Provided further, that with the consent of the Minister of Marine, it shall be lawful for the Southland Acclimatization Society to take from such rivers or streams as may be defined by the Minister after such consent, salmon for the purposes of pisciculture within the Southland Acclimatization district.

The total live births registered for the urban areas amounted to 1,017 as against 1,082 in November, a decrease of 65. The deaths in December were 503—a decrease of 11 as compared with the previous month. Of the total deaths males contributed 251, females 252. Fifty-three of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 10.54 per cent. of the whole number. Thirty-nine of these were under one year of age.

LICENSES to take or kill fallow-deer bucks and does may be issued by the Postmaster at Tauranga on payment of a license fee of £1 ls., in the form prescribed in the Second Schedule hereto, and subject to the said Act and regulations thereunder and this notification: Provided that not more than one such license shall be issued to the same person.
2. No licensee shall take or kill more than two fallow-deer bucks and one doe. Ball cartridge only to be used; provided that no metal-patched or metal-cased bullets shall be used for killing such deer.

IN exercise of the powers vested in me by the Animals Protection and Game Act, 1921-22, I, Philip Aldborough de la Perrelle, Minister of Internal Affairs of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby declare the period from the 1st day of March, 1929, to the 7th day of April, 1929 (both days inclusive), to be an open season in the Tauranga Acclimatization District, described in the First Schedule hereto, for the taking or killing of the following imported game—viz., red-deer stags and hinds—subject to the following conditions.

CONDITIONS.

1. LICENSES to take or kill red-deer stags and hinds may be issued by the Postmaster at Tauranga, on payment of a license fee of £1 ls., in the form prescribed in the Second Schedule hereto, and subject to the said Act and regulations thereunder and this notification. The number of licenses to be issued by the said Postmaster shall not exceed fifteen: Provided that not more than one such license shall be issued to the same person.

2. No licensee shall take or kill more than two red-deer stags and one hind; no stag shall be killed carrying antlers with less than eight points. Ball cartridge only to be used; provided that no metal-patched or metal-cased bullets shall be used for killing such deer.

3. No fawn shall be taken or killed on any pretext whatever; and no licensee shall allow any dog to accompany either himself or any attendant he may have with him.

4. Nothing herein contained shall extend to authorizing any person to sell any deer or portion thereof.

5. Regulations as to the use of marks of identification of deer-heads contained in section 6 of the regulations under the Animals Protection and Game Act, 1921-22, published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the 7th February, 1924, page 437, shall be strictly adhered to by each licensee, who, in addition thereto, shall return all unused "tags" to the Secretary of the Tauranga Acclimatization Society, Tauranga, immediately he has finished stalking for the season for which such "tags" have been issued, together with a statement of the number of deer shot.

6. Nothing in any license to take or kill red-deer stags and hinds shall authorize the holder thereof to take or kill red-deer stags or hinds on lands actually and exclusively used by any registered acclimatization society for acclimatization purposes, or on any sanctuary or public domain, or on any land excepted from the operation of the notification declaring an open season for the district.

7. Any person committing a breach of these conditions is liable, on conviction, to a fine of £20.
