Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the Board in New Zealand. 15. The Board shall be liable for any injury which may be

caused at the said wharves to any vessel or boat through any default or neglect on the part of the Board. 16. In case the Board shall—

Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them; or
 Cease to use or occupy the said wharves for a period

of thirty consecutive days ;

then, and in either of the said cases, this Order in Council then, and in entrer of the said cases, this officiant contact and every license, right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any notice to the Board or other proceedings whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the Board and to all persons concerned or interested, that to the Board, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the licenses, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

17. In the event of this Order in Council being revoked for any reason whatsoever, or upon the expiry of the period for which the license is granted, the Board shall, if required by the Minister so to do, remove the said wharves or wharf entirely from the sites or site and restore the sites or site to

their or its original condition within three months from the date of the revocation or expiry, as the case may be; and if the Board fails so to do, the Minister may cause the said wharf or wharves to be removed and the sites or site so restored, and may recover the costs incurred by the said removal and restoration from the Board.

Authorizing the Laying-off of a Road of less Width than 66 ft.

NOTE.—An unsettled, cloudy, and showery month, with precipitation about 15 per cent. above the normal at Thorndon. Total bright sunshine, 201 hours 53 minutes (43 per cent. of the possible), and two sunless days. Hail fell on the 16th. Mean earth temperature at 1 ft. was  $60.6^{\circ}$ , and at 3 ft.  $59.6^{\circ}$ . Mean dew-point,  $50^{\circ}$ ; mean vapour pressure, 0.361 in.; and mean relative humidity, 76 per cent.

#### SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF DECEMBER, 1927.

As has been remarked in the notes for previous months, a prominent characteristic of the present season has been the frequency with which cyclones have controlled the weather in New Zealand, and, during December, these conditions were to a large extent maintained. With the exception of a rather intense depression which crossed the Dominion on the 6th the vectorly type of pressure distribution was considered 6th, the westerly type of pressure distribution was conspicuous by its absence. The depression mentioned caused strong northerly winds and was accompanied by heavy rain in Westland.

land. Between the 12th and 19th a remarkable succession of cyclones moved down from a northerly direction off the east coast of the Dominion, their centres passing just eastward of the Chatham Islands. The precise origin of these storms is unknown, but they maintained low pressures, cold, strong southerly winds, and dull, wet weather in New Zealand, especially over districts with an easterly aspect. Whereas our pressure variations are generally controlled mainly by systems moving from the west, during this very unusual spell conditions over Australia and the Tasman Sea made little impression on the situation which had developed to the east of the Dominion. Some snow fell in the high country in the centre of the North Island, and some heavy rains were recorded on the east coast of the North Island. In Westland, though the weather was cold, no rain fell. Following this though the weather was cold, no rain fell. Following this period there was a complete reversal of weather type, and, the barometer rising persistently, anticyclonic conditions were maintained until the 28th. Fine and warm weather were maintained until the 28th. Fine and warm weather was, in consequence, experienced over the Christmas holidays. During the night of the 28th and on the 29th fairly general rains were experienced. These were associated with a cyclone which had moved slowly across the Tasman Sea, the centre crossing the South Island on the 29th. The total rainfall for the month exceeded the normal in the coast districts of the North Island from Fact Game

the east coast districts of the North Island from East Cape southwards, and at scattered places on the east coast of the

South Island only. Elsewhere it was below normal, the deficiency being considerable in all the western districts. The weather during the month was unusually changeable, with wide variations of temperature. It was not until the latter end that summer conditions became established. Tem. peratures were, on the average, considerably below normal, and garden growth was again checked. Shearing operations in the North Island were delayed somewhat by the cold, wet weather. There was, however, ample feed for stock, and the season continues to be, on the whole, a good one.

3. No licensee shall allow any dog to accompany either himself or any attendant he may have with him.
4. Nothing herein contained shall extend to authorizing any person to sell any deer or portion thereof.

5. Regulations as to the use of marks of identification of deer-heads contained in section 6 of the regulations under the Animals Protection and Game Act, 1921-22, published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the 7th February, 1924, page 437, shall be strictly adhered to by each licensee, who, in addition thereto, shall return all unused "tags" to the Secretary of the Westland Acclimatization Society, Hokitika, immediately he has finished stalking for the season for which such "tags" have been issued, together with a statement of the number of deer shot.

6. Nothing in any license to take or kill red-deer stags and hinds shall authorize the holder thereof to take or kill red-deer stags or hinds on lands actually and exclusively used by any registered acclimatization society for acclimatization purposes, or on any sanctuary or public domain, or on any land, ex-cepted from the operation of the notification declaring an open season for the district. 7. Any person committing a breach of any of these con-ditions is liable, on conviction, to a fine of £80.

#### A PROCLAMATION.

DETERMINING NEW DESIGNS FOR CERTAIN SILVER COINS OF THE REALM.

GEORGE R.I.

WHEREAS under section eleven of the Coinage Act, 1870, We have power, with the advice of Our Privy Council, from time to time by proclamation to determine the design for any coin :

And whereas it appears to Us desirable to determine new designs for the silver coins hereinafter specified, being certain of the silver coins mentioned in the First Schedule to the Coinage Act, 1870:

We, therefore, in pursuance of the said enactment and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, proclaim, direct, and ordain as follows :-

1. The designs for the said silver coins shall be as follows :-

the reverse the Ensighs Armonal of the United Kingdom contained in a shield having on each side the initial letter of Our Name in duplicate and interlaced surmounted by the Royal Crown with the inscription "FID. DEF. IND. IMP" together with the words "HALF-CROWN" and the date of the year interspersed with the national emblems of the rose, thistle, and shamrock. The Coin shall have a graving upon the adve a graining upon the edge.

(3) Florin-Every florin shall have the same obverse impression and inscription as the crown and for the reverse the initial letter of Our Name in the centre interlaced by the initial letter of our Name in the centre interfaced by four crowned Sceptres in the form of a cross; in the angles the Ensigns Armorial of the United Kingdom contained in four shields, with the inscription "FID. DEF. IND. IMP" together with the words "ONE FLORIN" and the date of the year. The Coin shall have a graining upon the adre the edge.

(4) Shilling—Every shilling shall have the same obverse impression and inscription as the crown and for the reverse

Our Royal Crest with the inscription "FID. DEF. IND. IMP" together with the words "ONE SHILLING" and the date of the year. The Coin shall have a graining upon the edge.

(5) Sixpence—Every sixpence shall have the same obverse impression as the crown with the inscription "GEORGIVS V D.G. BRITT: OMN: REX F.D. IND: IMP:" and for the reverse six acorns growing from interlaced oak branches with the words "SIX PENCE" and the date of the year. The Coin shall have a graining upon the edge.

(6) Threepence-Every threepence, not being a coin of (6) Threepence—Every threepence, not being a coin of the King's Maundy monies, shall have the same obverse impression as the crown, with the inscription "GEORGIVS V D.G. BRITT: OMN: REX F.D. IND: IMP" and for the reverse three acoms growing from interlaced oak twigs, with the words "THREE PENCE" and the date of the year. The Coin shall have a plain edge.

2. The King's Maundy Monies-Every Maundy silver 2. The King's Maundy Monies—Every Maundy silver fourpence, threepence, twopence and penny shall have for the obverse impression Our aforesaid Effigy, with the in-scription "GEORGIVS V D.G. BRITT: OMN: REX F.D. IND: IMP:" and for the reverse the respective figures "4," "3," "2," "1," (according to the denomination or value of the piece) in the centre, with the date of the year placed across the figure, and encircled with an oak wreath surmounted by the Royal Crown. These Coins shall have a blain edge. a plain edge.

3. This Proclamation shall come into force and have effect as from the first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven.
