Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority so conferred upon me by section fourteen of the Native Land Amendment Act, 1914, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim that the Native land set out in the Schedule hereto has become Crown land.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in him by section seventy-six of the Electric-power Boards Act, 1925, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby authorize the South Taranaki Electric-power Board to erect electric lines as shown on the plans marked P.W.D. 69740 and 69741, deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works at Wellington, in the Wellington Land District, and such further lines as may from time to time be required in the South Taranaki Electric-power District and outer area of such district as hereinafter defined; transformers and substations for the transmission and distribution of electrical energy in the South Taranaki Electric-power District and outer area of such district, as defined by Proclamation dated the twenty-fourth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-five, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 27, of the thirtieth day of the same month, and subsequently amended by Proclamation dated the twenty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 83, of the twenty-third day of the same month, subject to the following conditions.

1. No electric lines shall be used for the distribution of electrical energy until the South Taranaki Electric-power Board has obtained a license for such purpose in accordance with the provisions of section 2 of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1911.
2. Any conditions inserted in such licenses shall be strictly complied with by such Board.
3. Such Board shall forward for the approval of the Minister of Public Works such further plans and particulars as the Minister of Public Works may from time to time require.
4. The Board shall not, without the consent in writing of the Minister of Public Works, erect any electric lines along the routes of the Government main-trunk transmission-lines.
5. The works hereby authorized shall be constructed so as to comply with the regulations made under section 2 of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1911, dated the 11th day of

SCHEDULE.

1. SYSTEM OF SUPPLY.

The system of supply shall be as described in paragraphs (a) and (e) of clause 5 of the regulations.

Electrical energy shall be received in bulk and may be supplemented by supply from any existing power plant operating within the licensee's district or outer area of such district.

The primary distribution voltage shall be 11,000 or 6,600 volts between phases. The secondary distribution voltage shall be approximately 400 volts between phases and 230 volts between any phase and neutral.

2. DURATION OF LICENSE.

This license shall, unless sooner determined in accordance with the provisions hereinafter expressed, continue in force for a period of forty-two years from the date hereof. Upon the expiry of the said term, or upon the sooner determination of this license by revocation or otherwise, all rights hereby granted to the licensee shall cease and determine; but such expiration or determination shall not relieve the licensee of any liability theretofore incurred under this license.

3. CHARGES FOR ELECTRICAL ENERGY.

The charges for electrical energy shall not exceed 1s. per unit for lighting purposes, and 6d. per unit for motor-power, heating, or cooking purposes; provided that "lighting purposes" shall include the operation of motor generators for lighting purposes; and provided further that if accounts are paid within fourteen days of due date the charges shall not exceed 10d. per unit for lighting purposes and 4½d. per unit for motor-power, cooking, and heating purposes.

In the case of wholesale supply the charge shall not exceed £16 per kilovolt-ampere per year plus ½d. per unit. "Wholesale supply," for this purpose shall be held to be a supply in respect of which the consumer shall guarantee to pay not less than £180 per year.

A minimum charge of 7s. 6d. per month, including meter rent (if any), may be collected if required by the licensee, and shall be printed on the licensee's conditions of supply.

4. ROUTES RESERVED FOR GOVERNMENT LINES.

The licensee shall not, without the consent in writing of the Minister of Public Works, erect any electric lines along the routes of the Government main trunk transmission-lines.

5. CONVERSION OF LINES FROM EARTH-WORKING TO METALLIC.

Notwithstanding anything herein contained, the licensee shall bear the cost of converting the Railway or Post and Telegraph Department's lines which are now erected from earth-working to metallic, if such conversion is required by the Minister of Railways or the Minister of Telegraphs owing to electrical interference arising from the licensee's lines.

6. TELEGRAPH-LINES.

The licensee shall rectify to the satisfaction of the Minister of Railways or the Minister of Telegraphs any interference or disturbance caused by the erection or operation of the licensee's system that affects the satisfactory working of the telegraph-lines which are the property of the Railway Department or the Telegraph Department and which were erected prior to the licensee's lines: Provided that where the minimum separation is unobtainable the licensee shall bear the cost of any special protection deemed necessary by the Minister of Telegraphs.

7. ROUTE OF TRANSMISSION-LINE.

The route of the transmission-line between Patea Borough and the boundary of the Opunake Electric-power District shall be subject to the approval of the Minister of Telegraphs.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the Municipal Corporations Act, 1920, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations prescribing, pursuant to subparagraph two of paragraph four of the Eleventh Schedule to the said Act, the manner in which an appeal under the said paragraph four shall be made to the Supreme Court.

REGULATIONS.

1. In these regulations, if not inconsistent with the context,—

“ The said Act ” means the Municipal Corporations Act, 1920 :

“ Appellant ” means the applicant for a license referred to in the said Eleventh Schedule, and includes any person having under section 312 of the said Act the same right of appeal as is given by the said Eleventh Schedule :

“ Council ” means the Council of the Borough within which the building is situated :

“ Court ” means the Supreme Court :

“ License ” means a license to use any building within a borough for the purposes defined in section 308 of the said Act.

2. Within fourteen days after receipt of notice of any decision of the Council which may be the subject of an appeal the appellant shall state and sign a case setting forth the facts and the grounds of objection to the decision of the Council, and the redress to which the appellant considers himself to be entitled, and shall file the same in the office of the Court in the borough, or if there is no office of the Court in the borough then in the office of the Court nearest to the borough within the judicial district in which the borough is situated.

3. Such case shall state an address for service within the borough at which address the appellant may be served with any document or written communication in connection with the appeal.

4. In respect of any decision of the Council communicated to an appellant prior to the date of these regulations the date of receipt of the decision of the Council shall be deemed to be the date of the publication of these regulations in the Gazette.

5. A copy of the case stated and filed shall be served upon the Council by the appellant within seven days after the same is filed in the office of the Court.

6. Within seven days after service on it of the case stated the Council shall file an answer to the case. Such answer shall set forth the facts as alleged by the Council and the grounds of its decision, and a copy thereof shall be served on the appellant.

7. If sittings of the Court are held in the borough the case shall be heard there, and if not it shall be heard in the place nearest to the borough within the judicial district in which the borough is situated in which sittings of the Court for the trial of actions are held.

8. Either party may set down the case for hearing at the first sitting of the Court at the place of hearing held after the expiration of the time within which the Council is required to file its answer to the case of the appellant, and held after at least six clear days from the day on which the case is so set down for hearing.

9. Subject to the provisions of these regulations the appeal shall be heard and determined in accordance with the ordinary practice of the Court in its civil jurisdiction, as if on the trial of an action instituted between the appellant as plaintiff and the Council as defendant, and the rules of the Court shall apply thereto accordingly.

**W**HEREAS by subsection (1) of section 7 of the Customs Amendment Act, 1927, it is provided that nothing in the preceding provisions of that Act shall affect the agreement for Customs reciprocity made between the Governments of New Zealand and the Commonwealth of Australia and ratified by the Tariff Agreement (New Zealand and Australia) Ratification Act, 1922, or shall affect any Order in Council made for the purposes of or in relation to that agreement under the authority of the Customs Amendment Act, 1921 :

And whereas by subsection (2) of the same section it is provided that, subject to the terms of the said agreement, the Minister may, by notice published in the *Gazette*, at any time apply the British Preferential Tariff to any goods specified or referred to in such notice, and being the produce of the Commonwealth of Australia :

And whereas by clause 2 of the said agreement (as modified by a certain further agreement, effect to which was given pursuant to section 10 of the Customs Amendment Act, 1921, by Order in Council of date the 19th day of May, 1926, published in the *Gazette* on the 20th day of the same month, at page 1329) it is provided, *inter alia*, that the Dominion shall not impose any Customs duty or increase the rate of any Customs duty on any article the produce or manufacture of the Commonwealth entering the Dominion from the Commonwealth, except by mutual agreement, until after six calendar months' notice to the other party to the first-mentioned agreement :

And whereas a mutual agreement as aforesaid has been made between the parties to the said agreement enabling the Dominion without giving the said six calendar months' notice to increase the rate of Customs duty on wheat and wheat-flour, including wheat-meal and similar preparations of wheat, the produce and manufacture of the Commonwealth :

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the premises, and in exercise of the powers conferred on me by the said subsection (2) of section 7 of the Customs Amendment Act, 1927, I, William Downie Stewart, Minister of Customs, do by this notice apply, subject to the provisions of section 143 of the Customs Act, 1913, the British Preferential Tariff to wheat and wheat-flour, including wheat-meal and similar preparations of wheat, the produce or manufacture of the Commonwealth of Australia, and imported into New Zealand or entered for home consumption therein after the 31st day of October, 1927.

*Subsidies to Public Libraries in Country Districts.*

Education Department,  
Wellington, 8th October, 1927.

**N**OTICE is hereby given that the sum of £3,000 has been voted by Parliament for distribution to public libraries in country districts.

The distribution will take place about the 1st March, 1928, and no claim will be entitled to consideration that is not forwarded in due form and received by the Secretary, Education Department, Wellington, on or before the 31st January, 1928.

1. A library to be entitled to a subsidy must be public in the sense of belonging to the public, and of not being under the control of an association, society, or club whose membership is composed of a section of the community only ; and if it is within a borough a reading-room where the books may be read, and containing newspapers and periodicals, must be provided for the public free of charge ; *in addition, it must not be situated in a borough, town, or town district the population of which exceeds fifteen hundred. The receipts for the year from subscriptions, donations, and voluntary contributions must not have been less than £2, exclusive of moneys received from endowments, or from Government, or from Borough or County Councils, or for special building purposes, or as rent, hire, or consideration for the use of any room, or building, or land belonging to the institution, in respect of none of which will subsidy be allowed. The net proceeds of concerts, lectures, or other entertainments on behalf of the current expenses of the library will be regarded as voluntary contributions. The number of members subscribing to the library during the year must not have been less than eight, each of whom must have paid the subscription for at least six months. Libraries established during 1927 may make applications for a grant, and each case will be considered on its merits. A subsidy will not be given to more than one library in the same town.*

2. In the distribution of the vote a nominal addition of £25 will be made to the amount of the income of each library derived from subscriptions, donations, and rates, and the vote will be divided according to the amounts thus augmented ; *but no library will receive credit for a larger income than £25— that is, in no case will the augmented amount on which distribution is based exceed £50.*

3. The whole of the subsidy must be expended without delay in the purchase or loan of books for the library.

4. *It is particularly enjoined upon the authorities in charge of the public libraries concerned that a due proportion of the books purchased shall be books having a permanent value—that is, books of more than merely passing interest.*

5. Application to share in the distribution must be by means of a statutory declaration by the Chairman, or Secretary, or Treasurer of the institution on behalf of which it is made, and must be accompanied by a statement of the receipts and payments of the institution for the year ending on the 31st day of December, 1927, and *such declaration must be on the form provided for the purpose.*

6. Copies of the form of application may be obtained from the Secretary, Education Department, Wellington.

NOTE.—A wet and gloomy month, with precipitation 67 per cent. above the mean of previous years. Total bright sunshine, 128 hours 24 minutes, 39 per cent. of the possible, and three sunless days. Hail fell on the 26th and 27th and frost was recorded on the grass on six mornings. Mean earth temperature at 1 ft. was 47.3°, and at 3 ft., 49.6°. Mean dew-point, 42.2°; mean vapour pressure, 0.269 in.; and mean relative humidity, 80 per cent. of saturation.

SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF AUGUST, 1927.

The outstanding meteorological feature of August was the frequency with which cyclones passed over or in close proximity to the Dominion, while well-defined high-pressure systems were conspicuous by their absence. From the 10th to the close of the month there was practically a succession of these cyclones, but, with the exception of one which ruled between the 18th and 21st, they were of a shallow type, accompanied by much rain but little wind. On the 18th and 19th, while the centre of the intense disturbance mentioned was passing over the North Island, particularly stormy conditions and heavy rain were experienced in the North Island and on the East Coast of the South. Except in the Gisborne and Napier districts in the North Island, and the western, central, and southernmost portions of the South, both the aggregate month's rainfall and number of wet days were above the average. The general character of the month may be described as dull and moist with an absence of strong winds. Although frosts were frequent, there were few damaging ones, and conditions generally were favourable to a fair growth of grass, and cattle and sheep in consequence have thrived.

## RESOLUTION.

THE following regulations were laid before the members of the Thames Jockey Club (Incorporated) at a meeting held on the 4th day of October, 1927, at its office, Albert Street, Thames, and it was resolved by such club that the same be passed at once with a view to their approval by His Excellency the Governor-General in pursuance of the Gaming Act, 1908, section 33, as the regulations applicable to a race meeting or any postponement thereof to be held by the Thames Jockey Club (Incorporated) on the Auckland Racing Club's course situated in the City of Auckland and Town District of Ellerslie, and known as the Ellerslie Racecourse.

The following are the regulations referred to:—

## THAMES JOCKEY CLUB.

## REGULATIONS.

(Under the Gaming Act, 1908.)

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers in that behalf contained in section 33 of the Gaming Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities it enabling in that behalf, the Thames Jockey Club, a racing club within the meaning of the said Act (hereinafter referred to as "the said club"), doth hereby make the following regulations controlling the admission of persons to that part of the racecourse situated in the City of Auckland and Town District of Ellerslie, and known as the Ellerslie Racecourse, whilst the said racecourse is used or occupied by the said club for race meetings.

1. These regulations shall come into force on the date of the same being published in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

(2) In these regulations the words "bookmaker," "racing club," and "race meeting" shall have the meanings ascribed to those terms respectively by section 2 of the Gaming Act, 1908.

3. The following persons shall be and are hereby excluded from the racecourse above described while the same is used or occupied by the said club for a race meeting, namely,—

- (a) Bookmakers.
- (b) Bookmakers' clerks, bookmakers' assistants, and bookmakers' agents.
- (c) All persons under disqualification inflicted by any racing or trotting club in the Dominion of New Zealand, the Commonwealth of Australia, or elsewhere, if affiliated to the New Zealand Racing Conference, or the New Zealand Trotting Conference, or the New Zealand Trotting Association.
- (d) Common prostitutes, and persons who habitually consort with thieves or persons who have no lawful visible means of support.

(e) Professional tipsters, persons convicted of house-breaking, pocket-picking, forgery, uttering, or possessing counterfeit coin, theft, false pretences, receiving stolen goods, mischief, assault, or any offence or crime of any kind under the Crimes Act, 1908, and also idle and disorderly persons, rogues and vagabonds, and incorrigible rogues convicted under the Police Offences Act, 1908, and persons convicted of an offence under the Gaming Act, 1908.

Provided always that the Stipendiary Stewards' Committee appointed by the New Zealand Racing Conference upon being satisfied by evidence as to character and otherwise that any person who, by reason of any conviction, comes within the scope of this regulation should have relief from the effect thereof, may grant exemption to any such person, and may at any time revoke any such exemption without notice to such person, and without assigning any reason for such revocation.

The foregoing regulations of the Thames Jockey Club were made and passed by such club on the 4th day of October, 1927, and signed by the Chairman and Secretary.
