WHEREAS by section three of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), it is provided that, notwithstanding anything to the contrary in any Act, it shall not be lawful or competent for any local authority to borrow or contract to borrow any money (otherwise than in anticipation of its revenue within the limits of its powers, if any, in that behalf), whether from the State Advances Office or from any other source whatever, and whether in pursuance of a special Act or under any authority whatever, without the precedent consent of the Governor-General in Council given after compliance with the provisions of the said Act:

And whereas section eleven of the said Act provides that the Governor-General in Council, in giving his consent to the borrowing of moneys by the local authority, may impose such conditions with respect to the time at which such moneys may be borrowed, the rate of interest that may be paid in respect thereto, the term for which they may be borrowed, and provisions for repayment thereof as he thinks fit, and that it shall not be lawful for the local authority to borrow such moneys save in accordance with the conditions so imposed:

Open Season for Imported Game and Native Game, License Fees, &c., Otago Acclimatization District

IN exercise of the powers vested in me by the Animals Protection and Game Act, 1921-22, 1, Robert Alexander Wright, Acting Minister of Internal Affairs of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby declare the period from the 1st day of May to the 30th day of June, 1928 (both days inclusive), to be an open season in the Otago Acclimatization District, as described in the First Schedule hereto, except in the areas referred to in condition No. 3 and in the Second Schedule hereto, for the taking or killing of the following imported game and native game—viz., mallard duck, Canadian goose, grey duck, spoonbill duck (or widgeon), pukeko, and black swan; and the period from the 1st day of June to the 31st day of July, 1928 (both days inclusive), to be an open season in the said district for the taking or killing of the following imported game—viz., Californian quail; and the period from the 2nd day of January to the 12th day of February, 1929 (both days inclusive), to be an open season for the taking or killing of the following native game—viz., godwits; subject to the following conditions.

CONDITIONS.

1. LICENSES to take or kill such imported game and native game, including godwits, within the said district will be

issued to any person on payment of the sum of twenty shillings (20s.) each, and licenses to take or kill such native game only, including godwits, will be issued to any person on payment of the sum of ten shillings (10s.) each; and the Secretary of the Otago Acclimatization Society, or any person authorized by such Secretary in that behalf, is hereby authorized to sign and issue the said licenses.

2. The number of such imported game and native game that may be taken or killed by any one person in any one day shall not exceed twenty-five head in all of mallard duck, Canadian goose, Californian quail, grey duck, spoonbill duck (or widgeon), black swan, and pukeko; provided that not more than twelve head per day of pukeko or twenty head per day of Californian quail shall be taken by any one person; provided further that Californian quail shall not be taken or killed in the following districts, viz.: Waikaia, Heriot, Hindon, Maungatua, Waiholo, Waipori, Salisbury, Puke-rangi, and Puerua, nor may more than two head of Canadian goose be taken by any one person during the open season.

3. Nothing in any license to take or kill imported game and native game, including godwits (or native game only, including godwits), shall authorize the holder thereof to take or kill imported game and native game (or native game only) on lands actually and exclusively used by any registered acclimatization society for acclimatization purposes, or on any sanctuary or public domain, or any land mentioned in the Second Schedule hereto.

4. No person shall kill or destroy any such imported game or native game, or shoot at or attempt to shoot at any such imported game or native game, with any automatic or auto-loading gun, unless it is converted into a gun capable of carrying two cartridge only, or with any rifle or pea-rifle, swivel-gun, punt-gun, or pump-gun, or shall use any gun other than a shoulder-gun; and no gun shall be used for the purpose aforesaid the bore of which is larger than the size known as No. 12 at the muzzle, nor shall any gun be used which exceeds 10 lb. in weight.

5. A license issued pursuant to this notification to take or kill imported and native game or native game only shall entitle the holder thereof to take or kill native game in the Southland Acclimatization District, during the period and subject, *mutatis mutandis*, to the conditions prescribed in the notification fixing an open season for native game in that district.

6. Shooting may begin not earlier than one hour before sunrise and must cease not later than one hour after sunset.

7. No live birds of any species shall be used as decoys, nor shall more than twenty-five artificial decoys be used at any one time (whether by one or several persons) on any particular water within an area of less than 100 yards square.

8. No person shall use any power boat or launch in connection with the taking or killing of imported or native game.

9. Any person committing a breach of any of these conditions is liable, on conviction, to a fine of £20.

Register of Engineers.

Office of the Minister of Public Works, Wellington, 31st March, 1928.

IN pursuance of section 13 of the Engineers Registration Act, 1924, a certified copy of the names, qualifications, and addresses entered in the Register of Engineers is published for general information.

Under the heading of qualification is shown the particular clause of section 6 of the Act under which the applicant has been registered.

Section 6 of the Act is as follows:—

“6. (1.) Every person shall, on payment of the prescribed fee, be entitled to be registered under this Act as an engineer who—

“(a.) Holds some recognized certificate as hereinafter defined, and who satisfies the Board that he has had not less than three years' practical experience in engineering; or

“(b.) Has attained the age of twenty-five years, and has been engaged during a period of not less than six years before the commencement of this Act in the acquisition of professional knowledge or in the practice of engineering in a manner satisfactory to the Board, and who makes application for registration within twelve months after the commencement of this Act; or

“(c.) Passes or has passed an examination or examinations approved by the Board, and who satisfies the Board that he has had not less than three years' practical experience in engineering.

“(2.) For the purposes of this section the term 'recognized certificate' means a certificate, diploma, degree, or license granted by some university, college, or other public institution (whether in New Zealand or elsewhere), and which is recognized by the Board as furnishing sufficient evidence of the possession of the requisite knowledge and skill for the efficient practice of the profession of engineering.”

NOTE.—At the beginning of the month observations were commenced at the Kelburn Observatory for which no normal values are available. The month was an exceptionally dry and sunny one. At Karori Reservoir, half a mile distant to the S.S.W., with a similar exposure to that at Kelburn, the rainfall was 94 per cent. below normal. Total bright sunshine, 312-5 hours (68 per cent. of the possible), and one sunless day. Mean dew-point at 9 a.m., 52-8°; and mean vapour pressure, 0-398 in. The mean pressure for the month was the highest ever recorded in January at Wellington, and 0-281 in. above the normal of 29-903 in.

SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF JANUARY, 1928.

The past month has been notable for the exceptionally dry conditions experienced over the whole of the Dominion. The deficiency of rainfall is most serious in districts with a westerly aspect, following as it does on a dry December.

No vigorous low-pressure disturbance affected any part of the New Zealand region during the course of the month. On several occasions storms developed in Australia which would normally have brought general rains to this country. In each instance, however, although some slight effect was felt, the pressure changes were reduced to shallow waves by the time the disturbance crossed the Dominion. The most important of these waves passed on the 1st to 2nd and the 26th January, respectively. Each produced moderate rains in parts of the west coast districts, with scattered showers elsewhere.

The dominant feature of the pressure distribution has been the persistence of high pressure, especially in the North. Anti-cyclones were actually centred over or near New Zealand on 1st-2nd, 4th-6th, 8th-12th, 14th-23rd, and 29th-31st, respectively. The dry, warm, sunny, and droughty weather experienced was the direct consequence of these anticyclonic conditions. The mean pressure was the highest recorded for January at Wellington.

On the whole there has been a relative absence of wind, but between the 16th and the 19th, while a rather intense anti-cyclone lay across the South Island, strong easterly winds blew over the North Island, frequently reaching gale force in the far North and causing showery weather in the Auckland Peninsula.

The month has been the driest January on record in southern Auckland, Taranaki, and parts of the Manawatu, Nelson, and Marlborough districts.

At the end of the month, owing to the previous plentiful growth of feed, the effects of the drought has not, in general, been severely felt. In large parts of the North Island, however, especially in the central and western portions, milk returns had fallen off considerably. Elsewhere, although pastures were becoming parched, compensations were provided in the satisfactory maturing of grain and fruit crops, and the season has been a good one. Should rain not fall by the middle of February, however, many districts will suffer severely.

REGULATIONS.

(Under the Gaming Act, 1908.)

In pursuance and exercise of the powers in that behalf contained in section 33 of the Gaming Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities it enabling in that behalf, the Taranaki Hunt Club, a racing club within the meaning of the said Act (hereinafter referred to as "the said club"), doth hereby make

the following regulations controlling the admission of persons to that part of the racecourse situated in the district of Taranaki and known as the Taranaki Jockey Club's Racecourse, while the said racecourse is used or occupied by the said club for race meetings.

- (c) All persons under disqualification inflicted by any racing or trotting club in the Dominion of New Zealand, the Commonwealth of Australia, or elsewhere if affiliated to the New Zealand Racing Conference, or the New Zealand Trotting Conference, or the New Zealand Trotting Association.
- (d) Common prostitutes and persons who habitually consort with thieves or persons who have no lawful visible means of support.
- (e) Professional tipsters, persons convicted of house-breaking or pocket-picking, forgery, uttering or possessing counterfeit coin, theft, false pretences, receiving stolen goods, mischief, assault, or any offence or crime of any kind under the Crimes Act, 1908, and also idle and disorderly persons, rogues, and vagabonds, and incorrigible rogues convicted under the Police Offences Act, 1908, and persons convicted of an offence under the Gaming Act, 1908.

Provided always that the Stipendiary Stewards' Committee appointed by the New Zealand Racing Conference, upon being satisfied by evidence as to character and otherwise that any person who, by reason of any conviction, comes within the scope of this regulation should have relief from the effect thereof, may grant exemption to any such person, and may at any time revoke any such exemption without notice to such person, and without assigning any reason for such revocation.
