A Captain, Royal Navy, as the Second Naval Member.

The Secretary to the Commodore Commanding shall be appointed as Secretary to the Naval Board, but he shall not sit as a member of the Board.

3. The Naval Board shall be charged with the control of all matters relating to the Naval Forces, upon the policy directed by the Minister, and shall have executive command of the Naval Forces. The Governor-General may delegate to the Naval Board the functions, and commission it to execute the office of Commander-in-Chief of the Naval Forces.

4. Except as prescribed, the members of the Naval Board shall act as a whole. The orders of the Board shall be issued over the signature of the Secretary, or such other official as the Board may authorize to act for him.

5. The Naval Board shall meet weekly, or as may be directed by the Minister, or, in his absence, by the Senior Naval Member

of the Board present. Two members of the Board shall constitute a quorum.

6. All decisions of the Board which involve a matter of policy, or important principle, an increased rate, or any new expenditure, shall be submitted for Cabinet approval.

7. A representative of the Treasury shall be charged with the duty of keeping account of expenditure with a view to ensuring that it is kept within the estimates.

8. The Minister shall have the general direction and supervision of all business.

The special sphere of each member of the Naval Board, other than the Minister, shall be such as the Board may decide from time to time, being guided by the following distribution of business:—

First Naval Member: Operations of war and all Staff business—all large questions of Naval policy and maritime warfare.

Second Naval Member: Personnel and material.

(2) If such owner or master fails or neglects to comply with these regulations he shall be liable to a fine of £100.

And whereas the Minister of Labour is satisfied that the signatures to such requisition represent a majority of the occupiers of all the said shops within the said borough, and that all the occupiers of the said shops within the said borough affected by section 35 (1) of the said Act have been afforded an equal right to share at a reasonable cost in the profits of the business carried on by the exempted shop:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of sections 32 and 35 of the Shops and Offices Act, 1921-22, and in pursuance of section 15 of the Shops and Offices Amendment Act, 1927, I, for and on behalf of the Minister of Labour, do hereby direct that on and after the 20th day of August, 1928, all the chemists' shops within the Borough of Palmerston North, save and except the shop (hereinafter referred to as the "exempted shop") established at Main Street within the said Borough for the purpose only of the sale of medicines and surgical appliances that are urgently required, and known as the "Urgent Medicine Dispensary," shall be closed on Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays at 6 p.m., on Saturdays at 10 p.m., and, pursuant to section 15 of the Shops and Offices Amendment Act, 1927, on Sundays at 6 a.m., with the following exceptions: (1) On the working-day immediately preceding Christmas Day and on the working-day immediately preceding New Year's Day, the closing-hour shall be 11 p.m.; (2) on the Thursday immediately preceding Good Friday, the closing-hour shall be 10 p.m.; (3) should the occupier of any shop affected by this notice close his shop in any week during the whole of any two working-days other than Wednesday, then and in such case the closing-hour on Wednesday shall be 6 p.m.; (4) subsection (4) of section 35 of the Shops and Offices Act, 1921-22, shall not apply to any chemist's shop which is within a distance of two miles and a half from the exempted shop while medicines and surgical appliances are obtainable from the exempted shop.

The notice dated the 22nd May, 1918, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the 23rd May, 1918, fixing the closing-hours of chemists' shops in the Borough of Palmerston North, shall be and is hereby cancelled as from the date of the coming into operation of this notice.
