WHEREAS by subsection six of section fifty-seven of the Chattels Transfer Act, 1924 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), it is provided that the Governor-General, if satisfied that a practice has been established of dealing with any specific chattels or class of chattels by the method of hire-purchase, or that it is desirable in the public interest that such practice should become established in respect of any specific chattels or class of chattels, may from time to time, by Order in Council, add to the class of chattels defined in the Seventh Schedule to the said Act any other chattels or class of chattels, and that thereafter such chattels or class of chattels may be the subject of customary hire-purchase of chattels may be the subject of customary hire-purchase agreements :

And whereas His Excellency the Governor-General is satisfied that a practice has been established of dealing with the chattels defined in the Schedule hereto, by the method of hire-purchase :

LICENSES to fish for trout or other acclimatized fish in all waters within the said district may be issued under the hand waters within the said district may be issued under the hand of the Secretary of the Grey Acclimatization Society, or any one authorized by the said Secretary in that behalf, and such license shall entitle the person named therein to fish in the said acclimatization district from the 1st day of October in any one year to the 30th day of April in the year following, subject to the said Acts, and any regulations made thereunder, and to these regulations : Provided that the Secretary may refuse to issue a license to any person who, within the previous two years, has been convicted of any breach of the provisions of any Act relating to fishing for trout or other acclimatized

of any Act relating to fishing for trout or other acclimatized fish, or of any regulation made thereunder. 2. The fee to be charged for a license as aforesaid to each male person over the age of sixteen years shall be £1, and every such license shall be in the form set forth in the Second Schedule hereto. Licenses may also be issued to boys attend-ing school or under the age of sixteen, or to women, at a reduced fee of 5s. for each license so issued : Provided that it shall be lawful for any Secretary or his deputy, in any case where application is made for a license on or after the ninewhere application is made for a license on or after the nine-teenth day of December in any year, to issue a license to any man for the sum of 12s. 6d., but so that such license shall extend only from the time of granting the same until the termination of the then trout-fishing season: Provided further that day or week licenses may be issued to men, women, and boys at a fee of 2s. 6d. each: Provided further that whole-season licenses for Lake Brunner only may be granted to men, women, and boys at a fee of 10s. No license shall confer any right of entry upon the land of any person shall confer any right of entry upon the land of any person without his consent.

3. Trout or other acclimatized fish shall not be fished for, taken, or killed, otherwise than with one rod and line, but a landing-net or gaff may be used to secure any trout or other acclimatized fish caught with such rod and line. 4. It shall be unlawful to fish for trout or other acclimatized

fish with other than natural or artificial fly, natural or artificial minnow, silveries, bullies, grasshoppers, spiders, caterpillars, creepers, or worms.

5. No license shall authorize any person other than the person named therein to fish.

b. No needs therein to fish.
6. No person shall have in his possession any of the salmonidæ or trout between the 1st day of May and the 30th day of September in any year, which period is hereby appointed the close season for all such fish : Provided always that this regulation shall not apply to fish caught by the officers of the Marine Department, or of an acclimatization society, or the General Manager of the Department of Tourists and Health Resorts for the purpose of pisciculture : Provided further that nothing herein contained shall be deemed to affect the provisions of any regulation now in force, or hereafter made, with respect to keeping trout or salmon in freezing or cool chambers during the close season hereinbefore mentioned.
7. No person shall cast or throw into any stream in which trout or salmon exist or have been liberated, or shall allow to flow into, or place near the bank or margin of any such stream, any sawdust, or sawmill refuse, lime, sheep-dip, flaxmill

flow into, or place near the bank or margin of any such stream, any sawdust, or sawmill refuse, lime, sheep-dip, flaxmill refuse, or any other matter or liquid that is noxious, poison-ous, or injurious to fish : Provided that nothing herein con-tained shall extend to prohibit the depositing in such stream of debris from any mining claim. 8. No person shall take, fish for, catch, or kill, in any manner whatever, or have in his possession, any salmon, salmon-parr, or smolts, or the ova, young, or fry of any

salmon in any stage whatever; and any of the above-named taken by accident or otherwise shall immediately be returned alive into the water from which the same is taken.

9. No person shall fish for trout, or other acclimatized fish without a license; and every person fishing shall, on the demand of any Ranger, constable, officer of the said society, or of any person producing a license, produce and society, such Ranger, officer, constable, or person, his license, and the contents of his creel or bag, and the bait used by him for taking, catching, or killing such trout or other acclimatized fish.

10. Every trout not exceeding 9 in. in length from nose to tip of tail, taken or caught by any person shall immediately be returned alive into the water from which the same is taken.

be returned alive into the water from which the same is taken. 11. No cross-line fishing, stroke-hauling, or any other un-sportsmanlike device shall be used for the purpose of taking, catching, or killing trout, or other acclimatized fish; nor shall any of the above-mentioned baits be used with any medicated or chemical preparation whatever. 12. Except as aforesaid, no person shall fish with or use any net, or any instrument, or device, or means for taking trout, or other acclimatized fish in any river or stream within the district aforesaid or at the month or entrance of any such

the district aforesaid, or at the mouth or entrance of any such river or stream : Provided that nothing herein contained shall prevent the placing of any net other than a stake net in or across the mouth of the Grey River, or at any place in the said river below a straight line drawn across the said river opposite Tainui Street, in the Town of Greymouth, for the number of taking indigenous fish only nor render any person purpose of taking indigenous fish only, nor render any person liable to any penalty for so doing, or for taking indigenous fish by such means.

13. For the purposes of these regulations the mouth of every such river or stream shall be deemed to include every outlet of the same and the sea-shore between such outlets, and shall extend over a radius of 500 yards from the point or line where the waters of such river or stream meet those

or line where the waters of such river or stream meet those of the sea or of any harbour at low water. 14. No person shall buy, sell, or expose, or offer for sale, or shall fish for the purpose of obtaining for sale, any trout, or other acclimatized fish, or any part thereof, unless such person has a license to do so under regulations for taking trout, or other acclimatized fish, or for selling them. 15. No person shall take or catch more than twenty trout in any one day.

WHEREAS by section one hundred and eighty-six of W the Harbours Act, 1923 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), it is enacted that the Governor-General in Council may vest the management of any wharf, the property of His Majesty the King, in any local authority upon such terms and conditions as the Governor-General in Council thinks fit:

And whereas it is thought desirable to vest in the Waipu River Board (hereinafter called "The Board," in which term is to be construed, unless the context requires a different construction, its successors or assigns) the management of the wharf at Waipu, erected in accordance with the plan marked M.D. 2621, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington, on the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth in the First Schedule hereto, and to prescribe the dues and rates to be taken and charged by the Board for the use of the said wharf :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, doth hereby vest the management of the said wharf in the Board, subject to the conditions set forth in the First Schedule hereto, and doth hereby prescribe that the dues and rates specified in the Second Schedule hereto shall be taken and charged by the Board for the use of the said wharf Board for the use of the said wharf.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

CONDITIONS OF MANAGEMENT.

1. In these conditions the terms

- "Low-water mark" means low-water mark at ordinary spring tides : inister " means the Minister of Marine as defined by

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark adjacent thereto necessary for the maintenance of the said wharf at the site shown on the plan marked M.D. 2621.

3. All His Majesty's subjects shall at all reasonable times, and upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the above-mentioned wharf, and rights of ingress and egress thereto and therefrom.

His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, over, and out of the said wharf without payment. 5. The Board shall maintain and keep the above-mentioned wharf, and all erections on or in connection with the wharf

in good order and repair; and shall at all times exhibit therefrom, and maintain at the Board's own cost, suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels: Provided that no new light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved by the Minister :

6. All dues and rates received on account of the said wharf by the Board shall be applied to keeping the said wharf and all erections on or in connection with such wharf in good order and repair.

7. Any perso athorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said wharf and any buildings erected on the wharf or in connection therewith, and view the state of repair thereof; and upon the Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the Board in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair is not a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such

wharf or buildings, requiring the Board, within a reasonable time to be therein prescribed, to make good or repair the same, the Board shall, with all convenient speed, cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

8. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharf shall be taken away by the Board and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

9. The Board shall not erect, or suffer to be erected, on the said wharf any building or structure whatever, except with the consent of the Minister.

10. The Board shall keep a separate account of the receipts and expenditure on account of such wharf and premises, and shall cause such account to be balanced to the 31st day of March in every year, and shall send a copy of such account when balanced to the Minister, and shall supply any parti-culars in reference thereto as may be required by the Minister.

11. The Board shall appoint all officers necessary for the working and management of the said wharf.

12. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the Board to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulations of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1923, or its amendments, or any regulation thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

13. The rights, powers, and privileges hereby conferred shall continue in force for fourteen years, computed from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the Board shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

14. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred under or by virtue of this Order 1 Council may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the Board three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the Board in New Zealand.

15. The Board shall be liable for any injury which may be caused at the said wharf to any vessel or boat through default or neglect on the part of the Board. any

16. In case the Board shall-

 Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions herein-before set forth, or any of them; or
 Cease to use or occupy the said wharf for a period of thirty consecutive days;

then, and in either of the said cases, this Order in Council and then, and in either of the said cases, this Order in Council and every license, right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any notice to the Board or other proceedings whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Garette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the Board and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the licenses, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

17. In the event of this Order in Council being revoked 17. In the event of this Order in Council being revoked for any reason whatsoever, or upon the expiry of the period for which the license is granted, the Board shall, if required by the Minister so to do, remove the said wharf entirely from the site and restore the site to its original condition within three months from the date of the revocation or expiry, as the case may be; and if the Board fails so to do, the Minister may cause the said wharf to be removed and the site so restored, and may recover the costs incurred by the said removal and restoration from the Board.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

1. THE owner, master, consignee, or agent of every vessel other than oil-launches trading regularly to the port and shipping or discharging cargo shall pay the sum of fifteen pounds (£15) quarterly, in advance.

2. The owner, master, consignee, or agent of every vessel other than oil-launches not trading regularly to the port for the shipment or discharge of cargo shall pay the sum of two pounds $(\pounds 2)$ for each and every trip made by such vessel.

3. The owner, master, consignee, or agent of every oil-launch trading to the port for the shipment or discharge of cargo shall pay the sum of ten shillings (10s.) for each and every trip made by such oil-launch.

If in any year the company fails to remove any sand the deposit hereinbefore referred to shall be appropriated by the Minister as flat rent in respect of that year; but if, during any year, the company removes any sand, the deposit shall, in proportion to the amount of sand so removed, be applied as royalty at the rate hereinbefore mentioned, but so that the minimum amount payable as combined royalty and flat rent in any one complete year shall be not less than £25. All such payments shall be made to the Superintendent of Mercantile Marine at Auckland, or such other person as the Minister may direct.

5. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all other officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duties, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the said land without payment.

6. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the company to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1923, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

7. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue in force for the term of fourteen years computed from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges are altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the company shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the written consent of the Minister first obtained.

8. The rights, powers, and privileges hereby granted and conferred may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, without payment of any compensation whatsoever, on giving to the company three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known registered office of the company in New Zealand.

9. The company shall keep a strictly accurate record of all sand removed, whether from above or below low-water mark, and shall submit the same for inspection immediately at the end of each month to the Superintendent of Mercantile Marine at Auckland or such other officer as may be appointed by the Minister; and shall at the same time pay to the Superintendent or other officer as aforesaid the amount of royalty due to the Minister.

10. In case the company shall---

- (1) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them ;
- (2) Be in any manner wound up or dissolved;
- (3) Fail to pay the sums specified in clauses 3 and 4 of these conditions-

then, and in any such case, this Order in Council, and every license, right, power, or privilege thereby conferred, may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any notice to the company or other proceedings whatsoever; and publication in the New Zealand Gazette of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the company, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

11. Payment by the company of any of the sums hereinbefore mentioned shall be sufficient evidence of the acceptance by the company of the terms and conditions of this Order in Council.

NOTE.—A wet, cold, and gloomy month, with moderate to strong southerly to south-easterly winds prevailing. Rainfall at Karori Reservoir, near Kelburn, was 22 per cent. above the mean. Total bright sunshine, 80.6 hours, 29 per cent. of the possible, and seven sunless days. Frost was recorded on the grass on two mornings, and hail fell on the 22nd and 29th. Thunder and lightning occurred on the 1st, and fog was in evidence on three mornings. Mean dew-point at 9 a.m., 42.6°; and mean vapour pressure, 0.272 in.

SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF JUNE, 1928.

June was a wintry month, with a marked predominance of cold south-west or southerly winds. Temperatures were below normal in many parts; but, except in the southern portions of the South Island, frosts were not particularly numerous or severe. The majority of the strong winds blew along the length of the Island, with intermittent shiftings to a more southerly or south-easterly direction. Their force was, therefore, felt mainly in the northern and southern extremities of the Dominion and in the surrounding ocean waters, with occasional visitations on parts of the East Coast. The parts exposed to the winds received more than their usual quota of rainfall for the month. The Bay of Plenty, Waikato, Taranaki, Wanganui, Marlborough, Nelson, and Westland districts, and the interior of the South Island, however, had less than the average, the deficiency amounting to as much as 70 per cent. in some cases. Nelson and Taranaki experienced particularly fine weather. particularly fine weather.

The storms which occurred during the month were mainly of the cyclonic variety, four principal ones being recorded.

particularly fine weather. The storms which occurred during the month were mainly of the cyclonic variety, four principal ones being recorded. Westerly winds were again conspicuous by their absence. The cyclone centres all passed north of Cook Strait. Three of them were responsible for stormy conditions over the whole of the Dominion. Of these the first passed Cape Maria Van Diemen on the 10th and subsequently moved in a south-south-east direction past the Chatham Islands. Southerly gales and general rains were experienced on the 11th and 12th. During the approach of the storm between the 7th and 9th pressure was high to the east of New Zealand. On the 14th and 15th, while a moderate anticyclone was covering New Zealand, an intense cyclone developed off the coast of New South Wales. Moving slowly eastward, the centre passed through Cook Strait on the 18th. From the 15th to the 21st the weather was almost continuously dull and unsettled, with more or less rain. On the 18th the rain was general, and there were fairly widespread falls of snow in the South Island and the central parts of the North Island. North-easterly gales blew in the north on the 15th and 16th, and fairly general southerly gales from the 18th to the 21st. On the 21st there were again extensive falls of snow, while hail was reported in many places. The last cyclone appeared between Cape Maria Van Diemen and Norfolk Island on the 26th, causing northerly gales in North Auckland. Moving south-eastwards and intensifying, this disturbance caused strong south-westerly winds to gales and much rain in the last three days of the month. Three was a lull, however, on the night of the 28th during the development of a secondary depression. This was followed on the 29th by the third fall of snow for the month in parts of Canterbury and Otago, some of it even reaching the Plain country. Hail, also, was experienced at some stations. The Auckland Province suffered worst from this storm, the northern portion experiencing north-easterly gales dur

(2) In the case of goods exported from any other country a declaration made by the seller or by some other person (e.g., a responsible representative of a recognized association) approved by the Minister and verified according to the law of that country must, when the goods are entered, be pro-duced to the Customs stating when the articles were produced or manufactured.

(3) In any case the goods of which free admission is claimed may be examined by the Customs if this course is considered necessary to satisfy the proper officer that the goods are entitled to be entered under the item referred to.
