A PROCLAMATION.

**WHEREAS** by a Proclamation dated the nineteenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the twentieth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, the Town District of Kamo was duly constituted and proclaimed under the Town Districts Act, 1881, with the boundaries described in the Schedule to the said Proclamation :

And whereas by a Proclamation dated the twenty-seventh day of July, one thousand nine hundred and one, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the first day of August, one thousand nine hundred and one, the boundaries of the said town district were enlarged by the addition of the area described in the First Schedule to the said Proclamation :

And whereas it is expedient to curtail the boundaries of the said town district in the manner hereinafter set forth :

Now, therefore, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in me by the Town Boards Act, 1908, and the Counties Act, 1920, and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that as on and from the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine, the boundaries of the said Town District of Kamo shall be altered by excluding therefrom, and including in the County of Whangarei, the area described in the First Schedule hereto: that the boundaries of the said town district (as so altered) shall be those described in the Second Schedule hereto; that the area included as aforesaid in the County of Whangarei shall be included in the Wairua Riding and the Hikurangi Riding of the said county; and that the boundaries of those ridings shall be those described in the Third Schedule hereto.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

AREA EXCLUDED FROM KAMO TOWN DISTRICT.

ALL that area in the North Auckland Land District bounded as follows: Commencing at a point at the south-western

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corner of part Allotment 50, Parish of Whangarei, where the Otapapa Stream adjoins the Whangarei-Opua Railway line; thence towards the west generally by the Otapapa Stream to its confluence with the Waitaua and Ngau Poaka Streams, by the aforesaid Ngau Poaka Stream to the Whangarei-Opua Railway line, by that railway-line to the south-western boundary of part Parakiore No. 2 Block, as shown on plan 8351, deposited in the office of the District Land Registrar at Auckland, and by the boundaries of that block to the south-western corner of that part Te Tupua Block, containing 20 acres; thence towards the north generally by the southern boundary-line of the aforesaid part Te Tupua Block and the southern boundary-line of part Allotment 123, Parish of Whangarei, containing 2 roods 14 perches, and that boundary-line produced to the middle of the Great North Road; thence towards the east generally by a line along the middle of that road to a point in line with south-eastern boundary of part Allotment 118, Parish of Whangarei, containing 1 acre 3 roods 13 perches, shown on plan 8896, deposited in the office of the District Land Registrar at Auckland, by a right line to and by that boundary-line to the Waitaua River, and by that river to north-western boundary of part Allotment 50, Parish of Whangarei, shown on plan 1583, deposited in the office of the District Land Registrar at Auckland; thence towards the south generally by the north-western and south-western boundaries of the aforesaid part Allotment 50 to the north-western boundary-line of that part Allotment 50, Parish of Whangarei, containing 15 acres 3 roods 32 perches, and by that boundary-line to the Whangarei-Opua Railway line, then by that railway-line to the point of commencement.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

KAMO TOWN DISTRICT.

ALL that area in the North Auckland Land District bounded by a line commencing at a point in the Waitaua River in line with the centre-line of the road forming the south-western boundary of Sections 11, 12, 13, and 7, Parish of Whangarei; thence to and along the middle of that road to the south-eastern boundary of Section 8, Parish of Whangarei; thence south-westerly along that boundary to the Otangare Stream; thence south-westerly along that stream, and the north-eastern boundary of a portion of Mair's Grant to its junction with the northernmost corner of the land shown on plan 1264, deposited in the office of the District Land Registrar at Auckland; thence south-westerly along the north-western boundaries of the land shown on plans 1264 and 3459, deposited as aforesaid, to the Great North Road; across that

road, and north-westerly along its south-western side to the southern boundary of Lot 13, Burnett's Township; thence south-westerly along that boundary to the south-western corner of the said Lot 13; thence south-easterly along the south-western boundaries of Lots 12, 11, and 10, to the south-eastern corner of a six-acre lot; thence westerly along the southern boundary of that lot and its production to a stream; thence northerly along that stream to the south-western corner of the land shown on plan 14501, deposited in the office of the District Land Registrar at Auckland; thence along the south-western boundary of that land to its westernmost corner; thence north-westerly along the north-eastern boundary of Ketenikau No. 7 Block, across a public road to the Otapapa Stream forming the eastern boundary of the Onoke Block; thence by that stream to the Opuia-Whangarei Railway; thence across that railway and north-easterly generally along its northern side to the north-western corner of that part of Allotment 50, Parish of Whangarei, containing 15 acres 3 roods 32 perches; thence along the north-western boundary of that allotment to the south-western boundary of part Allotment 50 on plan 1583, deposited in the office of the District Land Registrar at Auckland; thence north-westerly and north-easterly along the south-western and north-western boundaries of the said part Allotment 50 to the Waitaua River; thence down the Waitaua River to the point of commencement.

### THIRD SCHEDULE.

#### WAIKURANGI RIDING.

ALL that area in the Whangarei County bounded on the north-west generally by the county boundary from the north-west corner of Kaihou 3 No. 20 Block to the south-western boundary of N.W. 13, as shown on plan 11730, deposited in the office of the District Land Registrar at Auckland; thence along that boundary to the north-western boundary of Section 9, Block XIII, Hukerenui Survey District; thence along that boundary to its south-western corner; thence along the northern boundary of Section 17, Block XIII aforesaid, the north-eastern and eastern boundary of Sections 17 and 16, and the northern and eastern boundaries of Section 14, Block XIII aforesaid, to the southernmost corner of Section 22, said Block XIII; thence along the north-western corner of Section 14, Otakairangi Parish, to its northernmost corner; thence along the north-eastern boundaries of Sections 14 and 13, Otakairangi Parish, to the north-western corner of Lot 4 on plan 11486, deposited in the office of the District Land Registrar at Auckland; thence along the north-western and north-eastern boundaries of the said Lot 4 to the Wairua River; thence up the Wairua River to the Mangahuru Stream; thence along that stream to its junction with a stream intersecting Papakuri 196a Block; thence up that stream to the south-eastern boundary of the Papakuri Block; thence north-easterly along that boundary to the road forming the western boundary of Section 6, Block IV, Purua Survey District; thence southerly along that road to the north-eastern boundary of Lot 1 on plan 13694, deposited in the office of the District Land Registrar at Auckland; thence south-easterly along that boundary to the south-western boundary of that portion of Maketawa Block shown on plan 1353, deposited as aforesaid; thence south-easterly along that boundary to the north-western boundary of the Parakiore Block; thence along the northern and eastern boundaries of Parakiore No. 1 Block to its south-eastern corner; thence along the northern boundaries of Ngawhakatikitū and Puriritahi Blocks to the western boundary of the Whangarei-Opuia Railway; thence by a right line across that railway to the north-western corner of part Puriritahi Block, shown on plan 1585, deposited in the office of the District Land Registrar at Auckland; thence along the north-western and north-eastern boundaries of the Puriritahi Blocks to the western boundary of the Whangarei Parish; thence along that boundary to the western side of the Great North Road, and along that road to the south-eastern boundary of that part 50B containing 3 roods 36 perches; thence along that boundary to a public road, and along the northern side of that road to the boundary of the Kamo Town District; thence along that boundary and the Borough of Whangarei to the southern boundary of Section 77, Block XII, Purua Survey District; thence along that boundary and the south-western boundaries of Sections 73, 76, 52, and 55, to the westernmost corner of the last-mentioned section; thence along a right line to the south-western corner of Section 37, Block XI, Purua Survey District; thence along a right line to the easternmost corner of Section 23B on plan 1315A, deposited in the office of the District Land Registrar at Auckland; thence along the north-eastern boundary of that section and of Sections 22 and 20, Block X, Purua Survey District, to the Patu Wairua Stream; thence down that stream to the Mangere Stream, and down the Mangere Stream to

the Wairua River; thence up that river to the south-western corner of Section 20, Block II, Purua Survey District; thence to the south-eastern boundary of the State Forest Reserve in Block VIII, Mangakahia Survey District; along a line running from the south-western corner of Section 20, Block II, Purua Survey District, to the southernmost corner of Section 40, Block IV, Mangakahia Survey District; thence along a right line to the north-eastern corner of Section 2, Block VII, Mangakahia Survey District; thence along the northern boundary of that section to and across the Hikurangi River; thence down the right bank of that river to the northern boundary of Pipiwai 2H 8 Block; thence along the northern boundaries of Pipiwai 2H 8, 2H 6, 2H 5B, 2H 3, 2H 2, and 2H 1, to the north-western corner of the last-mentioned section; thence along the north-eastern boundaries of Section 1, Block VI, Mangakahia Survey District, Kaihou No. 4, and the Nukutawhiti Block to the county boundary, and by the county boundary to the place of commencement.

#### HIKURANGI RIDING.

All that area in the Whangarei County bounded on the north-west by the county boundary from the western boundary of N.W. 13 as shown on plan 11730, deposited in the office of the District Land Registrar at Auckland, to the westernmost corner of Section 18, Block X, Hukerenui Survey District; thence along the Whangarei-Opuia Railway to its intersection with the main road at the southern boundary of Section 2, Block XI, Hukerenui Survey District; thence along the said main road to Section 38, Hikurangi Parish; thence along the western and southern boundaries of that section to the north-eastern boundary of the said Hikurangi Parish; thence south-easterly along that boundary to the Mangahuru Stream; thence up that stream to the north-eastern corner of Kahakaharoa No. 2 Block; thence along the eastern boundary of Kahakaharoa No. 2 Block to the Mangakino Stream; thence down the Mangakino Stream to the Waitaua River; thence up the Waitaua River to the north-western boundary of part Allotment 50, Parish of Whangarei, as shown on plan 1583, deposited in the office of the District Land Registrar at Auckland; thence along the north-western and south-western boundaries of the said part Allotment 50 to the north-western boundary of that part Allotment 50, Parish of Whangarei, containing 15 acres 3 roods 32 perches; thence along that boundary to the boundary of the Kamo Town District; thence along that boundary to the north-eastern boundary of the Wairua Riding hereinbefore described, and along that boundary to the place of commencement.

#### A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation dated the twelfth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and eight, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the twenty-sixth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and eight, the Town District of Pleasant Point was duly constituted and proclaimed under the Town Districts Act, 1908, with the boundaries described in the Schedule to the said Proclamation:

And whereas it is expedient to curtail the boundaries of the said town district in the manner hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in me by the Town Boards Act, 1908, and the Counties Act, 1920, and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that as on and from the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine, the boundaries of the said Town District of Pleasant Point shall be altered by excluding therefrom and including in the County of Levels the areas described in the First Schedule hereto; that the boundaries of the said town district (as so altered) shall be those described in the Second Schedule hereto; that the area included as aforesaid in the County of Levels shall be included in the Point Riding of the said county; and that the boundaries of the said riding shall be those described in the Third Schedule hereto.

## FIRST SCHEDULE.

## AREAS EXCLUDED FROM PLEASANT POINT TOWN DISTRICT.

ALL that area in the Canterbury Land District containing by admeasurement 25 acres, more or less, situated in Block III, Pareora Survey District, and bounded by a line commencing at a point on Maze's Road, at the southernmost corner of Rural Section No. 6894; thence along the south-eastern boundary of that section, a distance of 2001.5 links; thence at a right angle to the southern boundary of Rural Section No. 6331; thence returning along that boundary to Maze's Road; thence returning along the north-eastern side of that road to the point of commencement.

Also all that area in the Canterbury Land District containing by admeasurement 272 acres 2 roods, more or less, situated in Block IV, Pareora Survey District, and bounded by a line commencing at a point on Opihi Bridge Road at the south-west corner of Rural Section No. 23047; thence along the southern boundary of that section and the northern boundary of Reserve No. 2811 to its easternmost corner; thence along a right line to the northernmost corner of Rural Section No. 10453; thence along the north-eastern boundary of that section to Butler's Road; thence along the western side of that road to the easternmost corner of Reserve No. 1580; thence along the northern boundary of that reserve and a line in continuation thereof to the western boundary of Rural Section No. 10174; thence along that boundary to the southernmost corner of Rural Section No. 19684; thence along the western boundary of that section to the north-east corner of Rural Section No. 10408; thence along the northern boundary of that section to a point five chains from Opihi Bridge Road; thence by a right line parallel to the said road, to the northern boundary of Rural Section No. 16698; thence along the said boundary to Opihi Bridge Road; thence returning along the eastern side of that road to the point of commencement. ALL that area in the Canterbury Land District bounded by a line commencing at the northernmost corner of Rural Section 6331; thence along the south-western side of the Tengawai Bridge Road to the easternmost corner of Rural Section 4838; thence across that road and along the south-eastern boundary of Rural Section 7406 to the westernmost corner of Rural Section 10726; thence along the southern boundary of the last-mentioned section to the Opihi Bridge Road; thence across that road to the northern boundary of Rural Section 16698; thence along that boundary for a distance of 500 links; thence along a right line parallel to and distant 500 links from the eastern side of the Opihi Bridge Road to the southern boundary of Rural Section 16698; thence along southern boundary of Rural Section 16698 to its south-eastern corner; thence along the western boundaries of Rural Section 19684 and 10174 to a point in line with the northern boundary of Rural Section 1580; thence to and along that boundary to Butler's Road; thence along the western side of Butler's Road to the railway-line; thence along the railway-line to the easternmost corner of Rural Section 9008; thence along the south-eastern, south-western, and north-western boundaries of that section to a point in line with the north-eastern boundary of Rural Section 11119; thence across a road and along part of the north-eastern boundary of the last-mentioned section to the easternmost corner of Allotment 106 of said Rural Section 11119; thence along the south-eastern and south-western boundaries of the said Allotment 106 to Shere Street; thence along the south-eastern side of Shere Street to the north-eastern boundary of Allotment 41 of the said Rural Section 11119; thence along the north-eastern boundaries of Allotments 41 and 40 to the easternmost corner of the land shown on certificate of title, Vol. 217, folio 156, deposited in the office of the District Land Registrar at Christchurch; thence along the south-eastern boundary of the said land to the eastern boundary of Rural Section 10169; thence along part of the eastern boundary of that section to its south-eastern corner; thence along the southern boundaries of Rural Sections 10169 and 10407 and the south-western boundary of Allotment 38 of Rural Section 11119 to Manse Road; thence along the south-eastern side of Manse Road to the western boundary of Rural Section 10407; thence along the western boundary of the last-mentioned section to the south-eastern corner of Reserve No. 1581; thence along the southern boundary of that reserve and the north-eastern boundary of Rural Section 18185 to the railway-line; thence along the railway-line to Maze's Road; thence along the north-eastern side of Maze's Road to the southern boundary of Rural Section 6331; thence along the southern boundary of the said Rural Section 6331 for a distance of

2001.5 links; thence along a right line parallel to and distant 2001.5 links from Maze's Road to the north-western boundary of the said Rural Section 6331; thence along that north-western boundary to the northernmost corner of the said Rural Section 6331, to the point of commencement.

ALL that area in the Canterbury Land District bounded towards the north by a line along the middle of the Opihi River from a point opposite the westernmost corner of Rural Section 22786 to a point in line with the westernmost corner of Rural Section 22302; thence along the south-western boundary of said Rural Section 22302 to Butler's Road, forming the south-eastern boundary of said Rural Section 22302; thence along that road to the Timaru-Fairlie Railway; thence along that railway to the road forming the south-eastern boundary of Rural Section 15425; thence along that road to the road forming the northern boundary of Section 1, Papaka Settlement, Block VIII, Pareora Survey District; thence along that road, and the road forming the western boundary of the said Section 1 to the road forming the north-western boundary of Section 3, Papaka Settlement; thence along that road to the south-western boundary of the said Section 3; thence along that south-western boundary to the road forming the western boundary of Section 4, Papaka Settlement; thence along that road to Rolling Ridges Road; thence along Rolling Ridges Road to the eastern boundaries of Section 115, Rosewill Settlement; thence along the said eastern boundary to the road forming the southern boundary of the said Section 115; thence westerly along that road and the road forming the southern boundary of Section 103, Rosewill Settlement, to Tycho Flat Road; thence along Tycho Flat Road and Hay's Road through Rural Section 18864, and the road forming the northern boundaries of Rural Section 18873 and Section 85, Rosewill Settlement, to the northernmost corner of the said Section 85; thence along the north-western boundary of that section to Summit Road; thence along that road and the south-eastern boundary of Section 84, Rosewill Settlement to the road forming the north-western boundary of Section 79 of the said settlement; thence along that road to the county boundary; thence along that boundary to the Tengawai River; thence across that river and along its left bank to Totara Valley Road; thence north-westerly along Totara Valley Road to its junction with School Road at the westernmost corner of Rural Section 16115; thence north-easterly along School Road to the road forming the south-western boundary of Rural Section 22786; thence along that road to the westernmost corner of the said Rural Section 22786; thence by a right line to the middle of the Opihi River, the point of commencement, and excluding therefrom the Pleasant Point Town District.

ALL that area in the Wellington Land District containing by admeasurement 2,550 acres, more or less, being Sections 3, 5, 6, and 7, and part of Sections 1, 2, 4, 8, and 19, Block VIII, Manganui Survey District, and Crown land situated in Block VIII aforesaid, bounded generally as follows: Towards the north and east by a road; again towards the north by the Town of Erua; again towards the east by the North Island Main Trunk Railway Reserve; towards the south by Section 9, Block VIII aforesaid; towards the south-east and again towards the north by a road; again towards the south

by a road along the Makatote Stream; towards the west by a road along the Waimarino Stream; again towards the south by a road; and towards the north-west by the Waimarino Stream; save and excepting the intersecting roads. IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by section two hundred and seven of the Public Works Act, 1928, and of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in this behalf, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that the portion of the banks of Butler's Creek described in the Schedule hereto shall be protected.

The total live births registered for the urban areas amounted to 1,185 as against 1,017 in December, an increase of 168. The deaths in January were 493—a decrease of 10 as compared with the previous month. Of the total deaths males contributed 260, females 233. Forty-three of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 8.72 per cent. of the whole number. Thirty-one of these were under one year of age.
