*Proclaiming Native Land to have become Crown Land.*

 A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by section fourteen of the Native Land Amendment Act, 1914, it is provided, *inter alia*, that on being satisfied that the purchase of any Native land has been duly completed by or on behalf of the Crown under the authority of the Native Land Act, 1909, the Governor-General may issue a Proclamation that such land has become Crown land:

And whereas the purchase of the Native land set out in the Schedule hereto has been duly completed by or on behalf of the Crown under the authority of the Native Land Act, 1909, and its amendments:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority so conferred upon me by section fourteen of the Native Land Amendment Act, 1914, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim that the Native land set out in the Schedule hereto has become Crown land.

WHEREAS settlers in the locality known as "Maxwelltown," in the County of Waitotara, desire that the name of such locality should be changed to "Maxwell," and it is considered expedient to alter the same:

Now, therefore, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on me by the Designation of Districts Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim

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and declare that the name of the locality known as "Maxwelltown," in the County of Waitotara, shall be and the same is hereby altered to "Maxwell," and do assign the last-mentioned name to such locality accordingly; and also do hereby proclaim and declare that this Proclamation shall take effect on the first day of August, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven, not being earlier than six months after the first publication thereof in the *Gazette*.

WHEREAS the Scenery Preservation Board, constituted pursuant to the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), has recommended that the land described in the Schedule hereto should be permanently reserved for scenic purposes, and it is expedient to give effect to such recommendation:

Now, therefore, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto shall be a scenic reserve under the said Act, and subject to the provisions thereof.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by section three hundred and two of the Land Act, 1924, it is enacted that the Governor-General may, by Proclamation approved in Executive Council, declare that any unoccupied national-endowment land not exceeding in the aggregate twenty thousand acres, shall, as from a date to be specified in the Proclamation, cease to be national-endowment land:

And whereas it is deemed expedient that the land mentioned in the Schedule hereto, shall cease to be national-endowment land, and shall be available for disposal as inferior lands under the provisions of section two hundred and twenty-three of the Land Act, 1924:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities so conferred upon me by the aforesaid section, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, do hereby proclaim and declare that from and after the date of the gazetting hereof the land described in the Schedule hereto, which was set apart as national-endowment land under the provisions of section two hundred and fifty-eight of the Land Act, 1908, shall cease to be national-endowment land, and is set apart under the provisions of section two hundred and twenty-three of the Land Act, 1924, for disposal as inferior lands.

A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by section twenty of the Forests Act, 1921-22, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting on the recommendation of the Minister of Lands, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto, being portion of provisional State forest reserve set apart by Proclamation, dated the twenty-fourth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-two, and gazetted on the first day of June, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-two, is required for settlement purposes; and, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, such land shall, from and after the day of the gazetting hereof, cease to be provisional

State forest, and shall become subject to the provisions of the Land Act, 1924.

Now, therefore, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by sections forty-nine, fifty, and fifty-two of the Native Land Amendment Act, 1913, and in so far as each of these sections is applicable, do hereby proclaim as a public road the road-line described in the Schedule hereto.

*Defining the Middle-line of a Road in Block IX, Clyde Survey District—viz., a Deviation of the Whakaki—Hereheretau Road.*

A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by the Public Works Act, 1908, the Public Works Amendment Act, 1923, and of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in this behalf, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that the middle-line of the road desired to be constructed over Block IX, Clyde Survey District—viz., a deviation of the Whakaki—Hereheretau Road—shall be that defined and set forth in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

COMMENCING at a point on the Whakaki—Hereheretau Road, in Hereheretau 2c1 Block, near the western boundary of Block IX, Clyde Survey District, and proceeding thence generally in a north-easterly direction, and passing in, into, through, or over the said Hereheretau 2c1 Block, Block IX, Clyde Survey District, and terminating at a point on the said Whakaki—Hereheretau Road, being a distance of 24 chains, more or less, including all adjoining and intervening places, lands, reserves, roads, tracks, lakes, rivers, streams, and water-courses.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him by the National Provident Fund Act, 1926 (hereinafter referred to as the said Act), His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the regulations now in force under the said Act, and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the following regulations for the purposes of that Act, and, with the like advice and consent, doth hereby declare that this Order in Council shall come into force on the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven.

## REGULATIONS.

## PART I.—ADMINISTRATION AND GENERAL.

1. THESE regulations may be cited as the National Provident Fund Regulations, 1927.

2. In these regulations—

- “Board” means the National Provident Fund Board established by the said Act;  
 “Fund” means the National Provident Fund;  
 “Minister” means the Minister for the time being administering the said Act;  
 “Superintendent” means the Superintendent of the National Provident Fund;  
 “Contributor” means a contributor to the National Provident Fund;  
 “Member” means a member of an approved friendly society;  
 “Society” means the officers of, or the central or executive body of, an approved friendly society or of an approved district friendly society, and includes a branch thereof.

*The Board.*

3. (1) Meetings of the Board shall be held in Wellington.  
 (2) Ordinary meetings shall be held quarterly, on the third Thursday in February, May, August, and November.  
 (3) Special meetings may be held at such times as the Minister determines.  
 (4) At all meetings the Chairman shall have a deliberative as well as a casting vote.  
 (5) The Board shall keep a correct record of all business transacted at its meetings.  
 (6) The Secretary of the Board shall send to every member of the Board at least seven days' notice of every ordinary meeting, and at least three days' notice of every special meeting.  
 (7) The statements required by section 72 of the Act to be prepared by the Board shall be in the forms numbered 1, 2, and 3 respectively in the First Schedule hereto.  
 4. (1) The Superintendent shall refer to the Board at each quarterly meeting such matters as are required by the Act to be decided by the Board.  
 (2) The Superintendent shall otherwise administer the Fund, and have control of the staff and keep proper accounts of the moneys of the Fund.

*Payment of Contributions.*

5. (1) Contributions to the Fund may be paid at any postal money-order office, or at the district offices of the Fund at Auckland, Wellington, Christchurch, and Dunedin.  
 (2) Accounts of all moneys received by Postmasters shall be rendered periodically to the Superintendent by the General Post Office.

*Investment of Fund.*

6. (1) All moneys belonging to the Fund shall be specially invested by the Public Trustee as hereinafter provided.  
 (2) As from the first day of the month following the receipt of any such moneys, the Public Trustee shall allocate to the amount of such moneys then in hand securities held by him on behalf of the Common Fund of the Public Trust Office at the rate of interest prevailing at that time in respect of Common Fund investments.  
 (3) Where the moneys of the Common Fund have during that financial year been invested in different classes of securities bearing varying rates of interest, allocation for the purposes of the last preceding subclause shall be *pro rata* amongst such securities.

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(4) For his services in and about the collection of interest or otherwise in respect of such securities the Public Trustee shall be entitled to charge and deduct from such interest a fee of £2 10s. per centum per annum in respect of interest received from mortgages and £2 10s. per centum per annum on debenture interest.

(5) In order to provide for the payment of benefits out of the Fund, the Public Trustee shall pay over such sums as are required from time to time, on requisition in the Form No. 4 in the First Schedule.

## PART II.—ORDINARY CONTRIBUTIONS TO THE FUND.

7. (1) Every person qualified in terms of section 10 of the said Act who desires to become a contributor to the Fund shall make application to be enrolled as a contributor to the Fund in the Form No. 1 in the Second Schedule hereto.

(2) On payment of the first contribution (the aforesaid application having been duly completed) there shall be issued to the contributor a receipt-book, in which his contributions shall be entered and initialled for: Provided that where contributions are paid for or on behalf of a number of contributors the receipt may be given in the form provided for the purpose.

(3) The Superintendent may require any contributor to prove his age by the production of a birth-certificate or by such other satisfactory evidence as may be decided upon by the Board. In the case of persons born in New Zealand the Superintendent may refer applications to the Registrar-General of Births and Deaths for verification as to the age of applicants.

(4) On receipt of the application, and on advice of the payment of the first contribution, the Superintendent, after satisfying himself that the particulars are in order, shall forward to the contributor a notice of acceptance as a contributor.

(5) Contributors desiring to pay their contributions in advance for a term of five or more years may compound therefor in accordance with the commutation table set out in the Form No. 2 of the Second Schedule hereto.

(6) Contributors desirous of electing to increase or reduce their contributions shall make application for that purpose in the Form No. 3 in the Second Schedule hereto.

*Ceasing to be a Contributor.*

8. (1) Contributors who elect to cease to be contributors shall give notice of their election in the Form No. 4 in the Second Schedule hereto.

(2) Applications for refunds of contributions on the death of a contributor shall be accompanied by the death-certificate and such other proof of claim as the Board may require.

(3) Applications for the return of contributions of a person who has ceased to be a contributor through arrears shall be supported by such proofs of identity as the Board may determine.

*Groups of Contributors.*

9. (1) Where it is desired that an employer or other responsible person should make the payments on behalf of a body of qualified persons to the number of five or more employed at any one place of employment, the Superintendent, on application to that effect, may arrange for the receipt of the contributions in a lump sum either at a district office or at a postal money-order office, in which case a single receipt shall be issued to the payer, and notices shall be sent at stated intervals to each employee advising him of the date up to which his contributions are credited.

(2) Each such employee, if he has not already done so, shall, when the first payment is made on his behalf, duly complete the form of application to be enrolled as a contributor to the Fund.

(3) When the contributions of any employee are no longer to be paid on his behalf as provided in this clause, the employer shall give to the Superintendent a notice to that effect in the Form No. 5 in the Second Schedule hereto.

*Payment on Birth of a Child.*

10. Application for payment under section 19 of the said Act in respect of the birth of a child shall be made in the Form No. 6 in the Second Schedule hereto, and, if so required by the Superintendent, shall be supported by the birth-certificate of the child.

*Incapacity Benefit.*

11. (1) Claims for payment of the allowance due to a contributor who is wholly incapacitated from carrying on his trade, business, employment, calling, or occupation shall be made in the Form No. 7 in the Second Schedule hereto, and

shall be accompanied by the marriage-certificate of the contributor and birth-certificates of the children in respect of whom the claim is made, or, in the absence of such certificates, by such other evidence as the Board may deem satisfactory.

(2) The Board may require a medical certificate to be furnished at such time or times as may be decided in each case.

(3) Application for the appointment of any person to act as an agent for the receipt of allowances due on behalf of any incapacitated beneficiary must be made in the Form No. 8 in the Second Schedule hereto.

(4) The person in whose favour the warrant is to be issued must be a reputable person, and must record his assent to act on the application form.

(5) Every such warrant shall be in the Form No. 9 in the Second Schedule hereto.

*Claim for Allowance for Widow and Children on Death of Contributor.*

12. (1) Claims for an allowance under section 15 of the said Act for the benefit of the widow and children of a deceased contributor shall be in the Form No. 10 in the Second Schedule hereto, and must be supported by the following documents: Death-certificate of contributor, marriage-certificate of claimant, and birth-certificates of children. Satisfactory evidence of the identity and survival of the widow and children shall be supplied from time to time as required by the Superintendent.

(2) Where a claim against the Fund is made in respect of a deceased contributor, the identity of the contributor shall, if the Superintendent so requires, be supported by a statutory declaration, in the Form No. 11 in the Second Schedule hereto, made by some person other than the claimant.

*Mode of Payment.*

13. On receipt of a claim for an allowance or a payment out of the Fund, the Superintendent, after satisfying himself that the claim is in order, shall issue a voucher authorizing payment of the said claim to the person or persons named therein. He shall also at the same time issue a notice of payment to the person entitled to receive the same.

*Transfer of Rights.*

14. Where any person or association of persons contributing on behalf of another person desires to transfer his or its rights to such last-mentioned person, such transfer shall be made in the Form No. 12 in the Second Schedule hereto.

**PART III.—SUPERANNUATION FOR LOCAL AUTHORITIES AND OTHER EMPLOYERS.**

15. The application of the local authority to become a contributor shall be in Form No. 1 in the Third Schedule hereto.

16. The special resolution to be passed by the local authority shall include any conditions imposed by the Board in terms of section 24 of the said Act.

17. The local authority shall advise the Superintendent, in the Form No. 2 in the Third Schedule hereto, of any increases or reductions in the salaries of persons in respect of whom the local authority is a contributor.

18. The local authority shall notify the Superintendent, in the Form No. 3 in the Third Schedule hereto, when it ceases to be a contributor on behalf of any person who resigns or is dismissed.

19. Any person on behalf of whom a local authority has ceased to be a contributor may apply, in the Form No. 3 in the Third Schedule hereto, to have any refund due credited to him as a contributor on his own behalf.

20. The local authority shall notify the Superintendent of any employee transferred to another local authority, giving name, date of transfer, and pension allowance.

21. Any application to count as continuous service any service other than is specified in the special resolution shall be made through the local authority to the Superintendent.

22. The local authority shall from time to time advise the Superintendent, in the Form No. 4 in the Third Schedule hereto, with respect to persons in its employ who are retiring either from age or medical unfitness.

23. The Superintendent may require the local authority to furnish to the Board such proof of medical unfitness as it deems necessary.

24. The local authority shall also report to the Superintendent all cases of persons totally or partially disabled by accident, and who have in consequence become medically unfit for further duty, and have received compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act, 1922, stating the amount so paid to each person.

25. If the Board has reason to believe that any person who has been retired medically unfit is fit to resume duty, or should such person decline to go up for medical examination, then and in all such cases the Board shall immediately direct that all payments from the Fund to such person shall cease until such time as he produces satisfactory medical proof of his unfitness for duty, and the Board shall then determine what forfeiture (if any) shall be made from the retiring-allowance.

26. With respect to any male employee who may die from any cause before becoming a claimant on the Fund, leaving widow and children, the local authority shall, in addition to the foregoing particulars, furnish to the Superintendent a statement in the Form No. 5 in the Third Schedule hereto, signed by the widow, setting forth full and correct particulars of the family of the deceased person.

27. Any person in the employ of a local authority who is a member of a registered friendly society may apply in the Form No. 6 in the Third Schedule hereto, requesting that his sick and funeral benefits due by the said society be regarded as part benefits due under the said Act in terms of section 37 thereof.

28. A return of contributions paid to the Fund on behalf of employees shall be made monthly by every contributing local authority to the Superintendent, in the Form No. 7 in the Third Schedule hereto. Once in every three months such return shall be accompanied by a statutory declaration, to be made by the Clerk or other principal officer of the local authority in the Form No. 8 in the Third Schedule hereto.

29. The foregoing regulations contained in this Part shall, with the necessary modifications, and so far as the same are applicable, apply to any employer described as such in section 38 of the said Act.

**PART IV.—SPECIAL PROVISIONS RELATING TO APPROVED FRIENDLY SOCIETIES' MEMBERS.**

*Maternity Allowances.*

30. Every claim by a member of an approved friendly society for a maternity allowance under sections 42 to 47 of the said Act shall be made in the Form No. 1 in the Fourth Schedule hereto.

31. The society, on being satisfied that the claim is in order, and that the wife of the member, or the member (being a married woman), is legally entitled thereto, shall forthwith pay the allowance, taking the wife's receipt therefor, or if the husband has been duly authorized to receive it, his receipt in the space provided on the application.

32. The society shall transmit the receipted claims to the Superintendent, who shall credit the society accordingly in the accounts of the Fund.

*Contributions and Pensions.*

33. The society shall require members on behalf of whom the society becomes a contributor to the Fund pursuant to section 39 of the said Act to sign an application in the Form No. 2 in the Fourth Schedule hereto, to be transmitted to the Superintendent by the secretary to the society. The society shall issue to the member a receipt in the Form No. 3 in the Fourth Schedule hereto for contributions received by it on his account.

34. The contributions received on behalf of members shall be accounted for by the society to the Superintendent in the Form No. 4 in the Fourth Schedule hereto.

35. (1) The amount to be paid over by such society under section 49 of the Act in respect of a member becoming entitled to a pension shall be such sum as the Actuary of Friendly Societies reports upon actuarial computation to be the equivalent of a sickness allowance of £1 per week during the first six months' sickness, 10s. per week during the second six months' sickness, and 5s. per week during the remainder of his sickness, and which in his opinion could be paid by such society without loss; and, in consideration of such payment, the society shall accordingly be relieved from liability to that extent from the time of such member becoming entitled to the pension.

(2) Any society or branch which pays higher sickness allowances than herein mentioned may provide in its rules for the payment during sickness of an allowance representing the difference between such higher rates and the values relinquished as provided herein, or provide for the commutation of such difference into an equivalent sickness allowance or a reduction of contributions, or both, as may be certified by the Actuary for Friendly Societies.

36. The society shall each month advise the Superintendent of the death, withdrawal, lapse, or transfer of any of its members on behalf of whom contributions are made to the Fund. On receipt of such notice any return of contributions due from the Fund shall be paid through the society to the member or his representatives.

*Accounts.*

37. Separate accounts of all amounts received in respect of contributions from members and of claims paid for allowances shall be kept by societies in the Form No. 5 in the Fourth Schedule hereto.

38. The society shall transmit particulars of such accounts to the Superintendent as required.

39. All books, accounts, statements, and other documents used by a society in respect of its business under the said Act must be produced for audit purposes at such time and places as the Board may prescribe.

*General.*

40. In the case of any branch of an approved society being found guilty of maladministration of any of the benefits under the said Act, or being convicted of any offence under any Act, the Board may suspend such branch from the right of administering those benefits, and either undertake the administration thereof or request the society to do so.

41. Except in so far as is inconsistent with the said Act and these regulations, any business transacted by any society thereunder so far as it relates to societies shall be treated as part of its ordinary business, and the provisions of the Friendly Societies Act, 1909, shall apply thereto.

42. In provisionally approving a society under the said Act the Board may require the executive or managing committee of an applying society or district society to adopt provisional rules, which shall be confirmed at the first annual

or general meeting of the society or district society held thereafter. The rules of a society approved or provisionally approved for the purposes of the said Act shall be made to apply to the branches of that society.

43. The trustees of any approved friendly society may, in the Form No. 6 in the Fourth Schedule hereto, authorize the Superintendent to pay into the society's bank account any moneys payable to that society out of the Fund.

44. (1) On attaining the age of sixty years the member shall make application for a pension in the Form No. 7 in the Fourth Schedule hereto, and the society shall certify that he is at that date a financial benefit member of the order. The Superintendent shall then debit the society in the accounts of the Fund with the amount due under section 49 of the said Act.

(2) At the end of each calendar month the society or branch shall pay the member the amount of pension due for that month, and take a receipt therefor in the Form No. 8 in the Fourth Schedule hereto, which shall then be transmitted to the Superintendent, who shall credit the society accordingly in the accounts of the Fund.

(3) The member shall from time to time, as required by the Superintendent, furnish a life certificate in the Form No. 9 in the Fourth Schedule hereto.

PART V.—REVOCATION OF REGULATIONS.

45. The regulations hereby revoked are specified in the Fifth Schedule hereto.

*License authorizing the Westland Electric-power Board to use Water from the Wainihinini Creek, Kawhaka Creek, and McPherson's Creek for the Purpose of generating Electricity, and to use Electric Lines within Portion of the Westland Electric-power District.*

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 4th day of July, 1927.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Public Works Amendment Act, 1908, the Public Works Amendment Act, 1911, and of all others powers in anywise enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth—subject to the conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto, and to the regulations made under section two of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1911, on the ninth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-two, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the twelfth day of the same month, or any regulations hereafter made in amendment thereof or in substitution therefor (such regulations which are deemed to be incorporated herein, being hereinafter collectively referred to as “the regulations”)—hereby grant to the Westland Electric-power Board, being an electric-power Board duly constituted under the provisions of the Electric-power Boards Act, 1918 (hereinafter with its successors and assigns referred to as “the licensee”), a license to take and use from Wainihinini Creek, Kawhaka Creek, and McPherson's Creek (hereinafter referred to as “the said rivers”), in the Westland Land District, for the purposes hereinafter set forth, a stream of water (hereinafter referred to as “the said water”) not exceeding one hundred and sixty cubic feet per second respectively at any one time; and also to erect and use electric lines for power, lighting, heating, or other uses within that portion of the Westland Electric-power District (as at present constituted) outlined in red on plan marked P.W.D. 69033 (hereinafter referred to as “the said plan”), and deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works at Wellington, such electric lines at present proposed to be used being indicated on the said plan by blue and yellow lines. Nothing herein shall be held to guarantee that the said rivers contain sufficient water to supply the volume of water hereinbefore referred to; and all rights hereby granted shall be subject to all existing rights heretofore granted under the Mining Acts or otherwise.

SCHEDULE.

1. PLANS.

The licensee shall, before the works hereby authorized are commenced, forward for the approval of the Minister of Public Works (hereinafter referred to as “the Minister”)—

- (a) Full detailed drawings and specifications of the diverting weirs;
- (b) Drawings showing how and in what manner the water diverted is to be returned to the said rivers;
- (c) Contour-plans showing difference in level of water due to the construction of the headworks;
- (d) Drawings giving full particulars of any tunnels, aqueducts, and pipe-lines used in conveying the water from the headworks to the power-stations.
- (e) Drawings showing the arrangement of the generating, switching, and transforming plant in the power-stations;

and none of the said works or any portion thereof shall be commenced before the said approval is obtained.

2. UTILIZATION OF THE WATER.

The said water (less such volume of water as is otherwise authorized to be used for mining purposes, and less such volume as is required to be supplied to the Kumara Borough Council in terms of an agreement about to be entered into between the Westland Electric-power Board and the Minister of Mines) shall be used solely for the purpose of generating electricity, and the whole of such water shall be conveyed to the Teremakau River at or near the power-house.

3. LOCATION OF HEADWORKS.

The said water shall be taken from the said rivers at the headworks as indicated on the said plan.

4. GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF WORKS.

The licensee is hereby authorized, subject to the conditions herein contained, to construct, maintain, and use the following works for the purposes of this license, the position of the said works being indicated on the said plan.

- (a) Headworks consisting of weirs and necessary intakes;
- (b) Races, penstocks, and pipe-lines leading from such weirs to the power-houses hereinafter referred to; also tail-races from the power-houses to the Teremakau River;
- (c) Power-houses with all necessary equipment, including water-turbines, generators, transformers, lightning-arresters, switchboards, switches, exciters, and other appliances for generating electricity;
- (d) Transmission and other lines over the routes shown by means of blue and yellow lines on the said plan after compliance with the provisions of clause 18 hereof;
- (e) Such further transmission and other lines within the area of supply as may from time to time be required within such area of supply. Any extensions or alterations of lines pursuant to this paragraph shall be made only after compliance with the provisions of clause 13 of the regulations.

5. MAINTENANCE OF WORKS.

The licensee shall maintain the works used under this license in proper working order during the continuance of such license.

6. DURATION OF LICENSE.

This license shall, unless sooner determined in accordance with the provisions hereinafter expressed, continue in force for a period of thirty years from the date hereof. Upon the expiry of the said term, or upon the sooner determination of this license by revocation or otherwise, all rights hereby granted to the licensee shall thereupon cease and determine, but such expiration or determination shall not relieve the licensee of any liability theretofore incurred under this license.

7. RENTAL.

The licensee shall, in respect of this license, pay to the Public Works Engineer for the district, or otherwise as the Minister may from time to time require, a rental at the rate of 1s. per annum per kilowatt of maximum output, as recorded by the wattmeter to be installed by the licensee at the power-house; payment to be made yearly on the 31st day of March in each year, the first payment to be made on the 31st day of March next succeeding the day on which electrical power is first supplied. For the purpose of this clause “maximum output” means twice the number of units generated and recorded in the half-hour during which the output is the maximum for the year. Wattmeter readings shall be recorded half-hourly throughout each day. The minimum rental shall not be less than £10 per annum.

8. GRANTING OF OTHER WATER-RIGHTS.

Nothing herein shall prevent the Governor-General in Council from granting to any person or body corporate other than the licensee a license to take water from any portion of the said streams, except at the place where the licensee is by this license empowered to take it: Provided that no such license shall so operate as to reduce the natural fall between the headworks and tail-water, or the volume of the water which the licensee is by this license authorized to take from the said streams.

9. VARIATION IN CONDITIONS OF LICENSE.

The terms and conditions of this license may from time to time, at the request or with the consent in writing of the licensee, be altered by the Governor-General by Order in Council.

10. SURRENDER OF LICENSE.

The licensee may at any time, with the consent of the Minister surrender this license, and shall thereupon remove from the ground (if so required by the Minister, and subject to the terms of any mortgage between the licensee and the Minister of Mines) all removable equipment, machinery, buildings, poles, transmission-lines, and other plant herein authorized to be installed or provided. If the licensee fails or neglects so to remove the said plant within twelve months after being required so to do, such equipment, machinery, buildings, poles, lines, and other plant shall, without payment of compensation, vest in and become the property of the Crown.

11. SYSTEM OF SUPPLY.

The system of supply shall be as described in paragraphs (c) and (e) of clause 2 of the regulations.

The generating voltage shall be approximately 6,600 or 400 volts between the terminals, and transformed to 33,000 or 6,600 volts for transmission.

#### 12. CHARGES FOR ELECTRICAL ENERGY.

The charges for electrical energy shall not exceed 1s. 3d. per unit for lighting purposes (including the operation of motor-generators for lighting purposes), and 6d. per unit for motor-power, heating, or cooking purposes: Provided that, if accounts be paid within fourteen days of due date the charges shall not exceed 1s. per unit for lighting and 4½d. per unit for motor-power, heating, or cooking. In the case of wholesale supply the charge shall not exceed £12 per horse-power per annum. "Wholesale supply" for this purpose shall be held to be a supply in respect of which the consumer shall guarantee to pay not less than £250 per annum. Supply may be given to wholesale consumers at 6,600 volts.

Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of this clause, if not less than 25 per centum of the consumers at any time represent to the Minister that the licensee is charging for the supply of electrical energy at a rate which is returning an excessive profit, after allowing for the creation of a reasonable reserve fund, the Minister shall have power to cause such inquiry and investigation of the licensee's books and accounts as he may deem necessary; and if, after such inquiry and investigation, he is of opinion that unreasonably high profits are being made, having regard to all surrounding circumstances and conditions and to the nature of the undertaking, the Governor-General may, on the recommendation of the Minister, from time to time, reduce or otherwise amend the rates permitted to be charged to consumers under this license.

#### 13. INTERCHANGE OF SUPPLY OF ELECTRICAL ENERGY.

(1) In the event of the Minister establishing within or outside the area of supply a hydro-electric-power scheme of a frequency of 50 cycles per second on the three-phase-alternating-current system, he may require the licensee to connect that system with the licensee's electrical system in such a manner that an interchange of electrical energy between the two systems may be made from time to time when required by either the licensee or the Minister, up to at least one-half of the total capacity of the plant installed at the licensee's power-house.

(2) The licensee shall erect and maintain in good order, at the expense of the licensee, the necessary transmission-lines between the licensee's power-house and a point, to be determined by the Minister, not beyond the boundary of the area of supply.

(3) The Minister shall erect and maintain in good order, at the expense of the Minister, the necessary transmission-lines outside the area of supply for the purpose of connecting the two systems at the point mentioned in the last preceding subclause.

(4) The licensee and the Minister respectively shall, on demand, and from time to time as and when required, supply to each other so much of the surplus electrical energy as is then required and is available, but not in excess of one-half of the capacity of the plant installed in the licensee's power-house.

(5) The price to be paid by the licensee or the Minister shall not exceed the following rates:—

Between the hours of 8 a.m. and 8 p.m. daily: 1d. per unit.

Between the hours of 8 p.m. and 8 a.m. daily: ½d. per unit; to be measured in each case at the point fixed pursuant to subclause (2) hereof.

(6) For the purpose of this clause, either the licensee or the Minister may have the units measured in kilovolt-ampere hours instead of kilowatt hours.

#### 14. INTERCHANGE OF ELECTRICAL ENERGY.

Notwithstanding anything contained in this license, the licensee is hereby authorized to use electrical energy purchased from any other electrical-supply authority in lieu of or in addition to the electrical energy generated by the licensee's hydro-electric works, and also, with the approval of the Minister, to supply electrical energy in bulk to the Grey Electric-power Board and to the company known as Kanieri Electric (Limited) at a point or points to be designated in such approval.

#### 15. CROWN NOT LIABLE TO PAY COMPENSATION.

Nothing in this license shall be held to impose any liability upon His Majesty the King or upon the Government of New Zealand to pay compensation to any person, corporate body, or local authority by reason of the exercise by the licensee of the authority hereby granted; but the licensee shall be liable for any loss or damage which any person, corporate body, or local authority may sustain as the result of the exercise by the licensee of any of the powers granted by this license.

#### 16. BED OF STREAM NOT LEASED.

Nothing herein shall be held to constitute a lease from the Crown of the beds of the rivers or streams shown on the said plan, nor shall the provisions of Part IX of the Property Law Act, 1908, apply to this license.

#### 17. DEFAULT.

If the licensee fails or neglects to observe any of the conditions or obligations imposed by this license, then and in any such case the provisions of clause 16 of the regulations shall apply to the breach of any such condition or obligation.

#### 18. LOCATION OF OVERHEAD LINES.

Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, one side of every road or street shall be left free by the licensee for telegraph lines. Lines shall not be erected on both sides of a road or street unless the permission of the Minister of Telegraphs or the Post and Telegraph Department is first obtained in accordance with clause 5 of the regulations. Except at crossing-places the distance between any pole carrying a telephone line and a pole carrying high or extra-high tension circuits shall be not less than the height of the taller pole: Provided that where the minimum separation is unobtainable the licensee shall bear the cost of any special protection deemed to be necessary by the Minister for Telegraphs. The erection of power-lines on or adjacent to the route of the high-pressure or extra-high-pressure lines shall be subject to arrangement made on the spot by the licensee's engineer to the satisfaction of the telegraph engineer.

#### 19. ALTERATIONS TO WORKS.

In the event of the licensee at any time desiring to make alterations to the work involving a departure from the location or type of construction shown on the approved plans, it shall first submit for the Minister's approval plans showing such new location and [or] type of construction as it is proposed to adopt, and with such approval the alterations may be carried out.

#### 20. INSPECTION OF WORKS.

The Inspecting Engineer of the Public Works Department or any other person empowered in that behalf by the Minister shall at all times, both during and after the construction of the works, have free access to and liberty to inspect such works so as to ensure that the provisions of this license are given due effect to.

#### 21. CONTRACT BETWEEN LICENSEE AND CROWN.

This license shall be deemed to constitute a contract as between the licensee and His Majesty the King, and may be enforced by and against either party accordingly.

#### 22. REQUIREMENTS OF LOCAL AUTHORITIES.

Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, if this license is hereafter delegated in terms of clause 23 hereof, the licensee shall not be entitled to erect, maintain, or use any electric lines within the district of any local authority, except subject to such conditions (not inconsistent with the provisions of this license and the regulations relating thereto or any variation of this license or the regulations) as may from time to time be agreed upon between the licensee and the local authority.

#### 23. CONVERSION OF LINES FROM EARTH-WORKING TO METALLIC.

Notwithstanding anything herein contained the licensee shall bear the cost of converting the Railway or Post and Telegraph Departments' lines which are now erected from earth-working to metallic, if such conversion is required by the Minister of Railways or the Minister of Telegraphs owing to electrical interference arising from the licensee's lines.

#### 24. RAILWAY AND TELEGRAPH DEPARTMENTS' LINES.

The licensee shall rectify to the satisfaction of the Minister of Railways or the Minister of Telegraphs, as the case may be, any interference or disturbance caused by the erection or operation of the licensee's system that affects the satisfactory working of telegraph lines which are the property of the Railway Department or the Telegraph Department, and which were erected prior to the licensee's lines.

#### 25. RIGHT TO ENTER LANDS, ETC.

The licensee shall have the right at any time or times during the continuance of this license, with the consent of the Minister, given subject to such conditions as he may think fit to impose, to enter upon any road or other land, whether vested in or

occupied by the Crown or any other person or body corporate, and there to construct, erect, lay down, maintain, renew, or repair all such cables, wires, and other things as are required for the transmission of electricity between the power-houses hereinbefore referred to and any place to which the licensee is authorized to transmit electricity in pursuance of this license.

#### 26. REMOVAL OF EXISTING POST AND TELEGRAPH LINES FROM PUBLIC ROADS.

Where it is necessary to remove existing Post and Telegraph lines from public roads in consequence of the erection of electric-power lines, the obtaining of way leaves where necessary to enter upon and erect Post and Telegraph lines on private property shall be arranged by the licensee.

#### 27. TIME FOR SUBSTANTIAL COMPLETION OF WORKS.

The licensee shall substantially complete the works hereby authorized within a period of two years from the date of this license, or within such further time as the Minister may allow in the event of the work being delayed by strikes, lock-outs, breakdowns, or other unavoidable causes not due to any neglect by the licensee.

#### 28. DELEGATION OF LICENSE.

(1) The Westland Electric-power Board may, with the consent of the Governor-General in Council, but not otherwise, delegate by deed to any person or company all or any of the powers vested in or conferred on the said Board by this license. Every such instrument of delegation shall contain provisions, to be approved by the Minister, for the resumption of the delegated powers by the said Board.

(2) In the event of the powers conferred by this license being delegated as herein provided, the following provisions shall apply:—

(a) The licensee shall be empowered to take under the Public Works Act, 1908, as for a public work, such land as may, in the opinion of the Governor-General, be necessary to enable the licensee to construct and maintain the various works authorized by this license.

(b) Sections 94 to 97, and 99 to 102, inclusive, and subsections (1), (2), and (3), of section 103 of the Electric-power Boards Act, 1925, shall apply in respect of the works authorized by this license, and for the purposes of this license, all references in the said enactments to the Board shall be construed as references to the licensee, and references to the provisions of the said Act shall be construed as references to the terms of this license.

(c) Upon the expiration of the term of the license—

(i) His Majesty the King may take over and use the whole of the works executed pursuant to the instrument of delegation, including all structures, buildings, equipment, machinery, plant, and land hereinafter in this clause called the "works," on payment to the licensee of the then value of the works. The price to be paid under this paragraph shall be fixed in the manner provided for in the enactments referred to in paragraph (b) of this clause; or

(ii) If required so to do by the Westland Electric-power Board, the Governor-General may by Order in Council grant to the said Board a new license for a further period of thirty years, in accordance with the law then in force with respect to the grant of licenses for the use of water-power for the generation of electricity, and the construction and use of electric-lines; or

(iii) If His Majesty the King does not elect to take over the works under subparagraph (i) hereof or a further Order in Council is not issued under subparagraph (ii) hereof, the licensee may, within such time and subject to such conditions as the Minister may then impose, remove all structures, buildings, equipment, machinery, and plant erected or installed by the licensee under the powers conferred by this license. If the licensee fails or neglects to effect such removal within the time or subject to the conditions imposed by the Minister, such structures, buildings, equipment, machinery, and plant shall, without payment of any compensation, vest in and become the property of His Majesty the King.

(3.) This clause shall not be construed to confer on His Majesty any right to take over works, structures, buildings, equipment, machinery, plant, or land used solely for mining purposes.

Anglo-Mexican Revolutionary Claims Convention.

Prime Minister's Department,

Any person or company in New Zealand having a claim affected by this convention is advised to communicate forthwith with the Under-Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs in London.

ANGLO-MEXICAN REVOLUTIONARY CLAIMS CONVENTION.

A CONVENTION has been concluded between the British and Mexican Governments for the adjustment of pecuniary claims for losses incurred by British subjects in Mexico on account of revolutionary acts which occurred between November, 1910, and May, 1920.

Claims of this kind are to be submitted to a Commission composed of a British, a Mexican, and a neutral member. The Commission will take cognizance of two classes of claims for damages arising from revolutionary action—viz., direct and indirect claims. Direct claims are for losses or damages suffered either directly by British subjects or by British companies directly holding the property affected. Indirect are those for losses or damages suffered by British subjects in-

directly—i.e., by reason of their holdings in non-British companies operating in Mexico. In the case of indirect claims it will be necessary, if the claim is to come before the Anglo-Mexican Revolutionary Claims Tribunal, that at least fifty-one per cent. of the interest in the non-British company in question shall have been held by British subjects at the time the damages were sustained. Such claimants must also produce documentary evidence from the company that the company make over to the claimants the proportionate share of the company's rights in the matter of damages.

The convention lays down that the losses or damages in respect of which the Commission is to take cognizance of claims must have been caused during the period included between the 20th November, 1910, and the 31st May, 1920, inclusive, by one or any of the following forces:—

- (1) By the forces of a Government *de jure* or *de facto*;
- (2) By revolutionary forces which, after the triumph of their cause, have established Governments *de jure* or *de facto*, or by revolutionary forces opposed to them;
- (3) By forces arising from the disjunction of those mentioned in the next preceding paragraph, up to the time when a *de jure* Government had been established, after a particular revolution;
- (4) By forces arising from the disbandment of the Federal Army;
- (5) By mutinies or risings, or by insurrectionary forces other than those referred to under subdivisions (2), (3), and (4) of this article, or by brigands: Provided that in each case it be established that the competent authorities omitted to take reasonable measures to suppress the insurrections, risings, riots, or acts of brigandage in question, or to punish those responsible for the same; or that it be established in like manner that the authorities were blamable in any other way.

The Commission shall also deal with claims for losses or damages caused by acts of civil authorities, provided such acts were due to revolutionary events and disturbed conditions within the period referred to in this article, and that the said acts were committed by any of the forces specified in subdivisions (1), (2), and (3) of this article.

From the above it will be seen that it is important that claimants should furnish as complete evidence as possible to establish the identity of the forces responsible for the acts giving rise to their claims.

It is to be noted that under the terms of the convention His Majesty's Government undertake not to present to the Mexican Government, otherwise than under the convention, any claims for losses or damages arising in the manner and during the period above mentioned. It is important that any British subjects or companies, with claims of this nature against the Mexican Government, should in their own interests at once communicate with the Under-Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs at the Foreign Office, drawing attention to any claims which they have already filed with the Foreign Office or with His Majesty's Legation or Consulate in Mexico City, and furnishing any further particulars which may appear necessary in the light of the above resumé of the terms of the convention. Any British subjects or companies who have not yet formally filed with the Foreign Office or with His Majesty's Legation or Consulate in Mexico City a documented statement of their claim, should at once communicate with the Under-Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs at the Foreign Office, giving as full particulars as possible.

*Removal of Prohibition of Issue of Money-orders and Transmission of Postal Correspondence for certain Persons, &c.*

WHEREAS the Postmaster-General of the Dominion of New Zealand has from time to time issued orders under the provisions of section 28 of the Post and Telegraph Act, 1908, prohibiting the issue of money-orders in favour of, and the transmission within New Zealand of postal packets addressed to, the persons, firms, and institutions whose names and addresses appear in the Schedule hereto: And whereas the Postmaster-General is satisfied that the necessity for enforcing orders in the cases referred to no longer exists, he hereby rescinds the orders concerned so far as they relate to such persons, firms, and institutions, and orders that money-orders for such persons, firms, and institutions shall be issued, when required, and that postal packets addressed to such persons, firms, and institutions shall be registered, forwarded, and delivered in due course.
