Additional Regulations under the Immigration Restriction Acts. (C. No. 48).

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 11th day of July, 1927.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by the Immigration Restriction Act, 1908, and of the Immigration Restriction Amendment Act, 1920, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations additional to or in amendment of (a) the regulations made under the before-mentioned Acts on the tenth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, and gazetted on the fourteenth day of the same month (hereinafter referred to as "the principal regulations"), and (b) the regulations made under the before-mentioned Acts on the twenty-first day of February, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven, and gazetted on the twenty-fourth day of the same month; and doth declare that this Order in Council shall come into force on the first day of November, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven.

REGULATIONS.

1. THESE regulations shall be read together with and deemed part of the principal regulations.

2. Subclause (3) of clause 2 of the principal regulations shall be amended by adding thereto the following :—
 "and, if the Collector, in his discretion, so decides, subject to a deed to the following effect with respect to the person to whom a temporary permit is issued being executed by some person or persons resident in New Zealand approved by the Collector :—

Now this deed witnesseth that in pursuance of the premises and of an agreement so to do the said (_____) doth hereby for himself, his executors, and administrators, covenant with the Crown upon and at all times after the granting of any such permit as aforesaid to pay to the Crown all costs, charges, and expenses that may at any time be incurred by the Crown or any public body in or about the maintenance, relief, arrest, or detention of the visitor in New Zealand or his deportation from New Zealand, whether arising from sickness or poverty or from default of the visitor in compliance with any requirements of law or from any other cause, and whether or not such costs, charges, and expenses may, apart from these presents, be a debt recoverable by the Crown or such public body from the visitor or any other person : Provided always that in the case of any such costs, charges, or expenses as are not actually disbursed by the Crown or a public body, or the amount of which is not fixed by law or otherwise so as to amount to a liquidated sum, the amount thereof shall be such sum as is certified as being reasonable in the circumstances by the Minister of Justice, the Minister in Charge of Prisons, the Minister of Health, the Minister in Charge of Mental Hospitals Department, the Minister of Customs, a Hospital Board, or other person (including the Permanent Head of a Government Department) or body administering the Department or institution by, through, or in connection with which such costs, charges, and expenses were incurred.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this 11th day of July, 1927.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the Customs Act, 1913, and the Customs Amendment Act, 1921, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth, to the extent hereinafter appearing, hereby modify the Customs (Tariff Preference and General) Regulations, 1925, made by Order in Council of the twenty-first day of November, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-five, and gazetted on the twenty-sixth day of the same month; and doth, with the like advice and consent, make the following regulations for the purposes of the said Acts; and doth hereby order that such modifications shall take effect and that the following regulations shall come into force on and from the first day of August, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven.

ADDITIONAL CUSTOMS REGULATIONS.

1. THESE regulations may be cited as "The Customs (Tariff Preference on Tea) Regulations, 1927," and shall be deemed part of the Customs Regulations gazetted on the 2nd day of July, 1914.

2. For the purposes of these regulations "tea" includes all tea, whether in bulk or in packets.

3. The forms prescribed in these regulations are those in the Schedule hereto.

4. Nothing in clause 5 of the Customs (Tariff Preference and General) Regulations, 1925, shall be deemed to apply to tea. Tea, all of which is the growth of a country or countries the produce or manufactures of which are entitled to be entered for duty under the British Preferential Tariff shall, provided that the final process of manufacture of all such tea shall have been performed in some part of the British Dominions, be a class of goods which shall be deemed for the purposes of the Customs Amendment Act, 1921, to be the produce or manufacture of such country or countries.

5. Except as modified by these regulations, or except in so far as they are inconsistent with these regulations, the Customs (Tariff Preference and General) Regulations, 1925, shall, *mutatis mutandis*, apply to tea.

6. With respect to tea, the certificate referred to in section 16 of the Customs Amendment Act, 1921, shall be in Form 1 in the Schedule hereto, provided that where under the Customs Acts a certificate in Form 2 in the Second Schedule to the Customs (Tariff Preference and General) Regulations, 1925, is also required, both certificates shall be combined in one certificate, and shall be in Form 2 in the Schedule hereto.

7. Notwithstanding anything in these regulations, if the Collector is satisfied that any tea entered for duty under the British Preferential Tariff is *bona fide* entitled under these regulations to be so entered, he may, in such special cases as he thinks fit, accept with respect to such tea a certificate in Form 3 or 4 in the Second Schedule to the Customs (Tariff Preference and General) Regulations, 1925, provided that such certificate is so modified as to satisfy the Collector that the tea mentioned in the said certificate is entitled, under these regulations, to be entered for duty under the British Preferential Tariff; provided further that, except with the special permission of the Comptroller, such certificate shall not be accepted after the 31st day of October, 1927.

8. Notwithstanding the making of these regulations all duties which have become due and payable and all penalties and forfeitures which have been incurred prior to the coming into force of these regulations shall be recovered and enforced in the same manner as if these regulations had not been made.

Regulations for the Auditing of Land Agents' Trust Accounts.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 11th day of July, 1927.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by section thirty-four of the Land Agents Act, 1921-22, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations providing for an annual audit of the trust accounts of every land agent, and for a report of the results of such audit; and doth declare that such regulations shall be published in and, with the exception of clause three of Regulation four, shall come into force upon the date of their publication in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

REGULATIONS.

I. PRELIMINARY.

(1) THESE regulations may be cited as "The Land Agents Audit Regulations, 1927."

(2) In these regulations, where not inconsistent with the context,—

"Controller and Auditor-General" means the Controller and Auditor-General under the Public Revenues Act, 1926:

"Year" means a year ending on the 31st day of March:

"Land agent" means a land agent as defined by the Land Agents Act, 1921-22:

"Trust account" includes every general or separate account of a land agent into which there have been paid or should be paid any moneys received by such land agent in respect of the sale, lease, or other disposal of land or of any interest in land, or in respect of the letting of houses, or in respect of any other transaction in his capacity as a land agent (other than the expenses, commission, and other proper charges of or incidental to such sale, lease, or other disposal or transaction as aforesaid), and includes all accounts kept in any books of account of a land agent and having reference to any such general or separate account as aforesaid:

"Trust account moneys" means all moneys that are or should be paid into a trust account:

"Audit officer" means any officer of the Audit Department appointed in writing by the Controller and Auditor-General to be an Audit officer under these regulations.

2. PERIOD OF AUDIT.

(1) Within three months after the end of each year, commencing with the year ending on the 31st day of March, 1928, every land agent who carried on business during the whole or any part of that year shall cause his trust account for that year to be audited by a qualified accountant, and a report of the result of such audit to be sent by such accountant to the Controller and Auditor-General, verified as hereinafter provided.

(2) Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing regulations, if any land agent desires that his trust account should be audited as at any date other than the 31st day of March, and gives notice to that effect to the Controller and Auditor-General, the Controller and Auditor-General may, if he thinks fit, authorize and require that land agent to substitute such other date for the 31st day of March.

(3) At all times thereafter, so long as such authority remains in force, clause (1) of this regulation shall, in its application to that land agent, be read as if such other date was substituted for the 31st day of March.

(4) When any authority is so given by the Controller and Auditor-General to substitute any date for the 31st day of March, he shall at the same time determine the period in respect of which the first audit shall be made in pursuance of that authority, and the time within which such audit and the report thereon shall be made and delivered under these regulations; and these regulations shall be construed and shall have effect, with all necessary modifications, as if such determination formed a part thereof.

(5) When any date has been so substituted for the 31st day of March, no change in the date so substituted shall thereafter be made without the authority of the Controller and Auditor-General in accordance with the foregoing regulations.

3. QUALIFICATIONS OF AUDITORS.

(1) No accountant shall be deemed to be qualified, within the meaning of these regulations, unless he is a member of the New Zealand Society of Accountants, and is approved by the Controller and Auditor-General, or if he is, or at any time within two years before the date of his report has been, a partner, clerk, or servant of the land agent whose trust account is so audited by him, or, if the trust account is that of a company carrying on business as a land agent, a member, clerk, or servant of the said company: Provided that the Controller and Auditor-General may, if he is satisfied that no accountant qualified within the meaning of these regulations is available, approve of any competent accountant nominated by a land agent to audit his trust account.

(2) Where a land agent has in any year engaged a qualified accountant to audit any trust account and does not satisfy the Controller and Auditor-General that such accountant is not available and willing to audit that trust account for that year or the next succeeding year, he shall not engage any other qualified accountant to audit that trust account for the same year or the next succeeding year without the consent in writing of the Controller and Auditor-General.

(3) Subject to the foregoing provisions and to the provisions of clause (4) of Regulation 6 hereof, the auditor by whom any audit and report is to be made shall be selected and employed for that purpose by the land agent whose trust account is so audited.

(4) It shall not be obligatory upon a land agent who carries on business in more places than one, and keeps a separate trust account in respect of any such business, to engage the same accountant to audit each such trust account.

4. DUTIES OF LAND AGENTS.

(1) For the purposes of the trust account audit and report every land agent shall, as and when required, produce to the auditor all books, papers, accounts, documents, and securities in any way relating to his trust account or any bank account, and give such information as may reasonably be required by the auditor.

(2) It shall be the duty of every land agent to keep his trust account in such a manner as to disclose to the auditor the position of the funds therein, and to enable the same to be conveniently and properly audited. In particular, every land agent shall procure and submit to the auditor such voucher or other evidence as the auditor may deem sufficient as evidence of the proper disbursement of every sum paid from his trust account.

(3) (a) Every land agent shall cause a receipt, complying with these regulations, to be given forthwith for every sum of money received by him comprising or including trust account moneys.

(b) No land agent shall give or cause or permit to be given for any such moneys as aforesaid any receipt not complying with these regulations.

(c) Every land agent shall prepare every receipt in duplicate so as to provide a carbon copy, and shall retain such copy and produce it to the auditor.

(d) Every land agent shall cancel any receipt drawn in error, retain the same and attach it to its butt or carbon copy, and produce it to the auditor.

(e) No land agent shall give or cause or permit to be given any such receipt except on a form taken from a book of detachable forms and non-detachable duplicates printed by the Government Printer, and bearing a distinguishing mark and number inserted by the Government Printer.

(f) The Government Printer shall, on application by any person representing himself to be an auditor of the trust account of any land agent, supply him with particulars of the number of books of receipt forms at any time issued by him to such land agent and of the distinguishing marks and numbers inserted therein.

(g) No land agent shall give or cause or permit to be given any duplicate receipt which is not prepared on such a form as is hereinbefore provided and which does not bear both on the original and carbon copy thereof a certificate signed by or on behalf of the land agent to the effect that it is a duplicate of a receipt issued on a date to be stated in the certificate.

(h) This clause shall come into force on the 1st day of October, 1927.

(4) Every land agent shall cause all trust-account moneys received by him in his capacity as a land agent to be paid into a general or separate trust bank account as soon as possible after the receipt thereof, but not later in any case than the third banking-day after the receipt thereof.

(5) In the case of the first audit of any land agent's trust account under these regulations, and in any other case in which no such certified statement as is referred to in clause (4) of Regulation 5 hereof is available for the purpose of an audit, the land agent shall, in lieu thereof, make out and

deliver to the auditor before the making of his report a statement containing the like particulars as to moneys held and the disposal and state of investment thereof on the first day of the year to which the audit relates. Such statement shall be verified by the statutory declaration of the land agent, or where two or more land agents carry on business in partnership as land agents by the statutory declaration of one of the partners, or where a company carries on business as a land agent by the person appointed in writing to hold the land agent's license.

5. DUTIES OF AUDITORS.

(1) Forthwith upon the completion of any audit, the auditor shall send a report of the result of such audit to the Controller and Auditor-General, verified by the statutory declaration of the auditor in the form set out in the Schedule hereto.

(2) If any auditor in the course of auditing a land agent's trust account discovers that the said account is not kept in such a manner as to enable it to be properly audited, or discovers any matter which appears to him to involve dishonesty or any breach of the law on the part of that land agent, or discovers any loss or deficiency of trust-account moneys, or any failure to pay or account for any such moneys, he shall fully set out the facts so discovered by him in a report or reports delivered to the Controller and Auditor-General.

(3) If any such irregularities as aforesaid appear to relate to different moneys in which more than one person is interested, then the auditor shall set out the facts relating to such respective moneys in separate reports, so as to facilitate the inspection thereof under clause (1) of Regulation 7 hereof.

(4) In all other cases the auditor's report shall consist merely of a general certificate that in his opinion the land agent's trust account has been duly kept and is in order in all respects.

(5) In addition to making the aforesaid report, the auditor of a land agent's trust account shall at the same time audit, certify, and sign a statement to be prepared by the land agent setting forth in detail the particulars of all trust-account moneys held by that land agent on the last day of the year to which the audit relates, together with particulars of the disposal and state of investment thereof at that date, and shall deliver such statement, after being audited, certified, and signed as aforesaid, to the land agent, together with a signed copy of the report or reports made by the auditor to the Controller and Auditor-General. The statement and report or reports so delivered shall be retained by the land agent and produced by the land agent on demand to the auditor making the next succeeding audit of the land agent's trust account.

(6) Save in any report so to be delivered to the Controller and Auditor-General, or in or for the purpose of any legal proceedings which may arise out of such report or otherwise in relation to the trust account of the land agent concerned, no auditor shall, save with the previous consent in writing of the Controller and Auditor-General, disclose to any person any information which he has obtained in the course of any audit; and every auditor who commits a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a fine not exceeding £100, and shall, in addition, be subject to the like liability in damages to any customer or client of that land agent damaged by the disclosure of such information as the land agent would be if the land agent had disclosed such information.

6. POWERS OF CONTROLLER AND AUDITOR-GENERAL.

(1) On receipt of any report delivered to him under clause (2) of Regulation 5 hereof the Controller and Auditor-General may investigate the matter and, if necessary, institute proceedings against the land agent concerned.

(2) For the purpose of such investigation the Controller and Auditor-General and any Audit officer shall have power to examine the auditor who made the report, and to examine all books, papers, accounts, documents, and securities held by the land agent concerned relating to the matter reported on; and it shall be the duty of such land agent, if required, to produce to the Controller and Auditor-General or Audit officer all such books, papers, accounts, documents, and securities, and to give such information as may be reasonably required.

(3) Neither the Controller and Auditor-General nor any Audit officer shall, save for the purpose of any legal proceedings which may arise out of such investigation, disclose to any person any information which he has obtained from any report delivered to the Controller and Auditor-General under Regulation 5 hereof, or in the course of any such investigation.

(4) Notwithstanding anything contained in these regulations, the Controller and Auditor-General may elect to make the audit required by these regulations, in respect of any land

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agent, in which case he or any Audit officer shall be the auditor accordingly; and these regulations shall be construed and shall have effect, with all necessary modifications, as if the Controller and Auditor-General or Audit officer were the auditor provided for therein.

(5) Notwithstanding that the trust account of a land agent for any period has been audited and a report delivered or a certificate given in accordance with these regulations, the Controller and Auditor-General may at any time make, or cause to be made, a further audit of the trust account of that land agent for such period or any part thereof.

The provisions of these Regulations shall apply, *mutatis mutandis*, to such further audit in all respects as if it were an audit required under clause (1) of Regulation 2 hereof or clause (4) of this regulation.

7. GENERAL.

(1) The reports of auditors under these regulations shall, so far only as they relate to moneys or securities in which any person is interested, be available, in the hands of the Controller and Auditor-General, for inspection by that person, or by any solicitor authorized by him in that behalf.

(2) The report of an auditor in respect of any year shall be available, in the hands of the Controller and Auditor-General, for inspection by the auditor appointed to audit any trust account of the same land agent for the next succeeding year.

(3) It shall be the duty of the banker of every land agent, on the request of any auditor engaged in the audit of that land agent's trust account under these regulations, to supply that auditor with all such information as to the bank account or accounts of that land agent during the year to which the audit relates as may be reasonably required for the purposes of such audit.

(4) The fees payable by a land agent to any such auditor in respect of his audit and report shall be such as are agreed upon between the land agent and the auditor.

(5) Subject to any written agreement to the contrary between a land agent and any person for or in trust for whom any moneys are received or held by the land agent, the cost of auditing his trust account shall be borne by the land agent.

(6) A certificate in writing signed by the Controller and Auditor-General to the effect that the report of the result of the audit of the trust account of any land agent verified as required by these regulations has not been received by the Controller and Auditor-General within the time hereby prescribed shall be *prima facie* evidence that such land agent has not caused his trust account to be audited for the then preceding year as required by these regulations.

(7) Where a land agent carries on business in more places than one, and keeps a separate trust account in respect of any such business, then in all reports and other documents relating to the audit of any trust account of such land agent the auditor or other person furnishing the document shall make clear to what trust account or accounts such audit and document refer.

8. PENALTIES.

(1) Every land agent, auditor, banker, or other person who commits any breach of these regulations shall be liable to a fine not exceeding £100.

(2) If two or more land agents or other persons in partnership commit any breach of these regulations, each of those persons shall be severally liable to a fine not exceeding £100.

(3) Every land agent who after the coming into operation of these regulations makes default for a period of one month in causing his trust account for any year to be audited in pursuance of these regulations shall be liable to a fine of £100; and if after the coming into operation of these regulations two or more land agents in partnership make any such default, each of them shall be severally liable to the like fine.

(4) Any breach of these regulations constituted by default in compliance with any requirement imposed hereunder shall constitute a new offence in every week during which such default continues.

The total births registered for the urban areas amounted to 943 as against 1,074 in May—a decrease of 131. The deaths in June were 543—an increase of 10 as compared with the previous month. Of the total deaths males contributed 257, females 286. Seventy-seven of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 14.18 per cent. of the whole number. Sixty-one of these were under one year of age.

The equivalent annual rates per 1,000 of mean population for June, and six months ended June, 1927, were as follows. The infantile mortality rate per 100 births for the same period is also given.

Making additional By-laws under the Rotorua Borough Act, 1922.

WHEREAS by section 8 of the Rotorua Borough Act, 1922, the control and ownership of electric light and power for supply of electric energy to the Borough of Rotorua is vested in the Department of Tourist and Health Resorts, as incorporated by the Rotorua Town Act, 1907, and the Rotorua Borough Act, 1922: And whereas in respect of these works the said Department has all the power for the time being conferred by law on Borough Councils, except the power to borrow money or make and levy any special rate:

Now, therefore, the said Department, in pursuance of such power, hereby amends and makes additions to the by-laws under Part 13 of the Rotorua Borough By-laws made under the Rotorua Borough Act, 1922, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of 12th October, 1922, and amended by notification published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of 12th June, 1924, and 1st July, 1926, in the manner set out in the Schedule hereto, and doth hereby declare that the said amendment and additions to the said by-laws shall take effect and shall come into force on the 1st day of August, 1927:—

SCHEDULE.

Clause 37 of the by-laws made on the 1st day of July, 1926, is amended by adding to subclause (e) (1) the following words: "Such minimum charge shall be additional to the minimum charges provided for in subclause 37 (g) hereof."

PENALTIES.

74. *Acts constituting Breaches of By-laws.*—Every person who shall—

- (a) Do or cause to be done, or be concerned in doing anything whatsoever contrary to or otherwise than as provided by any of these by-laws;
 - (b) Omit to do anything which according to the true intent and meaning of any of these by-laws ought to be done by him at the time and in the manner therein provided;
 - (c) Refuse or neglect to comply with any notice duly given to him under any of these by-laws;
- shall be guilty of a breach of such by-law.

75. *Non-compliance with By-laws after Notice to constitute further Breach.*—Every person who shall—

- (a) Construct, affix, or provide, or cause to be constructed, affixed, or provided, any work, appliance, or material of any description whatever contrary to or otherwise than is provided by any of these by-laws, and who shall not within a reasonable stated time after notice in writing or any renewal notice in writing shall have been given to him by the Department's local controlling officer so to do, open up, lay bare, take away, or remove such work, appliance, or material, or cause the same to be opened up, laid bare, taken away, or removed, or alter or cause to be altered the same so as to comply with such by-law and notice;
 - (b) Omit to construct, affix, or provide any work, appliance, or material required by any of these by-laws to be constructed, affixed, or provided by him, and who shall not within a reasonable stated time after notice in writing or any renewal notice in writing shall have been given to him by the Department's local controlling officer so to do, construct, affix, or provide such omitted work, appliance, or material so as to comply with such by-law and notice;
- shall be guilty of a further offence against such by-law.

76. *Case of Purchase of Premises where By-law broken.*—

- (1) In every case where—
 - (a) A breach of any of these by-laws shall be made with respect to the construction of any building or work by the owner thereof, or any work, appliance, or material required by any of these by-laws to be provided in respect of any land or premises by the owner thereof shall not have been provided; and
 - (b) Any person shall thereafter become by purchase or otherwise the owner of such land, work, or premises;

it shall be lawful for the Department's local controlling-officer by notice in writing (which notice may be renewed from time to time) to require such person to rectify the matter of such breach, or to provide such omitted work, appliance, or material (as the case may be), within a stated time.

- (2) If the person served with any such notice shall fail to comply with the same he shall be deemed guilty of an

offence against such by-law, but without relieving any other person from any liability in respect of the breach by him of such by-law.

77. *Penalties.*—(a) Every person guilty of a breach of any of these by-laws for which no other penalty is provided is liable to a penalty not exceeding £20; or, where the breach is a continuing one, then to a penalty not exceeding £5 for every day or part of a day during which such breach continues.

(b) But the Department may, after conviction for the continuing breach of any by-law, apply to the Supreme Court for an injunction to restrain the further continuance of such breach by the person or persons so convicted.

(c) The continued existence in a state contrary to any of these by-laws of any work or thing shall be deemed a continuing offence within the meaning of this by-law.

(d) Where by any Act smaller maximum penalties than those mentioned in this clause are authorized to be imposed for the breach or continued breach of any of these by-laws, then a person guilty of any breach or continued breach of any such by-law shall (if such by-law is not authorized to be made under the Municipal Corporations Act, 1920) be liable only to such smaller penalty.

78. *Removal of Works executed contrary to By-laws.*—

(a) Whenever any work, material, or other construction or appliance, or anything whatever shall have been executed, erected, placed, laid, constructed, or affixed in contravention of any of these by-laws, or shall exist in a form or manner otherwise than as directed or authorized by any of these by-laws, it shall be lawful for the Department's local controlling officer by notice in writing under his hand to require the person by whom, or by whose authority or on whose behalf, the work shall have been done, or if he shall not at the time of the giving of the notice be either the owner or the occupier of the premises affected, then the person who shall at such time be the owner of such premises, to pull down, take up, or remove such work, material, construction, appliance, or thing as aforesaid, or alter the same so as to comply with the by-law or by-laws affecting the same within (in each case) a stated time.

(b) If such work, material, construction, appliance, or thing shall not be pulled down, taken up, or removed, or altered as aforesaid within such stated time, it shall be lawful for the Department's local controlling officer or any person authorized by him in that behalf to pull down, take up, and remove, or (as the case may be) alter as aforesaid the same work, construction, appliance, material, or thing, and to enter into and upon any land or building for that purpose and to do anything thereon or thereto necessary to effect such pulling-down, taking-up, removal, or alteration.

(c) The Department may recover in any Court of competent jurisdiction from the person who shall have committed the breach of any of these by-laws in respect of the execution, erection, placing, laying, constructing, or affixing, or existence of the said work, material, construction, appliance, or thing, or (as the case may be) from the person who was at the time of the giving of the notice the owner of the premises, all expenses incurred by the Department in connection with such pulling-down, taking-up, removal, or alteration.

(d) The exercise of the powers given by this by-law shall not relieve any person from liability to any penalty incurred under these by-laws.

79. *Limitation of Liability of Succeeding Owner.*—A person who has become, by purchase or otherwise, the owner of any premises shall not be liable under By-laws No. 76 or by By-law No. 78 in respect of any breach of any of these by-laws which shall have been made before he became such owner if he shall prove that at the time of his becoming such owner the matter of such breach was not patent, and that he had no notice of the fact of such breach.
