The total live births registered for the urban areas amounted to 979, as against 1,173 in November, a decrease of 194. The deaths in December were 564—an increase of 11 as compared with the previous month. Of the total deaths males contributed 289, females 275. Sixty-three of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 11·17 per cent. of the whole number. Forty-six of these were under one year of age.

(c) All persons under disqualification inflicted by any racing or trotting club in the Dominion of New Zealand, the Commonwealth of Australia, or elsewhere if affiliated to the New Zealand Racing Conference, or the New Zealand Trotting Conference, or the New Zealand Trotting Association.

(d) Common prostitutes and persons who habitually consort with thieves or persons who have no lawful visible means of support.

(e) Professional tipsters, persons convicted of house-

(e) Professional tipsters, persons convicted of house-breaking or pocket-picking, forgery, uttering or pos-sessing counterfeit coin, theft, false pretences, re-ceiving stolen goods, mischief, assault, or any offence ceiving stolen goods, mischief, assault, or any offence or crime of any kind under the Crimes Act, 1908, and also idle and disorderly persons, rogues, and vagabonds, and incorrigible rogues convicted under the Police Offences Act, 1908, and persons convicted of an offence under the Gaming Act, 1908.

Provided always that the Stipendiary Stewards' Committee appointed by the New Zealand Racing Conference, upon being satisfied by evidence as to character and otherwise that any person who, by reason of any conviction, comes within the scope of this regulation should have relief from the
