*Education Act, 1914.—Amended Regulations.*

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this 22nd day of August, 1927.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the Education Act, 1914, and the amendments of that Act, and of all other powers enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby amend, in the manner set forth in the Schedule hereto, the regulations at present in force relating to examination and classification of teachers, appeals of teachers against their classification or grading, probationers, free places, manual and technical instruction, secondary schools (staffing, salaries, &c.), agricultural bursaries, home science and domestic arts bursaries, organizing teachers, public schools (salaries, grading, staffing, &c.), training colleges, and junior and senior national scholarships; and, with the like advice and consent, doth prescribe that, except where otherwise expressly provided herein, this Order shall come into force on the date of publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

SCHEDULE.

I. EXAMINATION AND CLASSIFICATION OF TEACHERS.

THE regulations relating to the examination and classification of teachers made by Order in Council dated 13th February, 1912, and subsequently amended by several Orders in Council, are hereby further amended as follows :—

1. Subclause ii (b) of clause 5 is hereby deleted and the following substituted therefor :—
  - (b) If he, having entered upon the course for the degree of Bachelor of Arts in the University of New Zealand before 1926 or for the degree of Bachelor of Science in the same University before 1927, and being allowed till 1928 or 1929 respectively to complete the course under the old regulations as provided in the University statutes, gains certificates of proficiency to the following extent in the examination prescribed for such degree—namely, either (1) two pass subjects and two advanced subjects, or (2) three pass subjects and one advanced subject, or (3) four pass subjects :
  - (c) If he has been credited with not less than six units in at least three subjects at the examination for the degree of Bachelor of Arts in the University of New Zealand, or with not less than five units in at least two subjects at the examination for the degree of Bachelor of Science in the University of New Zealand.
2. Clause 6 is hereby deleted.
3. Clause 8 is hereby amended by deleting the proviso thereto.
4. Clause 9 is hereby amended—
  - (a) By inserting after the words “ a partially equivalent examination ” the words “ or other evidence of qualification ” :
  - (b) By inserting after the words “ assigned to examinations ” the words “ or qualifications.”
5. Clause 11 is hereby amended :—
  - (a) By inserting after the words “ trained teacher’s certificate ” the words “ and the endorsement of such certificate ” :
  - (b) By deleting the figures “ 28 ” and by substituting therefor the figures “ 27.”
6. Clause 12 is hereby amended by inserting the words “ in general ” after the word “ commencing.”
7. Clause 24 is hereby deleted and the following substituted therefor :—
 

“ 24. Any candidate who passes the Matriculation Examination of the University of New Zealand shall be entitled to exemption from further examination for Class D in the subjects of corresponding character in which he has obtained not less than 40 per cent. of the assignable marks. Further, if a candidate fails to pass but obtains in one and the same Matriculation Examination not less than 40 per cent. of the assignable marks in at least three of the following subjects : English, elementary mathematics, history, geography, physics, chemistry, home science, physiology, botany, agriculture, he shall be entitled to exemption from further examination for Class D in the subjects of corresponding character in which he has obtained not less than 40 per cent. of the assignable marks :

Provided that, where in the Class D Examination a certificate of practical work or a practical test is prescribed, the candidate may be required further to satisfy the necessary condition.

8. Clause 26 is hereby amended by deleting therefrom all the words after the words "shall take one additional subject from Group III."

#### II. APPEALS OF TEACHERS AGAINST THEIR CLASSIFICATION OR GRADING.

The regulations relating to appeals of teachers against their classification or grading made by Order in Council dated 13th June, 1921, and subsequently amended by Orders in Council dated 10th October, 1921, 31st July, 1922, and 7th November, 1923, are hereby further amended by the addition of the following subclause to clause 5 :—

"(2) Without the authority of the Director, no evidence heard by, or information given to, the Appeal Board during the hearing of any appeal shall be published either directly or indirectly, or otherwise communicated to any person or persons who were not present at the hearing of such appeal."

#### III. PROBATIONERS.

The regulations relating to probationers made by Order in Council dated 22nd March, 1926, are hereby amended as follows :—

1. Subclause (2) of clause 4 is hereby amended by deleting the second proviso thereto.

2. Subclause (1) of clause 10 is hereby deleted and the following substituted therefor :—

(1) (a) The appointment of every probationer shall be regarded as probationary. His engagement shall be terminable by the Board on one month's notice for any of the following reasons :—

(i) If the probationer does not after trial show reasonable promise of suitability for the teaching profession :

(ii) If he fails to obtain a satisfactory report as to his diligence and behaviour from the head teacher of the school in which he is employed :

(iii) If he fails to pass any examination prescribed :

(iv) If he is unfavourably reported on by an Inspector of Schools :

(v) If it shall be reported by a School Medical Officer at any time during his probationary service that his health is such as to render him unsuitable as a teacher :

(vi) If it should become known to the Board that he does not intend to continue his training as a teacher.

(b) For gross negligence, incompetence, disobedience, or immoral conduct a probationer shall be liable to summary dismissal without claim on the Board.

3. Subclause (1) of clause 13 is hereby amended by deleting all the words after the word "required," and substituting therefor the words "to make progress in their studies to the satisfaction of the Senior Inspector of Schools for the district."

#### IV. FREE PLACES.

The regulations relating to free places in secondary schools, district high schools, technical high schools, and technical schools and classes made by Order in Council dated 19th December, 1922, and amended by Orders in Council dated 9th July, 1923, 10th September, 1923, 1st September, 1924, and 1st November, 1926, are hereby amended as follows :—

1. Clause 3 is hereby amended :

(1) By deleting the proviso to subclause (a).

(2) By deleting the last paragraph of subclause (c).

(3) By adding the following new subclause :—

(e) He has obtained a certificate of competency in the subjects of the Sixth Standard with special merit in handwork or elementary science, provided that such pupil shall take a course of instruction that has been approved by an Inspector of Schools, and provided further that he shall not be admitted to any secondary school unless such school has been approved for this purpose by the Director.

2. Clause 4 (ii) is hereby amended by inserting the words "or (e)" after the words "under (c)."

3. Clause 5 is hereby amended :—

(1) By deleting the words "(a), (b), or (c)" from subclauses (1) and (2) and substituting therefor the words "(a), (b), (c), or (e)" in each case.

(2) By deleting subclause (3) and substituting the following therefor :—

"(3) Notwithstanding the provisions of subclauses (1) and (2) hereof, where the qualification is obtained under (b), (c), (d), or (e) of clause 3 hereof, and the holder has, prior to entry upon his free place, completed a course of

instruction for a year in Form III of a junior high school, the junior free place at a secondary school or technical high school shall be tenable for one year only, and at a district high school for two years only, from the 1st January preceding the date of admission as a free pupil, provided that in the case of a holder who was under the age of fourteen years on the 1st December preceding such date of admission the tenure of the free place may, on the recommendation of the Principal of the school, be extended for a further year."

(3) By deleting subclause (4).

4. Clause 6B is hereby deleted and the following substituted therefor:—

"6B. The technical high school shall give to each holder of a junior free place instruction in—

- (i) English as for the Intermediate Examination, or commercial English, including in either case the general study of selected standard works in both prose and verse, reading and recitation, handwriting, composition (both oral and written). The cultivation of correct habits of speech and of facility of expression, both oral and written, must receive special attention.
- (ii) History and civics, as for the intermediate examination, with special reference to such parts of the prescription for the intermediate examination as are most closely related to the other subjects of the particular course taken by the pupil, and to the rights and duties of citizens; the subject being so treated as to develop a sense of responsibility with regard to social service in both work and leisure.
- (iii) Arithmetic (including household accounts in the case of girls) or elementary mathematics as prescribed for the intermediate examination or practical mathematics or commercial or actuarial arithmetic.
- (iv) Any appropriate branch of free or instrumental drawing.
- (v) Physical training, including, where possible, instruction in swimming and life-saving.

The instruction referred to in (i), (ii), (iii), (iv), and (v) must be given regularly throughout the year for not less than three units in the case of (i); one and a half units in the case of (ii), three units in the case of (iii), two units in the case of (iv), and one unit in the case of (v).

In addition, the pupil must also take at the technical high school a vocational course, approved by the Minister, having a direct bearing on industrial, agricultural, domestic, or commercial pursuits, or, with the approval of the Minister previously obtained, a vocational course of a general character in preparation for one or other of the public examinations. The total time given to the instruction in a year must not, with the time given to the subjects enumerated in (i), (ii), (iii), (iv), and (v) hereof, be less than twenty units: Provided that during the tenure of her junior free place every girl shall take not less than three units each year of an approved course in home science—namely, an elementary course in general science bearing on the home, and in household economics and hygiene, together with one or more of the following subjects: Plain cookery, laundry-work, needlecraft and garment-making, home nursing.

5. Clause 7 (a) is hereby amended by deleting the proviso thereto.

6. Clause 10 (i) is hereby amended by inserting, after the words "shall not be held to apply," the words "and that a pupil may omit either history or a subject from Group IV, but not both."

7. Clause 14 is hereby amended by adding the following subclause after subclause (iv):—

- "(v) A pupil who, prior to entry upon a free place, has completed a course of instruction in Form III of a junior high school and who is qualified to enter upon a free place at a secondary school, district high school, technical high school, or technical school shall do so at the beginning of the school year immediately following that in which his junior-high-school course was completed, and for the purposes of subclause (ii) hereof the pupil's course in Form III of the junior high school shall be reckoned as forming a part of a junior-free-place course."

#### V. MANUAL AND TECHNICAL INSTRUCTION.

The regulations relating to manual and technical instruction made by Order in Council dated 20th November, 1925, are hereby amended as follows:—

1. Clause 38 is hereby amended by deleting from subclause (e) the words "as may be payable under the Act or regulations" and by substituting therefor the words "as the Minister may direct."

2. Clause 57 (iii) is hereby deleted.

3. Clause 74 is hereby amended by deleting the proviso to subclause (ii).
4. Clause 77 is hereby amended by adding the following subclause :—
- (iv) The duties of the Principal shall include the following—
- (a) The management of the teaching staff and the educational direction of the technical school :
  - (b) The advising of students as to classes and courses suitable to their needs ; consultation with parents and employers :
  - (c) The general supervision and oversight of the technical school and of its inside and outside activities :
  - (d) The co-ordination of the work of the school, especially that of evening classes with the trade training obtained by students in their occupations :
  - (e) Reporting to and advising the Board in regard to—
    - (i) Appointment of teachers.
    - (ii) Educational projects, courses, &c.
    - (iii) Sites, buildings, equipment, &c.
  - (f) Oversight of the office staff, and the general management of the finances of the school. In his capacity as the Board's chief executive officer, it shall be part of the duties of the Principal to act as Secretary to the Board, and the instructions of the Board shall be carried out under his direction.
  - (g) Oversight of caretaking and cleaning of buildings and maintenance of buildings and grounds.

In connection with any of the above-mentioned duties, the Board may provide the Principal with such assistance as may be permitted by these regulations, but no additional salary or allowances beyond those specified herein shall be paid to the Principal in respect of his service under the Board.

5. Clause 82 is hereby deleted as from the 1st day of May, 1927, and the following substituted therefor from that date :—

“ 82. *Married Allowance.*—An assistant holding a full-time position, whether relieving or permanent, who is married or is a widower or widow, shall, subject to any limitation hereinafter provided, receive an addition of £40 per annum to the salary otherwise provided in the regulations :

“ Provided that no payment under this clause shall be made (a) To a married assistant whose husband or wife is employed in the Education Service or Government Service, or is otherwise employed to such an extent as to satisfy the Minister that an allowance under this clause should not be paid ; or (b) to a widower, widow, or married woman assistant unless the Minister approves such payment on account of the fact that he or she has a child under sixteen dependent upon and supported by him or her or on account of other special circumstances ; or (c) to an assistant who is provided with free residence ; or (d) in any special case if the Minister, taking into consideration the special circumstances, is of opinion that an allowance under this clause should not be paid.”

6. The following new clause is hereby inserted :—

“ 82A. (1) Subject to the provisions of the next succeeding subclause, every teacher shall be entitled to be paid only in respect of the following periods :—

- “(a) The period commencing on the school day on which he enters upon his duties and ending on the school day on which his duties cease, including any holidays that may intervene between those dates :
- “(b) Any period of school holidays that may immediately succeed the day on which his duties cease as aforesaid ; in the case of the midsummer holidays such period shall be deemed to end not later than the 31st day of January in any year :
- “(c) The period necessarily occupied in transferring from one position to another.

“(2) The last preceding subclause shall be read subject to the following special provisions, namely :—

- “(a) A teacher who enters upon his duties during the first week in February in any year may be paid from the 1st day of February, inclusive, in that year.
- “(b) A teacher who, during any year ending on the 31st day of January, has been on leave without pay for a period or periods exceeding in the aggregate five school days, shall be entitled to be paid only for such part of the school holidays during that year as is equal to one-fourth of his period of service as hereinafter defined.

“(3) Notwithstanding anything in paragraph (b) of the last preceding subclause, the Minister may in any case authorize the payment of salary in respect of the whole period of holidays or in respect of a greater portion of those holidays than is therein provided for.



“(4) For the purposes of paragraph (b) of subclause (2) hereof, a teacher's period of service shall comprise the actual period spent in teaching, together with any period during which the teacher has been on leave with full pay or half pay, but does not include any period of school holidays or any other period.”

7. Clause 88 is hereby deleted and the following substituted therefor :—

“88. Notwithstanding anything in these regulations the Minister may, after consultation with the Board concerned, modify in any way which he may determine the staff of teachers employed in any technical school or technical high school or in any branch of manual training, including the supervision of elementary agriculture and science in schools controlled by the Board.”

#### VI. SECONDARY SCHOOLS—STAFFING, SALARIES, ETC.

The regulations relating to staffing and salaries of secondary schools made by Order in Council dated 5th May, 1924, and amended by Orders in Council dated 1st September, 1924, 12th December, 1924, 23rd March, 1925, and 22nd March, 1926, are hereby further amended as follows :—

1. Clause 11 (3) is hereby deleted and the following substituted therefor :—

“3. If circumstances make it appear expedient that a modification of the staffing of a school otherwise provided by these regulations is reasonable or necessary, the Minister may authorize or direct the Board to modify the staffing in such manner and for such period as he thinks fit.”

2. Clause 15 is hereby amended by adding the following subclause :—

“(4) Whenever, in accordance with these regulations, the Board is required, in order to reduce the staff of a school, to select a teacher whose services are to be dispensed with, the Director of Education shall be consulted before the Board comes to a decision.”

3. Clause 17 (2) is hereby amended by the addition of the following words :—

“Provided that he shall not be entitled to receive the annual increments referred to in subclause (1) hereof so long as the school remains in the lower grade.”

4. Clause 22 is hereby revoked as from the 1st day of May, 1927, and the following substituted therefor from that date :—

“*Married Allowance.*—An assistant holding a full-time position, whether relieving or permanent, who is married or is a widower or widow, shall subject to any limitation hereinafter provided, receive an addition of £40 per annum to the salary otherwise provided in the regulations :

“Provided that no payment under this clause shall be made (a) To a married assistant whose husband or wife is employed in the Education Service or Government Service, or is otherwise employed to such an extent as to satisfy the Minister that an allowance under this clause should not be paid ; or (b) to a widower, widow, or married woman assistant unless the Minister approves such payment on account of the fact that he or she has a child under sixteen dependent upon and supported by him or her, or on account of other special circumstances ; or (c) to an assistant who is provided with free residence ; or (d) in any special case if the Minister, taking into consideration the special circumstances, is of opinion that an allowance under this clause should not be paid.”

5. Clause 23 is hereby deleted.

6. The following new clause is hereby inserted :—

“24A. (1) Subject to the provisions of the next succeeding subclause, every teacher shall be entitled to be paid only in respect of the following periods :—

(a) The period commencing on the school day on which he enters upon his duties and ending on the school day on which his duties cease, including any holidays that may intervene between those dates :

(b) Any period of school holidays that may immediately succeed the day on which his duties cease as aforesaid ; in the case of the mid-summer holidays such period shall be deemed to end not later than the 31st day of January in any year :

(c) The period necessarily occupied in transferring from one position to another.

(2) The last preceding subclause shall be read subject to the following special provisions, namely :—

(a) A teacher who enters upon his duties during the first week in February in any year may be paid from the 1st day of February, inclusive, in that year.

(b) A teacher who, during any year ending on the 31st day of January, has been on leave without pay for a period or periods exceeding in the aggregate five school days, shall be entitled to be paid only for such part of the school holidays during that year as is equal to one-fourth of his period of service as hereinafter defined.

(3) Notwithstanding anything in paragraph (b) of the last preceding subclause, the Minister may in any case authorize the payment of salary in respect of the whole period of holidays or in respect of a greater portion of those holidays than is therein provided for.

(4) For the purposes of paragraph (b) of subclause (2) hereof, a teacher's period of service shall comprise the actual period spent in teaching, together with any period during which the teacher has been on leave with full pay or half pay, but does not include any period of school holidays or any other period."

7. Clause 37 is hereby amended by deleting the proviso to subclause (6) thereof.

#### VII. AGRICULTURAL BURSARIES.

The regulations relating to agricultural bursaries, made by Order in Council dated 18th December, 1924, are hereby amended as follows:—

1. Clause 4 is hereby amended by deleting the words "8th September" following the words "not later than the" and substituting therefor the words "1st February."

#### VIII. HOME SCIENCE AND DOMESTIC ARTS BURSARIES.

The regulations relating to home science and domestic arts bursaries, made by Order in Council dated 18th December, 1924, are hereby amended as follows:—

1. Clause 1 is hereby amended by revoking subclause (d).

2. Clause 2 is hereby amended by deleting all the words following the words "together with the necessary certificates with the" and by substituting therefor the words "Director of Education."

#### IX. ORGANIZING TEACHERS.

The regulations for organizing teachers made by Order in Council dated 26th October, 1920, and amended by Orders in Council dated 24th March, 1921, 16th January, 1922, 12th January, 1925, and 22nd March, 1926, are hereby further amended as follows:—

1. Clause 8 is hereby amended by deleting subparagraph (iii) of paragraph (c) of subclause (1) thereof, and substituting "such an allowance per mile for the use of a motor-cycle or motor-car as the Minister shall from time to time determine."

2. The following new clause is hereby inserted:—

"13. The staff of organizing teachers in any education district may be modified in any way the Minister, after consultation with the Education Board, may determine."

#### X. PUBLIC SCHOOLS: SALARIES, GRADING, STAFFING, ETC.

The regulations relating to public school teachers' salaries, grading, and staffing of public schools, and other matters made by Order in Council dated 12th January, 1925, and subsequently amended by Orders in Council dated 28th October, 1925, 22nd March, 1926, and 13th April, 1927, are hereby further amended by inserting after the word "notice," in clause 32, the words "of dismissal."

#### XI. TRAINING COLLEGES.

The regulations relating to training colleges made by Order in Council dated 13th December, 1926, and amended by Order in Council dated 13th April, 1927, are hereby further amended by the addition of the following subclause to clause 27:—

"(2) Students who during their course of training have specialized in, and have shown special knowledge of and ability to teach, any subject, may, on the recommendation of the Principal of the college, and with the concurrence of the Director of Education, receive an endorsement on their teachers' certificates of a special qualification to teach such subject."

#### XII. JUNIOR AND SENIOR NATIONAL SCHOLARSHIPS.

The regulations relating to Junior and Senior National Scholarships made by Order in Council dated 17th January, 1927, are hereby amended by deleting the words "Grade IIIA," in the first proviso to Clause 4, and by substituting therefor the words "Grade IIIB."

*Prescribing the Allowance payable to a Member of the Executive Body of a District Highway Council.*

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in him by the Main Highways Act, 1922, the Main Highways Amendment Act, 1925, and of all other powers and authorities in anywise enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby prescribe that the allowance payable to any member of the executive body of any District Highways Council for any period during which he is absent from his place of residence or business in connection with, and whilst engaged on, any business of the executive body which he has been duly authorized by resolution of that body to transact, shall be as follows :—

- (1) For each completed day of twenty-four hours the sum of twenty-one shillings.
- (2) For each portion of a day, a sum calculated at the rate of tenpence halfpenny per hour, provided that—
  - (a) A fraction of an hour, if less than half an hour, shall not be taken into account, and if half an hour or more shall be reckoned as one hour.
  - (b) The minimum allowance payable in respect of any one attendance shall be ten shillings and sixpence.

CERTIFICATE.

- (3) No claim of any member of the executive body of a District Highways Council for fees or travelling allowance or expenses shall be recognized unless such claim sets out the days claimed for, and is accompanied by the certificate of such member stating that on or during the days claimed for he was engaged in connection with the business of the District Highways Council and incurred the expenses set out in the claim. Such certificate shall be in the following form :—

WHEREAS by Order in Council dated the fourth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 61, of the seventh day of the same month, Isaac William Turner was licensed to use and occupy a part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark at Admiralty Bay as a site for a wharf, erected in accordance with the plan marked M.D. 4097, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington, for the term of fourteen years, computed from the fourth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen :

And whereas the said license was, with the consent of the Minister of Marine transferred to Robert Sharon Turner, of Admiralty Bay (who, with his executors, administrators, and assigns is hereinafter referred to as "the licensee") :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said license is required by the licensee as aforesaid; and in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the licensee to use and occupy that part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark immediately contiguous thereto, which is particularly shown and delineated on the plans so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of using the wharf thereon, such license to be held and enjoyed by the licensee upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto.

In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council the licensee shall pay to the Minister the sum of £2 10s., and thereafter an annual sum of £1 in advance, payable on the 1st day of April in each year, the proportionate part of such rental in respect of the period from the 4th August, 1927, until the 31st March following to be paid on the licensee being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.

4. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, over, and out of the said wharf without payment.

5. All persons shall, at all reasonable times, and upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the said wharf, and all rights of ingress and egress thereon or therefrom.

6. The licensee shall maintain and keep the above-mentioned wharf and all erections on or in connection with the wharf in good order and repair; and shall at all times exhibit therefrom and maintain at the licensee's own cost, suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels; provided that no new light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved by the Minister.

7. Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said wharf, and any buildings erected on the wharf or in connection therewith, and view the state of repair thereof; and upon the Minister leaving at

or posting to the last known address of the licensee in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf, requiring the licensee within a reasonable time to be therein prescribed, to make good or repair the same, the licensee shall, with all convenient speed, cause such defect to be removed, or such repairs to be made.

8. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the licensee to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1923, or its amendments, or any regulation thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

9. The ballast of all vessels trading at the said wharf shall be taken away by the licensee and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

10. The rights, powers, and privileges hereby conferred shall continue in force for fourteen years, computed from the 3rd day of August, 1927, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the licensee shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

11. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred under or by virtue of this Order in Council may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensee three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the licensee in New Zealand.

12. The licensee shall be liable for any injury which may be caused at the said wharf to any vessel or boat through any default or neglect on the part of the licensee.

13. In case the licensee shall—

- (1) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;
- (2) Cease to use or occupy the said wharf for a period of thirty days;
- (3) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause 3 of these conditions; or
- (4) Become bankrupt or be brought under the operation of any law for the time being in force relating to bankruptcy,

then, and in any of the said cases, this Order in Council, and every license, right, power, or privilege may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any notice to the licensee or any other proceeding whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensee and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

14. In the event of this Order in Council being revoked for any reason whatsoever, or upon the expiry of the period for which the license is granted, the licensee shall, if required by the Minister so to do, remove the said wharf entirely from the site, and restore the site to its original condition within three months from the date of the revocation or expiry, as the case may be; and if the licensee fail so to do, the Minister may cause the said wharf to be removed and the site so restored, and may recover the costs incurred by the said removal and restoration from the licensee.

WHEREAS by Order in Council dated the second day of March, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-five, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the fifth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-five, regulations were made under the authority of the Post and Telegraph Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), in connection with the licensing of the installation and working of apparatus for radio-telegraphy :

And whereas it is desirable to amend the said regulations in the manner hereinafter set forth :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the said Act, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the regulations numbered 9, 10, 11, 24, and 25, in the said Order in Council, and in lieu thereof doth make the regulations set forth in the Schedule hereto, and doth declare that such regulations shall be read as part of the hereinbefore-mentioned regulations, and shall take effect as from the date of publication of this Order in Council in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

SCHEDULE.

LICENSES : CLASSES AND CONDITIONS.

9. (1) THE following classes of licenses may be granted, and may be evidenced by instruments in accordance with the forms in the Schedules to these regulations :—

(a) Receiving-station licenses—

(b) Amateur transmitting and receiving-station licenses (Second Schedule).

(c) Experimental-station licenses (Third Schedule).

(2) In the case of radio-receiving stations in hotels, restaurants, places of amusement, or other places where the reception of radio communications is intended for a number of people, the license shall be a special receiving-station license.

(3) In the case of radio-receiving stations at show-grounds, exhibitions, and other places of a like nature, where the station is to be operated for a limited time, the license shall be a temporary receiving-station license.

(4) Licenses for radio-stations to be erected and operated by hospitals, schools, colleges, institutes, societies, and like bodies, shall, in accordance with the objects in view, be classified by the Minister in accordance with this regulation.

(5) Portable or mobile stations shall be classified by the Minister, and shall be subject to such additional conditions regarding field of operation and the like as the Minister may deem it necessary to impose.

(6) Licenses for portable or mobile radio-stations shall be in one of the forms in the First, Second, or Third Schedule hereto endorsed in accordance with paragraph (3) of this regulation.

10. In the event of a radio station licensed under these regulations being dismantled or of a change being made in the location thereof, the licensee shall, within seven days thereafter, notify the Postmaster at the nearest postal money-order office, in writing, accordingly.

11. Where a radio-station is to be erected and operated for a limited time, the Minister may, at the written request of any person, association, or corporation, grant a temporary license in writing, authorizing for a period to be determined by the Minister, the operation of such station in accordance with these regulations, and upon whatever terms in addition to these regulations the Minister deems desirable. The fees for such temporary licenses shall be those prescribed by these regulations for temporary receiving-station licenses.

*Duration of Licenses.*

24. Except where otherwise authorized by the Minister, every license, other than a temporary receiving-station license, shall be in force from the date of the granting thereof until the 31st day of March following, and may be renewed from year to year.

*Fees for Licenses.*

25. (1) Except where otherwise specified in these regulations, the license or renewal fee for each of the several classes of radio-stations shall be as follows, payable in advance :—

(a) For a receiving-station license—

- (i) Ordinary, £1 10s. per annum.
- (ii) Special, £5 per annum.
- (iii) Temporary, 10s. per week.

(b) For an amateur-transmitting and receiving-station license, £2 2s. per annum.

(c) For an experimental-station license, £2 2s. per annum.

(2) The fee for the first year, or portion thereof, shall accompany the application. For a period of less than one year, the fee shall be,—

(a) For a receiving-station license—(i) ordinary, 2s. 6d. per month, with a minimum of 7s. 6d.; (ii) special, 8s. 4d. per month, with a minimum of £1 5s.; (iii) temporary, 10s. for each week of seven days. For a period of less than seven days the fee shall be 10s.

(b) For an amateur-transmitting and receiving-station license, 3s. 6d. per month, with a minimum of 10s. 6d.

(c) For an experimental-station license, 3s. 6d. per month, with a minimum of 10s. 6d.

(3) If, in the case of renewals, payment of the above-mentioned fees be not made on or before the due date, the license shall automatically lapse.

(4) The fee for a duplicate copy of a license shall be 5s.

Alterations to Scale of Charges in force upon the New Zealand Government Railways.

IN pursuance of all powers and authorities enabling me under the Government Railways Act, 1926, and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, I, Joseph Gordon Coates, Minister of Railways, do hereby made the following alterations in the scale of charges in force on the New Zealand Government Railways open for traffic made on the 10th day of August, 1925, and published in the Gazette of 11th August, 1925; and I do hereby declare that such alterations shall come into force on the 25th August, 1927.

PART I.—PASSENGERS.

By omitting the following :—

10. School Boarders.

Tickets, available for return for two months from date of issue, will be issued at stations in the vicinity of the school in each case, at three-fourths of the ordinary return fare, to school boarders who are attending school for the purpose of receiving bona fide educational instruction, and who are solely engaged in their studies, and not following any occupation or employment, or in receipt of any salary or emolument therefrom, returning home for holidays within seven days after the end of recognized school terms only. Applicant must hand to the Stationmaster a certificate in the following form, signed by the master or mistress of the school :—

To the Stationmaster at
I hereby certify that is a bona fide school boarder attending my school solely for the purpose of receiving educational instruction; that is not following any employment, or in receipt of salary or emolument from any occupation; that present age is years months, and that is going home from school on the day of , 19 , for holidays; and I request that you will issue a -class return ticket accordingly, from Station to Station.

And substituting the following :—

10. Vacation Tickets.

1. Students or scholars who are in regular daily attendance at universities, colleges, technical colleges, state or private schools, and who are not following any occupation or employment or in receipt of any salary or emolument therefrom shall, when travelling during the recognized school or college vacations, be issued with return tickets at the following fares :—

- Under 12 years of age .. Half the holiday excursion fare. (Regulation 5, Part 1 of Tariff).
12 years of age and over .. The holiday excursion fare. (Regulation 5, Part 1 of Tariff).

2. Vacation tickets issued during the Christmas and New Year vacation will be available for two months, and such tickets issued during the remaining two vacations will be available for one month.

3. In each case the availability shall begin with and include the date shown on the ticket.

4. Vacation tickets will not be granted to students who only attend art, commercial, or other special classes.

5. These tickets will be issued on production of a certificate in the following form :—

Notice under the Shops and Offices Act, 1921-22, prohibiting the Sale within the Borough of Otaki of certain Goods comprised in the Trade of a Tobacconist.
