A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in the Governor-General by the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1924, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New

Zealand, do hereby abolish the existing registration districts known as the Tokatoka and Paparoa Districts, and do proclaim and declare that the territory heretofore comprised within the said districts is hereby divided anew into three registration districts, the names whereof shall be the Tokatoka, Ruawai, and Paparoa Districts, and the boundaries whereof shall be conterminous with the boundaries of the marriage districts bearing the same names as are set forth in a Proclamation of even date herewith made under the provisions of the Marriage Act, 1908.

And I hereby declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation on the ninth day of July, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight.

A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in the Governor-General by the Marriage Act, 1908, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby abolish the existing marriage districts known as the Tokatoka and Paparoa Districts, and do proclaim and declare that the territory heretofore comprised within the said districts is hereby divided anew into three marriage districts, the names and boundaries whereof shall be as follows:—

TOKATOKA DISTRICT.

All that area in the North Auckland Land District, bounded by a line commencing at a point on the sea-coast in line with the south-eastern boundary of Oturei C Block, as shown on plan 4862 deposited in the office of the District Land Registrar at Auckland; thence to and along that boundary and the south-eastern boundary of Oturei B and A Blocks to the northernmost corner of Section 14, Kopuru Parish; thence to and along the Aratapu Creek to the Wairoa River; thence across that river and northerly along its left bank to a point in line with the north-western boundary of the Arapohue Parish; thence to and along that boundary to the Mangonui River; thence up the middle of that river to a point in line with the south-eastern boundary of the Okahu Parish; thence along the south-eastern boundaries of the Okahu and Whakahara Parishes to the left bank of the Wairoa River; thence down the left bank of that river to the mouth of the Awaroa Stream; thence along a right line to the right bank of the Wairoa River; thence by the right bank of that river and the Kaipara Estuary to the sea-coast and by the sea-coast to the point of commencement.

RUAWAI DISTRICT.

All that area in the North Auckland Land District, bounded by a line commencing at a point on the left bank of the Wairoa River in line with the south-eastern boundary of the Tokatoka District hereinbefore described; thence to and along the south-eastern boundary of the said district to the Mangonui River; thence up the middle of the Mangonui River to the stream (Omaru River) forming the western boundary of Section 245, Matakoho Parish; thence southerly up the middle of that stream to the southernmost corner of Section 156, Omoro Parish; thence along the northern boundary generally of Sections 87, 86, 85, and 84, and the north-western boundaries of Sections 83, 82, 81, 80, and 79A, Matakoho Parish, to a point in line with the south-western boundary of Section 79, Matakoho Parish; thence to and along the south-western and western boundaries of Sections 79, 73, 77, 76, 58, 49, 51, 52, 52A, 53A, 53, and 54, Matakoho Parish, to the south-western corner of the last-mentioned section; thence along the southern boundary of Section 54A, Matakoho Parish, to the stream along its western boundary; thence down the middle of that stream to the left bank of the Wairoa River; thence up the left bank of the Wairoa River to the place of commencement.

PAPAROA DISTRICT.

All that area in the North Auckland Land District, bounded on the west and north-west by the Ruawai Registration District hereinbefore described, from the Wairoa River to the confluence of the Mangonui River and the Omaru Stream;

thence along the south-eastern boundaries of the Tauraroa and Waikiekie Parishes to the south-western boundary of Ruarangi Parish; thence along the western boundaries generally of the Ruarangi, Waipu, and Wairau Parishes to the Te Pahi River; thence along the Te Pahi and Arapaoa Rivers to the Otamatea River; thence along the Otamatea and Wairoa Rivers to the eastern boundary of the Ruawai District, the place of commencement.

And I hereby declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation on the ninth day of July, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight.

Order in Council consenting to the Raising of Loans by certain Local Authorities, and prescribing Terms and Rates of Interest.

CHARLES FERGUSSON, Governor-General.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 2nd day of July, 1928.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section three of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), it is provided that, notwithstanding anything to the contrary in any Act, it shall not be lawful or competent for any local authority to borrow or contract to borrow any money (otherwise than in anticipation of its revenue within the limits of its powers, if any, in that behalf), whether from the State Advances Office or from any other source whatever, and whether in pursuance of a special Act or under any authority whatever, without the precedent consent of the Governor-General in Council given after compliance with the provisions of the said Act :

And whereas section eleven of the said Act provides that the Governor-General in Council, in giving his consent to the borrowing of moneys by the local authority, may impose such conditions with respect to the time at which such moneys may be borrowed, the rate of interest that may be paid in respect thereto, the term for which they may be borrowed, and provisions for repayment thereof as he thinks fit, and that it shall not be lawful for the local authority to borrow such moneys save in accordance with the conditions so imposed :

And whereas the several local authorities mentioned in the Schedule hereto are desirous of raising the respective amounts set out opposite their names therein :

And whereas the said local authorities have complied with the provisions of the said Act, and it is expedient that the aforesaid precedent consent should be given to the raising of the loans on the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth :

And whereas by section one hundred and fourteen of the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1926, it is provided that, notwithstanding anything to the contrary in any Act or in any rule of law, where a local authority or public body has been authorized before the passing of this Act or is thereafter authorized to borrow money, whether pursuant to a poll of rate-payers or otherwise howsoever, whether the rate of interest or the term of years of the loan was or was not specified or determined, and such money or any part thereof has not been borrowed, the local authority or public body may, with the precedent consent of the Minister of Finance, borrow such money, or such amount thereof as has not been borrowed, at such rate of interest or for such term as may be prescribed by the Governor-General by Order in Council :

And whereas the Minister of Finance has in each case given his precedent consent as required by the said section one hundred and fourteen to the borrowing by the said local authorities of the respective loans aforesaid for the terms set out in the Fifth Column of the said Schedule at respective rates of interest being such as shall not produce to the lenders rates exceeding the respective rates specified in the Sixth Column of the said Schedule :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by the said Act, and by section one hundred and fourteen of the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1926, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby consent to the raising by the respective local authorities whose names are set out in the Second Column of the said Schedule of the loans referred to in the Third Column of the said Schedule up to the respective amounts set out in the Fourth Column of the said Schedule, for the respective terms set out in the Fifth Column of the said Schedule, at rates of interest being such as shall not produce to the lenders rates exceeding the respective rates specified in the Sixth Column of the said Schedule, subject to the condition that the respective local authorities shall, before borrowing the said respective sums or any part thereof, make provision for the repayment thereof by establishing a sinking fund under the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1926, and by making to such sinking fund payments at intervals of not more than one year at a rate or rates which shall be not less than the respective rates per centum set out in the Seventh Column of the said Schedule, such payments to be made in respect of every part of the said respective sums for the time being so borrowed and not repaid, and the first payment to be made not later than one year after the first day from which interest to the lender is computed on any moneys so borrowed, and subject to the further condition that in no case shall any portion of interest or sinking fund be paid out of loan-moneys.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by section three of the Main Highways Act, 1922, and of all other powers enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby order and declare that as and from the date of this Order in Council the roads or portions of roads and the streets or portions of streets enumerated in the Schedule hereto shall become main highways within the meaning and for the purposes of the Main Highways Act, 1922.

SCHEDULE.

HIGHWAY DISTRICT No. 1.

Parkhurst Road.

ALL that road or portion of road in the Waitemata County, commencing at its junction with the Auckland-Helensville Main Highway near Helensville Concrete Bridge, and proceeding generally in a north-westerly direction, and terminating at its junction with Springs Road on the south-western boundary of Section 1A, Block XIV, Kaipara Survey District, being a distance of 1 mile 20 chains, more or less. Shown on plan P.W.D. 71487, and thereon coloured red.

Beach Road.

All that road or portion of road in the Waitemata County, commencing at the northern boundary of the Takapuna Borough at Wairau Creek, and proceeding generally in a northerly direction via Murray's Bay, Brown's Bay, and Deep Creek, and terminating at Awaruku Creek, being a distance of 7 miles, more or less. Shown on plan P.W.D. 71487, and thereon coloured red.

Henderson-Kumeu, via Swanson.

All that road or portion of road in the Henderson Town District and the Waitemata County, commencing at its junction with the Auckland-Helensville Main Highway in the Henderson Town District, and proceeding generally in a westerly and northerly direction via Swanson, Waitakere, and Taupaki, and crossing the Main North Railway at the western end of the Kumeu Railway-station, and terminating at its junction with the Auckland-Helensville Main Highway, being a distance of 11 miles, more or less. Shown on plan P.W.D. 71487, and thereon coloured red.

Henderson Valley Road.

All that road or portion of road in the Henderson Town District and the Waitemata County, commencing at its junction with the Auckland-Helensville Main Highway in the Henderson Town District, and proceeding generally in a south-westerly direction, and terminating at a point on the western boundary of Section 7, Block I, Titirangi Survey District, being a distance of 4 miles 20 chains, more or less. Shown on plan P.W.D. 71487, and thereon coloured red.

Kaukapakapa-Port Albert, via Glorit and Tauhoa.

All that road or portion of a road in the Waitemata and Rodney Counties, commencing at its junction with the Helensville-Waiwera Main Highway on the northern boundary of Section 12, Block XI, Kaipara Survey District, near Kaukapakapa, and proceeding generally in a northerly direction via Glorit and Tauhoa, and terminating at its junction with the Port Albert-Wellsford Main Highway at the northernmost corner of Section 169, Block XI, Otamatea Survey District, near Port Albert, being a distance of 29 miles, more or less. Shown on plans P.W.D. 71487 and 71488, and thereon coloured red.

Waikumete - West Coast.

All that road or portion of road in the Glen Eden Town District and the Waitemata County, commencing at its junction with the Auckland-Helensville Main Highway in the Glen Eden Town District, and proceeding generally in a south-westerly direction, and terminating at a point opposite the Nihotupu Post-office, being a distance of 8 miles, more or less. Shown on plan P.W.D. 71487, and thereon coloured red.

Te Hana - Tomorata.

All that road or portion of road in the Rodney County, commencing at its junction with the Wayby-Maungaturoto Main Highway at a point opposite the western boundary of Section 186, Block VIII, Otamatea Survey District, and proceeding generally in a north-easterly direction, and terminating at its junction with the Waiwera-Mangawai Main Highway at a point opposite the north-eastern corner of Section 65, Block IV, Pakiri Survey District, being a distance of 4 miles, more or less. Shown on plan P.W.D. 71488, and thereon coloured red.

Wellsford-Whangaripo.

All that road or portion of road in the Rodney County, commencing at its junction with the Wayby-Maungaturoto Main Highway at a point opposite the Wellsford Post-office, Block XVI, Otamatea Survey District, and proceeding generally in an easterly direction, and terminating at its junction with a road at the western corner of Section 7, Block X, Pakiri Survey District, being a distance of 10 miles, more or less. Shown on plan P.W.D. 71488, and thereon coloured red.

Whakapirau-Maungaturoto Railway-station.

All that road or portion of road in the Otamatea County, commencing at the Whakapirau Wharf, and proceeding generally in a north-easterly direction, and terminating at its junction with the Maungaturoto Railway-station, Waipu Main Highway (at the Maungaturoto Railway-station), being a distance of 7 miles 20 chains, more or less. Shown on plan P.W.D. 71489, and thereon coloured red.

Ruanwai Creamery (Awaroa) - Armstrong's Corner.

All that road or portion of road in the Otamatea County, commencing at its junction with the Dargaville-Maungaturoto Main Highway at the north-western corner of Section 47, Block XVI, Tokatoka Survey District, and proceeding generally in a south-easterly direction, and terminating at its junction with Armstrong's Road at the south-eastern corner of Section 60, Block XVI, Tokatoka Survey District, being a distance of 3 miles 40 chains, more or less. Shown on plan P.W.D. 71489, and thereon coloured red.

Tangowahine Valley Road.

All that road or portion of road in the Hobson County, commencing at the Tangowahine Wharf, and proceeding generally in a northerly direction, and terminating at a point opposite the southern corner of Section 20, Block XIII, Mangakahia Survey District, being a distance of 10 miles, more or less. Shown on plan P.W.D. 72333, and thereon coloured red.

Dargaville-Kuihu, via Awakino and Mamaranui.

All that road or portion of road in the Hobson County, commencing at the north-western boundary of the Dargaville Borough and proceeding generally in a northerly, south-westerly, and north-westerly direction via Awakino Settlement, Mamaranui Railway-station, and then via the Kaihu Valley Road, and terminating at a point opposite the Kaihu School at the junction of the Aranga and Opanake Roads, being a distance of 24 miles 60 chains, more or less. Shown on plan P.W.D. 72333, and thereon coloured red.

Also all that street or portion of street in the Dargaville Borough, commencing at the junction of Normanby Street and Hokianga Road, and proceeding generally in a north-westerly direction via the said Hokianga Road, and terminating at the north-western boundary of the Borough of Dargaville, being a distance of 1 mile 12 chains, more or less. Shown on plan P.W.D. 71163, and thereon coloured red.

Whakapara - Matheson's Bridge.

All that road or portion of road in the Whangarei County, commencing at its junction with the Whangarei-Kawakawa Main Highway at the southern corner of Section 2, Block XII, Hukerenui Survey District, and proceeding generally in a north-easterly direction via the Whakapara - Helena Bay Road, and terminating at Matheson's Bridge near the northern boundary of Section 7, Block VIII, Hukerenui Survey District, being a distance of 6 miles, more or less. Shown on plan P.W.D. 71490, and thereon coloured red.

Whangarei-Whareora.

All that road or portion of road in the Whangarei County, commencing at the eastern boundary of the Borough of Whangarei, and proceeding generally in an easterly direction, and terminating at the Whareora Bridge, being a distance of 5 miles, more or less. Shown on plan P.W.D. 71490, and thereon coloured red.

Whangarei-Kiripaka.

All that road or portion of road in the Whangarei County, commencing at its junction with the Whangarei-Whareora Road near the eastern boundary of the Whangarei Borough, and proceeding generally in a north-easterly direction and terminating at the Kiripaka Bridge over the Ngunguru River, being a distance of 9 miles, more or less. Shown on plan P.W.D. 71490, and thereon coloured red.

Okaihau-Horeke.

All that road or portion of road in the Bay of Islands and Hokianga Counties, commencing at its junction with the Kawakawa-Mangamuka Main Highway at a point opposite the eastern corner of Section 808, Block VI, Omapere Survey District, and proceeding generally in a westerly direction, and terminating at the Horeke Wharf, being a distance of 14 miles, more or less. Shown on plans P.W.D. 71492 and 71494, and thereon coloured red.

Otiria Station Road.

All that road or portion of road in the Bay of Islands County, commencing at its junction with the Kawakawa-Mangamuka Main Highway at a point on the southern boundary of Section 140, Block XV, Kawakawa Survey District, and proceeding generally in a south-westerly direction, and terminating at a point opposite the Otiria Railway station, being a distance of 1 mile, more or less. Shown on plan P.W.D. 71492, and thereon coloured red.

Ngapuhi Station Road.

All that road or portion of road in the Bay of Islands County, commencing at its junction with the Maungatapere-Kaikohe Main Highway, and proceeding generally in a westerly direction, and terminating at a point opposite the Ngapuhi Station, all in Otuhi No. 1, Block III, Punakitere Survey District, being a distance of 1 mile, more or less. Shown on plan P.W.D. 71492, and thereon coloured red.

Fairburn Road.

All that road or portion of road in the Mangonui County, commencing at its junction with the Waipapakauri - Victoria Valley Main Highway at a point opposite the southern boundary of Section BISEA 3, Block VII, Takahue Survey District and proceeding generally in an easterly direction via Fairburn and Taheke, and terminating at its junction with the Victoria Valley - Mangonui Main Highway at the western corner of Section part 7B 1, Block I, Maungataniwha Survey District, being a distance of 11 miles, more or less. Shown on plan P.W.D. 72334, and thereon coloured red.

HIGHWAY DISTRICT NO. 2.

Te Kawwhata - Waerenga.

All that road or portion of road in the Waikato County, commencing at its junction with the Great South Road at the north-western corner of Section 409, Block XV, Maramarua Survey District, and proceeding generally in a north-easterly direction on to and along the road passing through Blocks XV and XVI, Maramarua Survey District, and Blocks XIII, IX, X, VI, and II, Piako Survey District, and terminating at its junction with the Pokeno-Waihi Main Highway at a point opposite the north-eastern corner of Section 68, Block II, Piako Survey District, being a distance of 17 miles, more or less. Shown on plan P.W.D. 71602, and thereon coloured blue.

Papakura-Hunua.

All that road or portion of road in the Papakura Town District and the Franklin County, commencing at its junction with the Papakura-Clevedon Main Highway in the Papakura Town District, and proceeding generally in a south-easterly direction via Marne Road, Settlement Road, and Hunua Road, all in the Town District of Papakura, and then along the road passing through Block 4, Drury Survey District, Blocks I and II, Opaheke Survey District, and terminating at a point opposite the Hunua Post-office, being a distance of 8 miles 32 chains, more or less. Pukekohe-Bombay.

Also all that street or portion of street in the Borough of Pukekohe, commencing at the junction of West Street and King Street, and proceeding generally in an easterly direction via the said King Street and East Street, and terminating at the eastern boundary of the Borough of Pukekohe at a point opposite the north-western corner of part Lot 4 of Allotment 12, Parish of Pukekohe, as shown on D.P. 373 and 374, being a distance of 1 mile 14 chains, more or less. Shown on plan P.W.D. 71175, and thereon coloured blue.

Puni-Otaua.

All that road or portion of road in the Franklin County, commencing at its junction with the Drury-Waiuku (via Pukekohe) Main Highway at the northern corner of Section 72, Puni Parish, Block XIV, Drury Survey District, opposite the Puni School, and proceeding generally in a south-westerly direction through Block XIV, Drury Survey District, Blocks II, I, and V, Onewhero Survey District, and Block V, Maioro Survey District, and terminating at its junction with the road forming the south-eastern boundary of Section 179, Block V, Maioro Survey District, opposite the Otaua Post-office, being a distance of 9 miles 12 chains, more or less. Shown on plan P.W.D. 71596, and thereon coloured blue.

Wharepoa Road.

All that road or portion of road in the Thames County, commencing at its junction with the Paeroa-Kopu Main Highway opposite the south-eastern corner of Section 6, Block 4, Waihou Survey District, and proceeding generally in a south-westerly direction on to and along the Wharepoa Road, passing through Blocks 4 and 3, Waihou Survey District, and terminating at a point opposite the Wharepoa Ferry Landing Reserve in Block 3, Waihou Survey District, being a distance of 3 miles 8 chains, more or less. Shown on plan P.W.D. 72335, and thereon coloured blue.

Papatoetoe-Howick.

All that road or portion of road in the Town District of Papatoetoe, commencing at the junction of the Great South Road and East Tamaki Main Road, and proceeding generally in a north-easterly direction via the said East Tamaki Main Road, and terminating at the north-eastern boundary of the Town District of Papatoetoe at a point opposite the south-western corner of Lot 7 as shown on D.P. 6873, being a distance of 13 chains, more or less. Shown on plan P.W.D. 71598, and thereon coloured blue.

Also all that road or portion of road in the Manukau County, commencing at a point opposite the south-western corner of the said Lot 7, and proceeding generally in a north-easterly direction through Blocks VI, VII, and III, Otahuhu Survey District, and terminating at its junction with the road forming the north-eastern boundary of Section 28, Block III, Otahuhu Survey District, being a distance of 5 miles 41 chains, more or less. Shown on plan P.W.D. 71598, and thereon coloured blue.

Howick-Manurewa.

All that road or portion of road in the Town District of Howick, commencing at the junction of Cook Street and Church Street, and proceeding generally in a south-westerly direction via the said Cook Street, and terminating at the southern boundary of the Howick Town District at a point opposite the north-eastern corner of Lot 5, Section 12, Small Farms, near Howick, in Block III, Otahuhu Survey District, being a distance of 1 mile, more or less. Shown on plan P.W.D. 71598, and thereon coloured blue.

Also all that road or portion of road in the Manukau County, commencing at the southern boundary of the Howick Town District at a point opposite the north-eastern corner of the said Lot 5, and proceeding generally in a south-easterly and south-westerly direction through Blocks III, VII, VIII, XII, XV, and XIV, Otahuhu Survey District, and Block VII, Wairoa Survey District, and terminating at the eastern boundary of the Town District of Manurewa at a point opposite the south-western boundary of Subdivision 20 of Clendon Grant, being a distance of 13 miles 34 chains, more or less. Shown on plan P.W.D. 71598, and thereon coloured blue.

Also all that road or portion of road in the Town District of Manurewa, commencing at the eastern boundary of the Manurewa Town District at a point opposite the south-western boundary of the said Subdivision 20, and proceeding generally in a south-westerly direction via Alfriston Road, and terminating at its junction with the Great South Road Main Highway at a point opposite the north-western corner of Lot 1 of Allotment 12, Parish of Papakura, as shown on D.P. -P 24, being a distance of 40 chains, more or less. Shown on plan P.W.D. 71598, and thereon coloured blue.

Tuakau—Onewhero.

All that road or portion of road in the Raglan County, commencing at its junction with the Pukekohe—Glen Murray Main Highway at a point opposite the southern end of the Waikato River Bridge at Tuakau, and proceeding generally in a south-westerly direction through Blocks VIII, VII, and XI, Onewhero Survey District, and terminating at its junction with the road forming the northern boundary of Section 14, Block XI, Onewhero Survey District, being a distance of 6 miles, more or less. Shown on plan P.W.D. 71603, and thereon coloured blue.

Kauroa—Te Mata.

All that road or portion of road in the Raglan County, commencing at its junction with the Hamilton—Raglan Main Highway at a point on the northern boundary of Section 50, Block VI, Karioi Survey District, and proceeding generally in a south-westerly direction via Kauroa Road through Blocks VI, V, and IX, Karioi Survey District, and terminating at a point opposite the Te Mata Post-office, being a distance of 4 miles 60 chains, more or less. Shown on plan P.W.D. 71603, and thereon coloured blue.

HIGHWAY DISTRICT No. 3.

Te Puna Point—Omokoroa.

All that road or portion of road in the Tauranga County, commencing at its junction with the Tauranga—Waihi Main Highway at a point on the north-western boundary of Section 43, Block VIII, Tauranga Survey District, and proceeding generally in a northerly direction, and terminating at Omokoroa at the south-western corner of Section 50, Block IV, Tauranga Survey District, being a distance of 6 miles, more or less. Shown on plan P.W.D. 71495, and thereon coloured blue.

Papamoa—Mount Maunganui.

All that road or portion of road in the Tauranga County, commencing at its junction with the Tauranga—Waihi Main Highway at the south-western corner of Section 1, Block III, Tumu Survey District, and proceeding generally in a north-westerly direction, and terminating at its junction with Wharf Road at Moturiki Township, being a distance of 8 miles 60 chains, more or less. Shown on plans P.W.D. 71496 and 71495, and thereon coloured blue.

Rotoma—Matata Road.

All that road or portion of road in the Rotorua and Whakatane Counties, commencing at its junction with the Whakatane—Rotorua Main Highway at the western boundary of scenic reserve, Block 10, Rotoma Survey District, and proceeding generally in a north-easterly direction via Pikowai South Road and Whakahaupapa Road, and terminating at its junction with the Whakatane—Tauranga Main Highway near Matata, near the northern corner of Section 3A, Block VI, Awa-o-te-Atua Survey District, being a distance of 22 miles, more or less. Shown on plans P.W.D. 71499 and 71497, and thereon coloured blue.

Wainui Road.

All that road or portion of road in the Whakatane and Opotiki Counties, commencing at its junction with the Gisborne—Whakatane (via Motu) Main Highway at the south-eastern corner of Section 12, Block II, Whakatane Survey District, and proceeding generally in a south-easterly direction, and terminating at its junction with the said Gisborne—Whakatane (via Motu) Main Highway at a point on the eastern boundary of Section 183, Block XI, Whakatane Survey District, being a distance of 18 miles, more or less. HIGHWAY DISTRICT No. 4.

Puha—Mangatu—Whatatutu.

HIGHWAY DISTRICT No. 5.

Waipukurau—Matamau, via Hatuma, Takapau, and Ormondville.

Omakere—Pourerere.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 2nd day of July, 1928.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section twenty of the Land Laws Amendment Act, 1926, it is provided that if in the opinion of the Governor-General it is expedient that any land vested in His Majesty and not reserved for any special purpose should be vested in any local authority in trust for the purpose of planting trees thereon, he may, by Order in Council, vest such land in that local authority for such purpose, with or without payment therefor, and subject to such terms and conditions as may be prescribed or imposed in such Order :

And whereas, in the opinion of the Governor-General, it is expedient to vest the land described in the Schedule hereto in the Chairman, Councillors, and Inhabitants of the County of Wairoa for tree-planting purposes without payment therefor :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the said section twenty, doth hereby declare that

from and after the day of the date hereof the land described in the Schedule hereto shall become vested in the Chairman, Councillors, and Inhabitants of the County of Wairoa for tree-planting purposes, subject to the special conditions hereinafter contained, that is to say,—

(1) The Wairoa County Council shall, within six months of the date hereof, or within such extended period as the Commissioner of State Forests may decide, prepare a general forest working-plan of future operations to cover a period of not less than five years; such working-plan shall fully specify the silvicultural operations proposed to be carried on during the currency of the plan and such other matters as the Director of Forestry thinks fit.

(2) It shall not be lawful for the said Council to carry on such silvicultural operations unless and until such plan has been approved by the Commissioner of State Forests, and all such operations shall be carried on according to such plan as approved by the said Commissioner and under the supervision of the Director of Forestry.

(3) Any officer of the State Forest Service shall have free access to the said land at all times for the purpose of inspecting planting or other forestal operations, or for the purpose of reporting on proposed forest activities.

(4) The said Council shall, as soon as practicable after the date hereof, appoint some fit person to supervise and manage all tree-planting operations which may be undertaken by the said Council, and generally to advise the said Council on all matters pertaining to its forestry operations.

(5) The said Council may dispose of, by private sale, tender, or auction, any timber, trees, tree-seeds, firewood, or other forest produce on or from the said land.

(6) The payment of expenses of administration, management, and development of the said land for forestry and other purposes incidental thereto (including any expenses of supervision incurred by the State Forest Service) shall be a first charge on all moneys received therefrom, whether by way of rent, fees, proceeds of sales of forest produce, or from any other source whatsoever.

(7) In April of each year the said Council shall furnish to the Commissioner of State Forests a report for the year ending on the preceding 31st day of March, presenting in complete detail full particulars of the technical operations, and of the said administration of the land hereby vested in the said Council and the financial operations relating thereto, and shall at the same time submit a plan of operations and management for the ensuing year, which shall be effective on approval by the Commissioner of State Forests.
