IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities I N pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by section twenty of the Forests Act, 1921–22, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting on the recommendation of the Minister of Lands, do hereby proclaim and declare that the lands described in the Schedule hereto, being portions of provisional State forests set apart by Proclamations dated the twenty-ninth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, and the eleventh day of October, one thousand nine hundred and twenty, respectively, and gazetted on the eighth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, and the fourteenth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and twenty, respectively, are required for settlement purposes; and, in accordance with the pro-visions of the said Act, such lands shall, from and after the day of the gazetting hereof, cease to be provisional State forests, and shall become subject to the provisions of the Land Act, 1924. The total live births registered for the urban areas amounted to 1,078 as against 1,073 in July, an increase of 5. The deaths in August were 702—an increase of 31 as compared with the previous month. Of the total deaths males contributed 358, females 344. Sixty-five of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 9.26 per cent. of the whole number. Fifty-two of these were under one year of age. The equivalent annual rates per 1,000 of mean population for August, 1928, and eight months ended August, 1928, were as follows.
