WHEREAS, there being no Harbour Board empowered to grant the license hereinafter mentioned, George Leonard Gregg, of Half-moon Bay, Stewart Island (who with his executors, administrators, and assigns is hereinafter referred to as "the licensee"), has applied to the Governor-General in Council for a license under the Harbours Act, 1923 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), to occupy a part of the foreshore at Half-moon Bay, Stewart Island, as a site for a stacking-stage, to be built in the position and in accordance with plan marked M.D. 6423, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington :

And whereas it has been made to appear to the Governor-General in Council that the work will not be or tend to the injury of navigation, and the said plan has, prior to the making of this Order in Council, been approved by the Governor-General in Council :

And whereas it is desirable that a license should be granted and issued to the licensee under the said Act for the purpose aforesaid, on the terms and conditions hereinafter expressed :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of

the power and authority conferred upon him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said license is required by the licensee as aforesaid; and in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the licensee to use and occupy that part of the foreshore on which the said stacking-stage is to be erected, as shown on plan marked M.D. 6423, deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of maintaining the said stacking-stage thereon, such license to be held and enjoyed by the licensee upon and subject to the terms set forth in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

1. In these conditions the term—

“Foreshore” means such parts of the bed, shore, or banks of a tidal water as are covered and uncovered by the flow and ebb of the tide at ordinary spring tides;

“Low-water mark” means low-water mark at ordinary spring tides;

“Minister” means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to that part of the foreshore occupied by the said stacking-stage, as shown on the plan marked M.D. 6423.

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council the licensee shall pay to the Minister the sum of £2 10s., and thereafter an annual sum of £3 in advance, payable on the 1st day of April in each year, the proportionate part of such rental in respect of the period from the date hereof until the 31st March following to be paid on the licensee being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.

4. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the said stacking-stage, without payment.

5. All persons shall, at all reasonable times, and upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the said stacking-stage, and all rights of ingress and egress thereon or therefrom.

6. The licensee shall maintain the above-mentioned stacking-stage in good order and repair, and shall at all times exhibit therefrom, and maintain at the licensee's own cost, suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels; provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

7. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said stacking-stage shall be taken away by the licensee and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

8. Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said stacking-stage, and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the licensee in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such stacking-stage, requiring the licensee, within a reasonable time to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, the licensee shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

9. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the licensee to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1923, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

10. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue to be in force for fourteen years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the licensee shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege, without the written consent of the Minister first obtained.

11. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, and the licensee may be required to remove the stacking-stage at the licensee's cost, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensee three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by

the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the licensee in New Zealand.

12. The licensee shall be liable for any injury which the said stacking-stage may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on the licensee's part.

13. In case the licensee shall—

- (1) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;
- (2) Cease to use or occupy the said stacking-stage for a period of thirty days;
- (3) Become bankrupt, or be brought under the operation of any law for the time being in force relating to bankruptcy; or
- (4) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause 3 of these conditions,—

then, and in any of the said cases, this Order in Council, and every license, right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any notice to the licensee or other proceeding whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensee, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

14. In the event of this Order in Council being revoked for any reason whatsoever, or upon the expiry of the period for which the license is granted, the licensee shall, if required by the Minister so to do, remove the said stacking-stage entirely from the site, and restore the site to its original condition within three months from the date of revocation or expiry, as the case may be; and, if the licensee fails so to do, the Minister may cause the said stacking-stage to be removed and the site so restored, and may recover the costs incurred by the said removal and restoration from the licensee.

15. The erection of the said stacking-stage shall be sufficient evidence of the acceptance by the licensee of the terms and conditions of this Order in Council.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Public Works Amendment Act, 1911, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth—subject to the conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto, and to the regulations made under section two of the aforesaid Act, and dated the eleventh day of July, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the twelfth day of the same month, or any regulations hereafter made in amendment thereof or in substitution therefor (and hereinafter collectively referred to as “the regulations”), and which regulations shall be deemed to be incorporated herein—hereby authorize the Union Steam Ship Company of New Zealand, Ltd. (hereinafter referred to as “the licensee”), to erect and maintain electric lines for lighting, power, and heating purposes along the routes described in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

1. ROUTES OF ELECTRIC LINES.

LINES commencing at the licensee's generating-station situated near the Port Chalmers Marine Repair Works, and proceeding thence generally to and along about and across the said Repair Works and the Otago Dock, the Port Chalmers Dock, the Union Steam Ship Company's Wharf, and the George Street Wharf.

As the said lines are more particularly delineated on the plan marked P.W.D. 69479, deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works, at Wellington, in the Wellington Land District, and thereon coloured green and yellow.

2. SYSTEM OF SUPPLY.

The system of supply shall be as described in paragraph (c) of clause 5 of the regulations.

The generating and transmission voltage shall be approximately 110 volts direct current between terminals.

3. DURATION OF LICENSE.

This license shall, unless sooner determined in accordance with the provisions hereinafter expressed, continue in force for a period of ten years from the date hereof. Upon the expiry of the said term, or upon the sooner determination of this license by revocation or otherwise, all rights hereby granted to the licensee shall thereupon cease and determine; but such expiration or determination shall not relieve the licensee of any liability theretofore incurred under this license.

4. EXTENSIONS AND TEMPORARY LINES.

Notwithstanding anything contained in the regulations incorporated herein, no extensions or lines other than those along the routes hereinafter described shall be deemed to be authorized by this license: Provided that, along the routes shown by dotted green lines on the said plan, 100-volt lines may be erected and dismantled from time to time as required, provided that in such erection and dismantling the relative requirements of the regulations (other than the obtaining of any consents) are complied with.

5. TELEGRAPH AND RAILWAY DEPARTMENTS' LINES.

The licensee shall rectify to the satisfaction of the Minister of Telegraphs or Minister of Railways any interference or disturbance caused by the erection or operation of the licensee's system that affects the satisfactory working of the telegraph-lines which are the property of the Telegraph Department or the Railway Department, and which were erected prior to the licensee's lines.

6. REQUIREMENTS OF PORT CHALMERS BOROUGH COUNCIL.

Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, the licensee shall not be entitled to erect, maintain, or use any electric lines within the Borough of Port Chalmers, except subject to such conditions, not inconsistent with the provisions of this license, and the regulations relating thereto, or any variation of this license, or the regulations or new regulations which may take the place of these regulations, as may from time to time be agreed upon between the licensee and the Port Chalmers Borough Council.

7. CLEARANCES OVER DOCKS.

The overhead clearances required under Regulation 131 shall be to the satisfaction of the Marine Department.

8. LINES ON GEORGE STREET WHARF.

The erection and dismantling of lines on the above wharf shall be subject to the conditions of Regulation 194.

Regulations under the Stock Act, 1908, governing the Importation of Cattle from the United States of America.— Notice No. Ag. 2710.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the Stock Act, 1908, and of every other power and authority enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations permitting the introduction into New Zealand of cattle from the United States of America; and doth hereby declare that these regulations shall be read together with, and form part of, the regulations made by Order in Council dated the fourth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, and published in the Gazette on the seventh day of the same month (hereinafter referred to as "the principal regulations"), and shall come into force on the date of publication in the Gazette.

REGULATIONS.

1. SUBJECT to the provisions of the principal regulations and to the following conditions, cattle may be introduced into New Zealand from the United States of America.

2. Every person desiring to introduce cattle as aforesaid must first obtain a permit to do so from the Minister of Agriculture.

3. Such cattle on arrival in New Zealand shall undergo quarantine at a quarantine ground for sixty days, and after liberation from the quarantine ground shall be subject to quarantine surveillance for such time as the Director may direct.

4. Every shipment of cattle must be accompanied by a statutory declaration in the form No. 1 of the Schedule hereto, made by the shipper of such cattle, setting forth the kind, number, sex, and brands or marks of such cattle, and declaring that all such cattle have been bred or domiciled throughout in a State where Texas fever does not exist, and never has existed; that they are at the time of shipment, and have been during the preceding six months, free from all infectious and contagious diseases; that they have not during the six months immediately preceding shipment been in direct or indirect contact with any stock infected with any such disease, and that the regulations of the United States Department of Agriculture (Bureau of Animal Industry) governing the inter-State movement of animals have been duly complied with.

5. On every such declaration there shall be inscribed a certificate, in the form No. 2 of the Schedule hereto, signed by a Veterinary Officer of the Bureau of Animal Industry, certifying that he has, within the fourteen days immediately preceding the date of shipment to New Zealand, examined and tested with the tuberculin test such cattle, and has found them free from infectious and contagious diseases. Particulars with respect to such test showing dosages and temperature records, shall be supplied with such certificate.

The total live births registered for the urban areas amounted to 1,128 as against 979 in December, an increase of 149. The deaths in January were 504—a decrease of 60 as compared with the previous month. Of the total deaths males contributed 270, females 234. Peel Forest Park.

BY-LAWS.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in it by the Peel Forest Act, 1926, the Peel Forest Board doth hereby make the following by-laws for the purposes of the said Act:—

Interpretation.—In the construction of the by-laws the words and expressions following shall have the meanings assigned to them respectively, that is to say,—

"The Park" means the Peel Forest Park constituted under the Peel Forest Act, 1926:

"Board" means the Peel Forest Board as constituted by section 5 of the said Act:

"Chairman" means the Chairman, as defined by section 9 of the said Act:

"Ranger" means a Ranger appointed under section 3 of the said Act:

"Stock" includes any horse, donkey, mule, goat, pig, or cattle beast.

1. The park shall be open to the public throughout the year without charge for admission thereto, except as hereafter provided.

2. No person shall light or cause to be lighted any fire within the limits of the park without the consent of the Board first had and obtained, except at and in such fire-places as shall from time to time be constructed by the Board and appointed by it for that purpose.

3. No person shall, without the written authority of the Chairman, acting on a decision of the Board, place in the ground, sow, or plant any seed or plant in the park, whether such seed or plant be native in New Zealand or not; nor shall birds, insects, or other animals be liberated therein except under like authority.

4. No person shall bring into, or permit or suffer any dog (unless led) to follow him within the park, and any dog found within the park (unless led) may be destroyed by any person authorized by the Board, and no person shall bring in to the park any other animal of any kind whatsoever except as hereinafter provided.

5. No person shall take, carry, or use firearms or any fireworks or explosive, or any weapon or instrument of a dangerous nature, or bows and arrows, or catapult, or shanghai, within the limits of the park, except with the permission of the Board.

6. No meeting or assemblage of persons of any kind for picnics, sports, or games shall be held within the limits of the park without the permission of the Chairman in writing first had and obtained, and any such meeting shall be held only at such place therein as shall be specified and appointed by the Board for such purposes or any of them.

7. Children under twelve will be allowed in the park only if accompanied by some responsible person.

8. All persons wishing to camp in the park shall apply to the office of the Ranger for assignment to camping-sites, and shall pay such fees or charges as may from time to time be fixed by the Board, and shall not change camp-sites without permission from the Ranger. The following conditions must be strictly observed in connection with camp-sites:—

(a) Combustible rubbish must be burned on camp-fires and all other garbage and refuse of all kinds shall be placed in garbage-cans, or, if cans are not available, placed in pits provided at the edge of the camp. At new or unfrequented camps garbage must be burned or carried to a place hidden from sight.

(b) No person, whether camping in the park or otherwise therein, shall, except at places which may be indicated by the Ranger or other officer of the Board, wash clothing or cooking-utensils, or bathe, or pollute in any other manner the waters of the park, nor shall he bathe in any of the streams near the regularly travelled thoroughfares in the park without suitable bathing-clothes.

(c) No person shall tie or tether stock in such a way that they may be able to enter any of the streams of the park. All animals shall be kept at sufficient distance from camping-grounds so as not to litter the ground and render the area unfit for use as tent-sites.

(d) No person shall take any dogs or cats into the park without permission of the Ranger.

(e) No person shall take any wood for fuel except from dead trees or from trees which have been cut for the purpose by the Board's employees.

9. No person shall bring into or drive or operate any vehicle of any description whatsoever or bring into or ride any horse, pony, or donkey in the park without the permission first had and obtained of the Board or some person authorized by it.

10. No person shall leave bottles, glass, paper, or other litter on any place within the limits of the park.

11. No person shall sell or offer for sale any article of merchandise or carry on any trade within the limits of the park except with the permission of the Board in writing first had and obtained.

12. Live-stock of any kind found improperly within the limits of the park will be impounded and held until the usual driving fees and impounding charges and other expenses have been paid. Nothing in this by-law shall be deemed to limit or prevent the taking of any proceedings for the recovery of any penalty or otherwise in respect of the trespass of such stock.

13. Any person of bad repute may be excluded or removed from the park, and any person who renders himself obnoxious by bad behaviour or disorderly conduct in the park may be summarily removed therefrom by the Ranger or other officer of the Board.
