*Declaring that Land in Buller Coalfield Reserve shall be administered by the State Forest Service.*

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by section six of the Forests Amendment Act, 1926, it is provided, *inter alia*, that the Governor-General may, on the joint recommendation of the Commissioner of State Forests and the Minister of Lands, by Proclamation, declare that any lands comprised in the Buller Coalfields Reserve described in the Third Schedule to the Westland and Nelson Coalfields Administration Act, 1877, shall be administered by the State Forest Service as if they were State forests within the meaning of the Forests Act, 1921-22:

And whereas the Commissioner of State Forests and the Minister of Lands have made a joint recommendation that the land described in the Schedule hereto shall be so administered:

Now, therefore, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting on the joint recommendation of the Commissioner of State Forests and the Minister of Lands, do hereby proclaim and declare that the area of land in the Buller Coalfields Reserve described in the Schedule hereto shall, as from the date of the publication of this Proclamation in the *New Zealand Gazette*, be administered by the State Forest Service as if it were a State forest within the meaning of the Forests Act, 1921-22.

SCHEDULE.

NELSON LAND DISTRICT.—NELSON-MARLBOROUGH FOREST-CONSERVATION REGION.—BULLER COALFIELD RESERVE.

ALL that area in Nelson Land District containing 14,000 acres, more or less, situated in Blocks XI, XII, XV, and XVI, Mokihinui Survey District, and Blocks IV, III, VIII, and VII, Ngakawau Survey District. Commencing at a point on the north-eastern boundary of the Westport Harbour Endowment, and bounded towards the west generally by the Mokihinui-Karamea Road, Tobin's Road, and Section 101, Block

XV, Mokihinui Survey District; towards the south generally by the road along the Mokihinui River fronting Section 9, Block XVI, Mokihinui Survey District, Section 8, Block XVI, Mokihinui Survey District, a line across a road to Podges Creek, by Podges Creek to the Mokihinui River, the Mokihinui River, a line across such river and a road to the most easterly point of Section 4 of the same block and district; towards the west again by the before-mentioned Section 4, Section 3, a line across a road, stream, and a road, Sections 2, 6, a line across a road to Coal or Parenga Creek, a line across such a creek and a road, along the creek road to its intersection by a road forming the south-eastern boundary of Section 66, Block XV, Mokihinui Survey District; thence along this last-mentioned road and the eastern boundary of Section 8A of the same block and district to a road along Chasm Creek; thence by the road along Chasm Creek to a point opposite the south-east corner of Section 8, Block III, Ngakawau Survey District, a line across such road, Chasm Creek, and a road; thence by the south-east and south-west boundaries of the last-mentioned Section 8 to the south boundary of Mokihinui Survey District; thence south-westerly by a right line in the direction of Trig. Station A.N., a distance of approximately 120 chains, to the bush-line; thence by the bush-line to the Ngakawau River, by such river, and again by the bush-line to the boundary of the Westport Harbour Endowment; thence north-easterly and north-westerly by such boundary to the point of commencement. Save and except the open lands, public roads, tramways, Timber Privilege No. 5248, and Section 7, Block XVI, Mokihinui Survey District. As the same is more particularly delineated on a plan No. 106/3, deposited in the Head Office of the State Forest Service, in Wellington, and thereon bordered red.

Amending Regulations under the Census and Statistics Act, 1926.

THE RIGHT HONOURABLE J. G. COATES, P.C., PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by the Census and Statistics Act, 1926, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the regulations made on the twenty-seventh day of May, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, and published in the *Gazette* on the tenth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, and doth hereby make the following regulations in lieu thereof.

REGULATIONS.

1. In these regulations,—

“The general manager for New Zealand” shall include the manager, secretary, or clerk, or other responsible authority or person for the time being in charge in the Dominion of the business of an accident-insurance company, and in the event of there being no such general manager for the Dominion, shall include the person or persons in charge for the time being of any branch or branches in the Dominion of an accident-insurance company, and also shall include the agent, attorney, or representative of an accident-insurance company :

“Accident-insurance company” means any person, firm, company, or association (whether incorporated or otherwise) who or which issues or is liable under accident-insurance policies in New Zealand, and includes companies now established in or out of New Zealand, and includes also mutual associations as well as proprietary; but does not include any institution subject to the provisions of the Friendly Societies Act, 1909, and its amendments. Any broker, agent, or other person who, on behalf of any person, firm, company, or association (whether incorporated or otherwise) not carrying on business in New Zealand negotiates any contract for accident-insurance shall, for the purpose of these regulations, himself be deemed to be an accident-insurance company.

2. The general manager for New Zealand of every accident-insurance company shall, upon request, and within such times as are hereinafter set out, furnish to the Statistician particulars in the form of the return set out in the Schedule hereto in accordance with any instructions that may accompany such form or may from time to time be issued by the Statistician.

3. The general manager for New Zealand shall certify the particulars contained in such form of return as correct to the best of his knowledge and belief, and shall transmit such form of return by post or otherwise so as to reach the Statistician not later than the 30th day of June in each year.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the Juries Act, 1908 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting (so far as required) by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the regulation respecting Maori jurors made by Order in Council on the twenty-first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, under the Juries Act, 1880, and enuring under the said Act, and published in the *Gazette* on the twenty-third day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, at page 1491, and the rules as to Maori juries made on the twenty-ninth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, under the Juries Act, 1880, and enuring under the said Act, and published as aforesaid on the thirtieth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, at page 1525, and doth hereby make for the purposes of the said Act the regulations and rules hereinafter set out, and doth hereby declare that such revocation shall take effect and the regulations and rules hereby made shall come into force from the thirty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven.

REGULATIONS AND RULES.

1. THESE regulations and rules may be cited as "The Maori Jury Regulations, 1927."
2. Every list of Maori jurors to be made out pursuant to clause 6 hereof shall contain the names of all Maori men (as defined by section 2 of the said Act) who are—
  - (a) Resident within the limits of the jury district;
  - (b) Reputed to be between the ages of 21 years and 60 years;
  - (c) Of good fame and character; and
  - (d) Not disqualified or exempted under sections 5 and 6 of the said Act.
3. The names of all such persons as aforesaid shall be inserted in the said lists notwithstanding that they may not be qualified pursuant to section 4 of the said Act, but the persons whose names are contained in any such list shall be subject to subsequent qualification pursuant to section 4 of the said Act by certification under clause 14 or clause 15 hereof.
4. The Jury Officer of every jury district shall, before the last day of January in every year, issue and deliver his warrant in the form marked A in the Schedule hereto (or as near thereto as may be) to some constable within such jury district, together with a sufficient number of the form of return marked B in the Schedule hereto, and the form of notice marked C in the Schedule hereto together also with forms of translation thereof in the Maori language.
5. If for any reason the constable to whom any such warrant is addressed is unable or fails to comply therewith the Jury Officer may from time to time issue and deliver a further warrant to some other constable.
6. Every constable to whom any such warrant is addressed shall forthwith after the receipt of such warrant prepare and



make out, in alphabetical order of first names or of surnames, as the Jury Officer may direct, or (failing such direction) as the constable shall, in accordance with local custom, deem the more convenient, a true list of all Maori men as required by clause 2 hereof, with the true place of abode of each, and the calling, description, or other particulars likely to serve for purposes of identification of each, in the proper columns of the said form of return.

7. Every such constable having made out such list shall, on the first and second Sundays in March in every year, fix a notice in the form marked C in the Schedule hereto (together with a translation thereof in the Maori language) upon or near the principal outer door of every Magistrate's Courthouse and some church or place of worship, meeting-house, hall, or place regularly frequented by Maori people situate in each locality which is the place of residence of any person whose name appears on such list within the jury district.

8. If such constable shall find that there is no person resident within the limits of the jury district whose name is to be inserted in such list as hereby required he shall make his return accordingly, and it shall not be necessary in that case to affix the notice required by clause 7 hereof.

9. The validity of any jury list shall not be affected by failure to comply with any of the requirements of clause 7 hereof.

10. Sections 17 to 30 (both inclusive) of the said Act shall apply, *mutatis mutandis*, to the revising, keeping, and transmitting to the Sheriffs of jury lists for Maori cases.

11. When any notice has been given of a claim to be tried by a Maori jury under section 144 or section 146 of the said Act, or of a mixed jury under section 148 of the said Act, the Registrar or proper officer of the Court in which the trial is to be heard shall issue a precept under his hand to the Sheriff of the Sheriff's district within which such trial is to be heard, commanding such Sheriff to summon a sufficient number of Maori jurors to attend and serve at such trial.

12. Such precept shall be in the form contained in the Sixth Schedule to the said Act, or to the like effect, and shall command the Sheriff to summon not less than thirty-six Maori men (if so many be resident within the jury district) when the trial is to be heard under section 144 or section 146 of the said Act, and not less than twelve Maori men (if so many be resident within the jury district) when the trial is to be heard under section 148 of the said Act.

13. The provisions of the said Act as to boxes for the names of common jurors, and as to jury-books for common jurors, and as to the summoning of jurors, as contained in sections 31 to 34 (both inclusive), sections 39 to 50 (both inclusive), sections 65 to 70 (both inclusive), and sections 95 to 101 (both inclusive), of the said Act, shall apply, *mutatis mutandis*, to Maori jurors and juries.

14. (a) Immediately after the meeting of Justices referred to in section 19 of the said Act the list of Maori jurors, when revised and completed pursuant to section 24 of the said Act, shall, before being delivered to the Sheriff pursuant to section 25 of the said Act, be submitted by the Jury Officer to some Stipendiary Magistrate for the time being exercising within the jury district the jurisdiction of the Magistrate's Court, for the purpose of certifying the capability of the Maoris named therein pursuant to section 4 of the said Act.

(b) The Magistrate shall take such steps as he may think fit to inform himself of the capability of any Maori whose name appears in the said list, and may for that purpose summon before him and examine any police officer or any person having special knowledge of the locality.

(c) The Magistrate shall strike out the name of any person on the said list whose capability he is unable to certify, and shall verify such striking out by appending his initials thereto, and shall thereafter sign a certificate at the end of the said list in the form marked D in the Schedule hereto.

(d) All Maoris whose names are retained on the said list so certified shall be deemed to be Maoris whose capability is certified under these regulations pursuant to section 4 of the said Act.

(e) The Jury Officer shall thereupon deliver or transmit the said list to the Sheriff pursuant to section 25 of the said Act.

15. Any Magistrate may at any time, in addition to the powers hereinbefore conferred, deliver to the Jury Officer a certificate in relation to any Maori, certifying his capability pursuant to section 4 of the said Act for the purpose of qualifying such Maori thereafter to serve as a juror.

*Vesting the Control of Scenic Reserves in the Hundalee Scenic Reserves Board.*

The Commissioner of Crown Lands, Blenheim, *ex officio*,

Robert Lanktree Withers,  
John Gilman Sharp Dunn, and

who are hereby constituted for that purpose a special Board by the name of the Hundalee Scenic Reserves Board (herein referred to as "the Board"), in trust, for the preservation of scenery, and with the powers and subject to the conditions hereinafter contained, that is to say,—

1. The first meeting of the Board shall be held on Wednesday, the seventh day of December, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven, at two o'clock p.m., in the County Council Office, Kaikoura, and thereafter the Board shall meet for the transaction of business on the first Wednesday in each quarter at the time and place aforesaid, or at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board.

2. The Commissioner of Crown Lands shall be the Chairman of the Board. He may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote.

3. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman, provided that two days' notice of such meeting is given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting; and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.

4. Any three members of the Board shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.

5. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at the meeting.

6. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose one of their number to be chairman for such meeting.

7. If, by resignation, death, incapacity, or otherwise, the seat of any member shall be or become vacant, or if any member absents himself, without reasonable cause, from three consecutive meetings of the Board, the Governor-General shall have power to appoint any other person to be a member of the Board in his stead.

8. The Board may, with the approval of the Minister in Charge of Scenery Preservation, make such rules as it deems necessary for the good conduct of the public frequenting the reserves, and may set apart areas for camping-grounds or other purposes, and may fix reasonable charges for the use thereof in accordance with a scale to be approved from time to time by the Minister.

9. The Board shall prepare and submit at an annual meeting to be held in the month of April in each year a report of the proceedings of the Board for the previous year ending on the thirty-first day of March, together with a statement of the receipts and expenditure of the Board for such year. A copy of every such report and statement, certified by the Chairman to be correct, shall be sent to the Minister in Charge of Scenery Preservation as soon as possible after each annual meeting.

10. The Board shall control the said reserves in accordance with the provisions of the said Act and of the regulations made thereunder.

Regulations under the Census and Statistics Act, 1926.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this 28th day of November, 1927.

Present :

THE RIGHT HONOURABLE J. G. COATES, P.C., PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by the Census and Statistics Act, 1926, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations prescribing matters in relation to which statistics shall, with the approval of the Minister, be collected under section nine of the Census and Statistics Act, 1926, and the form in which they are to be furnished, and the persons from whom the particulars are to be required, and doth declare that these regulations shall take effect as from the day on which they are published in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

REGULATIONS.

1. EVERY owner of a motor-vehicle plying for hire, or carrying passengers, mails, or merchandise over defined routes, shall, upon request, and within such time as he may be required by the Statistician so to do, furnish from time to time to the Statistician, or to whomsoever he may appoint, the particulars specified in the form set out in the First Schedule hereto in accordance with the instructions on or accompanying that form, and shall sign the form and transmit it by post or otherwise to the Statistician or to the officer appointed by him.

2. Every owner of a motor-vehicle, other than a motor-vehicle to which the foregoing Regulation No. 1 applies, and which is engaged for commercial purposes in the transport of persons or goods of any description at least ten miles from base or headquarters, shall, upon request, and within such time as he may be required by the Statistician so to do, furnish from time to time to the Statistician, or to whomsoever he may appoint, the particulars specified in the form set out in the Second Schedule hereto in accordance with the instructions on or accompanying that form, and shall sign the form and transmit it by post or otherwise to the Statistician or to the officer appointed by him.

3. In the two preceding regulations—

“Owner” includes the manager, secretary, accountant, or other person for the time being in charge of the office or records of any individual person, partnership, firm, syndicate, company, or other organization engaged in the provision of motor transport, or using a motor-vehicle to which either of the two preceding regulations applies, or any person for the time being in charge of any motor-vehicle so engaged, and includes any Government Department or local authority conducting a motor-transport service by road or otherwise using motor-vehicles in connection with its activities.
