IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him by the Public Works Amendment Act, 1911, and of every other power enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the Order in Council dated the twelfth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 47 of the fifteenth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, and doth hereby amend the Order in Council dated the fourteenth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-four, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 48 of the seventeenth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-four, authorizing the Uawa County Council to erect electric lines in portion of the Uawa County, by revoking clause three thereof (charges for electrical energy) and substituting therefor the following clause viz. :—

3. CHARGES FOR ELECTRICAL ENERGY.

The maximum charge for electrical energy shall not exceed 1s. 6d. per unit for lighting purposes, and 1s. per unit for motor-power, heating, or cooking purposes: Provided that "lighting purposes" shall include the operation of motor-generators for lighting purposes; and provided further that from and after the 14th day of July, 1930, the maximum charge for electrical energy shall not exceed 1s. per unit for lighting purposes and 6d. per unit for motor-power, heating, or cooking purposes."

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by the Maintenance Orders (Facilities for Enforcement) Act, 1921 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth amend, as set forth in the Schedule hereto, the regulations made under the said Act by Order in Council dated the tenth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-three, and published in the *Gazette* on the thirteenth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-three, at page 2416.

Upon registration of an order under section 3 of the said Act, or upon confirmation of a provisional order under section 5 of the said Act, all payments due under such order shall, unless a Magistrate shall upon such registration or at any time afterwards otherwise order, thereafter be made through the Clerk for the time being of the Magistrate's Court in which such registration is effected or provisional order is confirmed, as the case may be."

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

In the matter of the Tramways Act, 1908, and its Amendments, and in the matter of an Application made thereunder by the Council of the Borough of Napier in regard to the Use of “One-man” Tramcars on the Napier Borough Tramways.

WHEREAS the Council of the Borough of Napier, a borough formerly constituted under the provisions of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1908, and now constituted under the provisions of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1920, did on the tenth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight, and again on the eleventh day of July, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight, duly publish in *The Hawke's Bay Herald* newspaper, being a newspaper generally circulating in the said borough, a notice of its intention to apply under the Tramways Act, 1908, and the several Acts amending the same, for an Order in Council amending, as hereinafter appears, three former Orders in Council dated respectively the thirteenth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and twelve, the twelfth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, and the twenty-third day of April, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-three, and called respectively “The Napier Tramway Order No. 1,” “The Napier Tramway Order No. 2,” and “The Napier Tramway Order No. 3,” so as to permit the use of “one-man” cars on the Napier Borough Tramways: And whereas no ratepayers of the said borough have demanded that the question whether or not such amended Order should be applied for shall be submitted to the decision of the ratepayers: And whereas, pursuant to the said notice, the said Council (hereinafter called “the local authority”) did, on the fourteenth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight, make application to His Excellency the Governor-General for such amended Order: And whereas His Excellency has deemed it expedient to make such an Order in the manner and to the effect and upon and subject to the stipulations and provisions hereinafter expressed:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power in this behalf vested in him by the Tramways Act, 1908, and the several Acts amending the same, and of every power and authority in anywise enabling him in this behalf, acting by and with the consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby order and direct as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as “The Napier Tramways Order No. 4,” and shall come into force on the date hereof. Short Title, &c.
2. In this Order words and expressions to which by the Napier Tramway Order No. 1 meanings are therein assigned have in this Order the same respective meanings. Interpretation.
3. The Napier Tramway Orders Nos. 1, 2, and 3 are hereby varied and extended in manner following, that is to say— Variations and extensions of existing Orders.
4. The local authority may use on the tramway cars in accordance with the deposited plans, designed for use without conductors (hereinafter referred to as “one-man” cars), and all such cars may be used under the control and conduct of one motorman only, without any car-conductor. “One-man” cars authorized.
5. All “one-man” cars used on the tramway after the date of this Order shall be fitted with a “dead-man control” of a type to be approved of by the Minister—that is, with a system of control where effort by the motorman is necessary to keep the power on and the brakes off, and by which upon such effort being released the power is at once automatically cut off and the brakes applied. “Dead-man control.”
6. The fare-box of “one-man” cars, if used, shall be placed in such a position that it will not interfere with the safety of passengers or of persons employed on the car. Whenever necessary, the fare-box shall be sufficiently illuminated. Fare-box.
7. A notice, on which shall be printed information as to when fares are to be paid and tickets submitted for inspection, shall be placed in a conspicuous place on each “one-man” car. On “one-man” cars the collection of fares must not be carried out while the car is in motion unless a conductor is employed for the purpose. Payment of fares.
8. (a) On “one-man” cars passengers shall be permitted to enter and leave the car only on the near side and at the leading end. Entering and leaving cars.
- (b) To prevent passengers en route leaving or entering any “one-man” car by the wrong entrance, the off-side leading and trailing doors shall be securely closed; and, in addition, the near-side trailing door shall be securely closed; and before leaving any stopping-place the motorman shall close the near-side leading door of any “one-man” car, which shall remain closed until opened by him after the car has come to rest at the next stopping-place. When the doors are so closed the steps provided at them shall be folded up or otherwise rendered unusable.
- (c) When trailers are attached to “one-man” cars the motorman must not start the car until he has received a signal to do so from the conductor in charge of the trailers whose duty it is to give that signal, and the motorman shall (in addition)

satisfy himself that all is clear by looking to the rear of the outside of the car on the side on which passengers are boarding or alighting.

9. (1) When trailer cars are attached to "one-man" cars the number of car-conductors for the trailer cars shall be as follows:—

Use of trailers attached to "one-man" cars.

(a) Trains consisting of a "one-man" car and one trailer car: One car-conductor.

(b) Trains consisting of a "one-man" car and two trailer cars: Two car-conductors.

(2) No more than two trailer cars shall be used in connection to any single "one-man" car.

10. Before running "one-man" cars on the tramways such cars shall be in accordance with the deposited plans.

WHEREAS by section three of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), it is provided that, notwithstanding anything to the contrary in any Act, it shall not be lawful or competent for any local authority to borrow or contract to borrow any money (otherwise than in anticipation of its revenue within the limits of its powers, if any, in that behalf), whether from the State Advances Office or from any other source whatever, and whether in pursuance of a special Act or under any authority whatever, without the precedent consent of the Governor-General in Council given after compliance with the provisions of the said Act :

And whereas section eleven of the said Act provides that the Governor-General in Council in giving his consent to the borrowing of moneys by the local authority may impose such conditions with respect to the time at which such moneys may be borrowed, the rate of interest that may be paid in respect thereto, the term for which they may be borrowed, and provisions for repayment thereof as he thinks fit, and that it shall not be lawful for the local authority to borrow such moneys save in accordance with the conditions so imposed :

And whereas the Christchurch City Council is desirous of raising the respective amounts mentioned in the Schedule hereto :

And whereas the said local authority has complied with the provisions of the said Act, and it is expedient that the aforesaid precedent consent should be given to the raising of the respective amounts set out in the Fourth Column of the said Schedule on the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth :

REGULATIONS.

REGULATION 1.—PRELIMINARY.

(1) THESE regulations may be cited as the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1928.

(2) In these regulations, where not inconsistent with the context,—

“The said Act” means the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1927 :

“Director-General” means the Director-General of Health appointed under the Health Act, 1920 :

“Licensee” includes a person deemed to be a licensee under these regulations, and “licensed” and “holder of a license” have corresponding meanings :

“Medical Officer of Health” means the Medical Officer of Health in charge of the health district constituted under the Health Act, 1920, in which any premises are situate :

“Registered chemist” means a person for the time being registered as a pharmaceutical chemist within the meaning of the Pharmacy Act, 1908 :

“Medical practitioner” means a person for the time being registered under the Medical Practitioners Act, 1914, and not suspended from the practice of his profession under the Medical Practitioners Amendment Act, 1924 :

“Dentist” means a person for the time being registered under the Dentists Act, 1908 :

“Veterinary surgeon” means a person for the time being registered as a veterinary surgeon under the Veterinary Surgeons Act, 1926 :

“Practitioner” includes medical practitioner, dentist, and veterinary surgeon as herein defined :

A reference to “these regulations” shall be construed as a reference to Part I or Part II hereof as the case may require.

PART I: IMPORTATION AND EXPORTATION.

REGULATION 2.—LICENSES FOR IMPORTATION.

(1) A license to import dangerous drugs as defined by the said Act shall be in the form numbered 1 in the First Schedule hereto.

(2) Every person desiring to import any dangerous drugs (other than prepared opium, the importation of which is prohibited by the said Act) shall, before ordering the same, make application to the Comptroller of Customs, Wellington, in the form numbered 2 in the First Schedule hereto for a license to import the same, and shall satisfy him that the importation of the said drugs is lawful under the said Act and these regulations, and that any raw opium or coca leaf included in such application is required for, and, if imported,

will be used for, legitimate purposes, and that any other dangerous drug included in such application is required for, and, if imported, will be used solely for medicinal or scientific purposes.

(3) On the receipt of any such application the Comptroller may issue a license to import all or any of the dangerous drugs set forth therein, provided that he is satisfied that the importation thereof is lawful under the said Act and these regulations, and that any raw opium or coca leaf enumerated in such license is required for, and, if imported will be used for, legitimate purposes, and that any other dangerous drug enumerated in the license is required for, and, if imported, will be used solely for, medicinal or scientific purposes.

REGULATION 3.—LICENSES FOR EXPORTATION.

(1) A license to export dangerous drugs shall be in the form numbered 3 in the First Schedule hereto.

(2) Such license may be granted subject to such conditions or restrictions as the Comptroller may in any case direct, and shall be issued only on production of a certificate from the Government of the country to which any such dangerous drug is to be exported, that the importation into that country of the consignment in question is approved by that Government, that (in the case of raw opium and coca leaf) such drugs are required for legitimate purposes, and (in the case of other dangerous drugs) that such drugs are required solely for medicinal or scientific purposes.

(3) The production of the certificate mentioned in the last preceding clause of this regulation may, at the discretion of the Comptroller and under such conditions as he may require, be dispensed with in any special case, and in cases where dangerous drugs are to be exported to a country the laws of which do not provide for the issue of such a certificate.

(4) Nothing in these regulations shall apply to any dangerous drugs supplied, by permission of the Collector of Customs to the master of any ship trading overseas, in such quantities only as are required for use as medical stores for such ship.

PART II: MANUFACTURE AND DISPOSAL.

REGULATION 4.—LICENSES TO DEAL IN DANGEROUS DRUGS.

(1) Every person who desires to obtain a license under section 9 of the said Act shall apply therefor in writing to the Director-General in the form numbered 4 in the First Schedule hereto, and shall set out the dangerous drugs in which the applicant desires to deal, and the full address of the premises at which the applicant desires to deal in such drugs.

(2) All applications, returns, and other communications to be made or delivered to the Director-General by any applicant or licensee under this and the succeeding regulations shall be made through the Medical Officer of Health in charge of the health district constituted under the Health Act, 1920, in which are situate the premises to which such communications relate.

(3) The Director-General may in any case require the applicant to furnish information or evidence, by statutory declaration or otherwise, as to the nature of his business, the extent to which he proposes to deal in dangerous drugs, his personal character, or any other matter relevant to the granting of a license.

(4) If satisfied as to the character of the applicant and generally as to the propriety of the application, the Director-General shall grant to the applicant a license in the form numbered 5 in the First Schedule hereto, and shall enter the particulars of such license in a Register kept for the purpose.

(5) Every such license shall set out the dangerous drugs which the licensee is authorized to produce, manufacture, sell, distribute; or otherwise deal in, and shall not be deemed to authorize dealing in any dangerous drug not specified in the license.

(6) Every licensee desiring to deal in any dangerous drug not specified in his license shall apply for a further license for that purpose in the manner hereinbefore prescribed.

(7) Every license shall be deemed to be granted subject to the condition that the licensee shall not produce, manufacture, sell, distribute, or otherwise deal in any dangerous drug elsewhere than at the premises named in the license or at any premises that may, by indorsement thereon signed by the Director-General, be substituted for or added to the premises named in the license.

(8) Every licensee who desires to deal in the dangerous drugs specified in his license at premises other than the premises named in his license shall make application in that behalf to the Director-General as aforesaid, and shall in his application set out the full address of the proposed additional or substituted premises, and shall deliver his license for indorsement; and, if the Director-General approves the application, he shall indorse the license accordingly, and enter particulars of the indorsement in the Register referred to in clause (4) of this regulation, and such license shall thereafter take effect according to the tenor of the indorsement.

(9) Unless revoked under the provisions of Regulation 5 hereof, every license shall continue in force until the 31st day of March following the date of its issue, save that any license granted during the months of February and March in any year shall continue in force until the 31st day of March in the next ensuing year.

(10) Every licensee who desires to be licensed after the expiration of a current license shall make fresh application in that behalf to the Director-General as aforesaid at least one month prior to the expiration of his current license, but it shall not be necessary to specify anew in such application the dangerous drugs to which it is desired that the license shall relate.

(11) The Director-General shall, in the month of April in every year, cause to be published in the *Gazette* in the form numbered 6 in the First Schedule hereto a list of the names of all persons for the time being licensed under this regulation, together with the premises referred to in the respective licenses, and shall from time to time so cause to be published lists of additional names and additional or substituted premises.

(12) Every registered chemist and every practitioner shall, without the necessity of making application for a license and without the actual issue of a license under these regulations (but subject to the provisions of clause (6) of Regulation 5 hereof), be deemed to be licensed and to be the holder of a license to produce, manufacture, sell, distribute, or otherwise deal in all dangerous drugs for the purposes of their respective businesses or professions, but not otherwise, and (in the case of a registered chemist) at his business address set out in the Pharmaceutical Register of New Zealand, and (in the case of a practitioner) at the place where he practises his profession.

(13) It shall not be necessary to enter in the Register referred to in clause (4) of this regulation the names of persons deemed to be licensed under the last preceding clause of this regulation, nor shall the names of such persons be published in the list referred to in clause (11) of this regulation; but nothing herein contained shall prevent any such person, if he so desires, from applying for an express license under clause (1) of this regulation.

(14) No license granted under these regulations nor the rights thereby conferred nor any of them shall be exercisable by any person other than the licensee, or be assigned, charged, or alienated to or in favour of, or be capable of devolving upon any person, whether by act of parties or by operation of law.

REGULATION 5.—REVOCATION OF LICENSES.

(1) The Minister may at any time revoke the license of any person licensed under these regulations—

- (a) If such person is convicted of an offence against the said Act or these regulations; or
- (b) If the Minister is satisfied that such person has committed a breach of the terms of his license or has failed, without reasonable excuse, to comply with any condition expressly or by implication contained in his license; or
- (c) If it appears to the Minister that the license has been granted in error or through any misrepresentation or fraud, or has been granted without his approval to a person to whom, except with the approval of the Minister, no license should be granted pursuant to section 9 of the said Act.

(2) The Minister shall not revoke the license to be held by a medical practitioner except on the recommendation of the Medical Council of New Zealand.

(3) The Minister shall not revoke the license deemed to be held by a registered chemist, dentist, or veterinary surgeon except on the recommendation of the Director-General of Health.

(4) Revocation of a license shall be effected by publication in the *Gazette* of a notice to that effect under the hand of the Minister.

(5) Every person to whom any license has actually been issued shall, within one month of the revocation thereof, deliver the same to the Director-General for cancellation.

(6) Notwithstanding the provisions of clause (11) of Regulation 4 hereof, no practitioner whose license has been revoked under this regulation shall thereafter be deemed to be licensed under these regulations until he has made application for and obtained an actual license under the provisions of clauses (1) and (4) of Regulation 4 hereof.

REGULATION 6.—LICENSEES' RECORDS.

(1) Every licensee shall (subject to clause (2) of this regulation) keep in respect of any premises at which he is licensed to deal in dangerous drugs a Licensee's Register in the forms numbered respectively 7 (a) and 7 (b) in the First Schedule hereto, and shall enter therein with respect to all dangerous drugs produced, manufactured, sold, distributed, or otherwise dealt in by him at such premises the respective particulars indicated by those forms.

(2) Any licensee who is—

(a) A registered chemist keeping an open shop or place of business for the compounding and dispensing of prescriptions; or

(b) A Hospital Board, hospital manager, or dispenser, or similar officer; or

(c) A practitioner who dispenses his own medicines, and who in any case does not deal in any dangerous drug otherwise than by retail sale and by the compounding and dispensing of prescriptions containing dangerous drugs, may, instead of keeping a Register in the forms prescribed by clause (1) of this regulation, keep a Licensee's Register consisting of—

(i) A prescription-book wherein shall be entered a record of every sale of a dangerous drug and every prescription dispensed which contains any portion of a dangerous drug showing (a) The name and address of the person receiving the drug; (b) the name and address of the person prescribing the drug; (c) the proportion and total amount of the drug so dispensed; (d) the date on which the drug was delivered to the person receiving the drug; and

(ii) A Register in the form numbered 7 (c) in the First Schedule hereto wherein shall be entered with respect to all dangerous drugs sold, distributed, dispensed, or administered by him the particulars indicated by that form.

(3) Every licensee shall make the appropriate entries in the Licensee's Register on the day on which any respective drug was by him produced, manufactured, sold, distributed, or otherwise dealt with, as the case may require.

(4) No licensee shall make or cause or permit to be made in the Licensee's Register any entry which is untrue in any particular, unless the same is forthwith corrected as hereinafter provided, or obliterate or cancel or alter, or cause or permit to be obliterated or cancelled or altered, any entry made in the Licensee's Register:

Provided that any mistake in an entry may be corrected by a marginal note or footnote giving the correct particulars, and containing as a part of such note the date on which such note was written.

(5) Every licensee shall, within fourteen days after the close of each half-yearly period ending on the 31st day of March and the 30th day of September in every year, prepare and record stock-sheets of all dangerous drugs in his possession at the close of such half-yearly period, and a quantity stock account covering the half-yearly period since previous stock-taking, and enter thereon a proper explanation of any deficiency shown in such stock account.

(6) Every licensee who disposes of any dangerous drugs by way of wholesale—that is to say, to retailers, practitioners, hospitals, laboratories, or otherwise howsoever than solely by way of retail sale or supply to members of the public, including retail sale or supply of drugs compounded or dispensed, shall, within fourteen days after the close of each half-yearly period referred to in the last preceding clause hereof, prepare and forward to the Director-General a return in the form numbered 8 in the First Schedule hereto showing the total amount of each dangerous drug disposed of to every individual supplied during such half-yearly period.

(7) Every licensee shall keep the records required by this regulation in some place of security at the premises at which he is for the time being licensed to deal in dangerous drugs, and shall so keep every record for a period of one year following the date of the last entry made therein, save that if he shall cease to hold a license under these regulations he shall deliver such records to the Director-General for custody and destruction after the expiration of the said period of one year.

(8) Every licensee shall at all times permit any police officer or any officer of the Health Department to inspect the records referred to in this regulation and to make copies of any entries appearing therein.

REGULATION 7.—PRESCRIPTIONS FOR DANGEROUS DRUGS.

(1) Every prescription for the dispensing of a dangerous drug shall, except in the case of emergency referred to in clause (10) of this regulation—

- (a) Be in writing signed personally and with his usual signature (and otherwise than by means of a stamping contrivance) by a practitioner who has not been prohibited by notice under clause (11) of this regulation from issuing prescriptions for the dispensing of dangerous drugs;
- (b) Set out the date on which it is written;
- (c) Set out the address of the person by whom it is signed;
- (d) Set out the name and address of the person for whose use the prescription is given;
- (e) If given by a dentist bear the words "for local dental treatment only";
- (f) If given by a veterinary surgeon, bear the words "for animal treatment only";
- (g) Not be written in cipher;
- (h) Where it prescribes an unusual dose, or what may be regarded as a dangerous dose of any dangerous drug, have the amount of such dose emphasized by being underlined with the initials of the practitioner set in the margin opposite thereto.

(2) No person except a medical practitioner acting in a case of emergency under clause (10) of this regulation shall give a prescription for the supply of a dangerous drug which does not comply with the requirements of the last preceding clause hereof.

(3) No medical practitioner shall give a prescription for the supply of a dangerous drug otherwise than when required for the purposes of medical treatment.

(4) No dentist shall give a prescription for the supply of a dangerous drug otherwise than for the purposes of dental treatment.

(5) No veterinary surgeon shall give a prescription for the supply of a dangerous drug otherwise than for the purposes of animal treatment.

(6) No person shall supply any dangerous drug on more than one occasion on the same prescription:

Provided that if the medical practitioner signing a prescription so directs on the prescription, it may be supplied on not more than three occasions, at intervals to be specified on the prescription.

(7) No person shall dispense any dangerous drug pursuant to a prescription signed by a practitioner with whose signature he is not acquainted until he has satisfied himself that the signature is genuine.

(8) No person shall alter in any way any prescription appearing to be signed by a practitioner which purports to authorize or in such manner that the same purports to authorize the dispensing of any dangerous drug.

(9) No person shall dispense any dangerous drug pursuant to any written prescription except on condition that the prescription is retained by him, and every person so dispensing any dangerous drug shall mark on such prescription the date on which it was dispensed, and shall retain the prescription for a period of one year from that date on the premises at which it was dispensed, and shall at all times permit any police officer or any officer of the Health Department to inspect the same and make copies thereof.

(10) In cases of emergency a registered chemist may, at the direction of a medical practitioner personally known to him, supply to any person a dangerous drug which is dispensed pursuant to a prescription communicated by such medical practitioner orally or by telephone. Every medical practitioner who communicates orally

or by telephone to a registered chemist a prescription for the dispensing of a dangerous drug shall forthwith reduce such prescription to writing so as to comply with clause (1) of this regulation, and deliver the same to the registered chemist whom he authorized to dispense it, and such prescription and such registered chemist in respect thereof shall thereupon be subject to all the provisions of this regulation relating respectively to prescriptions for the dispensing of dangerous drugs and to the duties of persons in respect of such prescriptions.

(1) (a) On the recommendation of the Medical Council in the case of a medical practitioner and on the recommendation of the Director-General in the case of a dentist or veterinary surgeon, the Minister may, by notice under his hand published in the *Gazette*, prohibit any practitioner from issuing prescriptions for the dispensing of dangerous drugs.

(b) The Minister may at any time thereafter, on such respective recommendation as aforesaid, by a like notice withdraw such prohibition.

(c) After the publication of any such notice of prohibition it shall, unless the same has been withdrawn as aforesaid, be an offence for the practitioner named in such notice to issue a prescription for the dispensing of any dangerous drug or for any person to dispense a dangerous drug pursuant to a prescription signed by any practitioner so prohibited.

REGULATION 8.—SUPPLY AND POSSESSION OF DANGEROUS DRUGS.

(1) No person shall supply or procure or administer, or offer to supply or procure or administer, any dangerous drug to or for any person who is not a licensee under these regulations, except in the following cases:—

- (a) Where the drug is dispensed pursuant to a prescription which complies with the requirements of clause (1) of Regulation 7 hereof;
- (b) Where the drug is supplied by way of dispensing by a practitioner who dispenses his own medicines;
- (c) Where the drug is administered under the direct personal supervision of a medical practitioner or dentist in the course of his practice, or by a veterinary surgeon in the treatment of any animal;
- (d) Where the drug is dispensed in cases of emergency according to the provisions of clause (10) of Regulation 7 hereof;
- (e) Where the drug is supplied to a person in charge of a laboratory maintained for purpose of research or study at a university college or other institution approved by the Director-General or to a person engaged in the duties of an analyst under the Sale of Food and Drugs Act, 1908;
- (f) Where the preparation described in clause (1) of Regulation 9 hereof is administered by a registered chemist as first aid treatment in case of injury to the eye.

(2) No person shall supply any dangerous drug, other than a drug dispensed pursuant to a prescription under these regulations, otherwise than by personal delivery or delivery through the post or delivery through a common carrier, unless the person to whom he makes delivery has authority from the person to whom the drug is supplied to accept delivery on behalf of such last-named person.

(3) No person shall supply any dangerous drug dispensed pursuant to prescription otherwise than by personal delivery or delivery through the post or delivery through a common carrier to the person for whose use the prescription is given, unless the person to whom he makes delivery has authority from the person for whose use the prescription is given to accept delivery on behalf of such last-named person.

(4) No person shall supply any dangerous drug (whether compounded or dispensed, or otherwise) unless the package containing it is plainly marked with the name of such drug and the total amount thereof contained in such package:

Provided that this clause shall not apply to any preparation dispensed by a medical practitioner or dentist, or dispensed on the prescription of a medical practitioner or dentist.

(5) No person shall knowingly be in possession of, or attempt to obtain possession of, any dangerous drug unless—

- (a) He is licensed to import or export such drug; or
- (b) He is licensed to produce, manufacture, sell, distribute, or otherwise deal in such drug; or

- (c) He proves that the drug was supplied for his use or for the treatment of some animal under his care by a practitioner or pursuant to a prescription given by a practitioner in compliance with the provisions of Regulation 7 hereof:

Provided that the exemption contained in this paragraph shall not apply if such person is in course of being supplied with the same drug for the same purpose by any other practitioner, or pursuant to a prescription given by any other practitioner, and did not disclose that fact to the first-named practitioner before the supply of such drug by the first-named practitioner or before the giving by the first-named practitioner of the prescription pursuant to which he obtained possession of such drug; or

- (d) He is a person in charge of a laboratory maintained for purposes of research or study at a university college or other institution approved by the Director-General, or a person engaged in the duties of an analyst under the Sale of Food and Drugs Act, 1908, and (unless for the time being exempted from so doing by permission under the hand of the Director-General) keeps the Register required to be kept by a licensee under Regulation 6 hereof, and proves that the quantity of such drug obtained or in his possession was not greater than was necessary for the purposes of such laboratory or of his duties as an analyst as the case may be; or
- (e) His possession is for or on behalf of a person lawfully entitled to the possession of such drug.

REGULATION 9.—EXEMPTIONS.

(1) Notwithstanding anything contained in these regulations it shall be lawful for any occupier of a factory within the meaning of the Factories Act, 1921-22, to obtain from a licensee, without a prescription or other authorization, and to have in his possession at such factory, and for any licensee to supply to such occupier accordingly, and for such occupier or any person acting by his direction, to administer on the factory premises as first-aid treatment in case of injury to the eye a preparation consisting of an admixture of cocaine in castor oil with mercuric chloride in a proportion of not more than one part in 200 of cocaine and not less than one part in 3,000 of mercuric chloride.

(2) No person in possession of the preparation aforesaid by virtue of the authority conferred by this regulation shall use the same, or cause or permit the same to be used, for any purpose except for administration on the factory premises as first-aid treatment in cases of injury to the eye, or shall keep the same, or cause or permit the same to be kept, elsewhere than on the factory premises in a place of safety in the custody of the occupier or some responsible person nominated by the occupier, by nomination in writing kept at the factory, and available at any time for inspection by any police officer or officer of the Health Department.

(3) Notwithstanding anything contained in these regulations it shall be lawful for any person for the time being, approved in writing by the Director-General, engaged in dispensing medicine at any hospital or other institution under the control of a Hospital Board constituted under the Hospital and Charitable Institutions Act, 1926, or any separate institution under that Act, or any private hospital licensed under that Act or any institution maintained by the State, or any institution licensed under the Mental Defectives Act, 1911, to procure and be supplied with any dangerous drug, and to be in possession of any dangerous drug, and to administer any dangerous drug to any inmate or out-patient of such hospital or institution:

Provided that, unless for the time being exempted from so doing by permission under the hand of the Director-General, such person shall keep the Register required to be kept by a licensee under Regulation 6 hereof:

Provided also that this clause shall not authorize any person to be in possession of any dangerous drug except for the purpose of such administration as aforesaid, or to be in possession of a quantity of dangerous drugs in excess of the quantity reasonably necessary for the purposes of such administration as aforesaid.

(4) These regulations shall not apply to the preparations named in the Second Schedule hereto.

REGULATION 10.—PENALTIES.

(1) Any person committing a breach of these regulations which involves the unlawful supplying or procuring of any dangerous drug, or the unlawful offering to supply or procure any dangerous drug, shall, if he has previously been convicted of an offence against the said Act or these regulations involving unlawful supplying, procuring, or offering as aforesaid, be liable to a fine of £50 and imprisonment for a term of three months.

(2) Any person committing any other breach of these regulations shall be liable to a fine of £50.

NOTE.—The first half of the month was rather wet and stormy, while the latter half was remarkable for fine and mild conditions. At Karori Reservoir, near Kelburn, rainfall was 29 per cent. below the normal. Total bright sunshine, 122-1 hours, 41 per cent. of the possible, and one sunless day. A frost was recorded on the 18th, and fog was in evidence on four mornings. Mean dew-point at 9 a.m., 41-5°; and mean vapour pressure, 0-261 in.

SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF JULY, 1928.

There was a marked contrast as regards rainfall between the weather experienced during the month in the Auckland Province and that enjoyed by the remainder of the Dominion.

Except for part of the Bay of Plenty district the rainfall was considerably below normal over most of the northern province, and there were heavy floods in North Auckland and the Waikato and Waihou valleys.

Approximately average falls were received over much of northern Taranaki, Nelson, and Marlborough, and in parts of central and southern Otago and Southland the registrations were in excess of the average. In all other districts south of Auckland the month was a dry one. The shortage of rain was very pronounced in Canterbury, especially North Canterbury.

In the first half of the month there were some fairly general rainfalls, and the weather was at times stormy, but thereafter fine weather was the rule in all the central and southern provinces. In contrast with June, temperatures were everywhere remarkably mild. As a result there were not a few signs of spring amongst insect, bird, and plant life. Frosts were numerous in the South Island, but seldom severe, and there was marked absence of snowfall except at very high levels. Sunshine was more abundant than usual. The absence of westerly winds was no less marked than in the preceding months of the year.

There was a certain amount of growth of grass in many parts, and supplies of feed are generally good. Stock are in good condition, and lambing is proceeding satisfactorily in the earlier districts.

The rainfall of the month was associated chiefly with three cyclonic storms. The first of these moved from the Tasman Sea towards the Auckland Peninsula on the 7th, and moving thereafter in a more southerly direction crossed the South Island on the night of the 8th. General rain fell between the 7th and the 9th, with heavy falls in many parts. In North Auckland, where the precipitation was heaviest, there was heavy flooding in the rivers. Gales were caused in many places by this storm.

The second of the cyclones mentioned moved slowly from the North Tasman Sea and away eastward across the Auckland Peninsula between the 22nd and the 25th. On this occasion the heaviest rains fell in the Waihou and Waikato river valleys, and serious floods reached their culminating point on the 24th or 25th. In parts of the Waihou watershed the flood was a record one. At Waihi on the four days ending at 9 a.m. on the 25th a total rainfall of 19-80 inches was recorded. This storm produced comparatively little effect south of New Plymouth and Gisborne.

The third cyclone followed a somewhat similar track between the 29th and the 31st. It was of smaller area than the preceding ones, and its effects still more restricted. There were some heavy rainfalls, however, in the Thames, Coromandel, and East Cape districts, and rivers were kept in a flooded state till the end of the month.

Though each of these storms was responsible for gales in places, they were not as a rule prolonged, and comparatively little damage was done by them.

In the South Island the prevailing winds were from the south-west, and in exposed positions they were occasionally strong.
