his residence, or unless the pension-certificate is lodged with the application, for which latter a receipt shall be issued as a subsequent means of identification by the Registrar of the new district.

(b) For the purpose of effecting the transfer the Registrar of the district in which the pension is registered shall issue a transfer-warrant, and transmit the same, together with the pension-card, pension-certificate.

together with the pension-card, pension-certificate, and all papers relating thereto, to the Registrar of the new district.

(c) The Registrar issuing the transfer-warrant shall note the index-card and forward the application duly noted by him to the Commissioner.

(d) The Registrar receiving the aforesaid warrant and other papers shall supply the new number by which the pension will be known, and forward the said warrant by first mail to the Commissioner, who shall note the district card and issue the necessary instructions the district card and issue the necessary instructions to the paying office. The Registrar shall also issue the pension-certificate to the pensioner or to the duly authorized agent on surrender of the receipt previously issued for the pension-certificate, having first noted on the certificate the new number and the names of the new district and paying office, and shall file the pension-card and other papers, to which latter the receipt for the pension-certificate shall be attached.

20. If the pensioner or authorized agent for the pensioner desires that the office of payment only shall be changed, he may make application in writing to a Registrar, Postmaster, or Clerk of Court, and in support thereof shall forward the pension-certificate with the application. The Registrar, or Postmaster, or Clerk of Court receiving the application, after noting the change of paying office on the pension-certificate (which he shall return to the applicant), shall forward the application in the case of a pension payable under Part I or Part II of the said Act to the Registrar of the district in which the pension is recorded, who in turn shall advise the in which the pension is recorded, who in turn shall advise the Commissioner, who shall note the district card and issue the necessary instructions to the paying office. Any application in respect of a pension payable under any other part of the said Act shall be forwarded direct to the Commissioner.

#### PAYMENT OF PENSIONS.

21. The Commissioner shall, in respect of every pension granted, provided payment has not been stopped for any reason, transmit to the paying office in every month a form of advice of payment of the instalment falling due on the first day of the following month. Such advice shall be in the form numbered 11 in the First Schedule hereto.

form numbered 11 in the First Schedule hereto.

22. When receiving payment of any instalment of a pension the payee shall give a receipt for the same in the manner provided therefor in the advice form, and when making payment the paying officer shall, by affixing thereto his office stamp on the back of the produced pension-certificate, note the date and fact of such payment: Provided that the paying officer, if not satisfied as to the identity of the payee, shall withhold payment and report to the Commissioner.

23. If the payee is other than the pensioner, the payee shall in such receipt certify that to his certain knowledge

the pensioner is alive and residing in New Zealand, giving address, and that the instalment applied for is properly pay-

24. No payment shall be made in respect of any instalment of pension after the expiry of one month after the due date, or after the death of the pensioner, without the special authority

after the death of the pensioner, without the special authority of the Commissioner first obtained.

25. The paying officer shall, in every case where the last instalment covered by the pension-certificate has been paid, retain the pension-certificate. Where the said certificate does not indicate that all the instalments payable thereon have been paid he shall forward the same, with his accounts, to the Chief Postmaster; and in other cases may, unless otherwise instructed by the Commissioner, destroy the certificate.

26. Whenever any instalment is payable under a warrant issued under these regulations, the pension-certificate shall be produced by the payee at the time of payment, together with the warrant, and where the aforesaid warrant relates to a single instalment, or to the last of a series of instalments, it shall be delivered up to and retained by the paying officer on

shall be delivered up to and retained by the paying officer on payment of such instalment, and forwarded with his accounts to the Chief Postmaster.

27. In the event of any instalment being paid on production of a lost pension-certificate after the issue of a duplicate of such certificate, or on a pension-certificate during the currency

of a warrant directing payment to other than the pensioner, the holder of such duplicate or warrant shall have no claim against His Majesty in respect of the instalment so paid.

28. In the event of any instalment being forfeited, the pensioner or the duly authorized agent for the pensioner may make application in writing to receive such instalment to the Registrar or to the Postmaster, to whom the pension-certificate shall be produced, and such application shall be forwarded with a recommendation as to payment to the Commissioner, who shall notify his decision direct to the applicant. Every who shall notify his decision direct to the applicant. Every such application made in respect of any class of pension other than a widow's pension on behalf of the governing body of a charitable institution shall be accompanied by a warrant issued as provided in clause 31 of these regulations.

29. (1) With respect to the portion of an instalment accruing due as at the date of death in the case of any class of pension of the thorax wintstalment approach that there a wintstalment approach.

due as at the date of death in the case of any class of pension other than a widow's pension, or for any instalment unpaid at the date of death, the application shall be made in writing by the person who actually defrayed the burial-expenses of the pensioner, or on behalf of the governing body of a charitable institution wherein the pensioner was being maintained at date of death. If the application is made by the person who defrayed the burial-expenses it shall be accompanied by a receipted account for the said expenses, or for such part of the said expenses as is not less than the amount of pension payable; and if the application is made on behalf of the governing body of a charitable institution, for the cost of burial or maintenance of the pensioner to the date of death, it shall be accompanied by a warrant issued as provided in clause 31 of these regulations.

(2) Every application under this clause must be accompanied by the pension-certificate, and, in the case of a Maori pension,

by the pension-certificate, and, in the case of a Maori pension, by a certificate of death signed by a European of repute other than the applicant or the Registrar. Such application shall be made to the Registrar, who, after satisfying himself that the application is in order, shall forward it to the Commissioner with his recommendation as to payment; except that, in lieu of forwarding a receipt for funeral expenses paid by a charitable institution, he may certify on the application charitable institution, he may certify on the application that the receipt has been seen by him. No application shall be entertained where the pensioner has left an estate out of be entertained where the pensioner has left an estate out of which the funeral expenses, or the cost of maintenance, as the case may be, could be met, or where the pensioner has been dead more than three months, except under special circumstances, which must be explained to the Commissioner.

(3) In the case of an applicaton where no portion of the cost of the burial has been paid, the Commissioner may direct that payment of the pension accrued to date of death be made to the undertaker who arranged the burial of the pensioner instead of to the applicant.

pensioner instead of to the applicant.

30. With regard to the payment of that portion of a widow's pension payable in respect of the child or children of a deceased pensioner, application may be made by the person having the care or control of the said children to the Registrar, who shall forward the application for decision to the Commissioner accompanied by the pension-certificate and a report relating to the circumstances of the applicant. No application shall be entertained where the applicant is a person in affluent circumstances. circumstances.

#### AGENTS' WARRANTS.

31. With respect to a warrant authorizing payment of instalments to the governing body of a charitable institution

in terms of section 66 of the said Act the following provisions

shall apply:—
(a) The application for the warrant shall be made to the Registrar in the form numbered 12 in the First Schedule hereto, and shall specify—

(i) The name of each pensioner to which it relates;

(ii) The amount of the instalment applied for;

(iv) The cost and period of maintenance or relief, such period in no case commencing earlier than one calendar month before the day on which the instalment applied for falls due;

(v) The total amount of instalments applied for.
(b) The pension-certificate shall be produced in every case.
(c) The warrant, which shall be signed by the Registrar, shall be recorded on the application, and shall state the total amount for which it is granted.

the total amount for which it is granted.

(d) The warrant, which may relate to more pensioners than one, shall be delivered up to the paying officer by the payee when receiving payment of the instalments to which it relates, and shall be forwarded by the paying officer with his accounts.

(e) No warrant under this regulation shall be issued unless

o warrant under this regulation shall be issued unless any previous warrant issued to any person in respect of the same pension has been first surrendered to the Registrar, and no payment shall be made to a charitable institution except on production of a warrant issued in terms of these provisions. any dispute arises between the pensioner and the institution as to the proper disposal of the instalment, the question shall be decided in a summary way by a Magistrate

Magistrate.
32. With respect to a warrant authorizing payment of instalments to any person other than the pensioner in terms of section 67 of the said Act the following provisions shall

apply:—

(a) The application for the warrant shall be made to the Registrar direct, or to him through a paying officer or Clerk of Court, in the form numbered 13 in the First Schedule hereto, and shall be accompanied by the pension-certificate.

(b) The proposed payee, being a European of good repute, must be not less than twenty-one years of age.
(c) The warrant shall be in the form numbered 14 in the

(c) The warrant snall be in the form numbered 14 in the First Schedule hereto, and shall continue in force only during the currency of the pension-certificate to which it is expressed to relate: Provided that it may be renewed upon the issue of a renewed pension-certificate, or may be cancelled by the Registrar or Commissioner at any time for good cause shown.

(d) No such warrant shall be issued in respect of a pension where the previous is absent on about to be absent

where the pensioner is absent or about to be absent from the district in which the agent is residing, unless under special circumstances, which shall be set forth in the application.

(e) The Registrar shall issue the warrant together with the pension-certificate direct to the person entitled

thereto.

(f) If the pensioner does not consent to the application and refuses to give up the pension-certificate the Registrar may issue a duplicate pension-certificate with the warrant, and in respect to such duplicate the provisions of clauses 18 and 27 of these regulations shall apply.

(g) If after the issue of a duplicate pension-certificate in terms of the last preceding paragraph the original pension - certificate is presented for payment, the paying officer shall refuse payment thereon, and shall impound the certificate and forward it to the Commissioner.

#### RENEWAL AND REVIEW OF PENSIONS.

33. (1) For the purpose of ascertaining whether a rensioner under Part I or Part II of the said Act is entitled to a renewal of his pension, an Income and Property Statement in the form numbered 15 or 16 or 17 in the First Schedule hereto, as the case may require, shall be ledged with the Registrar immediately after the close of the income year.

(2) The Income and Property Statement required to secure

the continuance of an old-age pension granted to an inmate of a mental hospital, shall be signed by the Superintendent of a mental hospital, shall be signed by the Supermendent of the institution, and shall contain a certificate from the Public Trustee as to the property owned by and any income derived from the estate of the pensioner. The statement shall be dealt with as in the case of any other Income and Property Statement.

(3) If no statement is lodged within three months after the expiry of the said income-year the Registrar shall remove the

pensioner's name from his pension roll, and notify the Commissioner that he has done so. In any such case an application subsequently lodged shall be treated as an original pension-claim under these regulations, unless dealt with within the calendar year in which the aforesaid removal took place, in

which event it shall be dealt with in the same manner as if the statement had been duly lodged.

34. To facilitate the prompt furnishing of Income and Property Statements the Registrar shall issue to each pensioner before the close of the income year a copy of the prescribed form. On receipt of the said form duly completed he shall forthwith proceed, where necessary, to verify the statements of the pensioner by means of the forms provided for the purpose and in due course shall forward the necessary papers to the Commissioner with his recommendation, and any explanation

commissioner with his recommendation, and any explanation necessary as to the altered circumstances of the pensioner.

35. The Commissioner shall forthwith proceed to investigate the application in the same manner, with the same powers, and subject to the same provisions as in the case of an original pension-claim, and, having recorded his decision in the form numbered 18 or the form numbered 19 in the First Schedule hearts as the case may require particulars of which shall be numbered 18 or the form numbered 19 in the First Schedule hereto, as the case may require, particulars of which shall be noted on the district card, shall return the papers with a copy of his decision to the Registrar. The Registrar shall, in respect of each decision of the Commissioner received by him, notify the pensioner and note the pension-card, and, where a renewal of the pension has been authorized, shall issue a new pension-certificate to the paying officer, to be exchanged for the former certificate on expiry.

36. The Income and Property Statement required to secure the renewal of a pension under Part III of the said Act shall be dealt with as provided by clauses 34 and 35 of these regulations, except that the Commissioner, after noting the district

tions, except that the Commissioner, after noting the district card, shall notify the pensioner of his decision, and, in the event of a renewal of the pension being authorized, shall issue a new pension-certificate direct to the payee.

37. (1) Where at the investigation of any application for renewal of a pension, or at any other time, the Registrar is of the opinion that any pensioner under the said Act is, for any reason relating to the ownership of property or income, or for any other reason, drawing a larger or smaller amount of pension than that to which he is by law entitled, he shall forthwith furnish a report to the Commissioner, who shall, if deemed to be necessary, suspend payment of the pension, and proceed to investigate the circumstances in the same manner and with the same powers as in the case of an manner and with the same powers as in the case of an original pension-claim, and for that purpose the provisions of the said Act and of these regulations shall apply with all necessary modifications.

(2) In any case to which this clause relates the decision of the Commissioner shall be notified to the Registrar, who shall in the case of pensioners under Part I or Part II of the said Act in due course advise the pensioner and note the pension - card. The Commissioner shall in each such decision take such action in regard to the payment of the pension as is necessary in terms of the provisions of these

regulations.

38. Where as the result of any inquiry it is found that the pensioner has been paid an amount in excess of that to which he was by law entitled, the Commissioner may take to which he was by law entitled, the Commissioner may take action to recover such excess in the Magistrate's Court by plaint, as provided by the Magistrates' Courts Act, 1908. In lieu of any such proceedings he may make arrangements with the pensioner to refund in cash or deduct the amount from any further pension payable in such instalments as may be deemed desirable. Where it is ascertained that any overpayment has been obtained by fraud, a prosecution may be instituted by information laid in terms of the Justices of the Peace Act 1908

be instituted by information laid in terms of the Justices of the Peace Act, 1908.

39. No Court fees shall be payable in connection with any proceedings before a Magistrate under these regulations.

40. All moneys received by way of refund of overpaid pension, with or without Court proceedings, shall be paid into the Public Account at the nearest branch of the Bank of New Zealand, and the Registrar shall forward the bank receipts to the Commissioner, giving particulars of the refund.

41. Where a conviction for drunkenness is recorded for the first time against a pensioner the Registrar shall arrange for

41. Where a conviction for drunkenness is recorded for the first time against a pensioner the Registrar shall arrange for the appointment of an agent, and when notified of the issue of the necessary warrant the Commissioner shall give notice to the paying office to pay to the agent only; but where a second conviction for drunkenness or other offence dishonouring the pensioner in the public estimation is recorded during the currency of any pension-certificate the Commissioner may in his discretion suspend nayment of the during the currency of any pension-certificate the Commissioner may, in his discretion, suspend payment of the pension for such period as he deems fit. Where any further conviction is recorded during such currency the Commissioner shall cancel the pension, and shall notify the Registrar, who shall thereupon record the cancellation and shall recover and forward to the Commissioner the pension-certificate current at the date of expeculation at the date of cancellation.

#### RETURNS.

42. In respect of old-age and widows' pensions, the Registrar shall despatch to the Commissioner, not later than the third day in every month, returns for the preceding month as under:-

(a) A return of new pensions granted, indicating therein the pension-numbers that have been allotted to transferred pensions. In the event of no new pensions being granted, a "Nil" return shall be forwarded.

(b) A return of applications for new pensions investigated by the Magistrate and not granted, giving the reasons.

(c) A return of applications for renewal refused or adjourned during the month, and the reason for such refusal or adjournment.

#### GENERAL.

43. Except where otherwise specially provided, all powers and functions conferred upon or exercisable by a Registrar under the provisions of the said Act, or under any regulations made in pursuance thereof, shall be exercisable also by the Commissioner.

44. In every case where the death of a pensioner is reported to a Registrar the pension-certificate current at date of death, together with any warrant issued in respect thereto, shall be obtained and forwarded to the Commissioner. Immediately it comes to the knowledge of any Postmaster that a pensioner has died it shall be his duty to at once notify the Commissioner of the date and place of such death, and to return any unpaid

45. In every case where a pensioner is reported to have been committed to a mental hospital the pension-certificate current at the date of committal, together with any warrant

current at the date of committal, together with any warrant issued in respect thereto, shall be obtained and forwarded to the Commissioner for the necessary action.

46. If at any time a Registrar or Postmaster has reason to believe that any person in receipt of a pension under the said Act has done any act with intent to assign such pension, or any instalment thereof, contrary to the provisions of section 85 of the said Act, he shall at once furnish the Commissioner with a report on the matter, and the Commissioner shall take such action as will insure the carrying-out of the provisions of the said Act. provisions of the said Act.

47. It shall be the duty of a Clerk of Court, if at the time of the conviction of any person for any offence he has reason to believe that such person is a pensioner under the said Act, to ascertain whether such person is a pensioner, and, if so, to notify the Registrar of the conviction and of the nature of the offence.

48. On the death of any person in New Zealand being a male of the age of sixty-five years or upwards, or a female of the age of sixty years or upwards, or a widow with children under the age of fifteen years, or a totally blind person of the age of twenty years or upwards, or a miner, or a veteran of the Maori War, it shall be the duty of the Registrar of Deaths to whom the death is reported to inquire, and of the person reporting the death to inform the said Registrar, whether the deceased person was a pensioner under the said Act; and the said Registrar shall notify the Commissioner in writing of the death of any such person, even though he does not appear to be a pensioner.

49. It shall be the duty of the Public Trustee to supply to the Commissioner the names and addresses of deceased persons whose estates have been placed in his hands during each month for administration, and, in the event of any

each month for administration, and, in the event of any such person proving to have been a pensioner, to supply particulars of the estate.

particulars of the estate.

50. It shall be the duty of members of the Police Force, in addition to assisting applicants in the preparation of their pension-claims and Income and Property Statements, to render such service as the Department may require. Authority to incur expenditure on any occasion must be obtained beforehand from the Commissioner through the local Registrar. A police officer or Clerk of Court or Postmaster, if he believes that any pensioner is drawing a pension to which by law he is not entitled, either by reason of employment or for any other cause, or that any pensioner misspends his pension in drink, shall at once communicate with the Registrar of the district in which the said pensioner is residing, and the Registrar shall in such cases as are necessary take action as provided in these regulations.

51. The employment of medical practitioners for the purpose of determining the extent of the incapacity of any applicant for a miner's pension or for a pension to the blind shall be as decided by the Commissioner. N pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him by section two of the Maori Arts and Crafts Act, 1926, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations for the purpose of giving effect to the

#### REGULATIONS.

1. In these regulations "Board" means the

resolution of the Board, and includes, where not resolution of the Board, and includes, where not otherwise mentioned, a meeting of the Board or any committee thereof:

"Member" means a member of the Board:

"The said Act" means the Maori Arts and Crafts Act, 1926.
These regulations may be cited as the Maori Arts and Crafts Regulations, 1927.

#### MEETINGS.

3. The Board shall meet for the despatch of business at such times and places as the Board, the Chairman, or Deputy Chairman may from time to time direct.

4. Once at least in every year a meeting (hereinafter called "the annual meeting") shall be held at Rotorua. The time and place for such meeting shall be fixed by the Chairman, and shall be held (if possible) before the parliamentary session. The first such meeting shall be held in Wellington during July,

5. At every meeting the Chairman, or in his absence the Deputy Chairman, shall preside. If neither of these members is present, then some member chosen by the members present

shall present, then some member chosen by the members present shall preside.

6. A quorum at any meeting of the Board shall consist of five members, and no business beyond adjournment of the meeting shall be transacted unless a quorum is then present.

7. The Board shall decide all questions before it by a majority of votes. In case of an equality of votes the Chairman or other member presiding shall have a casting-vote as well as a deliberative vote.

8. Subject to the said Act and to these regulations, the

Board may regulate its own proceedings.

9. All proceedings and resolutions of the Board shall be recorded in a minute-book, to be kept for the purpose by the Secretary of the Board.

10. The seal of the Board shall be such as is determined by the Board and shall be kept in the custody of the Secretary or such other person as the Board may appoint for the purpose.

11. The seal of the Board shall not be affixed to any

document except in the presence either of the Secretary or other responsible officer of the Board and one member, or in the presence of two members, who shall attest the sealing of the document.

#### ACCOUNTS.

12. All moneys received by the Board shall be forthwith paid into the Native Trustee's Account to the credit of the fund.

13. All payments required to be made out of the fund shall be paid on the certificate of the Secretary, Director, or other responsible officer that the claim is in order, countersigned the Chairman or Deputy Chairman, or upon requisition under seal of the Board.

14. Proper books of accounts shall be kept by the Native Trustee, in which shall be entered correct records of all moneys received and paid out of the fund. Such books shall moneys received and paid out of the fund. Such books shall be open at all reasonable times to inspection by members of the Board or by any authorized officer of the Board.

15. The Native Trustee may from time to time deduct from the moneys held in the fund a fair and reasonable sum for the cost of the administration of the fund.

16. At the close of each financial year ending on the 31st day of March the Native Trustee shall cause to be prepred a

statement showing the total receipts and payments of the Board during that year. A copy of the statement shall be forwarded by the Native Trustee to the Secretary of the Board. 17. The Board shall cause to be prepared at the close of each financial year ending on the 31st day of March, statements showing the receipts and payments and income and expenditure for the year and a balance-sheet showing all assets and liabilities of the Board at the same date, which shall be audited by the Audit Office.

18. Copies of the statements referred to in the last two preceding clauses shall be placed before the Board at the annual meeting. The Secretary shall prepare and submit to the Board at such meeting a report of the operations and commitments of the Board during the same period, together with an estimate of the probable financial requirements of the Board for the next financial year.

19. A sum not exceeding £10 may from time to time be advanced to the Secretary or Director, who shall account therefor to the Board, for the purpose of paying postages, telegrams, and other incidental expenses.

TRAVELLING-ALLOWANCE AND LOCOMOTION EXPENSES.

20. The Board may, out of its funds, pay to its members a travelling-allowance of 25s. for every day or part of a day the member is absent from his usual place of residence in transacting any business of the Board: Provided that when a member leaves and returns to his usual place of residence on the same day his actual and reasonable expenses only shall

be paid.

21. The Board may also pay the actual and reasonable locomotion expenses incurred by members in transacting any business of the Board, including, where necessary, the provision of deck-cabins on steamers and sleeping-berths on trains.

(2) No bale of hemp shall contain any hank exceeding 5 lb. in weight.

(3) Each bale of hemp shall be securely bound with five bands neatly made of hemp, tow, or stripper-tow, and each bale of tow, stripper-tow, or stripper-slips with either four or five such bands.

(4) If the bands are made of tow their total weight per bale shall not exceed 3 lb. for five bands, or 2½ lb. for four

bands.
(5) The bands shall be an even distance apart, the outer

ones being 5 in. from the ends of the bale.

Provided that, where it is necessary for the purpose of transit from his mill, any miller may forward his phormium products to the appointed grading-store in packages of less dimensions than those prescribed, and with the registered brand as provided for in clause 4 hereof attached in any suitable and conspicuous manner. Such packages thell are soon as possible after arrival at the appointed shall, as soon as possible after arrival at the appointed grading-store, be repacked into bales in accordance with this clause, and shall at the same time have wire and tags inserted in accordance with subclauses (1) and (2) of clause 3.

#### Tags.

3. (1) Every miller shall cause to be placed in each bale of phormium products baled by him for export, before it leaves his mill, a piece of wire not lighter than 16 guage, about 2 ft. long, with tags securely attached to the ends thereof, as indicated in diagram No. 1 of the First Schedule hereto, as follows :-

(a) In the middle of the bale a tin tag  $4\frac{1}{4}$  in. long and  $2\frac{1}{4}$  in. wide, and of the shape shown in diagram No. 2 in the said First Schedule; and

(b) Outside the bale a tag made of strong white canvas with smooth surface, or other material approved in writing by the Chief Hemp Grader, 5 in. long by 2\frac{1}{4} in. wide, and of the shape shown in diagram No. 3 in the said First Schedule. The end of the wire after passing through the tag placed outside the bale shall be tightly twisted round the main wire for a distance of at least 3 in. from the end of the tag in the manner indicated in diagram No. 3 in the said First Schedule.

(2) Every tag shall bear, in letters and figures \(\frac{2}{4}\) in. in height, the registered brand of the mill where the phormium products were baled, and a consecutive number, not exceeding 9999, which shall be deemed the number of the bale. In the case of the tin tag, the brand and number shall be clearly impressed in the metal, in the case of the tag placed outside the bale the brand and number shall be printed in black

#### BRANDS.

4. (1) Every miller shall, in respect of each mill of which he is the occupier, apply to the Chief Hemp Grader for registration of the brand or brands intended to be used by him in compliance with clause 3 of these regulations, and no miller shall use any such brand until he has been advised by the Chief Hemp Grader that it has been registered. Every such application for registration shall be in or to the effect of the form numbered 1 set out in the Second Schedule hereto. Forms can be obtained free of charge from the Chief Hemp Grader. No brand shall be registered which, in the opinion of the Chief Hemp Grader, is likely to lead to mistakes or confusion, or is for any other reason undesirable for use as a brand.

(2) Brands which have been or are deemed to have been registered in accordance with the regulations hereby revoked, shall be deemed to have been registered in accordance with these regulations.

(3) Any brand already registered for hemp or hereafter registered in accordance with these regulations, may be used

for hemp, tow, stripper-tow, or stripper-slips.

(4) Any miller disposing of the mill in respect of which any brand has been registered as provided in this clause may, by writing addressed to the Chief Hemp Grader, transfer his right to such brand to the person to whom he has disposed of the mill, and the Chief Hemp Grader shall thereupon alter the register accordingly. the register accordingly.

No fee will be charged for the registration or transfer of millers' brands.

(6) The Chief Hemp Grader may at any time, after giving any miller one month's notice in writing cancel such miller's brand if satisfied that it has not been used during the preceding three years.

5. #### STORAGE FOR GRADING.

6. For the purpose of examination and grading, all phormium

6. For the purpose of examination and grading, all phormium products for export shall be stored by the owner thereof in one of the appointed grading-stores at least four clear days before the grading thereof is required to be done.
7. (1) The owner shall at the same time submit the phormium products for grading by giving the grader at the appointed grading-store in which the said products are being stored, written particulars in or to the effect of the form numbered 2 set out in the Second Schedule hereto.
(2) Where there is any noticeable difference in the quality of the phormium products forwarded to an appointed grading-store in one lot and under one brand, the owner shall submit such products in separate parcels of a uniform quality, with a

such products in separate parcels of a uniform quality, with a distinguishing mark on the canvas tag of each bale in each such parcel, and the advice to the grader as provided for in the last preceding subclause shall show the distinguishing mark of each such parcel.

(3) Forms for the notification of such particulars may be obtained from the Government Printer, Wellington.
(4) Every person who wilfully supplies false information on

(4) Every person who wilfully supplies false information on such advice as aforesaid commits a breach of these regulations.
(5) No phormium products will be graded unless all the foregoing provisions have been complied with.

8. Every owner of phormium products sending them to any of the appointed grading-stores shall make his own arrangements for the transit of the said products to and from the store, and also for their shipment, including receiving, storage, opening of bales, and drawing of hanks for examination, rebaling, packing, delivery and any other service. He shall also, insofar as he deems desirable, make his own arrangements for their insurance and protection from loss or damage. ments for their insurance and protection from loss or damage of any kind.


#### GRADING PROCEDURE AND CHARGES.


- 13. The grade of each parcel of phormium products submitted for grading shall be determined by the grader upon opening 5 per centum of the bales, and such further number as he deems necessary, and also, in the case of hemp, upon drawing hanks from as many additional bales as he considers advisable.
- 14. Any phormium products which on being opened for grading are found to be in a wet or damp condition will not be graded, but such products may be dried and resubmitted for grading. The charge provided for by clause 15 of these regulations will, however, be made in respect of each lot found to be in a wet or damp condition, and a separate charge will be made when the same lot is resubmitted for grading.
- 15. The charge for grading hemp shall be 4d. per bale, and for tow, stripper-tow, or stripper-slips, 3d. per bale, and shall be payable by the owner on demand. Any phormium products resubmitted for grading in accordance with any of the provisions of these regulations shall be treated as a separate parcel
- 16. As soon as possible after grading any phormium products the grader shall stamp the canvas tag attached to each bale thereof with a mark (herein called a "grade-mark") as shown in diagram No. 4 of the First Schedule hereto, indicating the in diagram No. 4 of the First Schedule hereto, indicating the grade of such phormium products as determined in accordance with clauses 9, 10, 11, and 12 hereof; and shall also, if he is satisfied that the phormium products are intended for export, sign and deliver to the owner a certificate of the said grade (herein called a "grader's certificate") in or to the effect of the form numbered 3 set out in the Second Schedule hereto: Provided that, in the case of stripper-slips, the total points awarded need not be shown in the grader's certificate. He shall also, if requested, sign and deliver a report on the phormium products to the miller whose brand they bear.
- 17. In the event of the hemp in any parcel being noticeably of less than average length the grader shall insert the words "Short" or "Very Short," as the case may be, on the grader's certificate.
- 18. On the request of the owner any grader shall substitute for separate certificates issued at the time of grading one inclusive certificate for two or more parcels shipped by the same vessel. Blank forms for this purpose will be supplied on application to any grader, and must be filled in by the owner and submitted to the grader for his signature. The separate certificate issued at the time of grading must in every case be returned before the inclusive certificate is given.

- 19. (1) Owners' marks, which may be affixed to bales in the appointed grading-stores by owners will be registered on application to the Chief Hemp Grader, but no such mark shall be used until the owner has been advised by the Chief Hemp Grader that the mark has been registered. In no case shall the miller's brand be removed or in any way interfered with. In every instance the owner shall notify the grader immediately before affixing any such marks. The Chief Hemp Grader may decline to register any owner's mark if he considers it to resemble a mark already registered so closely as to cause risk of confusion, or to be for any other reason undesirable for use as an owner's mark.
- (2) No fee will be charged for the registration of owners marks.
- 20. No person shall remove from an appointed gradingstore, except for the purpose of immediately shipping them for export beyond New Zealand, any phormium products in respect of which a grader's certificate has been issued, unless such certificate is first surrendered to a grader.
- 21. No phormium products in respect of which the certificate has been or ought to have been surrendered in accordance with the last preceding clause shall be exported until they have been resubmitted for grading and a new certificate has been issued in respect thereof.
- 22. (1) If after any phormium products have been graded and a certificate issued, such products are damaged by fire or water, or through any other cause, the owner shall, if the certificate issued in respect of such products is still in his possession, forthwith surrender the certificate to the grader; and whether the certificate is or is not surrendered, such products shall not be shipped from New Zealand without being regraded and a new certificate issued as hereinafter provided.
- (2) Such products may be reconditioned and submitted again for grading: Provided that in such case the owner shall, when giving the grader the written particulars prescribed by these regulations, state on the form of advice that the products have been so reconditioned: Provided also that the grader shall, when issuing a new certificate for such products endorse on the certificate a statement that they have been reconditioned.
- 23. Any person who knowingly and wilfully represents or implies for any purpose whatsoever that the grader's certificate issued in respect of any lot of phormium products is the certificate issued in respect of any other lot commits a breach of these regulations.
- 24. The decision of any grader as to the quality, condition, or grade of any phormium products shall be conclusive, and no action or other proceeding shall lie against the Crown, or against any grader, or against any other officer of the Crown in respect of any erroneous decision of a grader as to such quality, condition, or grade.
- 25. Except to dry, redress, or rebale the products or to use the same for manufacturing or other trade purposes, no person other than a grader in the execution of his duties shall remove or cause to be removed, wholly or partially, any miller's or owner's tag, brand, or mark, or any grademark, from any phormium products.

#### OFFENCES AND PENALTIES.

- 26. No person shall export, or attempt to export, or be concerned in exporting, any phormium products unless they bear distinctly impressed on the canvas tag provided for in clause 3 hereof the miller's brand, the number of the bale, and the grade-mark, and unless a grader's certificate in respect of such phormium products has been issued and is still in force. A grader's certificate which has been surrendered, or which ought to have been surrendered in accordance with any of the provisions of these regulations, shall for all purposes be deemed to be cancelled and to be no longer in force.
- 27. No person shall alter or obliterate, wholly or partially, or cause to be altered or obliterated, any miller's or owner's tag, brand, or mark on any phormium products, nor shall any person counterfeit any such tag, brand, or mark, or improperly impress or otherwise mark on any such products or on any covering thereof or anything attached thereto, any mark purporting to be the brand or mark of a miller or owner, either with the proper marking instrument of the miller or owner or with a counterfeit imitation thereof; or empty, or partially empty, or otherwise interfere with, any bale of phormium products branded by a miller in order to put therein or substitute any other phormium products; or use for the purpose of branding any such products any old tag bearing any miller's brand or any grade-mark, or anything resembling the same.
- 28. Any person who—(a) fails to observe or perform any duty directly or by implication placed upon him by these regulations, or (b) does anything contrary to the provisions thereof, commits a breach of these regulations.
- 29. Any person committing a breach of any of these regulations is liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty-five pounds.

(1) No person shall send or bring any package of trees or shrubs, or portions of trees or shrubs, from the North Island to any other portion of New Zealand unless such package is accompanied by a certificate, in the form set out in the Second Schedule hereto, signed by or on behalf of the consignor, stating that no plant or portion of a plant of any variety of apple, pear, quince, or crategus is contained in the package.

(2) The certificate shall be endorsed on a tag or label securely attached to the package in a prominent position.

(3) No person shall carry or despatch or deliver for purposes of despatch to any officer of the Post Office or the Railway Department or any other person any package containing trees or shrubs or portions of trees or shrubs intended to be sent from the North Island to any other portion of New Zealand, and not having attached thereto as herein provided the certificate required by this regulation.

4. (1) No person shall send or bring any bees from the North Island to any other portion of New Zealand unless such bees have been effectively quarantined at a place of quarantine as provided by this regulation for the six days immediately prior to their despatch from that Island, so as to prevent their having access to any flowers or other vegetation.

(2) The Director of the Horticulture Division of the Depart-

(2) The Director of the Horticulture Division of the Department of Agriculture shall appoint such places of quarantine within the North Island, and shall impose such conditions for their use, as he deems necessary.

(3) After completing the prescribed period of six days in quarantine the bees shall be forwarded direct from the place of quarantine to their final destination, an official permit in the form set out in the Third Schedule hereto or to the like effect, signed by an officer of the Department of Agriculture, being attached by tag or label to each parcel of such bees

(4) No person shall carry or despatch or deliver for purposes of despatch to any officer of the Post Office or the Railway Department or any other person any package containing bees intended to be sent from the North Island to any

(5) All expenses of sending bees to a place of quarantine and of forwarding them on completion of their period of quarantine to their destination outside the North Island shall be borne by the original sender of such bees, and shall be previated on demand.

IS Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of that Dominion, and in pursuance of the authority to make regulations for the peace, order, and good government of Samoa conferred upon him by the Samoa Act, 1921, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, doth hereby amend the Samoa Customs Consolidation Order, 1923, by making the following regulations.

## REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Samoa Customs Consolidation Amendment Order, 1927 (No. 2), and shall be read with and form part of the Samoa Customs Consolidation Order, 1923, and shall come into operation on the 6th day of June, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven.

2. The First Schedule (Import Duties) of the Samoa Customs . Consolidation Order, 1923, is hereby amended in the manner and to

the extent following, namely:-

### VICTORY PARK BOARD.

By-laws.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon it by sections 16 and 17 of the Victory Park Act, 1919, the Board of Trustees of Victory Park (hereinafter referred to as "the Board") does hereby make the following by-laws:—

#### Prohibiting any Person

- (1) Writing or causing to be written on any of the property of the Board any obscene or objectionable language;
- (2) Disfiguring, damaging, or destroying in any manner any buildings, fences, or other property of the Board;
  (3) Throwing stones, bricks, concrete, wood, or any hard
- material of any kind into or within the grounds;
- (4) Using obscene language;
  (5) Casting offensive matter on any part of the grounds,
- (a) Casing onensive matter on any part of the grounds, buildings, or subways;
  (b) Failing to obey the request of any official or servant of the Board in the execution of his duty;
  (7) Acting in an unseemly manner and refusing to leave the Park grounds when requested to do so by any official or servant of the Board.

#### Without authority from the Board-

- (8) Gaining or attempting to gain admission to the Park by production of any ticket, pass, or badge other than the ticket, pass, or badge entitling the holder to admission on the day of the presentation thereof;
  (9) Persons other than life members and ticket-holders gain-
- ing or attempting to gain admission to the Park grounds otherwise than by payment of admission fee at the entrance provided by the Board;

- (10) Gaining or attempting to gain admission to the Park grounds by means of non-transferable tickets, pass, or badge by any person other than the one to whom such ticket, pass, or badge was issued by the Board or the body to which the use of the Park has been granted by the Board;
- (11) Transfer to any person any non-transferable admission
- ticket, pass, or badge;
  (12) Gaining or attempting to gain admission by presentation of life member's badge by any person other than the one to whom such badge was issued by the Board;
- (13) Climbing on to the roofs, doors, or windows of any of the buildings or interfering in any way with the buildings, fences, appurtenances, or property of the Board in a manner likely to cause damage thereto;

  (17) Gaining or attempting to gain admission to any of the stands otherwise than by means of access provided;

  (18) Gaining or attempting to gain admission from the embankment to the enclosure otherwise than by means of the entrance provided for the purpose, and the payment of the requisite fee;

  (19) Bringing or causing to be brought into the grounds any intoxicating liquor of any description, or consuming liquor on any part of the ground in view of the public;

  (20) Taking bicycles or motor-cycles on to any part of the ground except that part known as the bicycle enclosure.


