Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority so conferred upon me by section fourteen of the Native Land Amendment Act, 1914, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim that the Native land set out in the Schedule hereto has become Crown land.

Such license shall be termed "Half-season License," season. Such license shall be termed "Half-season License," and shall entitle the holder thereof to fish only in the waters of the Otago Acclimatization District: Provided that such Secretary may refuse to issue a license to any person who within the previous two years has been convicted of any breach of the provisions of any Act relating to fishing for trout, tench, or perch, or of any regulation made thereunder. 2. Such licenses shall be issued at the following rates: Licenses for men, £1 for the whole season. Licenses for women and for boys attending school or under the age of sixteen years, 5s. for the whole season. Half-season license, as prescribed above, 12s. 6d. 3. No license shall authorize any person other than the person named therein to fish, and that only with one rod and line, and with the following baits—namely, natural or artificial flies, insects, or fish, or with worms, creepers, maggots, caterpillars, frogs, or tadpoles, or with Devons or spoons.

4. No person shall take trout, tench, or perch in Lake Hawea, its tributary rivers, Lake Wanaka, its tributary rivers, and the Hawea River during the period commencing on the 1st day of June in any year and ending on the 31st day of October in the same year, nor in any other waters within the Otago Acclimatization District during the period commencing on the lat day of May in any way and adding

within the Otago Acclimatization District during the period commencing on the 1st day of May in any year and ending on the 30th day of September in the same year. 5. No person shall have in his possession any trout, tench, or perch between the 1st day of June and the 30th day of September (both inclusive) in any year except in either case in freezing works or a freezing chamber. 6. No person shall cast or throw into any river, stream, or waters in which trout, perch, or tench exist or have been liberated, or shall allow to flow or otherwise get into any such river, stream, or waters any sawdust or sawmill refuse, lime,

river, stream, or waters any sawdust or sawmill refuse, lime, sheep-dip, flax-mill refuse, or any other matter or liquid that is poisonous or injurious to fish, or place the same near the bank or margin of any such river, stream, or waters so that the same actually gets into the said river, stream, or waters as the result of any ordinary natural agency: Provided that nothing herein contained shall extend to prohibit the deposit in such river, stream, or waters of the debris of any mining claim.

No person shall fish for trout, perch, or tench without a Increase, and every person fishing for trout, perch, or tench without a license, and every person fishing for trout, tench, or perch, or any of them, shall on demand of any ranger, constable, or officer of the said society, or of any person producing a license, produce and show to such ranger, constable, officer, or person his license and the contents of his creel or bag, and the bait used by him for taking, catching, or killing such trout touch or perch

Except as herein provided, no person shall put, stake, set, drag, draw, or place, or allow to be put, staked, set, dragged, drawn, or placed for any purpose whatsoever any net of any description except a landing-net or hand-net in any lake, river, stream, or dam, or within the mouth of any river or stream: Provided that nothing herein contained shall prevent the placing or using of any net other than a shall prevent the placing or using of any net other than a stake-net in or across the parts of the rivers and waters mentioned in the Third Schedule hereto, or prevent the taking of fish in accordance with any regulations made under the Fisheries Act, 1908.

Fisheries Act, 1908. 12. No person shall buy, sell, or expose or offer for sale any trout, tench, or perch or any part of such fish unless he has a license authorizing him to do so issued under the Fisheries Act, 1908, or any regulations made thereunder. 13. No person holding a license for taking trout, tench, or perch shall fish with more than one rod and line or with any bait other than such as are mentioned in Regulation 3 hereof. 14. For the nurposes of these regulations the mouth of

14. For the purposes of these regulations the mouth of every river or stream shall be deemed to include every outlet of the same and the sea-shore between such outlets, and shall from every point at which the waters of such river or stream meet those of the sea or of any inlet of the sea at low water.

15. Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, no bait other than a natural or artificial fly or natural or artificial bait other than a natural or artificial fly or natural or artificial minnow shall be used for taking fish in any of the lagoons in the Roxburgh Amalgamated Company's old workings, bounded on the south by the Molyneux River, on the east by the Teviot River and the Main Road, on the north by the Main Road, Roxburgh to Alexandra, and on the west by the Ladysmith Company's former claim : Provided that this regulation shall not apply to that dam or portion of the dam at Roxburgh at present held by Mr. W. Lutjens, Roxburgh, under occupation lease. under occupation lease.

16. Any person may net trout in Lake Hawea and Lake Wanaka provided that he holds a valid license to net trout therein, such license to be in the form numbered 3 in the Second Schedule hereto, and to be issued by the Otago Acclimatization Society.

17. No net of a smaller size than six (6) inches in the mesh from knot to knot in extension when wetted shall be used in

any portion of Lake Hawea or Lake Wanaka, and no person shall use more than two nets therein at the same time.

18. The season for netting in Lake Hawea and Lake Wanaka and fishing with rod and line in Lake Hawea and Lake Wanaka, their tributary rivers and streams, and the Hawea River shall extend from the 1st day of November in any one year to the 31st day of May in the following year (both dates inclusive). inclusive).

19. The fee for every such annual license to net trout in Lake Hawea and Lake Wanaka shall be the sum of one pound (£1) for each person so licensed, such fee to be paid to the Secretary or other duly authorized officer of the Otago Ac-climatization Society. Such license shall be in the form numbered 3 set out in the Second Schedule hereto.

20. It shall be the duty of every holder of a license authoriz-ing him to net trout at the close of the fishing season to furnish to the Secretary of the Otago Acclimatization Society a return giving the number and weight of the fish taken during the season.

21. Any person in lawful occupation of any land may fish without a license on payment of a fee for trout, perch, and tench upon such land during the same period and upon the same conditions as any other person might fish in the same

same conditions as any other person might fish in the same waters who holds a license issued under these regulations. 22. The term "Lake Wanaka," as used in these regulations, means such portion of Lake Wanaka as is within the said Otago Acclimatization District. 23. SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF JULY, 1927.

The total precipitation of the month was above normal over the North Island, with the exception of small areas about Cook Strait and at Kawhia and Gisborne. In the South Island there were considerable local variations in the amounts measured, but Nelson and Marlborough had an excess, and also isolated places on the east coast and in western Otago. Westland, North Canterbury, and most parts of Otago recorded less than the mean. In some districts, notably in the Bay of Plenty and Hawke's Bay, the excess was considerable.

of Plenty and Hawke's Bay, the excess was considerable. There were three outstanding storms during the month, which may be briefly described as follows: A cyclone from the north-westward was centred over the Auckland Peninsula on the 1st, and passed off East Cape on the night of the 2nd. On these two days some phenomenal rainfalls occurred in the Gisborne and Hawke's Bay Districts, resulting in serious floods in the low-lying country. Between the 9th and 14th an intense and extensive westerly low-pressure area dominated, with strong northerly winds, changing to southerlies, about the 13th. Much rain fell during this period and, on the 13th, there were heavy snowfalls in the high country in the South Island and also in the central portion of the North Island. Waiouru recorded a fall of 17 in., and at Taumarunui it was regarded as the heaviest fall since 1918. From the 25th 1) the close of the month wide and extensive cyclonic disturbances operated between New Zealand and Australia, and conditions were again extremely unsettled, with strong north-east to isouth-east winds. Although precipitation came mostly in the form of drizzle, some heavy rains were occasionally experienced, particularly in the northern and east coast districts on the 25th and 26th. In many parts of the North Island the continuous rain accounted for serious floods and landslips which interfered with railway and other traffic. Fair weather ruled between the 3rd and 8th, and other shorter fair periods were experienced, but usually the duration of

Temperatures, however, were about normal and above the mean of the previous month, and generally there was a good growth in vegetation for the time of year.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the respective Councils of the City of Auckland and of the Borough of Avondale. by petitions under the respective common seals of the Corporations of such city and borough, as provided by the Municipal Corpora-tions Act, 1920, have prayed the Governor-General that such city and borough (forming one continuous area) be

such city and borough (forming one continuous area) be constituted one united borough: Now, therefore, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance of the powers vested in me by the said Municipal Coeporations Act, 1920, do hereby proclaim that the said City of Auckland and the said Borough of Avondale are hereby constituted one united borough, and also that the said borough so constituted is a city by the name of the City of Auckland, and also that the boundaries of the said eity so constituted and named shall be those set forth in the Schedule hereto: the Schedule hereto :

And I do also proclaim that the said borough shall be an undivided borough, and that the number of councillors to be elected to the Council thereof shall be twenty-one, exclusive

of the Mayor: And I do hereby appoint John Sylvester Brigham (the Town Clerk to the existing City of Auckland) to be the Town Clerk temporarily of the said united borough; and I do hereby appoint Percy Franklin Notley (the Returning Officer to the said existing city) to be the Returning Officer temporarily to the said united borough:

And I do also proclaim and declare that this Proclamation shall take effect on and from the first day of September, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven.

SCHEDULE.

BOUNDARIES OF THE CITY OF AUCKLAND.
