Now, therefore, in pursuance of sections 32 and 35 of the Shops and Offices Act, 1921–22, and in pursuance of section 15 of the Shops and Offices Amendment Act, 1927, I, for and on behalf of the Minister of Labour, do hereby direct that on and after the 20th day of May, 1928, all the chemists' shops within the Combined District of Christchurch, care and execut the exempted shop shell be closed accordsave and except the exempted shop, shall be closed accordingly.
