And whereas the fee-simple of the land described in the Schedule hereto, being land heretofore held under renewable lease, has been acquired, and it is expedient that the said land should cease to be national-endowment land:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by the aforesaid section three hundred and two of the Land Act, 1924, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that from and after the seventh day of May, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight, the land described in the Schedule hereto, which was set apart as national-endowment land under the provisions of section two hundred and fifty-eight of the Land Act, 1908, shall cease to be national-endowment land.

WHEREAS by section one hundred and fifty-four of the Land Act, 1924, it is enacted that the Governor-General, by Proclamation, may from time to time declare any Crown lands within any mining district not held under lease or license, or for which a lease or license has been cancelled, to be open for disposal as provided in section one hundred and fifty-three of the said Act:

Now, therefore, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in exercise of the powers and authority conferred upon me by section one hundred and fifty-four of the said Act, and of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the lands described in the Schedule hereto shall be open on Tuesday, the fifteenth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine, for disposal on renewable lease, as provided in section one hundred and fifty-three of the said Act; and I do also declare that, for the purposes of section one hundred and thirty-three of the said Act, the lands described in the said Schedule hereto shall be deemed to be "heavy bush land."

And I do hereby provide that, after the first half-year's rent has been paid by the selector, the further instalments of rent payable by him for a period of four years shall not be demanded; provided that if at any time during the first five years of his occupancy the selector disposes of his interest in the land the rent so conceded shall be paid by him in full, and thereupon the Land Board may remit such instalments of rent payable by the incoming tenant, not exceeding in the aggregate the amount of rent previously conceded to the selector, as the Board thinks fit.

ON the recommendation of the Native Land Purchase Board, referred to in section three hundred and sixty-three of the Native Land Act, 1909, and in exercise of the power in this behalf conferred upon him by that section, and by section one hundred and eleven of the Native Land Amendment Act, 1913 (as amended by section eight of the Native Land Amendment and Native Land Claims Adjustment Act, 1916), His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby extend for a further period of eighteen months the Order in Council dated the twenty-third day of May, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven, and gazetted the twenty-sixth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven, but only in so far as it affects the Native lands specified in the Schedule hereto prohibiting all alienation other than alienation in favour of the Crown.

These sections form the third group to be offered of the Orakei Garden Suburb, situated on the Orakei Peninsula, within easy reach of Auckland City. The land is in grass, and from level to easy sloping, and several of the sections command unsurpassed views of the Auckland Harbour, Hauraki Gulf, and Rangitoto. The subdivision has been laid out on modern town-planning principles, with numerous reserves for the benefit of residents.

The formation of the roads fronting the sections offered, and the laying of the water-pipes has been completed. Sewerage-pipes have been laid to the sections west of Coates Avenue, and the laying of the sewerage pipes to the residue of the sections offered will be completed at an early date. Access is by way of the new waterfront road, which is open to the foot of the peninsula, or via Remuera and the Orakei Road, steps having already been taken towards the construction of a ferro-concrete bridge to replace the present wooden structure over the Orakei Creek.

When the railway is opened the subdivision will be within ten minutes journey of Auckland by either train or motor, and on account of the proximity to the city, and the views obtained, the sections are admirably suited for residential purposes.

Alterations to Scale of Charges in force upon the New Zealand Government Railways.

IN pursuance of all powers and authorities enabling me under the Government Railways Act, 1908, and its amendments, and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, I, Joseph Gordon Coates, Minister of Railways, do hereby make the following alterations in the scale of charges in force on the New Zealand Government Railways open for traffic made on the 10th day of August, 1925, and published in the *Gazette* of 11th August, 1925:—

PART 1.—PASSENGERS.

By adding to paragraph 2, Regulation 2, the following:—

(bb) Single tickets issued between two stations on separate sections of railway and which necessitate a sea journey will be available for one calendar month.

By adding to Regulation 11 the following:—

14A. Season tickets (Regulations 12, 13, 14, and 28) will be issued from any date in a month to include not less than the full month, quarter, half-year, or year following at a *pro rata* charge for the broken period being added to the charge for the succeeding month, quarter, half-year, or year, as the case may be. The fare for *pro rata* season tickets will be calculated as follows:—

Monthly tickets—1/30th of the monthly fare for each day in the unexpired portion of the broken calendar month covered by the ticket, plus the full fare for the succeeding month.

Quarterly tickets—1/90th of the quarterly fare for each day in the unexpired portion of the broken period covered by the ticket, plus the full fare for the succeeding quarter, and subject to the half-yearly fare as a maximum.

Half-yearly tickets—1/180th of the half-yearly fare for each day in the unexpired portion of the broken period, plus the full fare for the succeeding half-year, subject to the yearly fare as a maximum.

Yearly tickets—1/360th of the yearly fare for each day in the unexpired portion of the broken period, plus the full fare for the succeeding year.

By omitting from Regulation 23 the following:—

1. Annual tickets, tourist tickets, and season tickets do not entitle the holders thereof to travel by race or other special or excursion trains except when the ordinary trains are entirely suspended.

By adding to Regulation 24 the following:—

2A. Provided the other provisions of paragraph 1 of this regulation are complied with, school athletic teams which travel on the outward and homeward journey on the same day, and parties of school-children travelling for the purpose of holding picnics, may be issued with tickets at the day-excursion fares. In cases where the tickets are required for an availability in excess of one day the provisions of paragraph 2 of this regulation will be applicable.

LOCAL FARES AND REGULATIONS.

By adding to paragraph 4, Regulation 41, the following:—

(g) Tickets issued under the provisions of Regulations 9, 12, 14, 16, 19, 28, 39, and 40, available between Khandallah or Ngaio and Wellington (Thorndon) will be available for travel between Kaiwarra and Wellington (Lambton).

By omitting from Regulation 41 the following:—

5. (b) These tickets will be issued on Saturdays and Sundays as may from time to time be determined by the Department, and will be available for return up to and including the first following Monday in each case.

And substituting the following:—

5. (b) These tickets will also be issued from Wellington (Thorndon), Ngaio, and Khandallah to Tawa Flat, Porirua, Paremata, Plimmerton, Pukerua Bay, Paekakariki, Paraparaumu, Waikanae, Te Horo, and Otaki, and from Johnsonville to Plimmerton, Paekakariki, Paraparaumu, Waikanae, Te Horo, and Otaki, by trains leaving Wellington after 4 p.m. on Fridays. The tickets issued on Fridays will be available for return up to and including the first following Monday in each case.

5. (c) These tickets will be issued on Saturdays and Sundays as may from time to time be determined by the Department, and will be available for return up to and including the first following Monday in each case.

PART II.—LUGGAGE, PARCELS, HORSES, ETC.

By omitting Regulation 12 :—

12. Parcels for Distribution at Destination.

1. When more parcels or articles than one, whether loose or packed in hampers, crates, cases, or other packing, fastening, or container, are consigned from a forwarding agency or express company to a forwarding agency or express company, and such package or packages are for distribution at the destination station, the charges will be computed on the total weight of such consignment at double the ordinary rate applicable thereto.

2. The onus of proving that consignments are not forwarded to an agency for distribution rests with the consignor in each case.

3. For the purposes of this regulation the words "forwarding agency or express company" shall mean and include any person, firm, or company by whom or to whom goods intended for distribution are consigned (whether generally or in the particular case), and such person, firm, or company merely acts in the capacity of agent for the purpose of distribution or for the purpose of consigning for distribution.

4. Where a *bona fide* trading firm (not being a forwarding agency) consigns goods to itself, its branch, or its representative, in the ordinary course of its business, whether such goods are to be held as stock or are for delivery to its customers, the ordinary rate shall apply, and not the rate provided in paragraph 1 of this regulation.

5. Where an express company or forwarding agency consigns goods to a *bona fide* trading firm (not being a forwarding agency) or receives goods consigned from a *bona fide* trading firm (not being a forwarding agency) the ordinary rate shall apply, and not the rate as provided in paragraph 1 of this regulation.

6. Goods intended for conveyance under the provisions of paragraphs 4 and 5 of this regulation shall be delivered to the Railway Department as a single consignment, and any such consignment accepted for conveyance shall be taken delivery of at the destination station in a like manner. Delivery shall not, in any circumstances, be split to permit of distribution being made direct from the railway premises.

By omitting from paragraph 16, Regulation 15, the following :—

(f) Racehorses, hunters, or polo-ponies, which on the outward journey have been conveyed in Ug trucks by express, mail, or passenger trains will, when returning from the races, hunt club meeting, or polo-match by other than express, mail, or passenger trains be conveyed at half rates under the same conditions as horses conveyed by other than express, mail, or passenger trains. When horses or ponies have been conveyed on the outward journey by ordinary trains, and are returned by express, mail, or passenger trains, a refund of half the amount paid for the outward journey will be made.

And substituting the following :—

(f) Racehorses, hunters, or polo-ponies, which on the outward journey have been conveyed in Ug trucks by express, mail, or passenger trains will, when returning from the races, hunt club meeting, or polo-match by other than express, mail, or passenger trains, be conveyed at half rates, under the same conditions as horses conveyed by other than express, mail, or passenger trains. When horses or ponies have been conveyed on the outward journey by ordinary trains and are returned by express, mail, or passenger trains, full rates will be charged for the return journey less half the amount of the railage paid in respect of the outward journey.

PART III.—GOODS.

By omitting the word "bone-char" after the words "in each case for bones" in the first line of paragraph 3 of Regulation 11.

By omitting from Regulation 13 the following :—

The word "exclusively" from the third line in subparagraph (c), paragraph 1.

3. Without prejudice to its ordinary meaning, the term "farmers" includes, for the purpose of this regulation, *bona fide* orchardists, nurserymen, and market-gardeners.

And substituting the following :—

3. *Bona fide* farmer means any person, company, or institution engaged in farming operations, the receipts from which form the principal source of income, and includes an orchardist, nurseryman, or market-gardener; also any educational institution whose curriculum requires the carrying on of farming for the purpose of instructing its students.

1. 4. Where a *bona fide* trading firm (not being a forwarding agency) consigns goods to itself, its branch, or its representative, in the ordinary course of its business, whether such goods are to be held as stock or are for delivery to its customers, the classified or local rate, as the case may be, shall apply, and not the rate provided in paragraph 1 of this regulation.

5. Where an express company or forwarding agency consigns goods to a *bona fide* trading firm (not being a forwarding agency), or receives goods consigned from a *bona fide* trading firm (not being a forwarding agency), the classified or local rate, as the case may be, shall apply, and not the rate as provided in paragraph 1 of this regulation.

6. Goods intended for conveyance under the provisions of paragraphs 4 and 5 of this regulation shall be delivered to the Railway Department as a single consignment, and any such consignment accepted for conveyance shall be taken delivery of at the destination station in a like manner. Delivery shall not, in any circumstances, be split to permit of distribution being made direct from the railway premises.

By adding to Regulation 41 the following:—

5A. Artificial manure carried under the provisions of this regulation must be for use in manuring farm-lands within the Dominion of New Zealand.

Notice to Persons in whom is vested Ecclesiastical Authority over Religious Bodies.

THE attention of the persons or person within the Dominion of New Zealand in whom is vested ecclesiastical authority over any of the religious bodies enumerated in the Third Schedule annexed to an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand intitled the Marriage Act, 1908, and of all other persons concerned, is directed to the 11th section of the above-mentioned Act, requiring the several ecclesiastical authorities as aforesaid to send in to the Registrar-General, in the month of December in every year, a correct list of their Officiating Ministers within the meaning of the Marriage Act, 1908, of each of the said religious bodies.

The following are the religious bodies above referred to:—

The Church of the Province of New Zealand, commonly called the Church of England.

The Presbyterian Church of New Zealand.

The Roman Catholic Church.

The Methodist Church of New Zealand.

All Congregational Independents.

Baptists.

The Lutheran Church.

All Hebrew Congregations.

The Society of Friends.

The Salvation Army.

In default of any person having ecclesiastical authority over any of the religious bodies named above, the name of the Officiating Minister of any congregation of such religious body may be certified to by two recognized office-bearers thereof.

A minister of religion not connected with any of the aforesaid bodies must send to the Registrar-General in the month of December in each year a certificate signed—

(a) By the recognized head in New Zealand of the religious body to which he belongs; or

(b) By two duly recognized ministers of such religious body; or

(c) By ten adult members thereof, who append to their signatures their description as being such members, declaring that such minister is their Officiating Minister, the said signatures and descriptions being attested by some person who shall verify the signatures to the certificate as the genuine signatures of the persons whose they purport to be, by a statutory declaration signed by such person and appended to the certificate.

In each case enumerated under paragraphs (a), (b), and (c) above, the Minister of Internal Affairs must be satisfied that the body of persons named in the certificate is a religious body, and that the applicant is a minister of religion and is a person of good character and otherwise qualified to act as an Officiating Minister. In the case of the religious body known as "Brethren" a special form of certificate will be supplied on application.

Neglect in sending the certificate will deprive the minister of his status as an Officiating Minister under the Marriage Act.

N.B.—It is requested that the *Christian names* and the *addresses* of the several ministers may be specified in the lists sent in to the Registrar-General.

In order to obviate the necessity for further inquiry, it is also requested that the reason for omitting the name of any minister be stated (such as on account of death, absence from New Zealand, or as the case may be).
