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Proclaiming Native Land to be vested in His Majesty under Section 368 of the Native Land Act, 1909.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by section three hundred and sixty-eight of the Native Land Act, 1909 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), it is provided, *inter alia*, that the Crown may purchase any Native land in pursuance of a resolution of the assembled owners passed and confirmed in accordance with Part XVIII of the said Act, and on the resolution being adopted by the Native Land Purchase Board it shall become a contract of purchase as between the Crown and all persons who are the owners of the land; and the Governor-General may, by Proclamation, at any time after the contract of purchase has been so made, declare that the land so purchased is vested in His Majesty the King, and it shall vest accordingly, and shall become Crown land:

And whereas a resolution was passed by a meeting of assembled owners, and duly confirmed by the Waikato-Maniapoto District Maori Land Board, that the land set out in the Schedule hereto be sold to the Crown:

And whereas the Native Land Purchase Board has adopted such resolution:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon me by section three hundred and sixty-eight of the said Act, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land set out in the Schedule hereto is vested in His Majesty the King.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him by the Sale of Food and Drugs Act, 1908, and of all other powers enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations, amending the regulations made under the said Act on the twenty-third day of June, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-four, and published in the *Gazette* on the twenty-sixth day of the same month, at page 1505 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal regulations"), and doth declare that the regulations hereby made shall come into force on the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight, and shall be read together with and be deemed part of the principal regulations.

- (b) By revoking clause (3) thereof.

WHEREAS it is enacted by Part II of the Fisheries Act, 1908, that the Governor-General in Council may from time to time, by Order in Council gazetted, make regulations to have force and effect throughout New Zealand, except in the districts of Taupo and Rotorua, or only in such waters or places as are specified in the regulations:

"Provided further, that no bait other than natural and artificial fly shall be used for taking fish in the South Wairoa River, the Maungatawhiri River, Hay's Creek (otherwise known as Hunua Gorge Creek), Ararimu Creek, the Ongarue River, and the Waimiha River:

"Provided still further, that no bait other than natural or artificial fly, or natural or artificial minnow, or spoon bait shall be used for taking fish in the Waipa River throughout its course and tributaries thereof:

"Provided still further, that no bait other than artificial fly shall be used for taking fish in that portion of the Punui River lying between the junction of the Wairaka and Waipara Rivers.

"The fine for every breach of this regulation shall not be less than £2 or more than £50."

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him as aforesaid, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby prescribe that the rate of interest that may be paid by the Tauhei Drainage Board in respect of the said sum of four thousand nine hundred pounds shall be a rate not exceeding six per centum per annum, and the said Tauhei Drainage Board is hereby authorized to borrow the said sum of four thousand nine hundred pounds accordingly.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the Stock Act, 1908, and of every other power and authority enabling him in this behalf, His

Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations permitting the introduction into New Zealand of swine from Canada ; and doth hereby declare that these regulations shall be read together with, and form part of, the regulations made by Order in Council dated the fourth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, and published in the *Gazette* on the seventh day of the same month (hereinafter referred to as "the principal regulations"), and shall come into force on the date of publication in the *Gazette*.

REGULATIONS.

1. SUBJECT to the provisions of the principal regulations and to the following conditions the introduction into New Zealand of swine from the Dominion of Canada is permitted.

2. Every person desiring to introduce swine as aforesaid must first obtain a permit to do so from the Minister of Agriculture.

3. Every application for such permit shall be made in sufficient time to allow of inquiry being made in Canada before such permit is given, and shall give full particulars of the number, breed, and sex of the swine intended to be introduced, of the proposed date (approximate) of shipment, and of the name and address of the occupier of the farm, and the locality of the farm itself, from which they are intended to be obtained.

4. (1) Every shipment of such swine must be accompanied by a statutory declaration in the form No. 1 in the Schedule hereto, made by the shipper of such swine, setting forth the breed, number, sex, and brands or marks (if any) of such swine, and declaring that all such swine have been in Canada from birth ; that they are at the time of shipment, and have been during the preceding six months, free from all infectious and contagious diseases ; and that they have not during the six months immediately preceding shipment been in direct contact with any stock infected with any such disease.

(2) On every such declaration there shall be inscribed a certificate in the form of No. 2 in the Schedule hereto, signed by a veterinarian practising in the district in which such swine have been domiciled for the six months immediately preceding the date of their shipment to New Zealand, or from which they start for the port of shipment, certifying that he has, within the fourteen days immediately preceding the date of shipment to New Zealand, examined such swine and has found them free from infectious and contagious diseases.

5. The declaration and the certificate provided for in the last preceding regulation must be delivered to the veterinarian appointed to examine at the port of shipment swine intended for introduction into the Dominion.

6. Upon arrival in New Zealand the swine shall undergo at a quarantine ground a period of forty days' quarantine, and the fees therefor for transport and sustenance shall be the same as is provided for swine in the principal regulations.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section forty-three of the Reserves and other Lands Disposal and Public Bodies Empowering Act, 1925, it is provided that the Governor-General may, by Order in Council, vest the lands described in the Schedule hereto in the Wairau River Board for river-protection purposes and for afforestation purposes, subject to such terms and conditions as may be prescribed or imposed in such Order, and subject also to the payment by the Wairau River Board of such price (if any) as may be agreed upon between the Minister of Lands and the said Board:

And whereas the Minister of Lands has determined that no price should be paid in respect of the said vesting:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the said section forty-three, doth hereby declare that from and after the day of the date hereof the lands described in the Schedule hereto shall become vested in the Wairau River Board for river-protection purposes and for afforestation purposes, subject to the special conditions hereinafter contained, that is to say—

1. The Wairau River Board shall, within six months of the date hereof or within such extended period as the Commissioner of State Forests shall decide, prepare a general forest working plan of future operations. Such working plan shall fully specify the silvicultural operations proposed to be carried on during a specified period, and other such matters as the Director of Forestry thinks fit.
2. It shall not be lawful to carry on such silvicultural operations until such plan has been approved by the Commissioner of State Forests, and all such operations shall be carried out according to such plan as approved by the said Commissioner and under the supervision of the Director of Forestry.
3. Any officer of the State Forest Service shall have free access to the said land at all times for the purpose of inspecting planting or other forestal operations, or for the purpose of reporting upon proposed forest activities, but no charge shall be made unless the inspection is carried out at the request of the said Board.
4. The said Board shall, as soon as practicable after the date hereof, appoint some fit person to supervise and manage all tree-planting operations which may be undertaken by the said Board, and generally to advise the said Board on all matters pertaining to its forestry operations.
5. The said Board may dispose of, by private sale, tender, or auction, any timber, trees, tree-seeds, firewood, or other forest produce on or from the said land.
6. In April of each year the said Board shall furnish to the Commissioner of State Forests a report for the year ending on the preceding thirty-first day of March, presenting in complete detail full particulars of the technical operations, and shall at the same time submit a plan of operations for the ensuing year which shall be effective on approval by the Commissioner of State Forests.

- (d) Common prostitutes, and persons who habitually consort with thieves or persons who have no lawful visible means of support.
- (e) Professional tipsters, persons convicted of house-breaking, pocket-picking, forgery, uttering, or possessing counterfeit coin, theft, false pretences, receiving stolen goods, mischief, assault, or any offence or crime of any kind under the Crimes Act, 1908, and also idle and disorderly persons, rogues and vagabonds, and incorrigible rogues convicted under the Police Offences Act, 1908, and persons convicted of an offence under the Gaming Act, 1908.

Provided always that the Stipendiary Stewards' Committee appointed by the New Zealand Racing Conference, upon being satisfied by evidence as to character and otherwise that any person who, by reason of any conviction, comes within the scope of this regulation, should have relief from the effect thereof, may grant exemption to any such person, and may at any time revoke any such exemption without notice to such person, and without assigning any reason for such revocation.
