WHEREAS by section fourteen of the Native Land Amendment Act, 1914, it is provided, *inter alia*, that on being satisfied that the purchase of any Native Land has been duly completed by or on behalf of the Crown under the authority of the Native Land Act, 1909, the Governor-General may issue a Proclamation that such land has become Crown land:

And whereas the purchase of the Native land set out in the Schedule hereto has been duly completed by or on behalf of the Crown, under the authority of the Native Land Act, 1909, and its amendments:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority so conferred upon me by section fourteen of the Native Land Amendment Act, 1914, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim that the Native land set out in the Schedule hereto has become Crown land.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the Local Legislation Act, 1927, and of all other powers enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby authorize and empower the New Plymouth High School Board to have the use and control of the buildings, equipment, plant, and other chattels specified in the First Schedule hereto, on the terms and conditions set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, and with the like advice and consent, doth prescribe that this Order shall come into force on the date of publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

THE whole of the main Technical School building fronting Lizardet Street, and all subsidiary buildings, including engineering workshops, latrines, and storerooms, with all equipment used or available for use therein for the conduct of technical school classes at the 31st day of December, 1927; with the exception of the manual woodwork-room and its contents; and also (by way of inclusion and not of exception) the grounds surrounding and connecting the specified buildings.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

1. THE New Plymouth High School Board shall have the sole right to the use of the buildings, equipment, plant, and chattels specified in the First Schedule hereto, and shall at all times have free access to such buildings, and free use for the purposes of a technical school of the grounds surrounding and connecting the specified buildings: Provided that the Education Board of the District of Taranaki shall have the right of free access at all times for motor or other traffic to its storeroom, garages, and other buildings through the grounds between the main technical school building and the engineering workshop building.

2. THE Education Board of the District of Taranaki shall not place on any part of the grounds on the western side or within 20 ft. on the eastern side of the vertical plane nearest to the Education Office which passes through corners of the main Technical School and the Engineering Workshop buildings without intersecting either building, any fence, obstruction, or erection, temporary or permanent, without the consent previously obtained of the New Plymouth High School Board.

3. THE New Plymouth High School Board shall not place any fence, obstruction, or erection, temporary or permanent, on any part of the grounds surrounding the buildings of which it has the sole use without the consent previously obtained of the Education Board of the District of Taranaki.

4. THE New Plymouth High School Board shall be responsible for the proper maintenance, lighting, heating, cleaning, and caretaking of the buildings and equipment, plant, and chattels of which it has the sole use in all respects as if it held the freehold of such buildings, and shall also maintain in good order and condition that part of the grounds of which it has the free use for the purposes of a technical school as aforesaid.

5. THE New Plymouth High School Board shall pay all rates, water, lighting, and other charges which may become due in respect of the land and buildings described in the First Schedule hereof.

6. (1) The New Plymouth High School Board shall, if requested by the Education Board of the District of Taranaki, provide for such classes in manual training for pupils in primary schools and for such teachers' classes as may be required by the Education Board and approved by the Minister of Education.

(2) The total cost of such classes shall be borne by the Education Board in so far as it is not directly provided by the Education Department.

7. In case of any dispute or question arising upon any matter, whether under this Order in Council or otherwise, affecting the use of the buildings, equipment, plant, and chattels, and grounds specified in the First Schedule hereto, by the New Plymouth High School Board, or the fulfilment of or compliance with any term or condition set out in this Schedule, the decision of the Minister of Education shall be final.

Licensing Henry George Rose to use and occupy a Part of the Foreshore at Horeke, Waihou River, as a Site for a Shed.

WHEREAS, there being no Harbour Board empowered to grant the license hereinafter mentioned, Henry George Rose, of Horeke (who with his executors, administrators, and assigns, is hereinafter referred to as "the licensee") has applied to the Governor-General in Council for a license under the Harbours Act, 1923 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), to occupy a part of the foreshore below low-water mark at Horeke, on the Waihou River, in Hokianga Harbour, as a site for a shed, and, in accordance with the one-hundred-and-seventy-first section of the said Act, has deposited plans in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington (marked M.D. 6321), showing the place where it is intended to construct such shed, the area of foreshore and land below low-water mark intended to be occupied for such purpose, and the manner in which it is proposed to erect the said shed on the site marked number 3 of the said plans:

And whereas it has been made to appear to the Governor-General in Council that the proposed work will not be or tend to the injury of navigation, and the said plans have, prior to the making of this Order in Council, been approved by the Governor-General in Council:

And whereas it is expedient that a license under the said Act, for the purpose aforesaid, should be granted and issued to the licensee on the terms and conditions hereinafter expressed:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said license is required by the licensee as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the licensee to use and occupy that part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark which is particularly shown and delineated as site number 3 on sheet number 1 on the plans so deposited as aforesaid, for the purposes of maintaining thereon a shed constructed in accordance with the said plan, such license to be held and enjoyed by the licensee upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

1. IN these conditions the term—

"Foreshore" means such parts of the bed, shore, or banks of a tidal water as are covered and uncovered by the flow and ebb of the tide at ordinary spring tides:

"Low-water mark" means the low-water mark at ordinary spring tides:

"Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to that part of the

foreshore and land below low-water mark necessary for the erection of the shed as shown as site No. 3 of the plans M.D. 6321 (sheet No. 1).

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council the licensee shall pay to the Minister the sum of £2 10s., and thereafter an annual sum of £5 in advance, payable on the 1st day of April in each year, the proportionate part of such annual rental in respect of the period from the date hereof until the 31st day of March following to be paid on the licensee being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.

4. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, over, and out of the said shed without payment.

5. The licensee shall maintain the above-mentioned shed in good order and repair, and shall at all times exhibit therefrom, and maintain at the licensee's own cost, any lights that may be required by the Minister; provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

6. Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said shed and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the licensee in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such shed, requiring the licensee, within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, the licensee shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

7. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the licensee to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1923, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

8. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the licensee shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

9. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, and the licensee may be required to remove the shed at the licensee's own cost, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensee three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the licensee in New Zealand:

10. The licensee shall be liable for any injury which may be sustained by any vessel or boat in passing the shed, or by contact therewith, and which may be occasioned by any default or neglect on the licensee's part.

11. In case the licensee shall—

- (1) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;
- (2) Cease to use or occupy the said shed for a period of thirty days;
- (3) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause 3 of these conditions; or
- (4) Become bankrupt or be brought under the operation of any law for the time being in force relating to bankruptcy,—

then and in any of the said cases this Order in Council and every right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any notice to the licensee or other proceedings whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensee and to all persons concerned or interested that this Order in Council, and the rights and privileges thereby conferred, have been revoked and determined.

12. In the event of this Order in Council being revoked for any reason whatsoever, or upon the expiry of the period for which the license is granted, the licensee shall, if required by the Minister so to do, remove the said shed entirely from the site and restore the site to its original condition within three months from the date of revocation or expiry, as the case may be; and, if the licensee fails so to do, the Minister may cause the said shed to be removed and the site so restored, and may recover the costs incurred by the said removal and restoration from the licensee.

13. The erection of the shed shall be deemed to be an acceptance by the licensee of the conditions of this Order in Council.

“Returning Officer” means the Secretary of the Board or such other person as the Board may direct.

APPOINTMENT AND ELECTION OF MEMBERS.

2. The member appointed by the Education Board of the District of Taranaki shall be appointed by a resolution of the Education Board, and the name of the member so appointed shall forthwith be notified to the Board, by writing under the hand of the Secretary of the Education Board.

3. The member appointed by the New Plymouth Borough Council shall be appointed by resolution of the Council, and the name of the member so appointed shall forthwith be notified to the Board, by writing under the hand of any two Councillors or the Town Clerk of the Council.

4. The member appointed by the Taranaki County Council shall be appointed by resolution of the Council, and the name of the member so appointed shall forthwith be notified to the Board, by writing under the hand of any two Councillors or the Chairman and Clerk of the Council.

5. The Board shall, by writing under the hand of its Secretary, notify the Minister of the name of every member appointed pursuant to any of the foregoing regulations.

ELECTION OF MEMBERS BY PARENTS.

6. The members to be elected by parents of pupils shall be elected in the manner set out as follows, namely :—

(1) Every such election shall be held on a date to be fixed by the Board in accordance with clause 16 of these regulations.

(2) The Secretary of the Board, or such other person as the Board may direct, shall be the Returning Officer.

(3) For the purposes of each election the Returning Officer shall prepare a roll, and shall enter therein the name and address of every person qualified to be enrolled as a parent of a pupil. The roll shall be closed at 5 o'clock on the fourteenth day next before the day on which any election is to be held, and shall continue to be closed until the election is completed.

(4) The Returning Officer shall, by advertisement in a newspaper circulating in the district, publicly notify not less than twenty-one days before each election—

(a) The day and hour for the closing of nominations :

(b) The total number of candidates to be elected;

(c) The day and hour for the closing of the poll.

(5) Every candidate shall be nominated in writing by one or more parents entitled to vote for his election. Each such parent may nominate any number of candidates not exceeding the number to be elected.

(6) Every nomination-paper shall be in the form or to the effect following :—

I, [Name and address], being a parent duly entered on the roll, do hereby nominate [Name and address] as a candidate for election to the New Plymouth High School Board at the election to be held on the day of 19 . . . , 19 . . .

Dated this day of . . . , 19 . . .

[Signature of nominator.]

Candidate's consent (to be subscribed at the foot of nomination-paper) :

I hereby consent to my nomination.

[Signature of candidate nominated.]

(7) If the nomination-paper does not bear the written consent of the candidate nominated, such consent may be given by him to the Returning Officer before the nominations are closed, and every nomination-paper shall be void in so far as concerns any candidate whose written consent is not duly given as aforesaid.

(8) Nominations shall close at noon on the fourteenth day before the day of the election.

(9) If the number of nominations received does not exceed the number of vacancies to be filled, the Returning Officer shall forthwith declare the candidate or candidates so nominated to be duly elected.

If the number of nominations is less than the number of vacancies, the Board shall, at its next meeting, select duly qualified persons to complete the number required.

In all other cases the Returning Officer shall, as soon as the nominations are closed, prepare and post to each elector at his address as appearing on the roll a printed voting-paper containing in alphabetical order of surnames a list of all the duly nominated candidates for whom such parent is entitled to vote ; and such voting-paper shall be in the form or to the effect following :—

VOTING-PAPER FOR USE AT ELECTION TO BE HELD ON THE DAY OF . . . , 19 . . . , OF MEMBER OF THE NEW PLYMOUTH HIGH SCHOOL BOARD.

CANDIDATES.

[Set out in alphabetical order of surnames the full name of every duly nominated candidate.]

DIRECTIONS.

The number of candidates to be elected is

[Specify the number.]

The voter must draw a line through the name of every candidate for whom he does not intend to vote.

The number of candidates whose names are left uncanceled must not exceed . . .

The voting-paper must be posted or delivered to the Returning Officer in a closed envelope bearing on the outside the word “Voting-paper,” and on the inside of the flap of the envelope the signature of the voter. If posted to the Returning Officer it must be posted on or before the day of election, and, if delivered to him, must be delivered at his office, . . . Street, . . . , before the day of election, or not later than 5 o'clock in the afternoon of that day.

(10) When posting the voting-papers to the several voters the Returning Officer shall enclose with each voting-paper an addressed envelope for the return of the voting-paper, with a place marked on the inside of the flap for the signature of the voter.

(11) The poll shall close at 5 o'clock on the afternoon of the day of election ; but all voting-papers shall be included and counted which are not informal and are received by the Returning Officer in due course of post before the close of the seventh day after the day of the election.

(12) A voting-paper shall be informal in any of the following cases, that is to say,—

(a) If the elector votes more than once at the same election ;

(b) If the candidates whose names are left uncanceled exceed in number the total number of candidates for whom the person is entitled to vote ;

(c) If in any other way the paper fails to indicate clearly for whom the vote is intended to be given ; or

(d) If, being delivered to the Returning Officer, the sealed envelope containing the voting-paper is not delivered at his office before the close of the poll; or

(e) If, having been forwarded by post, the sealed envelope containing the voting-paper is not received at the office of the Returning Officer before the close of the seventh day after the day of election, or if, from the post-mark on the envelope or otherwise, the Returning Officer is satisfied that it was not posted until after the day of the election:

(f) If it does not bear the official mark and there is reasonable cause to believe that it was not issued to the voter by the Returning Officer:

(g) If the voter fails to sign his name on the inside of the flap of the envelope.

(13) On the eighth day after the day of election the Returning Officer shall open and examine all voting-papers duly delivered to him or received by him through the post as aforesaid, and, after rejecting all informal voting-papers, shall ascertain the candidates (not exceeding the total number to be elected) who have received the greatest number of votes, and shall declare such candidates to be elected.

(14) If, by reason of an equality of votes given for two or more candidates, the election is not complete, the Returning Officer shall decide by lot, in the presence of two members of the Board, which candidate or candidates shall be elected, and thereby complete the election.

(15) (a) Each candidate may, by writing under his hand, appoint one scrutineer, who may be present at the examination of the voting-papers and the counting of the votes by the Returning Officer.

(b) The Returning Officer shall, immediately after counting the votes, seal up all voting-papers, and transmit the whole to the Clerk of the nearest Magistrate's Court, who shall keep the same for six months thereafter, and shall not open or permit to be opened such packet except on the order of some Court of competent jurisdiction, and shall at the end of six months effectually destroy the same.

(16) (a) Forthwith after the completion of the election the Returning Officer shall, by notice exhibited on the outside of the office of the Board, notify the names of the persons elected, the number of valid votes recorded for each candidate, and the total number of votes rejected as informal, and shall notify to the Board and to the Minister the names of the persons elected.

(b) The Returning Officer and every scrutineer shall be required faithfully and impartially to perform the duties of their offices, and shall not directly or indirectly make known the state of the poll or give or pretend to give any information by which the state of the poll may be known before the final declaration thereof by the Returning Officer, or make known for which candidate any voter has voted, or communicate to any person any information likely to defeat the secrecy of the ballot.

(17) If a candidate informs the Returning Officer in writing, not later than three clear days before the polling-day, that he retires from the election, the Returning Officer shall give public notice thereof; and if by such retirement the number of candidates is reduced to the number of vacancies to be filled, the Returning Officer shall publicly declare the remaining candidates to be duly elected; but if the said number of candidates is not so reduced the poll shall proceed, but the person so retiring shall not be capable of being elected.

ELECTION OF REPRESENTATIVES OF EMPLOYERS AND EMPLOYEES.

7. (1) The Board shall, by and through its Secretary, register associations of employers in local industries, and associations of employees in local industries.

(2) The registers of such associations shall severally be closed at noon on the fourteenth day before the day of the election.

8. (1) The member to be elected by registered associations of employers in local industries shall be elected by an electing committee appointed when required.

(2) Registered associations of employers shall each be entitled to appoint one member of the electing committee for employers.

(3) The names and addresses of persons appointed as members of such electing committee shall be forwarded by the registered associations concerned to the Returning Officer before noon on the fourteenth day before the day of the election.

(4) Such electing committee shall meet on the day fixed for the election, and shall elect, on behalf of the associations of employers, one member in such manner as it shall deem fit, provided that no member of the electing committee shall exercise more than one vote, excepting the Chairman, who shall exercise a casting-vote in addition to his ordinary vote, in any case where such a vote is necessary to determine the election.

(5) The meeting of the electing committee shall be convened by the Returning Officer who shall act as secretary to the committee in person or by deputy.

(6) The name of the member so elected shall be notified forthwith to the Minister and to the Board by writing under the hand of the Returning Officer.

9. The provisions of Regulation 8 hereof shall apply, *mutatis mutandis*, to the election of a member by associations of employees in local industries.

10. If any dispute or question arises touching the regularity of any election, such dispute or question shall be determined by the Minister, whose decision shall be final.

11. The members of the Board appointed or elected in accordance with these regulations shall retire on the 31st May in the year 1930, and on the 31st May in each second year thereafter.

12. Retiring members shall be eligible for reappointment or re-election either by the same or another appointing or electing body.

13. The first appointments shall be made and the first election shall be held under these regulations in the month of May, 1928, and the members appointed or elected shall come into office on the 1st day of June, 1928.

14. It shall be the duty of the Board to notify the Minister, the Education Board, the New Plymouth Borough Council, the Taranaki County Council, registered associations of employers in local industries, and registered associations of employees in local industries, by writing under the hand of the Secretary of the Board in the month of March in each year in which members of the Board retire, of the forthcoming vacancies on the Board to be filled respectively by the Governor-General or the other appointing or electing authorities concerned.

15. Whenever a casual vacancy occurs it shall be the duty of the Board forthwith to report the fact to the Minister if the vacancy is to be filled by the Governor-General, or to the Secretary of the Education Board if the vacancy is to be filled by the Board, or to the Town Clerk in the case of a member to be appointed by the New Plymouth Borough Council, or to the County Clerk in the case of a member to be appointed by the Taranaki County Council.

16. (1) The appointment or election of members to fill vacancies caused by the expiry of the ordinary term of office shall be made in the month of May at the end whereof such expiry takes place, but shall not take effect until such expiry.

(2) The appointment or election of a member to fill a casual vacancy shall be made not later than fifty days after the vacancy occurs.

17. It shall not be necessary that the member appointed by any of the appointing or electing bodies shall himself be a member of such body, nor that a member elected by parents shall himself be the parent of a pupil.

18. If any appointment of a member is not made within the time hereinbefore prescribed, or if at any election the number of candidates nominated or duly elected is less than the number of vacancies to be filled, the Secretary shall give notice thereof to the Minister, and the vacancy for which no candidate has been appointed, nominated, or elected (as the case may be) may be filled by appointment by the Minister, or the Minister may direct that the body charged with the duty of appointing a member may proceed to make such appointment, or that the Board proceed to another election for the election of such member or members as the case may be.

19. Where anything connected with the appointment or election of members is omitted to be done, or cannot be done at or by the time hereby prescribed, or is done after such time, or is otherwise irregularly done in matter of form the Minister may at any time before or after the time at or by which such thing is required to be done extend the time for doing such thing to such further time as he thinks fit, or may validate anything so done after the time required or so irregularly done in matter of form as he thinks fit.

20. No act or proceeding of the Board, or of any committee of the Board, or of any person acting as a member of the Board, shall be invalid in consequence of there being a vacancy in the membership of the Board at the time of such act or proceeding, or by reason of there being a defect in the appointment or election of any person so acting, or by reason of his being incapable of being appointed or elected.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 11 of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1909, I, Kenneth Stuart Williams, Minister of Public Works, do hereby order and declare that the regulations, scale of fares, rates, and charges for passengers and goods, and the conditions on which passengers and goods will be carried on the Tahawai to Opotiki Section of the East Coast Main Trunk Railway prior to its being opened for traffic under the Government Railways Act, 1908, shall be as set forth in the Schedule hereto, such regulations, scale, and conditions to come into force on the 24th day of May, 1928, from which date all previous regulations, scale of fares, rates, charges, and conditions for the carriage of passengers and goods fixed or imposed in respect of the said railway or any portion thereof are declared to be hereby revoked, saving and excepting the berthage charges for the use of the Mount Maunganui Railway-wharf issued by Order in Council dated the 10th day of April, 1922, and published in *New Zealand Gazette* No. 29, dated the 13th of April, 1922.

WHEREAS a requisition in writing, signed by a majority of the occupiers of all the chemists' shops within the Combined District of Wellington, comprising the City of Wellington and the Town District of Johnsonville, has been forwarded to the Minister of Labour, desiring that all such shops within the said combined district, save and except the shop (hereinafter referred to as "the exempted shop") established at 59 Cambridge Terrace, within the City of Wellington, for the purpose only of the sale of medicines and surgical appliances that are urgently required, be closed on Sundays, pursuant to section 15 of the Shops and Offices Amendment Act, 1927; and, further, that subsection (4) of section 35 of the Shops and Offices Act, 1921-22, shall not apply to any chemist's shop which is within two miles and a half of the exempted shop while medicines and surgical appliances are obtainable from the exempted shop:

And whereas the Minister of Labour is satisfied that the signatures to such requisition represent a majority of the occupiers of all the said shops within the said combined district, and that all the occupiers of the said shops within the said combined district affected by section 35 (1) of the said Act have been afforded an equal right to share at a reasonable cost in the profits of the business carried on by the exempted shop:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of sections 32 and 35 of the Shops and Offices Act, 1921-22, and in pursuance of section 15 of the Shops and Offices Amendment Act, 1927, I, for and on behalf of the Minister of Labour, do hereby direct that on and after the 3rd day of June, 1928, all the chemists' shops within the Combined District of Wellington, save and except the exempted shop, shall be closed accordingly.

Destruction of Deer.

IN exercise of the powers vested in me by the Animals Protection and Game Act, 1921-22 (hereinafter referred to as the said Act), I, Francis Joseph Rolleston, Acting Minister of Internal Affairs of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby notify that the following imported game—viz., red deer and fallow deer—may be taken or killed within any acclimatization district, subject to the following conditions.

CONDITIONS.

1. NOTWITHSTANDING anything contained in the said Act, the Secretary of any acclimatization society, or any person or persons duly authorized in writing by any such Secretary may, during the period hereinafter mentioned, kill within the district of that society red deer and fallow deer of either sex and of any age which, in the opinion of the said Secretary or of the said authorized persons, should be destroyed.

2. Such deer may be destroyed as aforesaid during a period of twelve months from the date hereof.

3. A return shall be furnished to the Minister of Internal Affairs by the Secretary of each acclimatization society, within one calendar month after the expiry of the aforesaid period, and such return shall state the number (if any) and sex of all deer so destroyed as aforesaid, the dates, and names of persons by whom, and the locality in which the deer were destroyed.

4. The head or antlers of any stag, or the venison or skins of any deer, taken or killed pursuant to this Warrant, may be disposed of subject to the regulations made under the said Act by Order in Council dated the 1st day of February, 1924, and gazetted on the 7th day of the same month.

5. Any person who commits a breach of any of the provisions of these regulations is liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

6. For the purposes of these regulations, "acclimatization society" includes, in respect of the Rotorua Acclimatization

District, the Department of Tourist and Health Resorts; and references to the Secretary of an acclimatization society shall be deemed to include the General Manager of that Department.
