A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the Scenery Preservation Board, constituted pursuant to the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), has recommended that the land described in the Schedule hereto should be permanently reserved for scenic purposes, and it is expedient to give effect to such recommendation:

Now, therefore, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto shall be a scenic reserve under the said Act, and subject to the provisions thereof.

THE RIGHT HONOURABLE J. G. COATES, P.C., PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS the Kuku Drainage Board, being of the opinion that certain lands situated in the County of Horowhenua and not included in the Kuku Drainage District (hereinafter referred to as "the said district") are deriving benefit from the drainage-works carried out by the said Board, did, in accordance with the provisions of section six of the Land Drainage Amendment Act, 1913 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), present a petition to His Excellency the Governor-General praying that the boundaries of the said district might be altered so as to include such lands in the said district :

And whereas in respect thereof a Commission has been appointed to inquire and report as to the several matters mentioned in subsection three of section six of the said Act :

And whereas the Commission so appointed has reported that part of such lands should be included in the said district :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by section six of the said Act, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby order and declare that as on and from the date hereof the boundaries of the said district are hereby altered so as to include in the said district the lands described in the First Schedule hereto, and that the boundaries of the said district shall be those described in the Second Schedule hereto.

The Council shall maintain and keep the above-mentioned wharf and shed, and all erections on or in connection with the wharf and shed, in good order and repair; and shall at all times exhibit therefrom, and maintain at the Council's own cost, suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels: Provided that no new light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved by the Minister.

6. All dues and rates received on account of the said wharf and shed by the Council shall be applied to keeping the said wharf and shed and all erections on or in connection with such wharf and shed in good order and repair.

7. Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said wharf and shed or any buildings erected on the wharf or in connection therewith, and view the state of repair thereof; and upon the Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the Council in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf and shed or buildings, requiring the Council, within a reasonable time to be therein prescribed,

to make good or repair the same, the Council shall, with all convenient speed, cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

8. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharf shall be taken away by the Council and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

9. The Council shall not erect, or suffer to be erected, on the said wharf and shed any building or structure whatever, except with the consent of the Minister.

10. The Council shall keep a separate account of the receipts and expenditure on account of such wharf and shed and premises, and shall cause such account to be balanced to the 31st day of March in every year, and shall send a copy of such account when balanced to the Minister, and shall supply any particulars in reference thereto as may be required by the Minister.

11. The Council shall appoint all officers necessary for the working and management of the said wharf and shed.

12. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the Council to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulations of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1923, or its amendments, or any regulation thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

13. The rights, powers, and privileges hereby conferred shall continue in force for fourteen years, computed from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the Council shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

14. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred under or by virtue of this Order in Council may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the Council three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the Council in New Zealand.

15. The Council shall be liable for any injury which may be caused at the said wharf and shed to any vessel or boat through any default or neglect on the part of the Council.

16. In case the Council shall—

(1) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions herein before set forth, or any of them; or

(2) Cease to use or occupy the said wharf and shed for a period of thirty consecutive days;

then, and in either of the said cases, this Order in Council and every license, right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any notice to the Council or other proceedings whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the Council and to all persons concerned or interested that this Order in Council, and the licenses, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred have been revoked and determined.

17. In the event of this Order in Council being revoked for any reason whatsoever, or upon the expiry of the period for which the license is granted, the Council shall, if required by the Minister so to do, remove the said wharf and shed entirely from the site and restore the site to its original condition within three months from the date of the revocation or expiry, as the case may be; and if the Council fails so to do, the Minister may cause the said wharf and shed to be removed and the site so restored, and may recover the costs incurred by the said removal and restoration from the Council.

Authorizing the Laying-off of a Road of less Width than 66 ft.

WHEREAS in the opinion of the Minister of Lands it is inexpedient, by reason of the fact that the land shown upon the plan of Town of Mt. Pleasant Extension No. 17, affecting part of Rural Section 4, in Block XVI, Christchurch Survey District, is intended to be used wholly for residential purposes, that the road shown therein should be of the width of 66 ft.

Now, therefore, I, Alexander Donald McLeod, Minister of Lands, do hereby, in pursuance of the power conferred upon me by section 17, subsection (1), of the Land Act, 1924, and of every other power me thereunto enabling, authorize the laying-off of such road of a width of 30 ft.: Provided always that it shall not be lawful for any person to erect or cause to be erected any building at a less distance than 33 ft. from the middle of such road.

NOTE.—An unsettled, cloudy, and showery month, with precipitation about 15 per cent. above the normal at Thorndon. Total bright sunshine, 201 hours 53 minutes (43 per cent. of the possible), and two sunless days. Hail fell on the 16th. Mean earth temperature at 1 ft. was 60.6°, and at 3 ft. 59.6°. Mean dew-point, 50°; mean vapour pressure, 0.361 in.; and mean relative humidity, 76 per cent.

SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF DECEMBER, 1927.

As has been remarked in the notes for previous months, a prominent characteristic of the present season has been the frequency with which cyclones have controlled the weather in New Zealand, and, during December, these conditions were to a large extent maintained. With the exception of a rather intense depression which crossed the Dominion on the 6th, the westerly type of pressure distribution was conspicuous by its absence. The depression mentioned caused strong northerly winds and was accompanied by heavy rain in Westland.

Between the 12th and 19th a remarkable succession of cyclones moved down from a northerly direction off the east coast of the Dominion, their centres passing just eastward of the Chatham Islands. The precise origin of these storms is unknown, but they maintained low pressures, cold, strong southerly winds, and dull, wet weather in New Zealand, especially over districts with an easterly aspect. Whereas our pressure variations are generally controlled mainly by systems moving from the west, during this very unusual spell conditions over Australia and the Tasman Sea made little impression on the situation which had developed to the east of the Dominion. Some snow fell in the high country in the centre of the North Island, and some heavy rains were recorded on the east coast of the North Island. In Westland, though the weather was cold, no rain fell. Following this period there was a complete reversal of weather type, and, the barometer rising persistently, anticyclonic conditions were maintained until the 28th. Fine and warm weather was, in consequence, experienced over the Christmas holidays. During the night of the 28th and on the 29th fairly general rains were experienced. These were associated with a cyclone which had moved slowly across the Tasman Sea, the centre crossing the South Island on the 29th.

The total rainfall for the month exceeded the normal in the east coast districts of the North Island from East Cape southwards, and at scattered places on the east coast of the

South Island only. Elsewhere it was below normal, the deficiency being considerable in all the western districts.

The weather during the month was unusually changeable, with wide variations of temperature. It was not until the latter end that summer conditions became established. Temperatures were, on the average, considerably below normal, and garden growth was again checked. Shearing operations in the North Island were delayed somewhat by the cold, wet weather. There was, however, ample feed for stock, and the season continues to be, on the whole, a good one.

*Open Season for Deer-shooting, Westland Acclimatization
District (Okuru Block), South Westland.*

IN exercise of the powers vested in me by the Animals Protection and Game Act, 1921-22, I, Francis Joseph Rolleston, Acting Minister of Internal Affairs of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby declare the period from the 1st day of March, 1928, to the 30th day of April, 1928 (both days inclusive), to be an open season in that part of the Westland Acclimatization District described in the First Schedule hereto, for the taking or killing of the following imported game—viz., red-deer stags and hinds—subject to the following conditions.

CONDITIONS.

1. LICENSES to take or kill red-deer stags and hinds may be issued by the Postmaster at Hokitika on the recommendation of the Secretary of the Westland Acclimatization Society at Hokitika, on payment of a license fee of £5, in the form prescribed in the Second Schedule hereto, and subject to the said Act and regulations thereunder and this notification. The number of such licenses to be issued by the said Postmaster shall not exceed two: Provided that not more than one such license shall be issued to the same person, and also that stalkers shall shoot only on the blocks specified in their respective licenses, and if the number of applications received for licenses exceed the number of available licenses, then the persons to whom such licenses are to be issued shall be decided by ballot.

2. No licensee shall take or kill more than four stags. A licensee may also, pursuant to a license issued under this notification, take or kill an unlimited number of old hinds and stags with deformed heads. Ball cartridge only to be used. Provided that no metal-patched or metal-cased bullet shall be used for killing such deer.

3. No licensee shall allow any dog to accompany either himself or any attendant he may have with him.

4. Nothing herein contained shall extend to authorizing any person to sell any deer or portion thereof.

5. Regulations as to the use of marks of identification of deer-heads contained in section 6 of the regulations under the Animals Protection and Game Act, 1921-22, published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the 7th February, 1924, page 437, shall be strictly adhered to by each licensee, who, in addition thereto, shall return all unused "tags" to the Secretary of the Westland Acclimatization Society, Hokitika, immediately he has finished stalking for the season for which such "tags" have been issued, together with a statement of the number of deer shot.

6. Nothing in any license to take or kill red-deer stags and hinds shall authorize the holder thereof to take or kill red-deer stags or hinds on lands actually and exclusively used by any registered acclimatization society for acclimatization purposes, or on any sanctuary or public domain, or on any land excepted from the operation of the notification declaring an open season for the district.

7. Any person committing a breach of any of these conditions is liable, on conviction, to a fine of £20.

A PROCLAMATION.

DETERMINING NEW DESIGNS FOR CERTAIN SILVER
COINS OF THE REALM.

GEORGE R.I.

WHEREAS under section eleven of the Coinage Act, 1870, We have power, with the advice of Our Privy Council, from time to time by proclamation to determine the design for any coin:

And whereas it appears to Us desirable to determine new designs for the silver coins hereinafter specified, being certain of the silver coins mentioned in the First Schedule to the Coinage Act, 1870:

We, therefore, in pursuance of the said enactment and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, proclaim, direct, and ordain as follows:—

1. The designs for the said silver coins shall be as follows:—

(1) *Crown*—Every Crown shall have for the obverse impression Our Effigy with the inscription "GEORGIUS V DEI GRA: BRITT: OMN: REX" and for the reverse the Royal Crown with the date of the year encircled by a wreath composed of the national emblems of the rose, thistle, and shamrock, with the inscription "FID. DEF. IND. IMP" together with the word "CROWN." The Coin shall have a graining upon the edge.

(2) *Half-Crown*—Every half-crown shall have the same obverse impression and inscription as the crown, and for the reverse the Ensigns Armorial of the United Kingdom contained in a shield having on each side the initial letter of Our Name in duplicate and interlaced surmounted by the Royal Crown with the inscription "FID. DEF. IND. IMP" together with the words "HALF-CROWN" and the date of the year interspersed with the national emblems of the rose, thistle, and shamrock. The Coin shall have a graining upon the edge.

(3) *Florin*—Every florin shall have the same obverse impression and inscription as the crown and for the reverse the initial letter of Our Name in the centre interlaced by four crowned Sceptres in the form of a cross; in the angles the Ensigns Armorial of the United Kingdom contained in four shields, with the inscription "FID. DEF. IND. IMP" together with the words "ONE FLORIN" and the date of the year. The Coin shall have a graining upon the edge.

(4) *Shilling*—Every shilling shall have the same obverse impression and inscription as the crown and for the reverse

Our Royal Crest with the inscription "FID. DEF. IND. IMP" together with the words "ONE SHILLING" and the date of the year. The Coin shall have a graining upon the edge.

(5) *Sixpence*—Every sixpence shall have the same obverse impression as the crown with the inscription "GEORGIUS V D.G. BRITT: OMN: REX F.D. IND: IMP:" and for the reverse six acorns growing from interlaced oak branches with the words "SIX PENCE" and the date of the year. The Coin shall have a graining upon the edge.

(6) *Threepence*—Every threepence, not being a coin of the King's Maundy monies, shall have the same obverse impression as the crown, with the inscription "GEORGIUS V D.G. BRITT: OMN: REX F.D. IND: IMP" and for the reverse three acorns growing from interlaced oak twigs, with the words "THREE PENCE" and the date of the year. The Coin shall have a plain edge.

2. The King's Maundy Monies—Every Maundy silver fourpence, threepence, twopence and penny shall have for the obverse impression Our aforesaid Effigy, with the inscription "GEORGIUS V D.G. BRITT: OMN: REX F.D. IND: IMP:" and for the reverse the respective figures "4," "3," "2," "1," (according to the denomination or value of the piece) in the centre, with the date of the year placed across the figure, and encircled with an oak wreath surmounted by the Royal Crown. These Coins shall have a plain edge.

3. This Proclamation shall come into force and have effect as from the first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace, this third day of November, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven, and in the Eighteenth year of Our Reign.
