A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by section twenty of the Forests Act, 1921–22, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting on the recommendation of the Minister of Lands, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto being portion of Provisional State Forest Reserve No. 1605, set apart by Proclamation dated the eleventh day of October, one thousand nine hundred and twenty, and gazetted on the fourteenth day of that month, is required for settlement purposes; and, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, such land shall, from and after the day of gazetting hereof, cease to be a provisional State forest, and shall become subject to the provisions of the Land Act, 1924.

WHEREAS by section three hundred and two of the Land Act, 1924, as amended by section ten of the Land Laws Amendment Act, 1926, it is enacted that on the disposal of any national-endowment land by way of sale, or on the acquisition of the fee-simple of any such land, the Governor-General may by Proclamation declare that such land shall, as from a date to be specified in the Proclamation, cease to be national-endowment land:

REGULATION Number 50—Cancel and substitute :—

50. Men on enrolment and re-enrolment who are in possession of any article of the standard kit in good condition (i.e., not more than half worn) may be credited with an amount representing half the current issuing-price of each article in their possession, in lieu of the free issue of the article in kind. A kit-upkeep gratuity at rates communicated periodically in New Zealand Navy Orders will be credited to all men on the second and each subsequent appearance for compulsory training as laid down during the term of enrolment, provided kit is complete and in good order; except that in cases in which a man is permitted by the regulations to carry out a shorter period of training every year, instead of a longer period every alternate year, credit for the allowance will not be made until the man joins for the second half of this divided period. No kit-upkeep gratuity will be credited in any period of training during which a new kit has been issued or brought up to date under the authority of this article.

Add new Regulation Number 52A—

52A. A member of Class D of the Naval Reserve shall not during any period of training ashore—

1. Absent himself from a duly appointed parade.
2. Interrupt or obstruct any parade.
3. Damage any property belonging to or lawfully used by the Reserve.
4. Attend a parade not properly dressed in the uniform of the Reserve as laid down in these regulations.
5. Refuse to obey the lawful command of his superior officer.

C

6. Conduct himself in an offensive or insolent manner or in a manner likely to bring discredit upon His Majesty's uniform.
7. Fail, when called upon so to do by the Commanding Officer of his Division, to produce all arms, equipment, and clothing issued to him on joining the Reserve or at any time thereafter.
8. Fail to notify any change of address within seven days of such change.

Any person committing a breach of any of the provisions of this article shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding imprisonment with hard labour for three months or to a fine not exceeding twenty pounds.

WHEREAS, there being no Harbour Board empowered to grant the license hereinafter mentioned, Roy Gladstone Barnard, Frank Howard James, and John Theodore Grange, of Wellington (hereinafter called "the licensees"), have jointly and severally applied to the Governor-General for a license under the Harbours Act, 1923 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), to use and occupy a part of the foreshore and the land below low-water mark at Fitzroy Bay, Cook Strait, for the purpose of taking away the shingle and sand deposited thereon; and, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, have deposited a plan in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington (marked M.D. 6623) showing the area of foreshore and the land below low-water mark intended to be occupied for such purpose:

And whereas it is desirable to grant the license applied for:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said license is required by the licensees as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the licensees to use and occupy that part of the foreshore and the land below low-water mark which is particularly shown and delineated within a red line on the plan so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of taking away the shingle and sand deposited thereon, such license to be held and enjoyed by the licensees upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

1. In these conditions the term—

"Foreshore" means such parts of the bed, shore, or bank of a tidal water as are covered and uncovered by the flow and ebb of the tide at ordinary spring tides:

"Low-water mark" means low-water mark at ordinary spring tides:

"Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the part of the foreshore and the land below low-water mark necessary for the purposes hereinbefore mentioned, as shown within a red line in the plan marked M.D. 6623, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department as aforesaid.

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council the licensees shall, on being supplied with a copy thereof, pay to the Minister the sum of £2 10s., and thereafter shall deposit half-yearly the sum of £52, to be applied as hereinafter provided, payable on the first days of January and July in each year.

4. The royalty payable by the licensees on all shingle taken in each year in consideration of the concessions and privileges hereby granted shall be at the rate of one shilling per cubic yard in respect of the first two thousand and eighty cubic yards, ninepence per cubic yard in respect of the next three thousand cubic yards, and sixpence per cubic yard on any quantity exceeding five thousand and eighty cubic yards taken in each year. If in any half-year the licensees fail to remove any shingle the deposit hereinbefore referred to shall be appropriated by the Minister as flat rent in respect of that half-year; but if during any year the licensees remove any shingle the deposit shall, in proportion to the amount of shingle so removed, be applied as royalty at the rate hereinbefore mentioned, but so that the minimum amount payable as combined royalty and flat rent in any one complete year shall be £104. All such payments shall be made to the Secretary, Marine Department, at Wellington, or such other person as the Minister may direct.

5. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all other officers in the Government service acting in execution of duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the aforesaid land without payment.

6. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the licensees to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1923, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

7. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue in force for the term of five years, computed from the date hereof, with the right of renewal for a further term of five years, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges are altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the licensees shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

8. The rights, powers, and privileges hereby granted and conferred may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General without payment of any compensation whatsoever, on giving to the licensees three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the licensees in New Zealand.

9. The licensees shall keep a strictly accurate record of all shingle removed, whether from above or below high-water mark, and shall submit the same for inspection immediately at the end of each month to the Secretary, Marine Department, at Wellington, or such other officer as may be appointed by the Minister, and shall at the same time pay to the Secretary or other officer as aforesaid the amount of royalty due to the Minister.

10. In case the licensees shall—

- (1) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;
- (2) Become bankrupt, or be brought under the operation of any law for the time being in force relating to bankruptcy;
- (3) Fail to pay the sums specified in clauses 3 and 4 of these conditions;

then, and in any such case, this Order in Council, and every license, right, power, or privilege thereby conferred, may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any notice to the licensees or other proceeding whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensees, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred have been revoked and determined.

6. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall not apply to those portions of the foreshore required for securing the shore ends of any telegraph-

cables that are at present or may be at any time laid down within the said area of foreshore.

7. The Council may enclose any part or parts of the foreshore described in the First Schedule hereto for the purpose of holding athletic sports or games, and may by by-law fix a charge for admission to such enclosed part or parts, provided that the total number of days on which such enclosures are made shall not exceed six in any one year.

8. The Council may, subject to the provisions of section 171 of the Harbours Act, 1923, erect or license or permit the erection of bathing-sheds or boat-sheds on the foreshore described in the First Schedule hereto, and may make by-laws regulating the use thereof, and may fix charges for such use, provided that the funds so received shall be expended in improving the foreshore for the benefit of the public.

9. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the Council to remove or cause to be removed any stone, sand, shingle, or shells without the consent of the Minister being first obtained.

10. By-laws made by the Council under the said Act in respect of the foreshore shall not have effect unless and until approved in writing by the Minister.

11. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue to be in force for twenty-one years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority.

12. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the Council six calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister, and delivered at or posted to the last-known address of the Council in New Zealand.

Declaring certain Areas to be Sanctuaries for Native and Imported Game.

CHARLES FERGUSSON, Governor-General.

PURSUANT to the powers vested in me by the Animals Protection and Game Act, 1921-22 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby revoke all previous Warrants issued under the said Act or any of the enactments repealed thereby declaring areas to be sanctuaries or reserves for the purposes of the said Acts, and do hereby notify and declare the areas described in the Schedule hereto to be sanctuaries for the purposes of the said Act, and that no imported or native game shall be taken or killed within the said areas, except pursuant to an authority granted under section thirty-one or section thirty-two of the said Act; nor shall any person, except under such conditions as may from time to time be prescribed by the Minister, take any dog or firearm into such areas, or discharge any firearm or explosive in such areas, or do anything likely to cause any imported or native game to leave such areas.

SCHEDULE.

ASHBURTON ACCLIMATIZATION DISTRICT.

MAORI Lakes near Mount Somers: All that area in the Canterbury Land District, being the two small lakes known as Maori Lakes, situated in the Heron and Tripp Survey Districts, and the area included in a line running parallel to and 20 chains distant from the shores of those lakes.

AUCKLAND ACCLIMATIZATION DISTRICT.

channel between the Big Lagoon and Chandler's Lagoon; thence towards the west generally by the said channel to a small lagoon in Section 5, Opawa, situate in Block I, Clifford Bay Survey District; thence by the western side of that lagoon and a line parallel to and 5 chains distant from high-water mark of the Big Lagoon, through Section 5, Opawa, public road, Crown land, and Section 3, Opawa, all of which sections are situate in Block I, Clifford Bay Survey District aforesaid, to the channel in Section 3, Opawa, situate in Block I, Clifford Bay Survey District; thence by that channel through Sections 3, 4, 6, 9, Opawa, situate in Block I, Clifford Bay Survey District aforesaid, and a line parallel to and 5 chains distant from high-water mark, through Section 9, Opawa, public road, 7, Opawa, public road, 8, Opawa, all of which are situate in Block I, Clifford Bay Survey District aforesaid, to the southern side of the estuary of the Wairau River; thence by a right line across the said estuary in the direction of the Pilot-station to the west side of the mouth of the Wairau River; and thence by a right line to the north-western end of the Boulder Bank, the place of commencement.

Lake Grassmere: All that area in the Marlborough Land District known as Lake Grassmere, and the area within a line running parallel to and 5 chains distant from the margin of the said lake.

Two lagoons near Amberley: All that area containing 74 acres, more or less, being Section 5664, Block XII, Grey Survey District, the said section being the property of Alfred Edward Tutton, of Amberley.

Area at Lake Sumner: All that area in the Canterbury Land District situated in Mytholm, Lake Sumner, Marion, Saddle, Minchin, Katrine, and Noble Survey Districts and bounded as follows: Commencing at the junction of the north branch of the Hurunui River and the Sisters Stream; thence by the left bank of the aforesaid north branch of the Hurunui River in a north-westerly direction to Lake Sumner; thence by a right line in a northerly direction to the summit of Mount Longfellow; thence by a right line in a north-westerly direction to the most northern point of Lake Marion; thence by a line parallel to and one mile on the north side of Lake Sumner and the Hurunui River to the summit of the Southern Alps; thence south along the aforesaid Southern Alps to a point one mile on the south side of Harper Pass; thence by a line parallel to and one mile south of the Hurunui River, Lake Sumner, the Canal, Loch Katrine, the Dray Road, Lake Taylor to a point one mile due south of Trig. Open Season for Deer-shooting, Hawke's Bay Acclimatization District.

IN exercise of the powers vested in me by the Animals Protection and Game Act, 1921-22, I, Philip Aldborough de la Perrelle, Minister of Internal Affairs of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby declare the period from the 15th day of March, 1929, to the 20th day of May, 1929 (both days inclusive), to be an open season in the Hawke's Bay Acclimatization District, described in the First Schedule hereto, for the taking or killing of the following imported game—viz., red-deer stags and hinds—subject to the following conditions.

CONDITIONS.

1. LICENSES to take or kill red-deer stags and hinds may be issued by the secretary of the Hawke's Bay Acclimatization Society, on payment of a license fee of £2, in the form prescribed in the Second Schedule hereto, and subject to the said Act and regulations thereunder and this notification: Provided that not more than one license shall be issued to the same person.

2. A licensee may, pursuant to a license issued under this notification, take or kill an unlimited number of stags and hinds: Provided that no stags are taken or killed carrying antlers with less than eight points.

3. No licensee shall allow any dog to accompany either himself or any attendant he may have with him. Ball cartridge only to be used; provided that no metal-patched or metal-cased bullet shall be used for killing such deer.

4. Nothing herein contained shall extend to authorizing any person to sell any deer or portion thereof.

5. Regulations as to the use of marks of identification of deer-heads contained in section 6 of the regulations under the Animals Protection and Game Act, 1921-22, published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the 7th February, 1924, page 437, shall be strictly adhered to by each licensee, who, in addition thereto, shall return all unused "tags" to the Secretary of the Hawke's Bay Acclimatization Society, Napier, immediately he has finished stalking for the season for which such "tags" have been issued, together with a statement of the number of deer shot.

6. Nothing in any license to take or kill red-deer stags and hinds shall authorize the holder thereof to take or kill red-deer stags or hinds on lands actually and exclusively used by any registered acclimatization society for acclimatization purposes, or on any sanctuary or public domain, or on any land excepted from the operation of the notification declaring an open season for the district.

7. Any person committing a breach of any of these conditions is liable, on conviction, to a fine of £20.

Station; thence by a right line to Pohokura Trig. Station aforesaid; thence by the eastern watershed of the Mokomokonui Stream to the Tataraoakino Mountain; thence by the leading spur to the confluence of the Mohaka and Waipunga Rivers; thence by the leading spur to Trig. Station 69A, Taraponui; thence by the leading spur and the southern watershed of the Waikare River to the sea at Moeangiangi; thence towards the east generally by high-water mark of the sea to the middle of the Waimata River, being the north-eastern corner of Waimata Survey District in Akitio County; thence by the northern boundaries of Waimata and Mount Cerberus Survey Districts and the northern boundary of Wellington Land District to the middle of the Manawatu River; thence by the middle of the Manawatu River to a point in line with the summit of the Ruahine Range; thence to and by the summit of that range to a right line running between Aorangi Trig. Station and the confluence of the northern branch of the Waipawa River with the Makaroro River; thence by that line to Aorangi Trig. Station; thence by a right line running in the direction of trig. numbered 32 to the middle of the Rangitikei River, and by the middle of that river to the place of commencement.

NOTE.—A wet month, with moderate to strong north-westerly winds prevailing. Precipitation at Karori Reservoir, near Kelburn, was 174 per cent. above the mean of previous years. Thunder was heard on the 1st and fog was in evidence on the 11th. Total sunshine, 213.9 hours, 46 per cent. of the possible, and four sunless days. Mean dew-point, 53.1°; and mean vapour pressure, 0.404 in.

SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF DECEMBER, 1928.

December was a very wet month over much the greater part of the Dominion. About double the normal rainfall was recorded on the average over the North Island and in Canterbury, Nelson, and Marlborough. In many places it was the wettest December for many years, and in some the wettest on record. Westland, parts of Central and Northern Otago, and Southland proved exceptions to the rule, having rainfalls below the average.

There was again a marked absence of westerly winds, while southerlies were rather unusually prevalent. The low rainfalls in Westland and Otago were associated with the lack of westerly winds. Gales were few and winds generally light.

Though the southerly winds caused cool temperatures in parts of the eastern districts, conditions were, on the whole, mild and humid. Few places experienced any severe cold snaps. The month resembled its predecessor in the frequency of thunderstorms. These occurred most widely on the 1st, 15th, 16th, 23rd, 29th, and 31st, but were recorded in some places also on the 2nd, 5th, 6th, 9th to 14th, 20th, 24th, 25th, and 28th.

Owing to the abundance of rainfall the growth of vegetation has been very heavy. Conditions are generally very favourable for the agricultural community, and stock are in good shape. The humid atmosphere and absence of sunshine has interfered with shearing and haymaking in many districts, but especially in Canterbury, where also the wheat harvest has suffered considerably. Again, some damage was done by the rain to early stone fruit. So far, however, there are few reports of blight in potatoes or other fungoid diseases. The dairying industry is having a particularly good season, although in some parts the growth of grass has been so luxuriant that stock have been unable to keep it down.

The tendency for depressions to be of cyclonic form which has characterized the whole year was no less evident in December. On three occasions cyclones developed in the northern portions of depressions as they were crossing the Dominion. The first of these was on the 9th, when the cyclone appeared to the westward of the North Island. The centre passed through Cook Strait on the 10th. Moving slowly and being reinforced by the development of secondaries, the cyclone

remained off the east coast until the 15th, when it gradually moved away. Southerly winds set in on the 10th, and continued in most districts for the remainder of the spell. Very wet weather prevailed throughout the whole period, especially from the 9th to the 14th. On the 9th heavy rain was very general. A very severe hailstorm occurred on the 11th in the Napier district, and did serious damage to fruit crops and trees on a narrow line extending from Eskdale through Greenmeadows to Parkowhai. At some places stones up to an inch and a half in diameter were observed. On the 13th, when the cyclone became very intense, southerly gales were experienced at some places, temperatures dropped and snow fell on the mountain tops in both Islands. The period was reminiscent of that between the 12th and the 19th of last December when, however, the cyclones were centred further eastward. Last year, also, the southerly winds were more severe and temperatures lower.

A rather intense depression moving from the westward caused northerly gales in Cook Strait and rain from Taranaki and Wellington southwards on the 19th. The second cyclone, which, however, was of only slight intensity, developed in the northern portion of this depression on the 20th.

The third cyclone followed the passage of a southern depression on the 24th. Its centre was in the far northern portion of the Tasman Sea, and did not pass away to the eastward until the 29th. This storm was responsible for very wet weather during the holiday season. Heavy and general rains were experienced in almost all districts, especially on the 25th or 26th and the 28th. Low-pressure waves of the westerly type kept the weather unsettled, especially in the South Island, until the end of the month.
