Preparation of Valuation List, City of Wanganui.

[L.S.] CHARLES FERGUSSON, Governor-General. A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the system of rating on the unimproved value under the Rating Act, 1925 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), is at the present time in force in the City of Wanganui:

And whereas pursuant to section forty-four of the said Act a poll of the ratepayers of the City of Wanganui was taken upon the proposal that the adoption of the system of rating property on the basis of the unimproved value thereof be rescinded:

And whereas the said proposal was carried

And whereas the system of rating on the annual value under the said Act comes into force in the said City of Wanganui as from the thirty-first day of March, one thousand nine

hundred and twenty-nine:

And whereas in terms of the said Act where the system of rating on the annual value is in force in any district it is required that a valuation roll shall be made either annually or quired that a valuation roll shall be hade either annually of triennially at the option of the local authority, and that a valuation list as prescribed by the said Act shall, on or before the fifteenth day of January in every year where an annual valuation is made and in every third year when the valuation is triennial, be prepared, signed, and transmitted to the local

authority:
And whereas in terms of section fifteen of the said Act it is provided that such valuation list shall be deposited at some convenient place to be publicly notified, and shall lie open for the inspection of all persons interested therein until the fifteenth day of February:
And whereas it has been found impossible to prepare the valuation list as provided by section eight of the said Act within the time prescribed by that section:
And whereas it is expedient that the time for preparing the said valuation list, the period for which the said valuation

said valuation list, the period for which the said valuation list shall be deposited and lie open for inspection, and the time within which objections to the said valuation list may be delivered be extended;

Now, therefore, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers in that behalf enabling me in the said Act, the Municipal Corporations Act, 1920, and of all other powers in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do

(c) That such valuation list shall, for the purposes of section fifteen of the said Act, be open for the inspection of all persons interested therein until the twenty-eighth day of March, one thousand nine hun-

dred and twenty-nine:

(d) That such valuation list may, for the purposes of section seventeen of the said Act, be inspected until the twenty-eighth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine:

(c) That such value and valuation list shall be de-

(e) That objections to the said valuation list shall be de-livered on or before the twenty-eighth day of March,

one thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine.

And I do hereby further proclaim and direct that the provisions of the said Act and the Municipal Corporations Act, 1920, and the regulations thereunder respectively, relating to the valuation list and roll respectively, shall apply hereto, save and except as the same are hereinbefore respectively modified or altered.

Nothing herein contained shall authorize the Council to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulations of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1923, or its amendments, or any regulation thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

13. The rights, powers, and privileges hereby conferred shall continue in force until the 20th December, 1941, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the Council shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

The rights, powers, and privileges conferred under or by virtue of this Order in Council may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the Council three calendar months' previous notice in writing. 15. The Council shall be liable for any injury which may be caused at the said wharf to any vessel or boat through any default or neglect on the part of the Council.

Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions herein-before set forth, or any of them; or

In the event of this Order in Council being revoked for any reason whatsoever, or, upon the expiry of the period for which the license is granted, the Council shall, if required by the Minister so to do, remove the said wharf entirely from the site and restore the site to its original condition within three months from the date of the revocation or expiry, as the case may be; and if the Council fails so to do, the Minister may cause the said wharf to be removed and the site so restored. and may recover the costs incurred by the said removal and restoration from the Council.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the Orchard and Garden Diseases Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), and of all other powers in that behalf enabling him, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the regulations under the said Act governing the control of downy mildew and phylloxera in vines, made on the tenth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven, and published in the *Gazette* on the thirteenth day of the same month at page 7, and doth hereby make the following regulations in lieu thereof, and doth hereby declare that such revocation shall take effect and the regulations hereby made shall come into force on the date of the publication of this Order in Council in the Gazette.

to the said counties or any of them:

"Vine" means any vine of the genus vitis and any portion thereof excepting the fruit:

"Fungus" means the fungus known as downy mildew:

"Insect" means the insect known as Phyllox-ra

"Department" means the Department of Agriculture.

2. No person shall remove any vine or any fungus or insect from the North Island to any other portion of New

3. Except as hereinafter provided, no person shall remove any vine or any fungus or insect beyond the boundaries of

the prescribed area.

the prescribed area.

4. No person shall remove any vine beyond the boundaries of the prescribed area to any other portion of the North Island unless such vine is accompanied by a certificate signed

Island unless such vine is accompanied by a certificate signed by an Inspector, declaring that such vine has been treated and disinfected as directed by him and to his satisfaction.

5. Nothing in these regulations shall be deemed to apply to an Inspector with respect to his sending any vine or any fungus or insect beyond the boundaries of the prescribed area for the purpose of the identification of disease, or to the Department sending any vine, which has been treated to the satisfaction of the Department, beyond the boundaries of the North Island for the purpose of establishing new varieties in any other portion of New Zealand.

6. Every person commits an offence against the said Act

6. Every person commits an offence against the said Act who directly or indirectly by himself, his servant, or agent does or attempts to do any act in contravention of these regulations or fails to faithfully observe and perform any duty or obligation imposed on him by this Order in Council.

The duty of the umpire on reference to him of any question shall be to consider the respective valuations of the two arbitrators in the matter in which their valuations do not agree, and then to make an independent and substantive valuation, and the last-mentioned valuation shall be the decision of the umpire; but in giving his decision on any question so referred to him the umpire shall in every case be bound to make a valuation not exceeding the higher and not less than the lower of the valuations made by the arbitrators respectively.

Note.—On the whole a bright sunny month, with moderate to strong north-westerly winds prevailing. Total bright sunshine, 232 hours (54 per cent. of the possible), and one sunless day. Precipitation at Karori Reservoir, near Kelburn, was 49 per cent. above the mean. Frost was recorded on the grass on the morning of the 14th. Lightning was seen on the 19th and 26th; thunder was heard on the 26th., and fog was in evidence on the 4th and 25th. Mean dew-point, 48.8°; and mean elastic force of vapour, 0.344 in.

#### SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF NOVEMBER, 1928.

November has been a dry month in most parts of the Dominion. Rainfall was above the average in the eastern districts of the North Island from Wellington to East Cape and at scattered places in eastern parts of the South Island, but elsewhere there was a considerable deficit.

The month was on the whole cool, though summerlike conditions set in suddenly on the 16th and continued till the 25th. During this period remarkably fine weather was the rule. This year has been characterized by an unusual frequency of thunderstorms, and this feature was maintained during November, there being only twelve days on which thunderstorms were not reported by some station. Frosts were few in number and light only.

In most districts, there is an ample supply of feed, and crops of all kinds are in good condition, especially in the Wellington and Hawke's Bay Provinces. The fine spell from the 16th onwards, however, induced early flowering in many crops, and generally speaking they are in a forward condition. Good rains will be needed in December to ensure good yields from crops and sufficient pasturage for the summer. The early setting in of summer weather gives rise to some little anxiety for the future.

On the 1st the weather was controlled by the cyclone which had crossed the northern part of the North Island, and which was referred to in the notes for October. General rain fell over the North Island with many heavy falls. The floods in the Wairarapa and Manawatu rivers were maintained.

On the 5th an intense depression of the westerly type brought heavy rain to the western districts and central highlands of the South Island. Northerly gales were experienced from Cook Strait southwards.

Conditions remained rather unsettled until the 12th. Between the 8th and 12th another rather intense depression passed, culminating in the development of a cyclone off East Cape. On the 8th and 9th northerly gales blew, that on the 8th being very heavy and doing much damage in Christchurch. From the 10th to the 12th there were southwesterly gales with heavy rains in most districts and low temperatures. Snow fell on the high country, and hail in places. Strong southerly winds and cold showery weather continued between Napier and East Cape till the 15th, the rain being particularly heavy at East Cape.

The fine and warm spell to which reference has already been made followed the unsettled period of the first half of the month. On the 25th, however, a fairly intense cyclone approached from the Tasman Sea and crossed the Dominion during the following two days. The passage was accompanied by good general rains, especially on the 26th, which were of great benefit to the country. Cool south-westerlies set in on the 27th as the cyclone passed, but the storm was losing intensity, and the cold snap proved of only slight severity.
