IS Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of that Dominion, and in pursuance of the authority to make regulations for the peace, order, and good government of Samoa conferred upon him by the Samoa Act, 1921, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

- 1. These regulations may be cited as "The Samoa Prisons and Constabulary Order, 1929."
- 2. There shall be in the mandated territory of Western Samoa a force to be called the Samoan Constabulary.
 - 3. The force shall consist of-
 - (i) An Inspector who, subject to the orders of the Administrator, shall have the command of the Samoan Constabulary:
 - (ii) Such number of Sub-inspectors as the Administrator may from time to time direct:
 - (iii) Such number of European and Samoan sergeants of police, corporals, lance-corporals, constables of different grades, clerks, and messengers as the Administrator may from time to time direct.
- 4. Every member of the Samoan Constabulary shall be engaged to serve, and his appointment shall be, for a term of not less than one year (subject, however, to the right of the person who for the time being has the power of making such appointment to terminate such service at any time), and may be re-engaged at or before the termination of the period of enlistment for a further period.

 5. (1) Every member of the Samoan Constabulary shall on his appointment take and subscribe before a Judge or Commissioner of the

appointment take and subscribe before a Judge or Commissioner of the High Court, or any person appointed in writing in that behalf by the Minister of External Affairs, the following oath:—

- "I, A. B., do swear that I will well and truly serve our Sovereign Lord the King in the Samoan Constabulary until I am lawfully dismissed or discharged; that I will see and cause His Majesty's peace to be kept and preserved; that I will prevent to the best of my power all offences against the same; and that I will faithfully discharge all my duties as a member of the Samoan Constabulary and all other duties that may be required of me by law. So help me God."
- (2) Every person who has taken and subscribed the oath as aforesaid shall be deemed to have from the day on which the same was taken and subscribed thereby entered into a written agreement with, and shall be thereby bound to serve, His Majesty as a member of the Samoan Constabulary in whatsoever capacity he may, in accordance with the provisions of these regulations, be required to serve, and at the appropriate rate of pay of any rank to which he may be appointed or reduced until legally discharged, and such agreement shall not be set aside, cancelled, or annulled for want of reciprocity, but every such agreement shall be determined by the discharge, dismissal, or other removal from office of any such person, or by his resignation under the provisions of clause 9 hereof.

6. If any question arises as to the right of any member of the Samoan Constabulary to hold or execute his office, common reputation shall be deemed evidence of such right, and it shall not be necessary to have or produce any written appointment or other

document or matter whatsoever in proof of such right.

7. The person who for the time being has the power of appointing members of the Samoan Constabulary may at any time discharge, dismiss, or reduce in rank any Inspector, Sub-inspector, or member thereof who, in his opinion, has been guilty of any act of misconduct or insubordination, or who, in his opinion, is remiss or negligent in the execution of his duty, or who, in his opinion, is otherwise unfit to remain a member of the Samoan Constabulary; and may also, for any period not exceeding twenty-one days pending inquiry into a charge of any act of misconduct or insurbodination or remissness or neglect in the execution of duty, suspend any such Inspector, Sub-inspector, or member of the Samoan Constabulary.

8. (1) The Inspector may inquire into and hear any charge against a member of the Samoan Constabulary of any act of misconduct or insubordination or remissness or neglect in the execution of his duty, and for such purpose may take all necessary statements and evidence, and may, if he finds the charge proved, impose a fine not exceeding £5, subject, however, to the offender's right of appeal to the Administrator.

(2) Notwithstanding that under the provisions of this clause the Inspector may have inquired into, heard, and determined a charge against a member of the Samoan Constabulary, and notwithstanding the imposition of a fine on such member, the person who for the time being has the power of appointing members of the Samoan Constabulary may in respect of such charge exercise the powers conferred upon him by clause 7 hereof.

9. No member of the Samoan Constabulary may resign his office unless expressly authorized so to do by the Administrator until the

completion of his period of enlistment.

10. The Samoan Constabulary shall be trained, armed, and equipped with such arms and accourrements and in such manner as the Administrator shall from time to time direct.

11. Members of the Samoan Constabulary (other than the Inspector

and Sub-inspectors) shall be paid at the following rates:-

Eight shillings and sixpence per day. Constables Lance-Corporals ... Eleven shillings and fourpence per day. Twelve shillings and one penny per day. Corporals or Lance-Sergeants

Twelve shillings and tenpence per day. Sergeants

Provided that if the Administrator shall have recommended with respect to any member of the Samoan Constabulary a different rate of pay from that hereinbefore set forth, the member with respect to whom such recommendation has been made shall be paid at the rate so recommended.

12. Members of the Samoan Constabulary shall be supplied free with clothing, board, and lodging: Provided that at the option of the Administrator an allowance of £18 per annum may be paid to any member in lieu of clothing, and provided also that at the option of the Administrator an allowance of four shillings and sixpence per day may be paid to any member in lieu of board.

13. The Administrator may from time to time make such regula-

tions as he thinks fit-

(1) For the government of the Samoan Constabulary and with respect to all matters which in his opinion are necessary for rendering the members thereof efficient in the discharge of their duties:

(2) Prescribing the duties of members of the Samoa Constabulary.

Prisons.

14. The Administrator may if he thinks fit, by writing under his hand, commit the custody and management of the property of any convicted prisoner who shall be serving a sentence of imprisonment in Samoa or otherwise to the Public Trustee, and such power may be exercised either generally or as to individual convicts.

15. On the appointment of the Public Trustee as aforesaid, all the real and personal property, including choses in action, to which the convict was at the time of his conviction entitled, or afterwards while serving a sentence of imprisonment becomes entitled, shall vest in the Public Trustee for all the estate and interest of such convict therein.

16. The Public Trustee shall receive and retain out of any estate of a convict which he shall administer such remuneration as the instru-

ment appointing him to administer such estate shall prescribe.

17. The Public Trustee shall have all the rights and powers and shall perform all the duties as regards each such estate that he shall administer as are appointed and prescribed in New Zealand under the Prisons Act, 1908, and its amendments, to or for the administrators of the property of a convict.

18. The Administrator shall have power from time to time to make

regulations with regard to prisons and in particular as to-

The safe custody and control of prisoners;
 The management of prisons;

(3) The discipline, conduct, and employment of prisoners;

(4) The duties and discipline of all constables, warders, or other persons engaged or employed in prisons;

(5) Penalties for breaches of such regulations.

WHEREAS it is provided by section five of the Fisheries HEREAS it is provided by section five of the Fisheries Act, 1908 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), that the Governor-General may from time to time, by Order in Council gazetted, make regulations imposing conditions and restrictions on the taking of fish, and prohibiting any specified mode of taking fish, or the use of any specified engines, tackle, or apparatus for taking the same:

And whereas it is considered expedient to make the regulations hereinafter set forth with respect to the use of nets, tackle, and apparatus for taking fish within the waters hereinafter described:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations, and doth hereby revoke the regulations set forth in the Schedule hereto.

REGULATIONS.

TRAWLING.

(1) DURING the period from the 16th day of November in any year until the 15th day of March following, both days inclusive, no person shall haul or use a trawl-net for the purpose of taking fish in that portion of the sea which is bounded on the north by a straight line drawn from Cape Colville to Rodrey Point.

Colville to Rodney Point.

(2) During the period from the 16th day of March to the 15th day of November in any year, both days inclusive, no person shall have or use a trawl-net for the purpose of taking

fish in that portion of the Hauraki Gulf which is bounded as follows: On the north by a straight line drawn from the north head of Colville Bay to Tiri Tiri Lighthouse; on the west by a straight line drawn from the said lighthouse to Flat Rock; and thence by a straight line drawn north (true) to its intersection with a straight line from Cape Colville to Rodney Point, and again on the north by a straight line drawn from the said point of intersection to Rodney Point.

DANISH SEINING.

(3) No person shall use a Danish seine net for taking fish within the waters respectively specified within the following boundaries :-

(a) Commencing at high-water mark at Gull Point; thence by a straight line drawn to Rangitoto Beacon, and then east (true) to a point at high-water mark on the shore of Rangitoto Island; thence by the western and southern shores of Rangitoto Island and the southwestern and south-eastern shores of Motutapu Island to a point at high-water mark to the eastward of the shed at Emu Bay; thence by a straight line drawn from the said point to a point at high-water mark of Waiheke Island in line with the house in Cable Bay; Waiheke Island in line with the house in Cable Bay; thence generally along the southern shores of Waiheke Island to the eastern head of Matuku Bay (otherwise known as McLeod's Bay); thence by a straight line to Thames Point on Ponui Island; thence by highwater mark to a point north (true) of Ponui Passage Lighthouse, and thence by a straight line to the said lighthouse; thence by a straight line to Deadman Point on the Coromandel Peninsula; thence generally by high water mark of the mainland to the comby high-water mark of the mainland to the com-

mencing-point.
(b) Inside straight lines drawn across Little Passage from Puri Point to Epuni Point, from the western extreme of Waihau Island (also known as Cook and the Maori) to the eastern extreme of Tuhuia Islet (otherwise known as Cow Island); thence to the northern extreme of Rangipukea Island, and from the southern extreme of Rangipukea Island to Deadman Point; as the said area is shown and delineated, coloured blue, on plan marked M.D. 6428, and deposited in the office

of the Marine Department at Wellington.

- (c) Mahurangi Harbour, inside a straight line drawn from the south head to the north head at the entrance thereof.
- (d) Inside a straight line drawn from the outer point of Fishermen's Bay (Accord Point) to Momona Point (otherwise known as Mansion House Point) Bon Accord Harbour, Kawau Island.
- (e) Manukau Harbour, inside a straight line drawn from the signal-staff on the South Head, to the eastern extreme of Paratutai Island.
- (f) Kaipara Harbour, inside a straight line drawn from the outer end of North Sandspit (otherwise known as Dry Spit) to Puki-tu.

(4) No person shall use a Danish seine on a vessel having an over-all length greater than 50 ft. in that portion of the Hauraki Gulf which is bounded as follows: On the north by a straight line drawn from the north head of Colville Bay to Tiri Tiri Lighthouse; on the west by a straight line drawn from the said point to Flat Rock; and thence by a straight line drawn north (true) to its intersection with a straight line from Cape Colville to Rodney Point, and again on the north by a straight line drawn from the said point of intersection

to Rodney Point.

to Rodney Point.

(5) During the period from the 16th day of November in any year until the 31st day of January following, both days inclusive, no person shall use a net of any description whatsoever for taking fish within that area of waters bounded as follows: Commencing at high-water mark of ordinary spring tides at Takatu Point, proceeding thence by a straight line drawn to Kauri Point on Waiheke Island; thence by highwater mark along the northern and western shores of the said drawn to Kauri Point on Waiheke Island; thence by highwater mark along the northern and western shores of the said Island to a point due west of the house at Cable Bay; thence by a straight line to a point at high-water mark of Motutapu Island in line with the shed at Emu Bay; thence by highwater mark along the northern portions of Motutapu and Rangitoto Islands to a point east (true) of Rangitoto Beacon; thence by a straight line to Gull Point on the mainland; thence by highwater mark to the south head of the entrance to Mahurangi Harbour; thence by a straight line to the north head of the entrance to the said harbour; thence by high-water mark to the commencing-point; excluding from the said area the waters inside a straight line drawn from the outer point of Fishermen's Bay (Accord Point) to Momona or Mansion House Point, Bon Accord Harbour, Kawau Island: Provided that this regulation shall not apply to set nets used for taking that this regulation shall not apply to set nets used for taking flounders, soles, or mullet, or to drag nets used for "herring" or piper only, within the said area.

(6) The mesh in the last three yards of the cod-end of every Danish seine net shall measure, when prepared for use, not less than four and a half inches.

(7) It shall be unlawful to use or convey a Danish seine net on any vessel when such vessel is engaged in trawling.

(8) No person shall use an otter-board with or attach the

same to any Danish seine net, nor shall any person convey an otter-board on any vessel while such vessel is engaged in Danish seining.

(9) For the purpose of these regulations a Danish seine is a net having a warp attached to each wing and which is operated by being drawn over the sea-bottom, the power for such operation and for the hauling of the net being provided

by a winch driven by an internal combustion or steam engine.
(10) Any person committing a breach of any of the above regulations is liable to a fine of £50.

Alterations to Scale of Charges upon the New Zealand Government Railways.

IN pursuance of all powers and authorities enabling me under the Government Railways Act, 1926, and its amendments, and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, I. William Burgoyne Taverner, Minister of Railways, do hereby make the following alterations in the scale of charges in force on the New Zealand Government Railways open for traffic made on the 10th day of August, 1925, and published in the Gazette of 11th August, 1925.

PART I.—PASSENGERS.

By omitting Regulation 31A:

31a. Boy Scouts and Girl Guides.

Boy scouts and girl guides, sixteen years of age and under, in parties of not less than six in number, travelling to attend parades or instruction camps, will be issued second-class return tickets at one-half of the ordinary fare (Regulation 2), or, where applicable, at suburban fare (Regulation 40): Minimum charge, 9d., on production of a certificate in the following form:

(d) From any officered station on the South Island main line and branches, including Central Booking-office, Christchurch, to any station on the Picton Section or on the North Island main line and branches, except Wellington (Lambton or Thorndon).
(e) From Stewart Island to any station on the North Island main line and branches, except Wellington (Lambton or Thorndon), or the South Island main line and branches (except Bluff).
