WHEREAS by section fourteen of the Native Land Amendment Act, 1914, it is provided, *inter alia*, that on being satisfied that the purchase of any Native land has been duly completed by or on behalf of the Crown under the authority of the Native Land Act, 1909, the Governor-General may issue a Proclamation that such land has become Crown land :

And whereas the purchase of the Native land set out in the Schedule hereto has been duly completed by or on behalf of the Crown under the authority of the Native Land Act, 1909, and its amendments:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority so conferred upon me by section fourteen of the Native Land Amendment Act, 1914, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim that the Native land set out in the Schedule hereto has become Crown land.

The system of supply shall be as described in paragraphs (a) and (e) of clause 5 of the regulations. Electrical energy shall be received in bulk and may be supplemented by supply from any existing power plant operating within the licensee's district or outer area of such district.

The primary distribution voltage shall be 11,000 or 6,600 volts between phases. The secondary distribution voltage shall be approximately 400 volts between phases and 230 volts between any phase and neutral.

#### 2. DURATION OF LICENSE.

This license shall, unless sooner determined in accordance with the provisions hereinafter expressed, continue in force for a period of forty-two years from the date hereof. Upon the expiry of the said term, or upon the sooner determination of this license by revocation or otherwise, all rights hereby granted to the licensee shall cease and determine; but such expiration or determination shall not relieve the licensee of any liability theretofore incurred under this license.

## 3. CHARGES FOR ELECTRICAL ENERGY.

The charges for electrical energy shall not exceed 1s. per unit The charges for electrical energy shall not exceed 1s. per unit for lighting purposes, and 6d. per unit for motor-power, heat-ing, or cooking purposes; provided that "lighting purposes" shall include the operation of motor generators for lighting purposes; and provided further that if accounts are paid within fourteen days of due date the charges shall not exceed 10d. per unit for lighting purposes and  $4\frac{1}{2}d$ . per unit for motor-newer cooking and heating purposes

10d. per unit for lighting purposes and  $4\frac{1}{2}d$ . per unit for motor-power, cooking, and heating purposes. In the case of wholesale supply the charge shall not exceed £16 per kilovolt-ampere per year plus  $\frac{1}{2}d$ . per unit. A minimum charge of 7s. 6d. per month, including meter rent (if any), may be collected if required by the licensee, and shall be printed on the licensee's conditions of supply.

The licensee shall not, without the consent in writing of the Minister of Public Works, erect any electric lines along the routes of the Government main trunk transmission-lines.

Notwithstanding anything herein contained, the licensee shall bear the cost of converting the Railway or Post and Telegraph Department's lines which are now erected from earth-working to metallic, if such conversion is required by the Minister of Railways or the Minister of Telegraphs owing to electrical interference arising from the licensee's lines.

# 6. Telegraph-lines.

The licensee shall rectify to the satisfaction of the Minister of Railways or the Minister of Telegraphs any interference or disturbance caused by the erection or operation of the licensee's system that affects the satisfactory working of the telegraph-lines which are the property of the Railway Depart-ment or the Telegraph Department and which were erected prior to the licensee's lines: Provided that where the mini-mum separation is unobtainable the licensee shall bear the cost of any special protection deemed necessary by the cost of any special protection deemed necessary by the Minister of Telegraphs.

7. If sittings of the Court are held in the borough the case shall be heard there, and if not it shall be heard in the place nearest to the borough within the judicial district in which the borough is situated in which sittings of the Court for the trial of actions are held.

Subsidies to Public Libraries in Country Districts.

Education Department,

in country distribution will take place about the 1st March, 1928, and no claim will be entitled to consideration that is not forwarded in due form and received by the Secretary, Education to the secretary for Department, Wellington, on or before the 31st January, 1928.

A library to be entitled to a subsidy must be public in the sense of belonging to the public, and of not being under the control of an association, society, or club whose membership is composed of a section of the community only; and if it is within a borough a reading-room where the books may be read, and containing newspapers and periodicals, must be provided for the public free of charge; in addition, it must not be situated in a borough, town, or town district the population of which exceeds fifteen hundred. The receipts for the year from subscriptions, donations, and voluntary contribu-tions must not have been less than £2, exclusive of moneys received from endowments, or from Government, or from Borough or County Councils, or for special building purposes, or as rent, hire, or consideration for the use of any room, or Borough or County Councils, or for special building purposes, or as rent, hire, or consideration for the use of any room, or building, or land belonging to the institution, in respect of none of which will subsidy be allowed. The *net* proceeds of concerts, lectures, or other entertainments on behalf of the current expenses of the library will be regarded as voluntary contributions. The number of members subscribing to the library during the year must not have been less than eight, each of whom must have paid the subscription for at least six months. Libraries established during 1927 may make applications for a grant, and each case will be considered on its merits. A subsidy will not be given to more than one library in the same town. rts merits. A subsidy will not be given to more than one library in the same town. 2. In the distribution of the vote a nominal addition of £25

In the distribution of the vote a nominal addition of £25 will be made to the amount of the income of each library derived from subscriptions, donations, and rates, and the vote will be divided according to the amounts thus augmented; but no library will receive credit for a larger income than £25—that is, in no case will the augmented amount on which distribution is based exceed £50.
 The whole of the subsidy must be expended without delay in the purchase or loan of books for the library.
 It is particularly enjoined upon the authorities in charge of the public libraries concerned that a due proportion of the books purchased shall be books having a permanent value—that is, books of more than merely passing interest.
 Application to share in the distribution must be by means of a statutory declaration by the Chairman, or Secretary, or Treasurer of the institution on behalf of which it is made, and must be accompanied by a statement of the receipts and payments of the purpose.

# SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF AUGUST, 1927.

The outstanding meteorological feature of August was the frequency with which cyclones passed over or in close proximity to the Dominion, while well-defined high-pressure systems were conspicuous by their absence. From the 10th to the close of the month there was practically a succession of these cyclones, but, with the exception of one which ruled between the 18th and 21st, they were of a shallow type, accompanied by much rain but little wind. On the 18th and 19th, while the centre of the intense disturbance mentioned was passing over the North Island, particu-larly stormy conditions and heavy rain were experienced in the North Island and on the East Coast of the South. Except in the Gisborne and Napier districts in the North Island, and the western, central, and southernmost portions of the South, both the aggregate month's rainfall and number of wet days were above the average. The general character of the month may be described as dull and moist with an absence of strong winds. Although frosts were frequent, there were few damaging ones, and conditions generally were favourable to a fair growth of grass, and cattle and sheep in consequence have thrived.
