A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by section three hundred and two of the Land Act, 1924, as amended by section ten of the Land Laws Amendment Act, 1926, it is enacted that on the disposal of any national-endowment land by way of sale, or on the acquisition of the fee-simple of any such land, the Governor-General may by Proclamation declare that such land shall, as from a date to be specified in the Proclamation, cease to be national-endowment land:

And whereas the fee-simple of the land described in the Schedule hereto, being land heretofore held under renewable lease, has been acquired, and it is expedient that the said land should cease to be national-endowment land:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by the aforesaid section three hundred and two of the Land Act, 1924, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that from and after the twentieth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight, the land described in the Schedule hereto, which was set apart as national-endowment land under the provisions of section two hundred and fifty-eight of the Land Act, 1908, shall cease to be national-endowment land.

shall determine the election by lot. The Secretary of the Board shall forthwith submit to the Native Minister the name and description of the member so elected. The member elected to be Chairman shall preside over the meeting of the Board at which he has been elected, but shall not otherwise act as Chairman until his election shall have been approved by the Native Minister.

32. (1) The Board may from time to time, with the approval of the Native Minister, appoint some fit and proper person to be the Secretary of the Board and with the like approval may at any time remove any such Secretary.

(2) The Secretary of the Board shall be deemed to be the servant of the Board, and shall receive such salary or other remuneration as the Board, with the approval of the Native Minister, shall determine.

(3) The Secretary shall have all such powers and duties as the Board shall determine, and he shall at all times conform to the direction of the Board in that behalf.

33. The Board may from time to time appoint such other officers and workmen of the Board as shall be found necessary and expedient for the proper carrying out of the business of the Board.

(a) The amount paid by the Crown to the owners of such land for the fee-simple estate thereof.

(b) Two and one-half per centum of the amount so paid to cover costs of acquisition by the Crown: Provided that the amount chargeable under this paragraph shall not exceed £50 nor be less than £5.

(c) The amount, if any, by which interest on the sum fixed by (a) hereof at the rate of 5 per centum per annum from the respective date or dates of payment thereof by the Crown until date of notice of price given to the lessee by the Commissioner exceeds the amount of rent paid or payable to the Crown during this period under any such lease of such land that has been in existence during such period, or such lesser amount in respect of such excess as may in special circumstances be fixed by the Land Board with the approval of the Minister of Lands.

Education Act, 1914.—Amended Regulations.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him by the Education Act, 1914, and the amendments of that Act, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the regulations relating to attendance register and returns and average attendances, made by Orders in Council dated 21st December, 1914, 10th September, 1923, 22nd March, 1926, 13th April, 1927, and 13th December, 1927, and also the regulation relating to the average attendance of secondary schools made by Order in Council dated 5th September, 1911, and in lieu thereof doth make the regulations set out in the First and Second Schedules hereto; and, with the like advice and consent, doth hereby amend the regulations relating to salaries, grading, and staffing of public schools made by Orders in Council dated 12th January, 1925, 28th October, 1925, 22nd March, 1926, 13th April, 1927, 22nd August, 1927, and 30th December, 1927, in the manner set forth in the Third Schedule hereto; and, further, doth hereby make the regulations set forth in the Fourth Schedule hereto relating to architectural bursaries; and, with the like advice and consent, doth prescribe that except where stated to the contrary, this Order shall come into force on the 1st day of January, 1929.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

ATTENDANCE REGISTERS, RETURNS, AND AVERAGE ATTENDANCE.

1. ATTENDANCE REGISTERS AND RETURNS.

1. (1) The following attendance registers shall be kept by the head teacher of every public school in the forms provided by the Department, and shall contain the information set out below, together with such further particulars regarding the admission, attendance, progress, and withdrawal of the pupils of the school as are required by the registers:—

- (a) An admission register showing the dates of birth, admission, and withdrawal of each pupil:
- (b) A register of daily attendance showing, with respect to all pupils not under school age, a record of their attendances for every half-day on which the school is open and the total attendances on each half-day:
- (c) A summary of attendance register showing the total and average weekly attendances and roll numbers, and the average attendance for each term.

(2) All registers must be carefully preserved by the head teacher until their destruction is authorized by the Minister.

2. (1) The attendance of scholars in every school shall be recorded every morning and every afternoon in the daily-attendance register, which shall be marked not later than two hours before the close of morning school nor later than one hour and a half before the close of afternoon school. The register shall be marked and kept in accordance with the directions printed thereon.

(2) The attendance of a child at morning school shall be reckoned as one attendance, and the attendance of a child at afternoon school shall be reckoned as one attendance, and a school open in the morning and open in the afternoon shall be deemed to have been open twice. The school shall be held to be open on any morning or afternoon if at least one child is present before the first half-hour of the ordinary school time has passed.

3. For the purpose of recording attendances of pupils the school year shall be divided into three terms, ending not later than 15th May, 31st August, and 31st December, respectively.

4. The average attendance for any term, or any lesser period, shall be ascertained by first throwing out of account what shall be called "excepted half-days" — that is, every morning and every afternoon on which the attendances have numbered less than three-quarters of the number of pupils belonging at the time to the school—and by throwing out of account also the attendances of every such morning and afternoon, and then by dividing the remaining number of attendances by the remaining number of half-days.

5. All the teachers on the staff of a school shall assist in keeping the registers and in making up summaries of attendances for each week and each quarter, and any carelessness or inaccuracy on the part of any teacher in recording attendances shall be regarded as a serious dereliction of duties.

6. (1) If any child whose name is entered upon the register of attendance of any school is attending at an examination conducted by the Department, or the Education Board, or the University of New Zealand, or at a recognized class for manual instruction, then the time necessarily spent by such child at such examination or class, or in travelling thereto, shall be reckoned as time spent in attendance at such school; and the head teacher thereof shall ascertain the number of half-day attendances to be recorded for such child on account of such examination or class as aforesaid, and shall add the total of such attendances to the total of those previously entered in the register of attendance belonging to the said school.

(2) In like manner the time spent by any pupil, not exceeding one day at a time, in receiving dental treatment shall be reckoned as attendance at school, provided such pupil produces the necessary written authority from a dental officer or dental practitioner for absence and attends school whenever practicable during the remaining portion of the morning or afternoon. Every authority for absence under this subclause shall show the day and the hour at which the examination or treatment is made, and likewise the time when it is completed. Attendances so recorded shall be marked in the daily register thus: *d/*, or */d*, or *d*, or in a similar distinct manner. For the purposes of verification all certificates of absence provided under this subclause shall be filed in the school.

7. On the day on which the head teacher of a school first knows that a pupil has been definitely removed from his school, such head teacher shall record the removal in the admission register and in the register of daily attendance. He shall record also that a pupil has left the school when such pupil has been absent for any period of thirty consecutive school days, unless the head teacher has been definitely informed that such absence is only temporary. Such pupils shall forthwith be considered as ceasing to belong to the school, and in any computation of average attendance for any period thereafter their names shall not be taken into account in any way.

8. (1) The head teacher of every school shall, within three days after the end of each term, send to the Education Board, on the form provided by the Department, a return of attendance for such school for the term.

(2) The Education Board of each district shall send to the Director of Education, before the expiry of one month after the end of each term, on the form provided by the Department, a statement of the attendances for the term for all the schools in the district.

2. AVERAGE ATTENDANCE.

9. (1) The yearly average attendance for any school or department thereof shall be the mean of the average attendances thereat for the three terms of the year ending 31st August:

Provided that if the average attendance at any such school or department for any one term is such as to make the yearly average attendance less than the minimum of the grade or subgrade in which the school or department would be placed if it were graded on the mean of the average attendances for the other two terms, then the mean of average attendances for the last-named two terms may, at the discretion of the Board, be deemed to be the yearly average attendance for such school or department:

Provided further that if it is shown to the satisfaction of the Minister, on the certificate of the District Health Officer, or of a Schools Medical Officer, or of the Secretary of the Board upon information supplied by the head teacher, that an infectious disease of an epidemic character has during one or two terms been locally prevalent to the extent of affecting 10 per cent. or more of the children in any school or department, or if it is shown to the satisfaction of the Minister that exceptionally severe weather or other cause has similarly affected the attendance, then the mean of the average attendance for the remaining two terms or the average attendance for the remaining term shall be deemed to be the yearly average attendance for such school or department.

(2) The yearly average attendance so determined shall be the average attendance on which shall be based the grading, staffs, and salaries of schools, and the payments to Education Boards for incidental allowances of School Committees from the 1st February following :

Provided that until 1st February, 1930, the schools shall be graded on the yearly average attendance determined in accordance with the regulations previously in force.

(3) In order to ascertain the average attendance for the year ending 31st August, 1929, the average for the quarter ending 31st December, 1928, shall be substituted in the preceding subclauses of this clause for the average attendance for the third term of 1928.

10. (1) The average attendance for any education district for any term shall be the total of the average attendances of all the schools in such district for that term.

(2) The yearly average attendance for any district for the purposes of subsection (1) of section 6 of the Education Act, 1914, shall be the mean of the average attendances for such district for the three terms ending 31st December in each year.

11. In the case of a new school the mean of the average attendances for the terms of the year ending 31st August in which the school has been open continuously for not less than one term shall be deemed to be the yearly average attendance for such year; but the average attendance for any period before the term during the whole of which the school is open shall not be taken into account in calculating the yearly average attendance. A school that is reopened shall be deemed to be a new school if it has been closed for more than six months immediately preceding such re-opening.

12. In the case of the opening of a new school, or in the case of the closing of a school, if such school is open for less than half the number of school days in the first or last term (as the case may be) in which the school is open, then in computing the average attendance for the education district for such term the average attendance at the said school shall not be taken into account.

13. When during any year—

(a) A main and a side school are separated and established as mixed or separate schools :

(b) A side school is attached to a main school :

(c) Two or more full-time schools are established as a group of part-time schools :

(d) A part-time school is established as a full-time school :

(e) A public school is established as a district high school :

(f) The attendance of one or more schools is affected by the consolidation of two or more schools or by the opening of a school in a new building on a new site, or by other causes approved for the purpose by the Minister :

then, in any of these cases, the school or group of schools so established shall be deemed to be a new school.

14. The average attendance of a side school or of a part-time school shall be calculated for all purposes for which it is required under the Act in the same way as the average attendance of a mixed or separate school.

15. The provisions of clauses 1, 2, 3, 4, and 8 of the regulations in this Schedule shall apply to schools registered as primary schools under section 7 of the Education Amendment Act, 1921-22.

16. Should any dispute or difficulty arise respecting the meaning or effect of the regulations in this Schedule, such dispute or difficulty shall be submitted to the Minister, whose decision thereon shall be final and conclusive.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

AVERAGE ATTENDANCE OF SECONDARY SCHOOLS.

THE number of pupils in average attendance at any Secondary school, on the basis of which moneys are payable from the secondary Education Endowments Deposit Account for any provincial district to the governing bodies of the secondary schools in that district, in accordance with subsection (3) of section 30 of the Education Reserves Act, 1928, shall be the mean of the average attendances of such school for the school terms during the whole of which the school has been open in the year ending 31st December immediately preceding the date of payment of the money from the Public Account: Provided that, in the case of the opening of a new school during any year, the average attendance shall be regarded as nil till the school has been open for a whole term, and that thereafter, up till the

31st December following, the average attendance shall be the average attendance for the term or the mean of the average attendances for the terms during the whole of which the school has been open.

THIRD SCHEDULE.

PUBLIC SCHOOLS: SALARIES, GRADING, STAFFING, ETC.

THE regulations relating to salaries, grading, and staffing of public schools made by Orders in Council dated 12th January, 1925, 28th October, 1925, 22nd March, 1926, 13th April, 1927, 22nd August, 1927, and 13th December, 1927, are hereby amended as follows:—

1. By deleting subclause (2) of clause 10 thereof and substituting the following:—

(2) Subject to the provisions of clause 16 hereof, the average attendance on which the amount payable from 1st February in any year for or on account of the salary of the teacher of a school of Grade 0 shall be determined shall be the average attendance for the current term or the yearly average attendance for the preceding year, whichever is the higher, provided that the salary for the month of January shall be at the same rate as for the preceding month.

2. By deleting from clause 18 the words "quarterly average attendance of a school," and substituting "average attendance of a school for any term."

3. By deleting from clause 21 thereof the words "30th September" wherever they occur, and substituting "31st August."

4. By deleting clause 22 and substituting:—

"If at the beginning of any term it appears that a school in Grade 0 has an average attendance for the last preceding term of not less than eleven or for each of two terms immediately preceding of not less than ten (as the case may be) the school may, at the discretion of the Board, be placed in Grade 1."

5. (a) By deleting from clauses 23, 29, and from the proviso to clause 30 the word "quarter" wherever it occurs, and substituting the word "term."

(b) By deleting from clause 23 the words "quarterly average attendances for the several quarters," and substituting "average attendances for the several terms."

6. By deleting from clause 29 the words "averages for two consecutive quarters are both," and substituting "the mean average attendance for two consecutive terms is."

7. By deleting from clause 30 the word "quarters," and substituting "terms."

FOURTH SCHEDULE.

ARCHITECTURAL BURSARIES.

1. THE Director of Education (hereinafter referred to as "the Director") may award an architectural bursary, tenable at any school of architecture recognized by the University of New Zealand, to any person who has satisfied all the following conditions,—namely, that—

(1) He is not over the age of twenty years on the last date on which applications for a bursary are receivable (namely, the 1st day of March in each year);

(2) He has passed the Matriculation Examination of the University of New Zealand, and has obtained at such examination not less than 45 per cent. of the maximum number of marks assigned in each of the subjects (a) physics and (b) drawing; and

(3) (a) He has satisfactorily completed at a technical school in New Zealand an approved course in Carpentry and Building Construction occupying not less than four continuous years and not less than four hundred hours in each year: Provided that the Director may, in his discretion, accept in lieu of the aforesaid course in a technical school an approved course of at least four years of secondary education, of which not less than two years and not less than fourteen hundred hours have been occupied in a Carpentry and Building Construction course; or

(b) (i) He has satisfactorily completed at a technical school in New Zealand an approved preparatory course in Carpentry and Building Construction occupying not less than two continuous years and not less than four hundred hours in each year; and (ii) he has, further, in succession thereto, satisfactorily completed an intermediate course in Carpentry and Building Con-

struction at recognized technical classes occupying not less than three continuous years and not less than one hundred and fifty hours in each year; and (iii) he has served as an apprentice or pupil in some branch of the building trade or in the office of a registered architect for a period of not less than three years.

- (4) He has been resident in New Zealand for one year immediately preceding the date of application for a bursary.
- (5) He has been recommended by the Principal of a technical school or secondary school in New Zealand as being worthy of holding a bursary.
- (6) He produces satisfactory evidence as to character and health.
- (7) He has entered, by his parent or guardian or some other person approved by the Director, into a bond with His Majesty the King to repay to His Majesty the amount paid in allowances and fees in respect to his bursary in case he should fail to complete satisfactorily the prescribed course.

2. An application for a bursary shall be made on the form provided, and shall be sent, together with the necessary certificates, so as to be received by the Director of Education, Wellington, on or before the 1st day of March in any year; and the applications must be supported by a recommendation from the Principal of the school attended.

The Director shall consider the applications for bursaries and award not more than three in each year to those applicants whom he considers are best qualified.

3. The term of a bursary shall be three years, if the holder so long fulfils the prescribed conditions: Provided that, on the recommendation of the Professorial Board of the college attended, the Director may extend the term for one year longer.

4. The holder of a bursary shall enter on the degree course at a school of architecture recognized by the University of New Zealand.

5. The bursary must be held continuously, except in the case of illness or special circumstances approved by the Director.

6. An Architectural Bursary shall not be tenable with a University Junior Scholarship, a University National Scholarship, a New Zealand University Bursary, or any other scholarship, exhibition, or bursary, or combination thereof, which may have been granted to the applicant for the purpose of providing free university education; nor shall an Architectural Bursary be held after the tenure of one of these scholarships or bursaries unless in special circumstances to be approved by the Director.

7. (a) There shall be paid to or on behalf of each holder of a bursary the amount of the tuition fees payable by him in respect of the University course taken by him with the approval of the Director, provided that, except in special cases approved by the Director, not more than one year's fees shall be payable with respect to any subject at the same grade.

(b) If, in the opinion of the Director, the holder of a bursary is obliged to live away from his home or his usual place of residence in order to prosecute his studies he shall, in addition to the fees as aforesaid, receive an allowance at the rate of £50 per annum.

(c) To the holder of a bursary who lives at home, but is obliged to travel more than four miles each way in order to attend the classes, there may be paid the amount up to a maximum of £10 by which his actual and reasonable travelling-expenses exceed £4 per annum.

8. Unless on the report of the Chairman of the Professorial Board or of the Principal of the institution at which the bursary is held it is shown to the satisfaction of the Director of Education that the holder of a bursary has regularly attended the classes in the course approved for him as described in clause 4 hereof, has made satisfactory progress in the work of these classes, and has kept terms in the subjects and passed the University examinations (if any) required by the course, the bursary shall forthwith be determined, provided that the bursary may be continued if the Director is satisfied that any failure in attendance, diligence, or progress was due to illness or other sufficient cause. On such determination the holder shall, if the Director so requires, refund the fees and allowances already paid on his behalf.

9. On receipt of an unfavourable report on the attendance, diligence, or progress of the holder of a bursary from the Chairman of the Professorial Board concerned, or the Principal of the institution at which the bursary is held, the Director of Education may at any time determine the tenure of the bursary, and require the holder thereof to refund the fees already paid on his behalf.

And whereas section eleven of the said Act provides that the Governor-General in Council, in giving his consent to the borrowing of moneys by the local authority, may impose such conditions with respect to the time at which such moneys may be borrowed, the rate of interest that may be paid in respect thereto, the term for which they may be borrowed, and provisions for repayment thereof as he thinks fit, and that it shall not be lawful for the local authority to borrow such moneys save in accordance with the conditions so imposed :

And whereas the several local authorities mentioned in the Schedule hereto are desirous of raising the respective amounts set out opposite their names therein :

And whereas the provisions of the said Act have been duly complied with, and it is expedient that the aforesaid precedent consent should be given to the raising of the loans on the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by the said Act and by section one hundred and fourteen of the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1926, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby consent to the raising by the respective local authorities whose names are set out in the Second Column of the said Schedule of the loans referred to in the Third Column of the said Schedule up to the respective amounts set out in the Fourth Column of the said Schedule, for the respective terms set out in the Fifth Column of the said Schedule at rates of interest being such as shall not produce to the lenders rates exceeding the respective rates specified in the Sixth Column of the said Schedule, subject to the condition that the respective local authorities shall before borrowing the said respective sums, or any part thereof, make provision for the repayment thereof by establishing a sinking fund under the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1926, and by making to such sinking fund payments at intervals of not more than one year at a rate or rates which shall be not less than the respective rates per centum set out in the Seventh Column of the said Schedule, such payments to be made in respect of every part of the said respective sums for the time being so borrowed and not repaid, and the first payment to be made not later than one year after the first day from which interest to the lender is computed on any moneys so borrowed, and subject to the further condition that in no case shall any portion of interest or sinking fund be paid out of loan-moneys.

WHEREAS it is provided by section one hundred and fifty-one of the Hospitals and Charitable Institutions Act, 1926 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), that the Governor-General may from time to time by Order in Council make all such regulations consistent with the said Act as he thinks necessary or expedient for carrying into full effect the provisions thereof :

And whereas by subsection one of section thirty-eight of the said Act it is enacted that no appointment of any medical officer (including an honorary medical officer), or of a matron, master, manager, or engineer of an institution under this Act, or of the Secretary of the Board, shall be made until the expiration of twenty-one days after the Minister has been notified of the intention to make such appointment, unless the Minister has previously approved a proposal to make such appointment.

And whereas by subsection two of the said section thirty-eight it is further enacted that, before notifying to the Minister its intention to make any appointment as aforesaid, the Board shall forward to the Minister a list of the applicants :

And whereas it is thought expedient that regulations should be made providing for the manner in which persons may become applicants for appointment as aforesaid :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by the said Act, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the regulations hereinafter set forth.

REGULATIONS.

1. In order that persons may become applicants for appointment to any position to which section 38 of the Hospitals and Charitable Institutions Act, 1926, relates every Hospital Board intending to make any such appointment shall, by resolution duly passed, fix or approve of all terms of employment (including remuneration), subject to which such appointment is to be made.

2. The Board shall thereafter give public notice of its intention, and such notice shall describe the position to which it is intended to make an appointment, and shall invite applications for appointment to such position, and shall set out the official description and address of the person to whom applications are to be sent and the last date for receiving applications, and shall contain an intimation that intending applicants may obtain from the Board particulars of the terms of employment.

3. The last date for receiving applications to be so stated shall be not less than fourteen days after the last date on which the said notice is published in compliance with the succeeding clauses hereof.

4. The said notice shall be published at least once in each of four daily newspapers published respectively in Auckland, Wellington, Christchurch, and Dunedin.

5. If the institution or office to which the proposed appointment is to be made is controlled by a Hospital Board, and its principal office is elsewhere than in one of the Cities of Auckland, Wellington, Christchurch, and Dunedin, the said notice shall also be published at least once in some newspaper circulating in the locality in which such institution or such office is situated, other than a newspaper published in Auckland, Wellington, Christchurch, or Dunedin.

6. The Board shall, on request made prior to the last date for receiving applications, forthwith furnish any intending applicant with particulars of the terms of employment fixed or approved by resolution as aforesaid.

7. In the case of an intended appointment of a part-time medical officer or in any other case in which the Minister thinks compliance with the foregoing regulations or any of them to be unnecessary the Minister may, by writing under his hand addressed to a Board, exempt such Board from compliance either wholly or in part with the requirements of these regulations.

The total live births registered for the urban areas amounted to 1,082 as against 1,145 in October, a decrease of 63. The deaths in November were 514—a decrease of 95 as compared with the previous month. Of the total deaths males contributed 279, females 235. Sixty-two of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 12.06 per cent. of the whole number. Fifty-seven of these were under one year of age.

NOTE.—A mild month, with strong north-westerly winds prevailing. Precipitation at Karori Reservoir, near Kelburn, was 39 per cent. above the mean. Total bright sunshine, 174.6 hours, 43 per cent. of the possible, and three sunless days. Fog was in evidence on the 19th, and thunder and lightning on the 8th. Hail fell on the 8th, 13th, and 14th. Mean dew-point, 47.5°; and mean elastic force of vapour, 0.328 in.

SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF OCTOBER, 1928.

October was characterized by rains in excess of the average in all parts of the Dominion. In most districts the excess was considerable, and, from the agriculturalist's point of view, the position for the coming season is most promising. The heavy falls towards the end of the month, especially, were of great value to the East Coast provinces where a dry spell had previously been experienced. In parts of the South Island the absence of sunshine following on the cold and dry conditions in September prevented any rapid growth of vegetation, but in most districts feed is abundant and in excellent condition. Lambing has, on the whole, been very satisfactory. Warm, sunny days in November are now required in order to ensure the best returns from the soil.

Although the rainfall was, on the average, above normal in all districts, there were isolated stations on both east and west coasts where slight deficiencies were reported. The greatest excesses occurred in the high country of the South Island and in Central Otago where some stations had more than double the average. Hanmer Springs recorded 11.58 in., compared with an average of 3.31 in. Of the North Island provinces, Wellington had the greatest excess, while among individual stations Tauranga was outstanding with double its average fall.

Temperatures were, on the whole, mild, and the few cold spells were of too short a duration to have a serious effect on vegetation. A few inland frosts occurred about the middle of the month, one on the 15th doing some damage to early-sown crops.

For the greater part of the month, unsettled, and frequently stormy, weather prevailed. Depressions were numerous and mainly of the westerly type. During the first ten days the westerly weather was particularly strongly developed, and gales from between north and west were of almost daily occurrence. The most violent were on the 5th, 6th, and 8th, and on the first two days much damage was done to buildings, fences, and trees in South Canterbury, the wind on the evening of the 6th being considered the severest experienced for many years in that district. Heavy rains fell in the ranges of the South Island. High levels were reached by the southern lakes, especially Lake Wakatipu, while many of the rivers were in flood. An unusual number of thunderstorms were recorded. In the East Coast districts warm and dry conditions predominated during this period.

A most interesting phenomenon associated with the strong winds between the 6th and 8th was that they transported enormous quantities of dust from Australia. Deposits of varying thickness were reported from almost all districts south from New Plymouth and Napier. In Otago and Southland the deposition occurred mainly on the 6th, and was particularly heavy. Snow on the mountains was tinted to a pale chocolate colour. The time of arrival of the dust clouds became later and later as the distance from the southern extremity increased. Dust transported from Australia has been noted previously in New Zealand, but on this occasion the phenomenon was on a far greater scale and a special investigation of it is being undertaken.

First northerly, and then southerly gales were associated with an intense depression which crossed the Dominion on the 13th. Hail fell in places, and the ranges of the South Island received falls of snow.

From the 21st to the 26th and during the last three days of the month the weather was controlled by intense cyclonic disturbances. Except on the 28th, conditions were extremely unsettled, with general rains. South to south-east gales and very cold weather occurred at many places on the 30th and 31st. Heavy rains fell in the East Coast districts, and there was some flooding in the North Island and in Canterbury North and Marlborough. In the Manawatu and Wairapa districts the floods assumed serious proportions, and much of the low-lying country was under water. The cold temperatures were responsible for some losses of shorn sheep.

Classification of Assistant Teachers in Technical Schools and of Manual-training Teachers.

THE following lists of assistant teachers employed in technical schools, and recognized technical classes, and recognized manual-training classes, or classified for employment in such schools or classes, are issued under the authority of the Minister of Education, in accordance with the regulations relating to technical schools, recognized technical classes, and recognized manual-training classes, made by Order in Council dated the 20th November, 1925.

Under the heading "Division" is shown the division and class in which the teacher is classified.

The class of salary corresponding with the class and division in which the teacher is placed is given in the Schedule to the aforementioned regulations.

Attention is drawn to the regulations relating to appeals of teachers against their classification and grading, under which any teacher who considers he has good grounds for objection to his classification may lodge an appeal to reach the Director of Education not later than forty clear days after the publication of this list in the *New Zealand Gazette*—i.e., such appeals must reach the Director not later than the 22nd January, 1929, and must contain an explicit statement of the grounds on which the appeal is based.

NOTE.—In the last column of the classification list T.S. stands for "Technical School," E.B. for "Education Board," S. of A. for "School of Art," and J.H.S. for "Junior High School."

Open Season for Deer (Wapiti) Shooting, Southland Acclimatization District (Fiordland National Park).

IN exercise of the powers vested in me by the Animals Protection and Game Act, 1921-22, I, Philip Aldborough de la Perrelle, Minister of Internal Affairs of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby declare the period from the 1st day of March, 1929, to the 31st day of May, 1929 (both days inclusive), to be an open season in the Southland Acclimatization District for the taking or killing of the following imported game—viz., wapiti—within that part of the said acclimatization district described in the First Schedule hereto, being the areas hereinafter described as Blocks Nos. 1, 2, and 3, subject to the following conditions.

CONDITIONS.

1. LICENSES to take or kill wapiti stags may be issued by the Chief Postmaster, Invercargill, on the recommendation of the secretary of the Southland Acclimatization Society, on payment of a license fee of £10, in the form prescribed in the Schedule hereto, and subject to the said Act and regulations thereunder and this notification. The number of such licenses shall not exceed six, of which not more than two shall be issued for each block: Provided that not more than one such license shall be issued to the same person. Also providing that if the number of applications received for licenses exceeds the number of available licenses, then the persons to whom such licenses are to be issued shall be decided by ballot. Licenses to be issued only to parties of two stalkers.
2. No licensee shall take or kill more than two wapiti stags, and no stag shall be killed carrying antlers with less than ten points.
3. No hind or fawn shall be taken or killed on any pretext whatever; and no licensee shall allow any dog to accompany either himself or any attendant he may have with him.
4. Nothing herein contained shall extend to authorizing any person to sell any deer or portion thereof.
5. Regulations as to the use of marks of identification of deer-heads, contained in section 6 of the regulations under the Animals Protection and Game Act, 1921-22, published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the 7th February, 1924, page 437, shall be strictly adhered to by each licensee, who, in addition thereto, shall return all unused "tags" to the Secretary of the Southland Acclimatization Society, Invercargill, immediately he has finished stalking for the season for which such "tags" have been issued, together with a statement of the number of deer shot.
6. The fees paid for licenses issued pursuant to this notification shall, after deducting the cost of and incidental to the issue of such licenses, and any other expenses in connection therewith, be paid to the Department of Tourist and Health Resorts and the Southland Acclimatization Society in equal proportions.
7. Any person committing a breach of any of these conditions is liable on conviction to a fine of £20.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

CONDITIONS.

1. LICENSES to take or kill red-deer stags and hinds may be issued by the Chief Postmaster at Invercargill on payment of a license fee of £2 2s., in the form prescribed in the Second Schedule hereto, and subject to the said Act and regulations thereunder and this notification. The number of such licenses to be issued by the said Chief Postmaster shall not exceed fifty: Provided that not more than one such license shall be issued to the same person.
2. Ball cartridge only to be used; provided that no metal-patched or metal-cased bullet shall be used for killing such deer.
3. No licensee shall allow any dog to accompany either himself or any attendant he may have with him.
4. Nothing herein contained shall extend to authorizing any person to sell any deer or portion thereof.
5. Regulations as to the use of marks of identification of deer-heads contained in section 6 of the regulations under the Animals Protection and Game Act, 1921-22, published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the 7th February, 1924, page 437, shall be strictly adhered to by each licensee, who, in addition thereto, shall return all unused "tags" to the Secretary of the Southland Acclimatization Society, Invercargill, immediately he has finished stalking for the season for which such "tags" have been issued, together with a statement of the number of deer shot.
6. Nothing in any license to take or kill red-deer stags and hinds shall authorize the holder thereof to take or kill red-deer stags or hinds on lands actually and exclusively used by any registered acclimatization society for acclimatization purposes, or on any sanctuary or public domain, or on any land excepted from the operation of the notification declaring an open season for the district.
7. Nothing in this warrant shall apply to deer within the areas described in the warrants dated 8th November, 1923, and 4th August, 1926, in which areas protection is removed from deer.
8. Any person committing a breach of any of these conditions is liable, on conviction, to a fine of £20.

WHEREAS a requisition in writing, signed by a majority of the occupiers of all the chemists' shops within the Combined District of Auckland, comprising the City of Auckland, the Boroughs of Birkenhead, Devonport, Mount Albert, Mount Eden, Newmarket, Northcote, Onehunga, and Takapuna, and the Town Districts of Ellerslie, Glen Eden, New Lynn, and Henderson, has been forwarded to me, desiring that all such shops within the said combined district, save and except the shop (hereinafter referred to as "the exempted shop") established at 155 Newton Road, within the City of Auckland, for the purpose only of the sale of medicines and surgical appliances that are urgently required, be closed as set out below, and that subsection (4) of section 35 of the Shops and Offices Act, 1921-22, should not apply to any shop within two miles and a half of the exempted shop while medicines and surgical appliances are obtainable from the exempted shop—On Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays at 6 p.m., on Fridays at 9.30 p.m., and on Sundays from the hour of 7 a.m., with the following exceptions: (1) In the event of a day other than Saturday being observed as the statutory closing-day in any week the closing-hour on Friday in that week shall be 6 p.m., and on Saturday 9.30 p.m.; (2) on the evening of the working-day immediately preceding Good Friday the closing-hour shall be 9.30 p.m.:
