Altering Boundaries of Auckland and Suburban Drainage District.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the Auckland and Suburban Drainage Board has presented a memorial requesting that the area described in such memorial be declared to form part of the Auckland and Suburban Drainage District (hereinafter referred to as "the said district"):

And whereas the Governor-General is satisfied that the inclusion of such area in the said district will prove beneficial to the inhabitants and the owners of property therein:

Now, therefore, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me in that behalf by section ninety-five of the Auckland and Suburban Drainage Act, 1908, do hereby proclaim and declare that the area described in the Schedule hereto shall be included in and form part of the said district.

AREA TO BE INCLUDED IN AUCKLAND AND SUBURBAN DRAINAGE DISTRICT.

Wellington, 23rd January, 1929.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council made on the 3rd day of September, 1923, and gazetted on the 6th day of the same month, regulations (to be cited as the Drainage and Plumbing Regulations) were made under the Health Act, 1920, prescribing the conditions to be observed in the construction of approved drains, septic tanks, sanitary conveniences, and sanitary appliances:

And whereas by the said regulations it was provided that the same were suspended as provided in the said Act:

And whereas by section 133 of the said Act it is enacted that the operation of any such regulations may, if so provided therein, be wholly suspended until they are applied by the Minister by notice in the *Gazette* to any part of New Zealand:

Land and Income Tax (Annual) Act, 1928.

INCOME-TAX PAYABLE.

Additional tax will accrue if the tax is not paid on or before 1st March, 1929. The liability to pay is not suspended by any objection. The demands will be posted from the office of the Commissioner of Taxes on or about 31st January, 1929. Demands must be presented with all payments, and taxpayers who expect a demand and do not receive one should notify me of the fact.

(Gas) Regulations, 1924.

IN exercise of the powers conferred upon us by clause 26 of the Board of Trade (Gas) Regulations, 1924, we, the undersigned Gas Referees, duly appointed under the said regulations, do hereby determine that on and from the 15th day of January, 1929, until further notice, the fees which shall be payable by gas companies for the examination and testing, with or without stamping, of meters, shall be as stated hereunder:—

Provided that, for the purpose of computing the foregoing fees, the measuring capacity shall be taken as being that indicated on the meter by the maker:

Provided also, that where a company's meter-testing room is more than three miles from the headquarters of a Gas Examiner or an Inspector of Meters, the following additional fees shall be payable by the company—

- (a) Where a company's meter-testing room is within ten miles of the headquarters of a Gas Examiner or an Inspector of Meters, ten shillings per day or portion of a day that is spent by the Examiner or Inspector in testing the company's meters.
- (b) Where a company's meter-testing room is not within ten miles from the headquarters of a Gas Examiner or an Inspector of Meters, twenty-five shillings per day or portion of a day that is spent by the Examiner or Inspector in testing the company's meters.
